Current Situation:

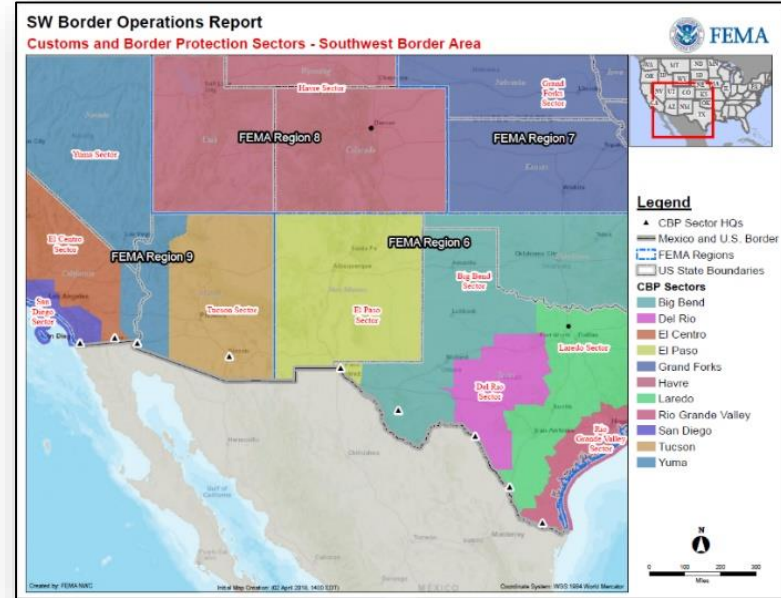
FEMA continues to support DHS and the Interagency Border Emergency Cell (IBEC) with operations on the southwest border.

FEMA Headquarters Actions

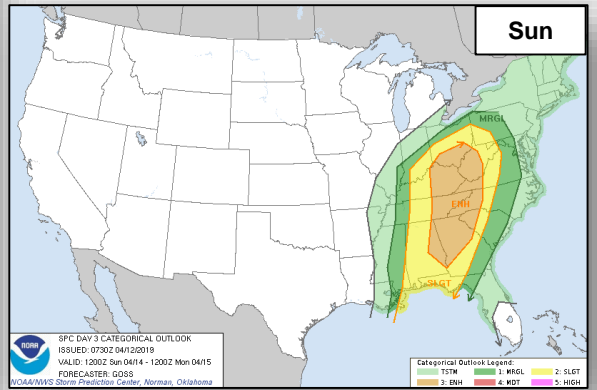
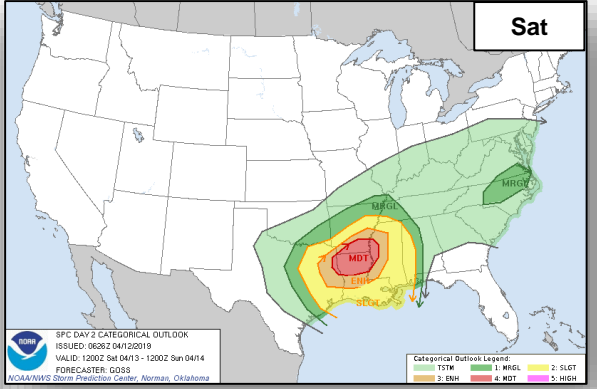
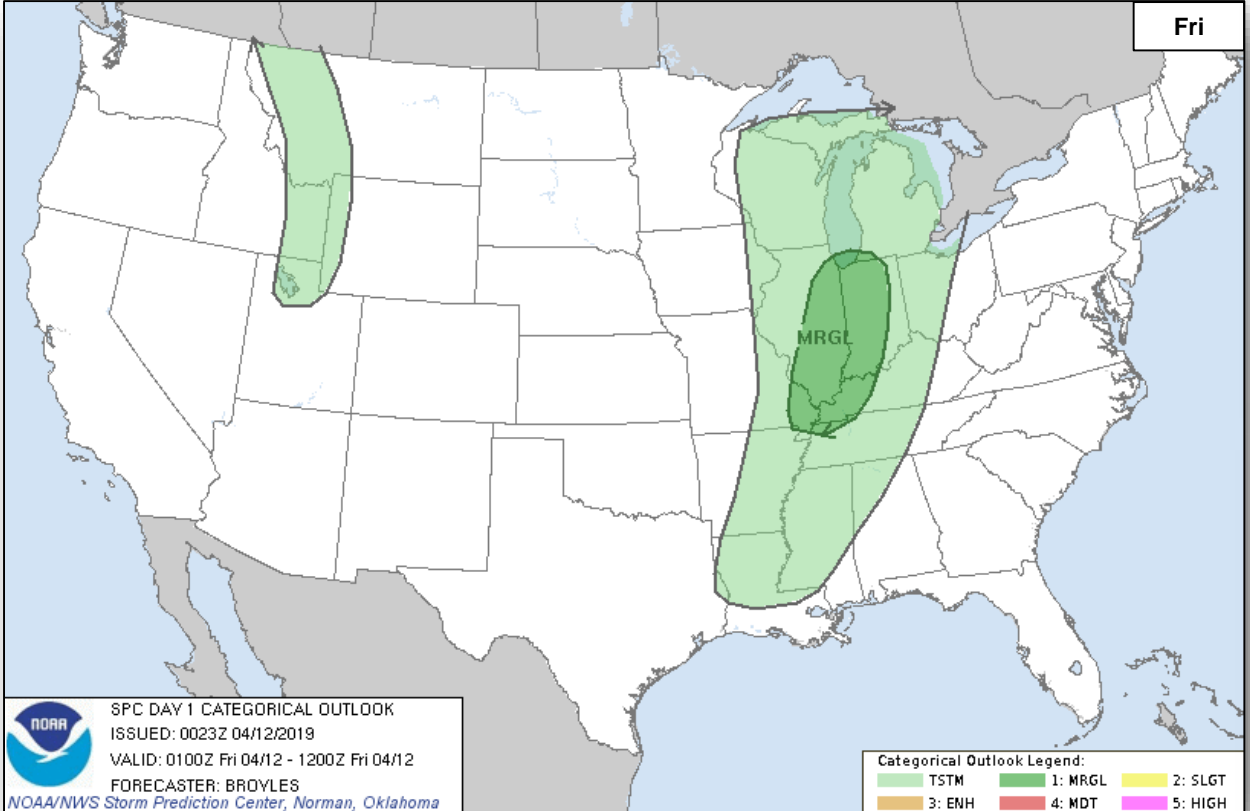
- Interagency Border Emergency Cell (IBEC) established & operating in FEMA NRCC
 - ESF representatives (except ESF-3 and ESF-9) represented
- FEMA NRCC Response Operations Cell (ROC) – Activated
 - Aligns/coordinates Region VI, Region IX, NWC and HQ programs and actions
- Field Operations Directorate (FOD) / Volunteer Force Coordination Cell (VFCC):
 - 39 FEMA Employees registered for DHS Volunteer Force
 - Registration process for interagency went live
 - Language for time, attendance and travel drafted; will be disseminated once available
 - Interagency volunteer Deployment Tracking System (DTS)
 - Privacy Threshold Analysis not approved yet – Privacy Impact Analysis triggered. FEMA OCC is working with Privacy on solutions
 - Interagency Reimbursable Work Agreement, with CBP and ICE completed and submitted

FEMA Regional/Field Support:

- *FEMA Coordination Team (FEMA Region VI and HQ) – Rio Grande Valley and El Paso Sectors:*
 - Deployed to El Paso, TX; liaisons to CBP
 - Elements of Region VI IMAT I deployed to McAllen, TX
 - Continuing to assess/coordinate CBP sector and local emergency management requirements
 - Demobilization/transition plan completed to facilitate deliberate transfer of contacts and activities from FEMA to CBP
- *FEMA Region IX – San Diego, Yuma, and El Centro Sectors:*
 - Scoping team (RA, Ops, Mass Care, and VOAD) completed initial assessments



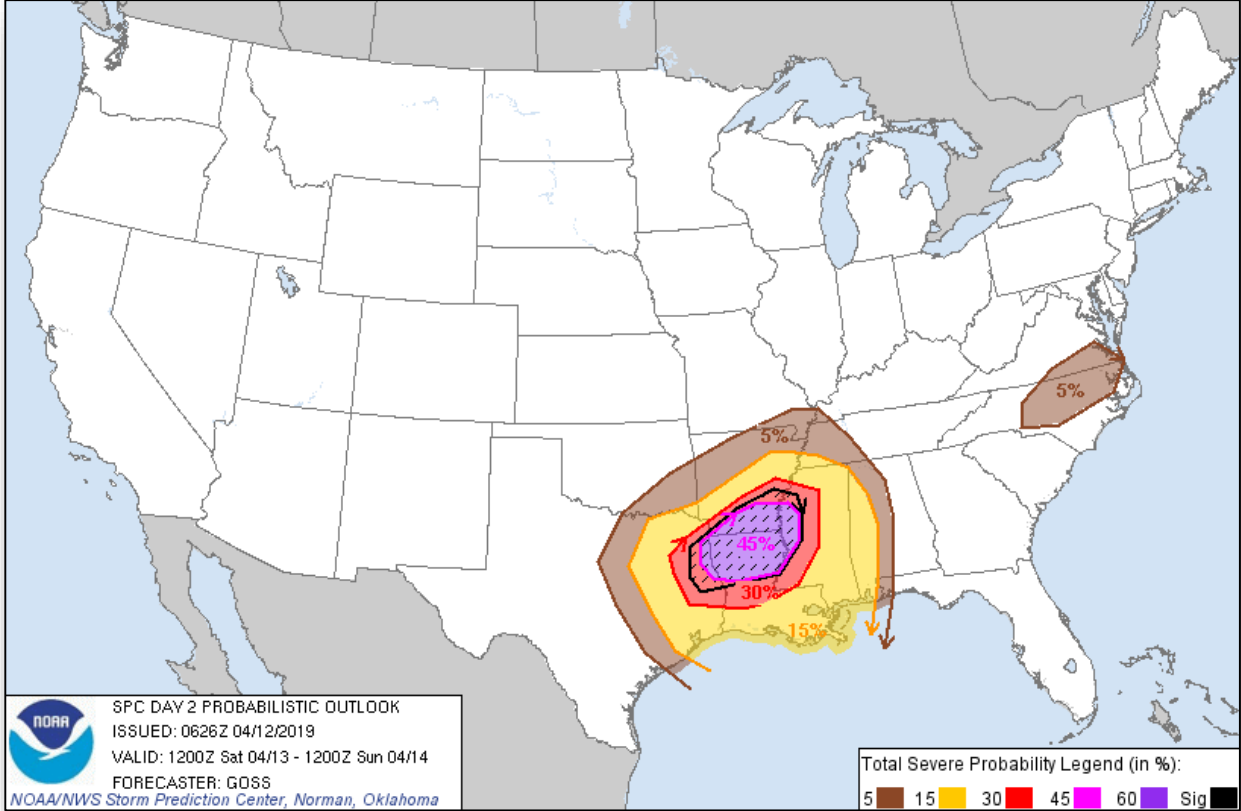
Severe Weather Outlook

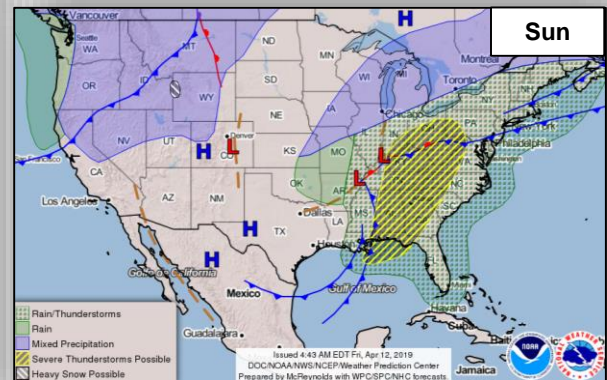
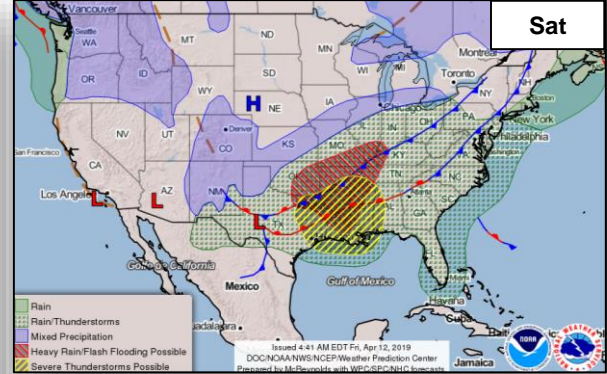
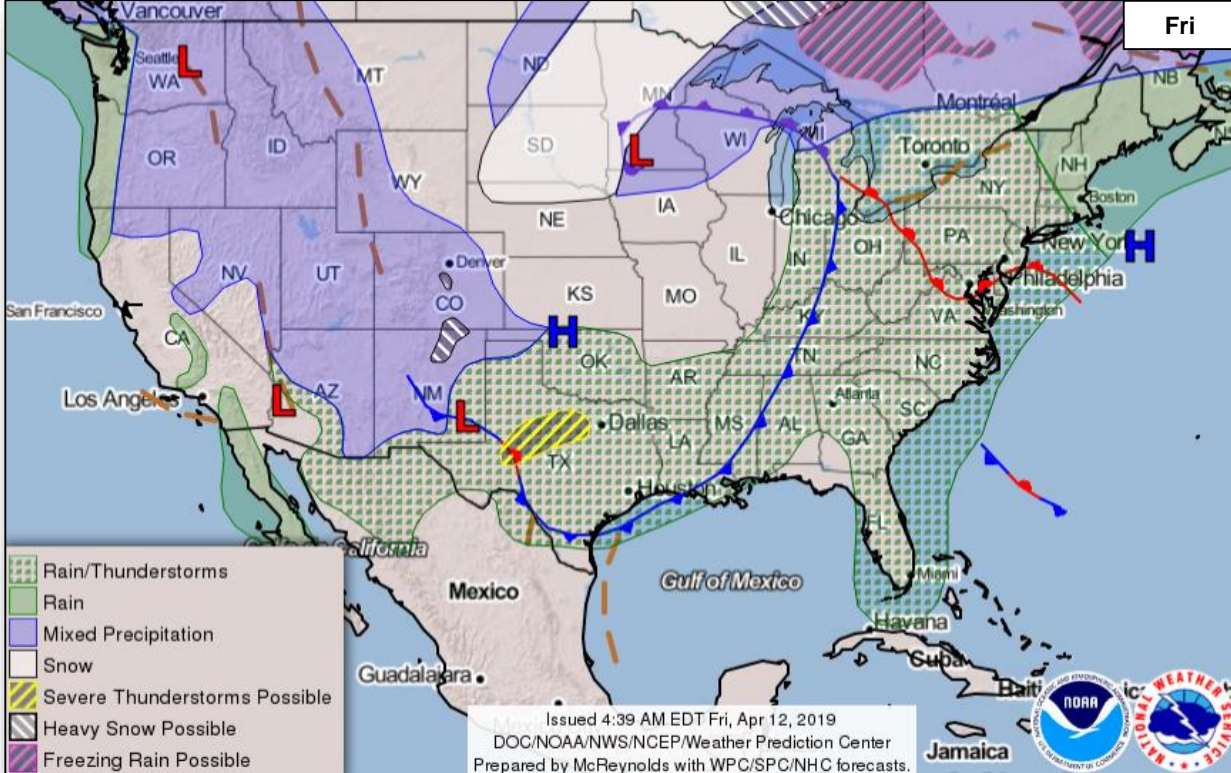

Probability for Severe Weather within 25 miles of a point

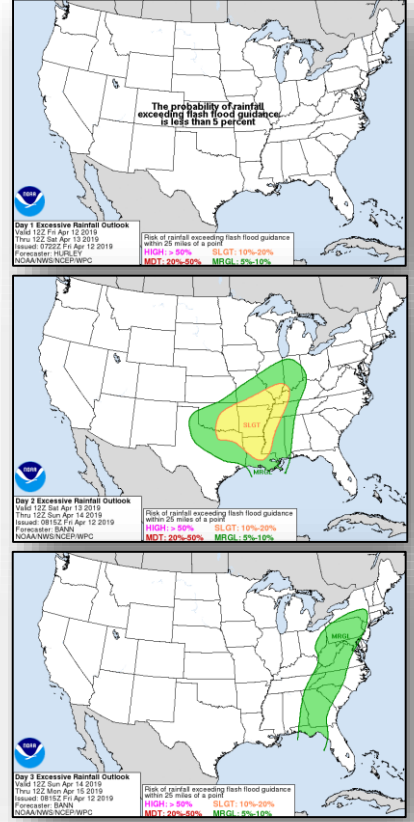
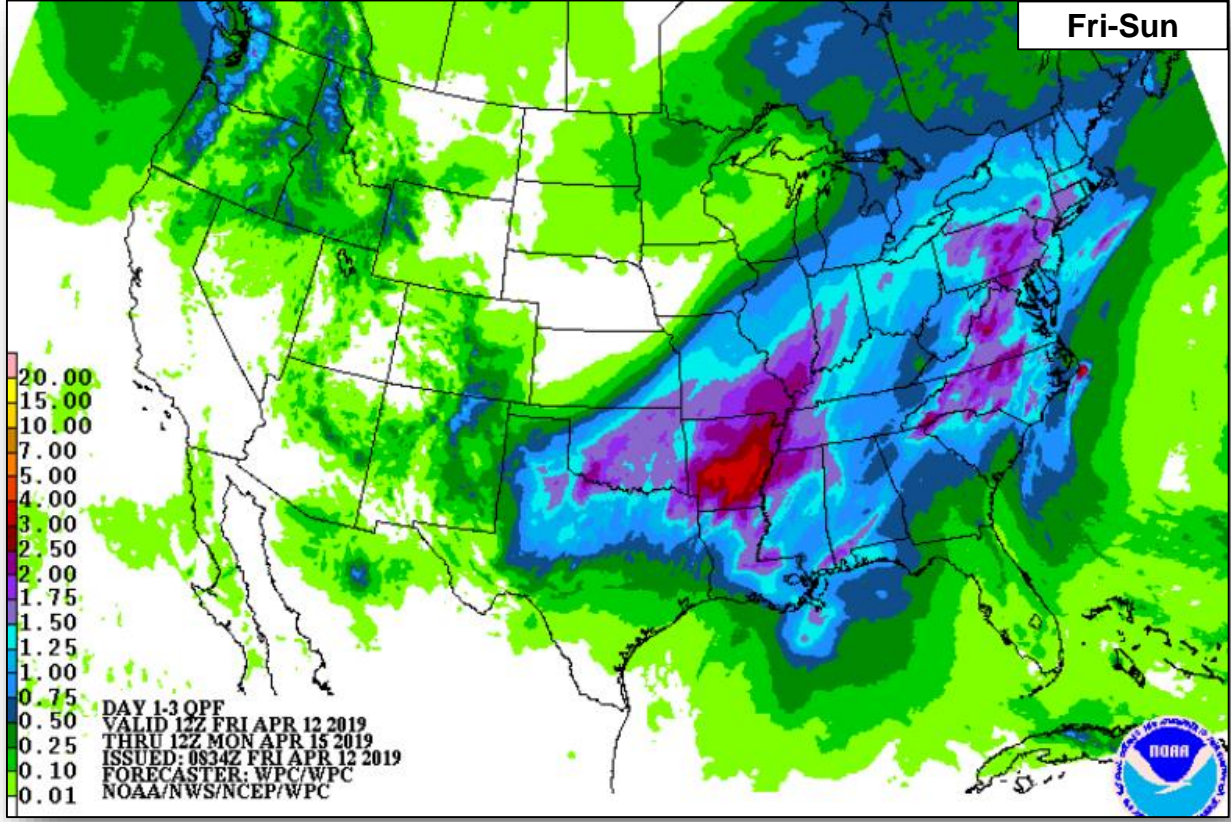
