Significant Events: Tropical Cyclone Yutu Response

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Hurricane Oscar (CAT 2)
- Eastern Pacific Disturbance 1 Low (10%); Disturbance 2 Medium (40%); Disturbance 3 Low (20%)
- Central Pacific No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next 5 days
- Western Pacific No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Heavy snow possible Southern/Central Rockies
- Critical and enhanced fire weather northern and southern CA
- Red Flag Warnings northern CA

Tropical Cyclone Yutu

Safety and Security:

All CNMI government offices will re-open for six-hour days today, October 30

Food, Water, Sheltering:

- Rota: all water services online; Tinian: pending damage assessments, generators will be installed which will restore water service to the island
- Aerial preliminary damage assessments:
 - Saipan: 779 structures assessed; 317 major damage, 462 destroyed
 - o Tinian: 183 structures assessed; 113 major damage, 70 destroyed
 - o Rota: 51 structures assessed; 38 major damage, 13 destroyed
- Shelters/Occupants: 13 / 927 (+53) across CNMI; all Rota shelters closed; 11 shelters at or over capacity
- · As commodities arrive, sheltered population will move into tents over the next 7-10 days

Health and Medical:

- · Saipan: hospital remains operational on generator power and is below capacity
- Tinian: Tinian Medical Center structurally compromised, no current patients, damage assessments ongoing

Energy:

- Saipan: 99% of customers without power; Tinian 100% customers without power; Rota: power restored to nearly 99% of customers
- Saipan: 8 of 9 power feeders offline; restoration pending field assessments and repairs at power plant
- Tinian: 4 of 4 power feeders offline; 1 generator installed, 1 installation in progress
- Rota: all 3 power feeders online
- Gas stations: Saipan: 11 of 19 open; Tinian: one station has fuel but dispensers inoperable; parts for repairs ETA October 30

Communication:

- · Saipan: 5 out of service; 20 cell towers on generator power, cell service intermittent
- Tinian: 1 cell tower down, 2 cell towers on generator power; no estimated timeline for full restoration of network due to extensive infrastructure damage
- Rota: 1 cell tower down; 4 cell towers on generator power





Transportation:

- Public transportation systems not operational
- All sea ports open with no restrictions
- Airports:
 - Saipan: restricted to humanitarian relief only under visual flight; mobile air traffic tower delivery ETA November 1; generator non-operational, awaiting installation of new generator; most civilian airlines have cancelled all flights for immediate future
 - Tinian: open for humanitarian relief flights only
 - Rota: open; road debris clearance 90% complete
- Major roads and most secondary roads are accessible

Hazardous Waste

Saipan: 1 waste water plant is operational; 1 non-operational

State/Local Response

- CNMI EOC at Full Activation
- Governor declared a State of Emergency; Guam National Guard supporting

FEMA HQ/Federal Response

- FEMA-3408-EM-CNMI approved Oct 23; FEMA-4404-DR-CNMI approved Oct 26
- FEMA Region IX RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
- FEMA Region IX IMAT-2 deployed to Saipan; LNOs in Guam, Rota and Tinian
- FEMA Region VII IMAT deployed to CNMI (already deployed for Mangkhut)
- FEMA NRCC Response Operations Cell (ROC) at day shift only; NWC at Enhanced Watch night shift only
- FEMA HQ ISB team and MERS assets deployed
- HHS medical teams deployed to assess medical needs of shelter populations, provide crisis counseling, refill prescription medications; working with Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation to open medical support shelter and decompress patient care needs


