

Situation:

- Fire began Oct 22 and is threatening communities in and around Napili-Honokowai (combined pop 3,000) on state and private land, near the tourist areas of Kaanapali (pop 1k) and Lahaina (pop 12k)
- Threatening homes, infrastructure, utilities, a small airport and equipment in the area
- Kapalua Airport (small commuter airport) is shut down
- Honoapiilani Highway, the main road in the area, has been shut down at times
- Power poles destroyed but most communities continue to have power
- 1 shelter open with 2 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:01 am. EDT)

- Region IX RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
- FMAG approved on Oct 23


