

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Post-Tropical Depression Dolly – Final (Advisory #9 as of 11:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 370 miles SW of Cape Race Newfoundland
- Moving NE at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- · Last public advisory issued by the National Hurricane Center





Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



<u>Tropical Depression Three-E</u> (Advisory 4 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- About 1,455 miles ESE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Moving W at 8 mph
- · Maximum sustained winds of 35 mph
- · Some strengthening is forecast over the next 48 hours
- · Likely to become a tropical storm tonight or tomorrow

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Development of this system is no longer expected due to unfavorable environmental conditions
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (0%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A few hundred miles SW of the coast of Mexico
- Conditions forecast to be conducive for development in a couple of days
- Likely to become a tropical depression in a few days while it moves WNW parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec by late this week
- Conditions expected to be conducive for gradual development over the weekend as it moves WNW parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)





COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 36,287 (-36) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,501 (-19) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 29,339,757 (+2,022,722) cumulative (as of June 24).

Confirmed Cases of COVID-19



United States: 121,117 (+784)Worldwide: 469,587 (+3,847)


Response:

- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs at Steady State; monitoring




National Weather Forecast






Fire Weather Outlook






