

<u>Current Situation</u>: Severe thunderstorms, extending from eastern Texas into the Tennessee Valley, occurred Saturday into Sunday morning and continue today from the Southeast into eastern portions of the Ohio Valley, Lower Great Lakes, and the Mid-Atlantic. As of this morning, there have been 160 preliminary storm reports (tornado/19, wind/99, hail/42).









National Weather Forecast






Precipitation Forecast












