
FEMA is supporting the Department of Homeland Security's Interagency Border Emergency Cell (IBEC) and operations on the southwest border.

FEMA Headquarters Actions




- Interagency Border Emergency Cell (IBEC) established April 4; cell working from FEMA NRCC
 - ESF representatives manning IBEC beginning April 8 (except ESF-3 and ESF-9)
- FEMA NRCC Response Operations Cell (ROC):
 - Activated to align/coordinate Region VI, Region IX, NWC and HQ programs and actions
 - Supporting DHS Interagency Border Emergency Cell
- Field Operations Directorate (FOD) / Volunteer Force Coordination Cell (VFCC):
 - Security vetting for Tier 3 volunteers begun
 - Tier 4 Memo sent to IBEC leadership
 - Interagency volunteer Deployment Tracking System (DTS) – tested and revising
 - Finalizing travel, time and attendance guidance
 - 34 FEMA Employees registered for DHS Volunteer Force

FEMA Regional/Field Support:

- FEMA Coordination Team deployed to El Paso, TX; liaisons to CBP
- FEMA Region VI – Rio Grande Valley and El Paso Sectors:
 - Elements of IMAT I deployed to McAllen, TX

 - Scoping team (RA, Ops, Mass Care, and VOAD) completed initial assessments






National Weather Forecast



Severe Weather Outlook





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
Precipitation Forecast




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


Winter Precipitation



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Forecast Snowfall




Forecast Ice Accumulation






