- Severe Thunderstorms – Southern Plains into the Lower Mississippi Valley

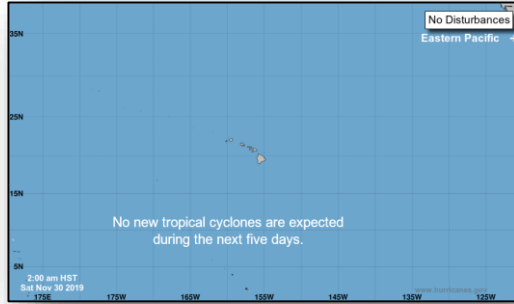
## **Tropical Activity:**

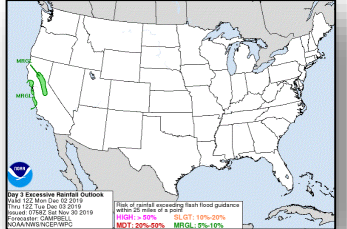
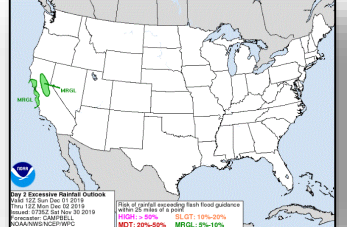
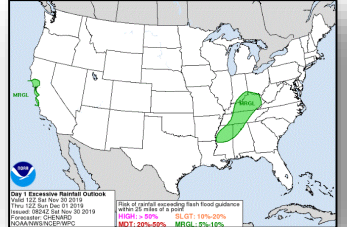
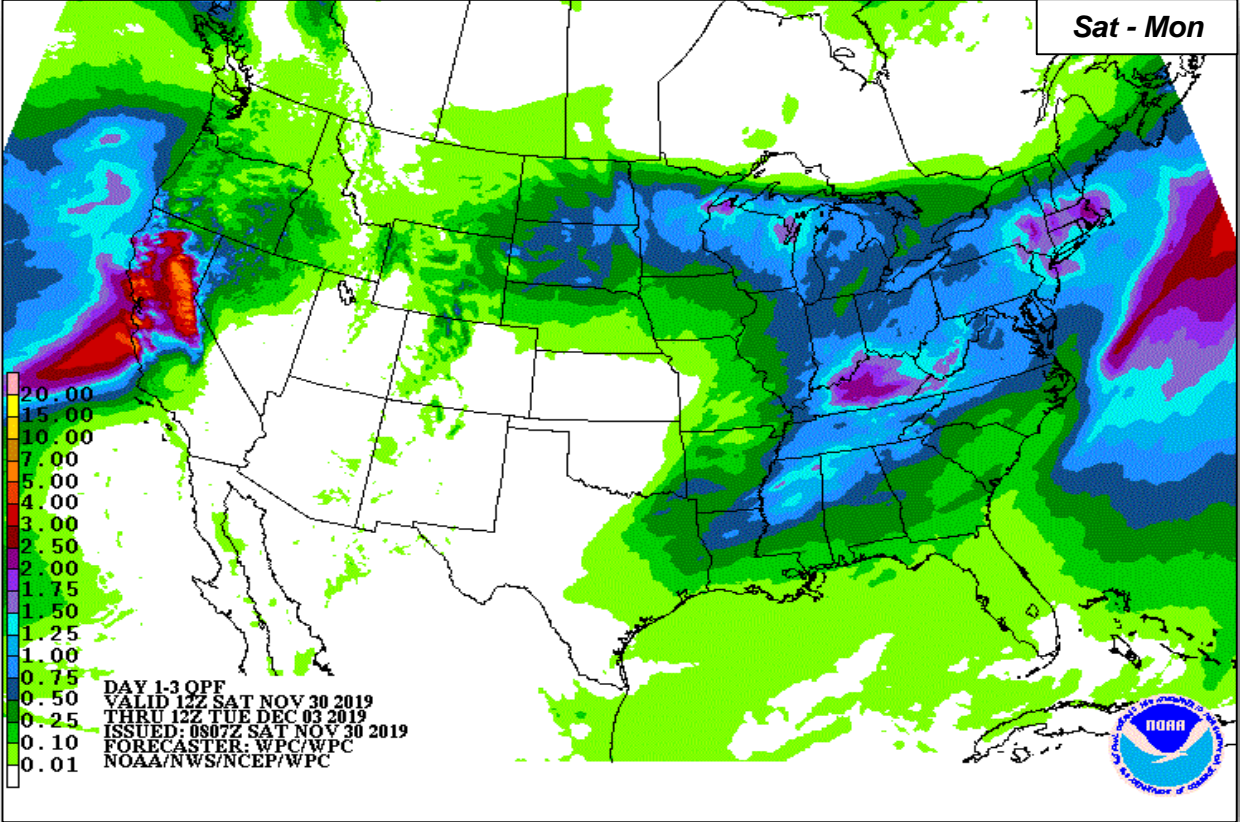
# Forecast Snowfall – 72 hour



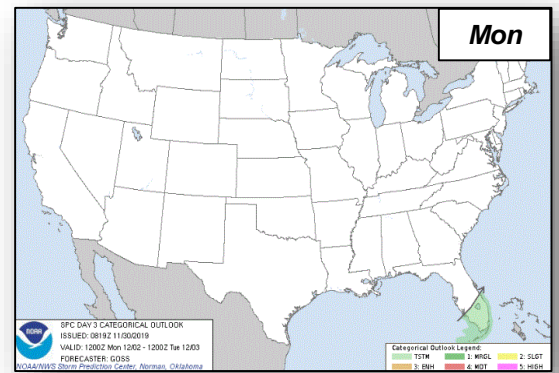
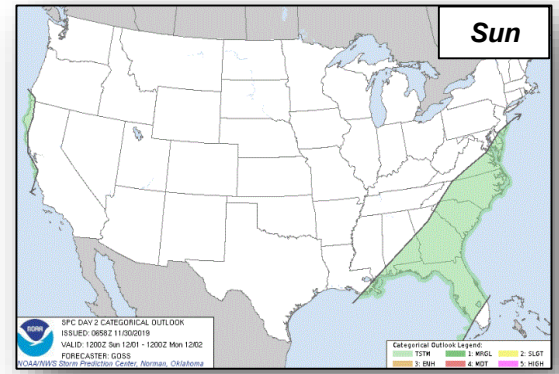
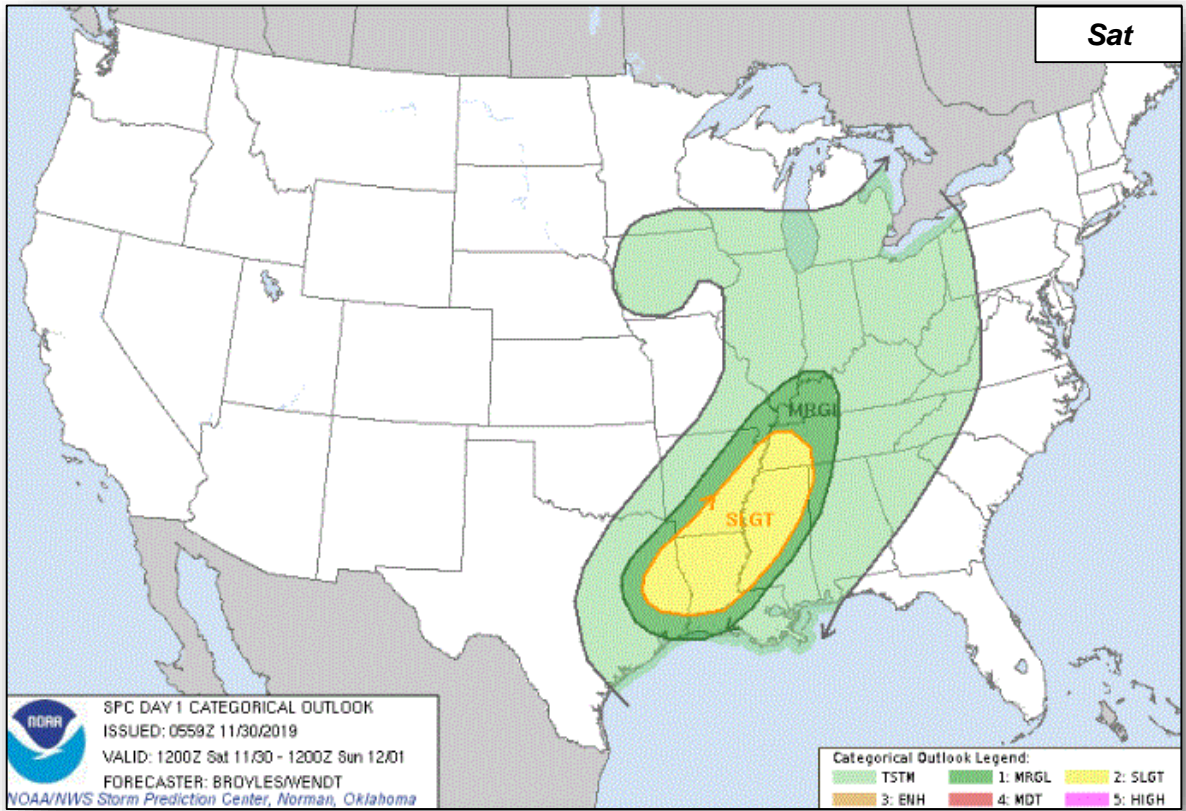

# Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

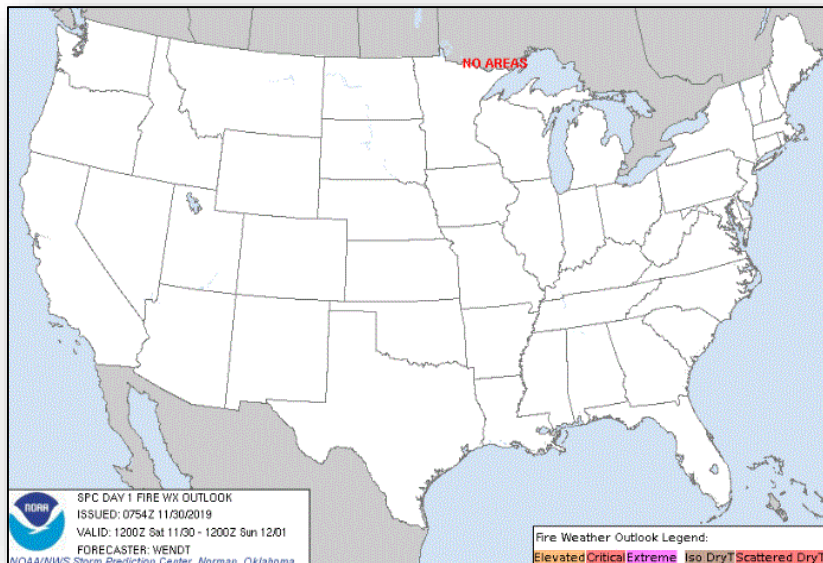
