Current Situation:

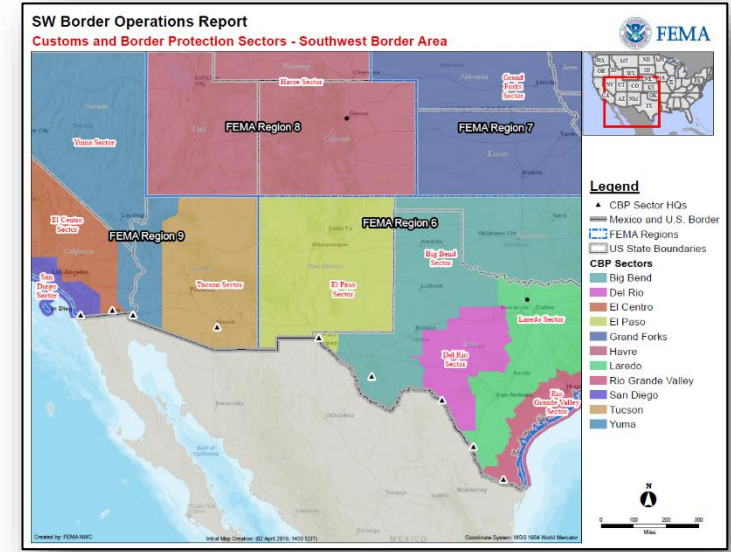
DHS CBP and ICE continue to be challenged with handling the increased migrant population at the Southwest border. DHS Secretary has requested support from DHS Components and OFA in assisting both CBP and ICE with personnel in specific areas, enabling more agents to work the migrant issue.

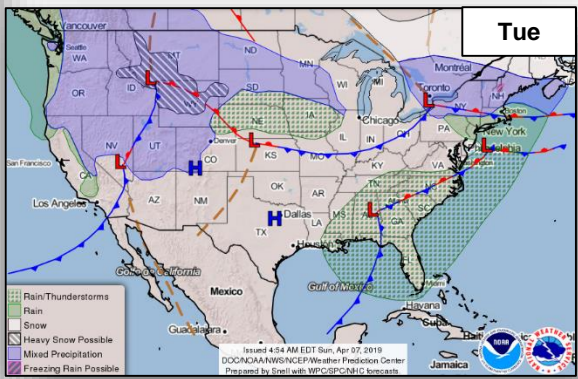
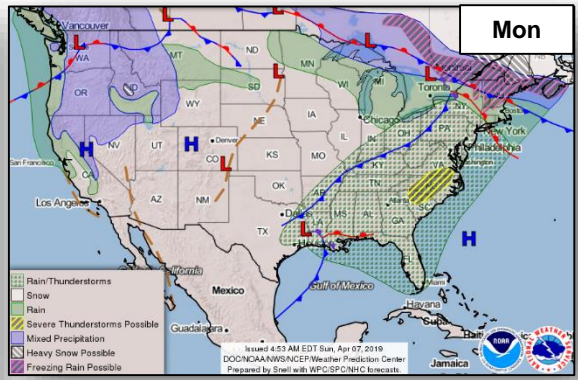
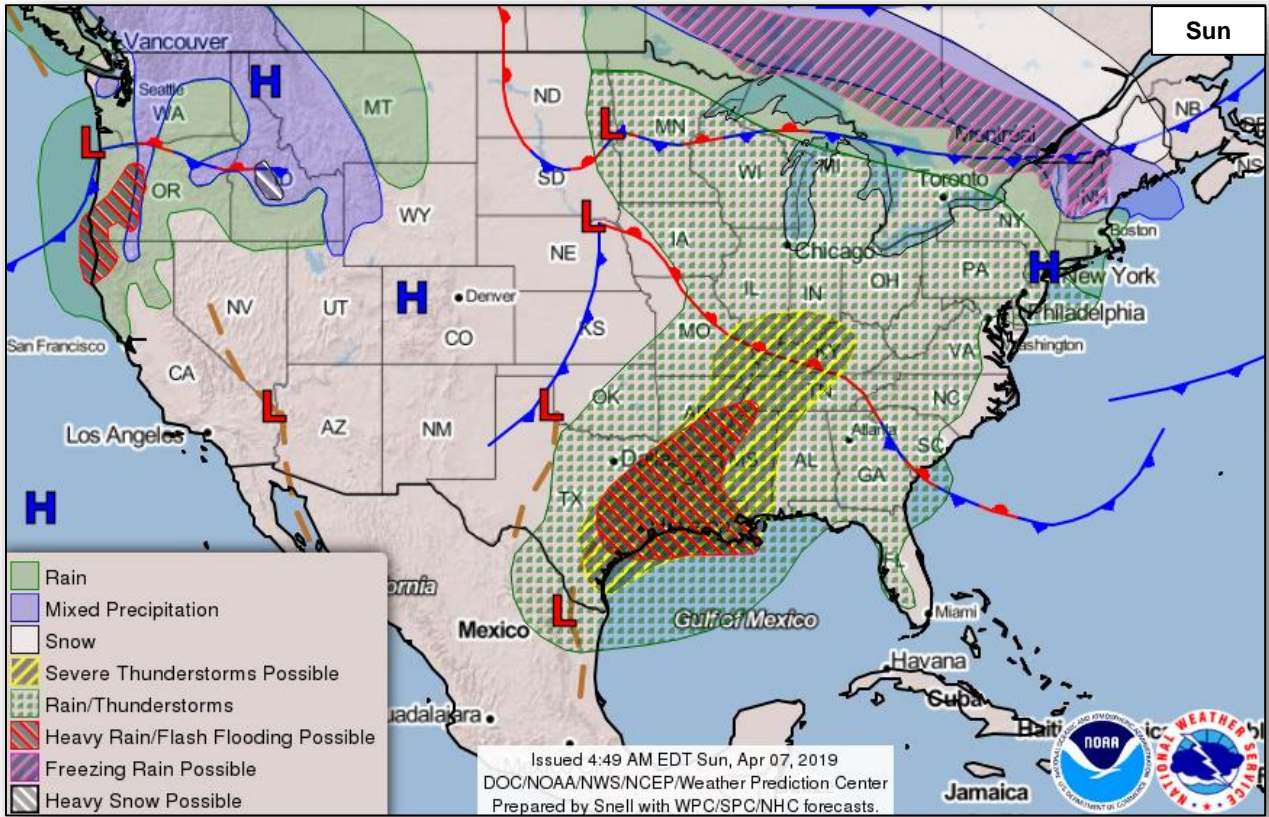
- Interagency Border Emergency Cell (IBEC) established April 4; cell will work out of the FEMA NRCC
 - ESF representatives manning IBEC beginning April 8 (except ESF-3 and ESF-9)
 - Draft organizational structure includes Plans, Operations, Logistics, Administration, and Finance
 - Four Lifelines will be reported: Safety and Security, Medical, Transportation, Food/Water/Shelter
- FEMA NRCC Response Operations Cell (ROC) (virtual day-shifts):
 - Activated to align/coordinate Region VI, Region IX, NWC and HQ programs and actions
 - Will expand to support the DHS Interagency Border Emergency Cell
 - Providing support to the daily Interagency VTC
- Field Operations Directorate (FOD) / Volunteer Force Coordination Cell (VFCC):
 - Currently 472 (+61) volunteers; list is growing
 - Interagency volunteer Deployment Tracking System (DTS) expected to be operational April 8-9
 - Assisting with the establishment of a PMC capable of RSOI oversight
 - Engaged with DHS/CBP identifying, tracking, incorporating, and assimilating LEO volunteers
 - Current focus on deployment of drivers, medical personnel, and attorneys

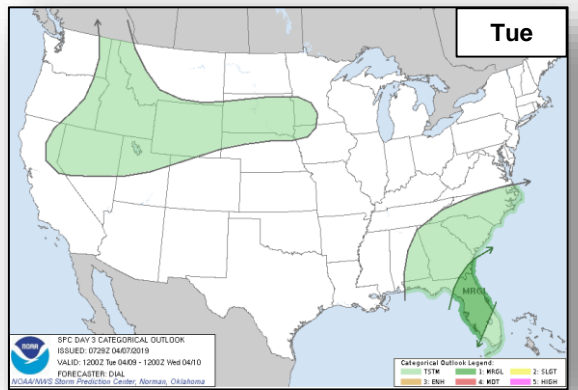
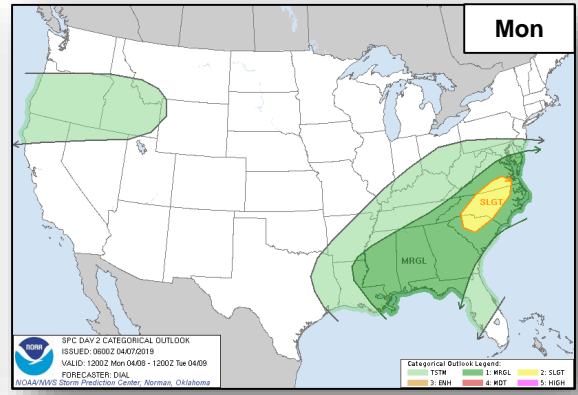
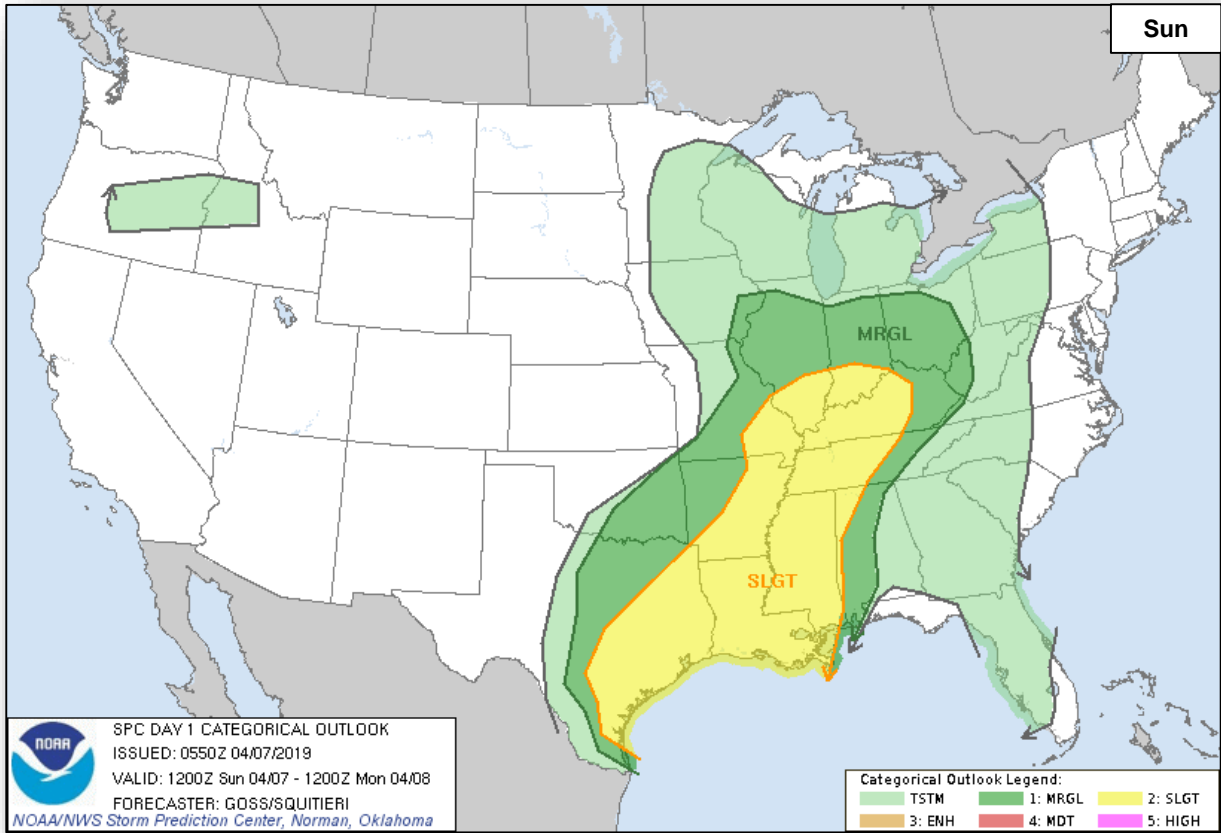

 - Scoping team (RA, Ops, Mass Care, and VOAD) assessed/coordinating CBP sector requirements



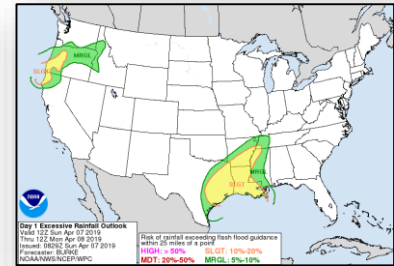
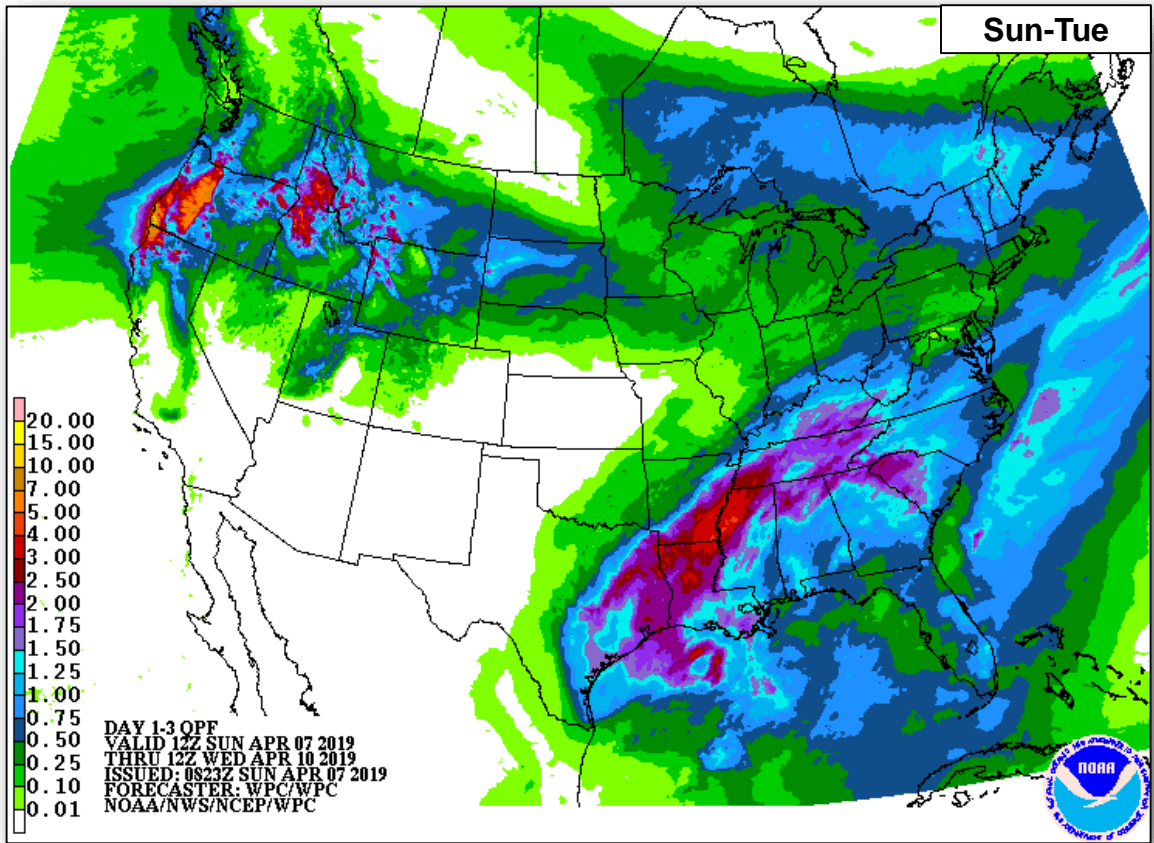
National Weather Forecast



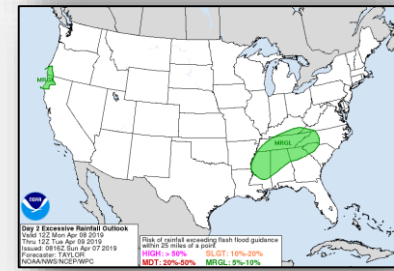
Severe Weather Outlook



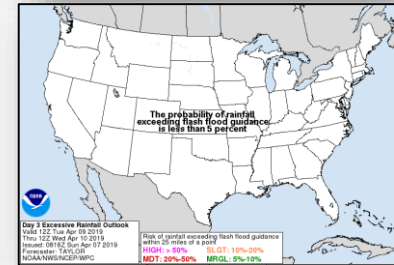
Precipitation Forecast

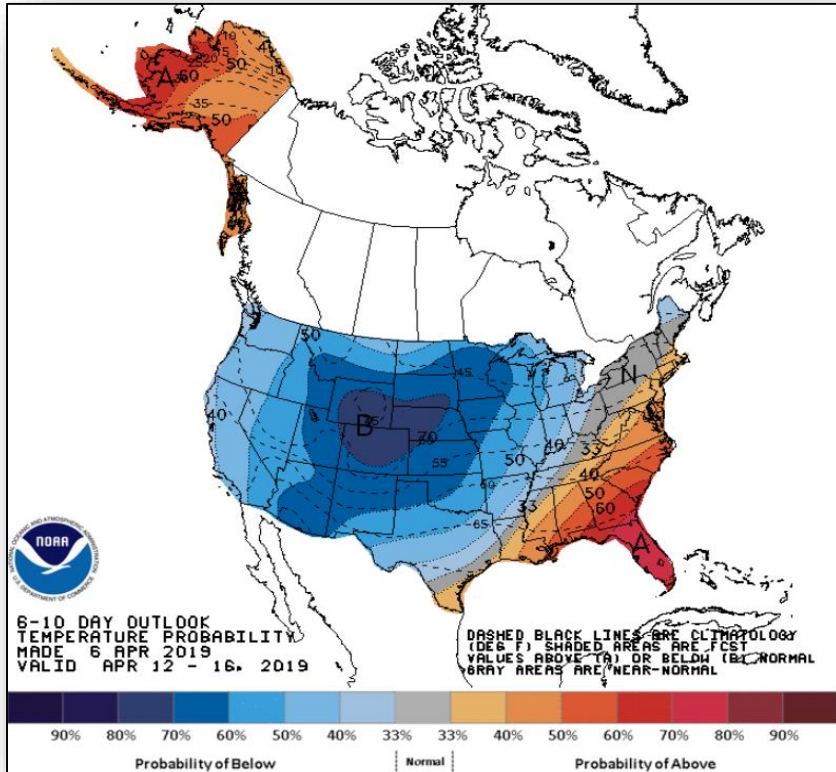

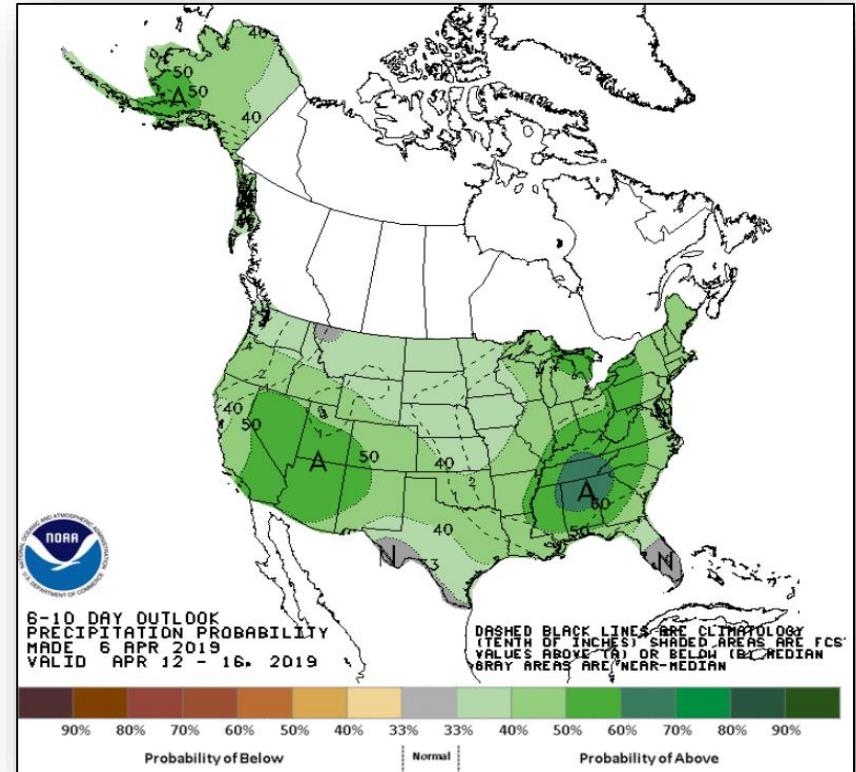
Long Range Outlooks – April 12 – 16

6 - 10 Day Precipitation Probability

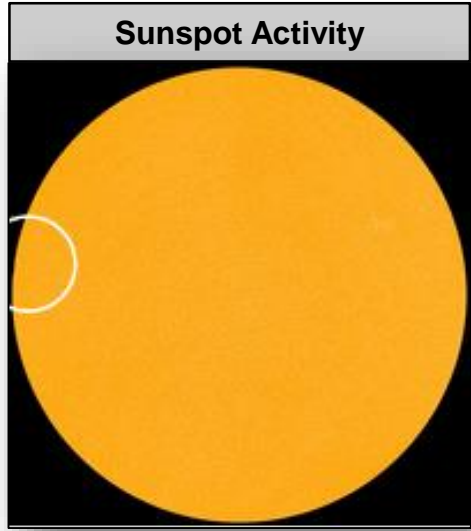
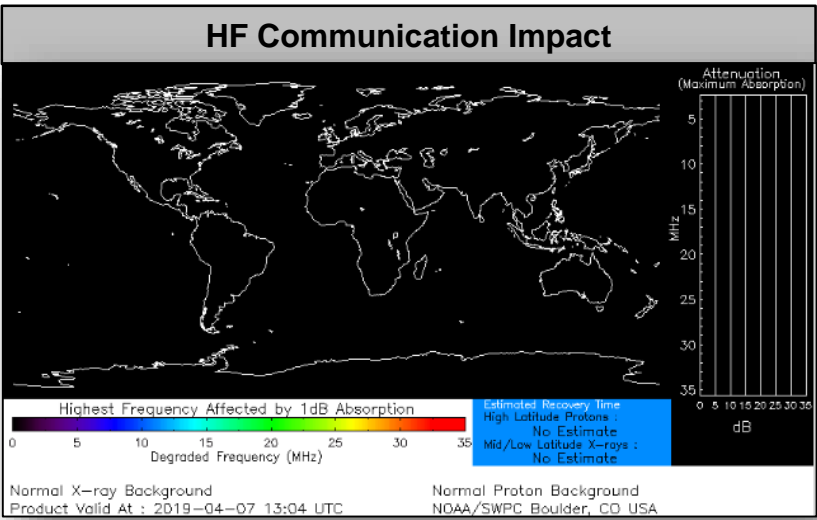
