Winter Weather / Flooding – California



Situation

Guerneville, CA (pop. 4,534) is isolated by flooding from the Russian River; all routes in/out of the community are impassable. The river is forecast to gradually recede and drop below flood stage by late tonight. A Flood Warning remains in effect through this morning.

Lifeline Impacts

Safety and Security

- Numerous homes and businesses damaged/destroyed in Guerneville Food, Water, and Shelter
- 3 shelters; 105 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:16 a.m. EST)
- Sonoma County: Approximately 1,800 homes (4,000 residents) evacuated
- 3,297 persons / 2,062 households are under mandatory evacuation orders in communities near the Russian River (CalOES).

<u>Energy</u>

 Approximately 4k customers without power in Sonoma County; 16k (0.1%) customers without power across CA (EAGLE-I, 7:30 a.m. EST)

Transportation












National Weather Forecast










Precipitation Forecast




Significant River Flood Outlook






Severe Weather Outlook






Winter Precipitation Outlook









Forecast Snowfall
