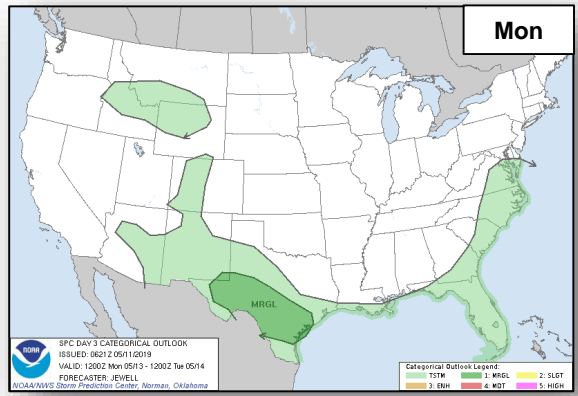
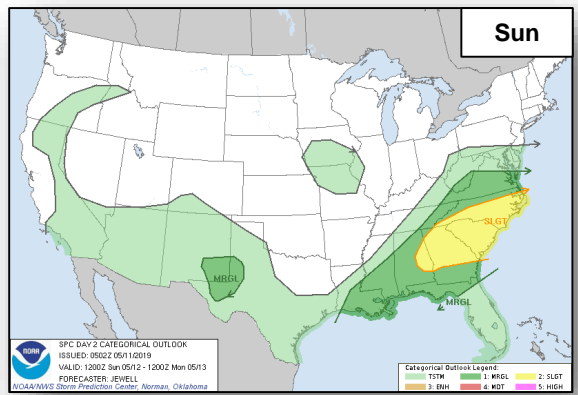
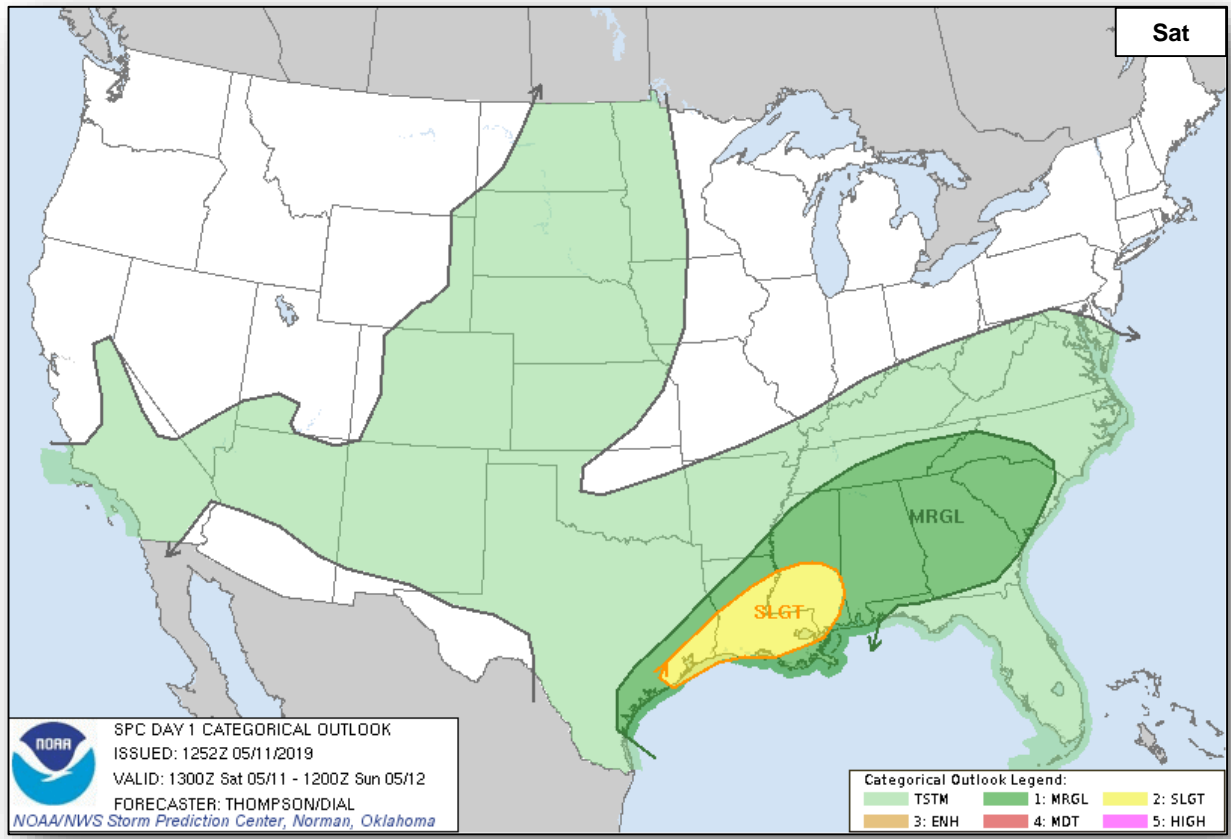
National Weather Forecast



Severe Weather Outlook



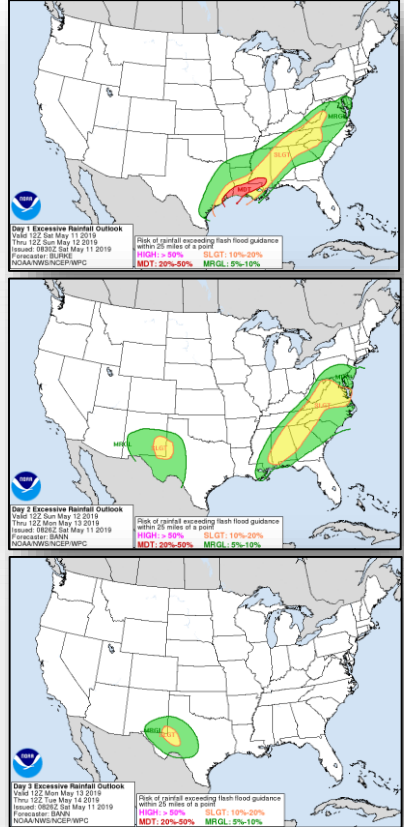
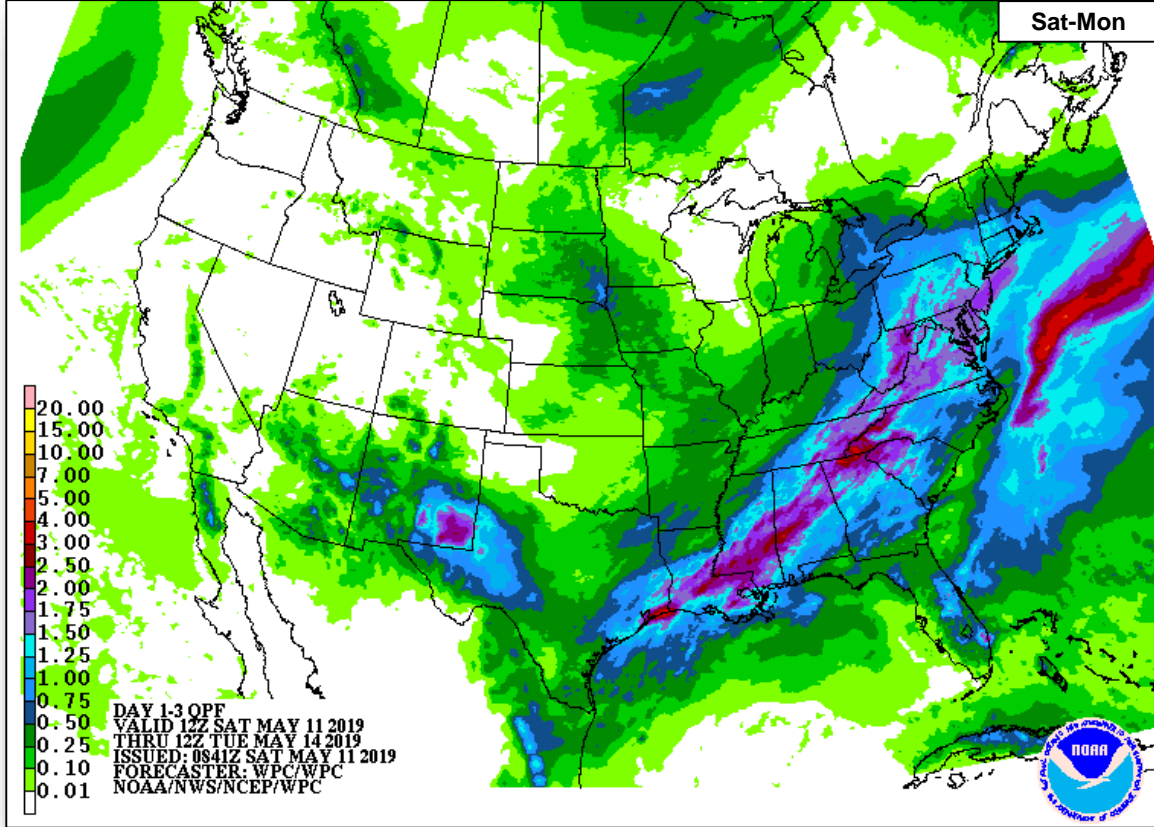

Precipitation Forecast



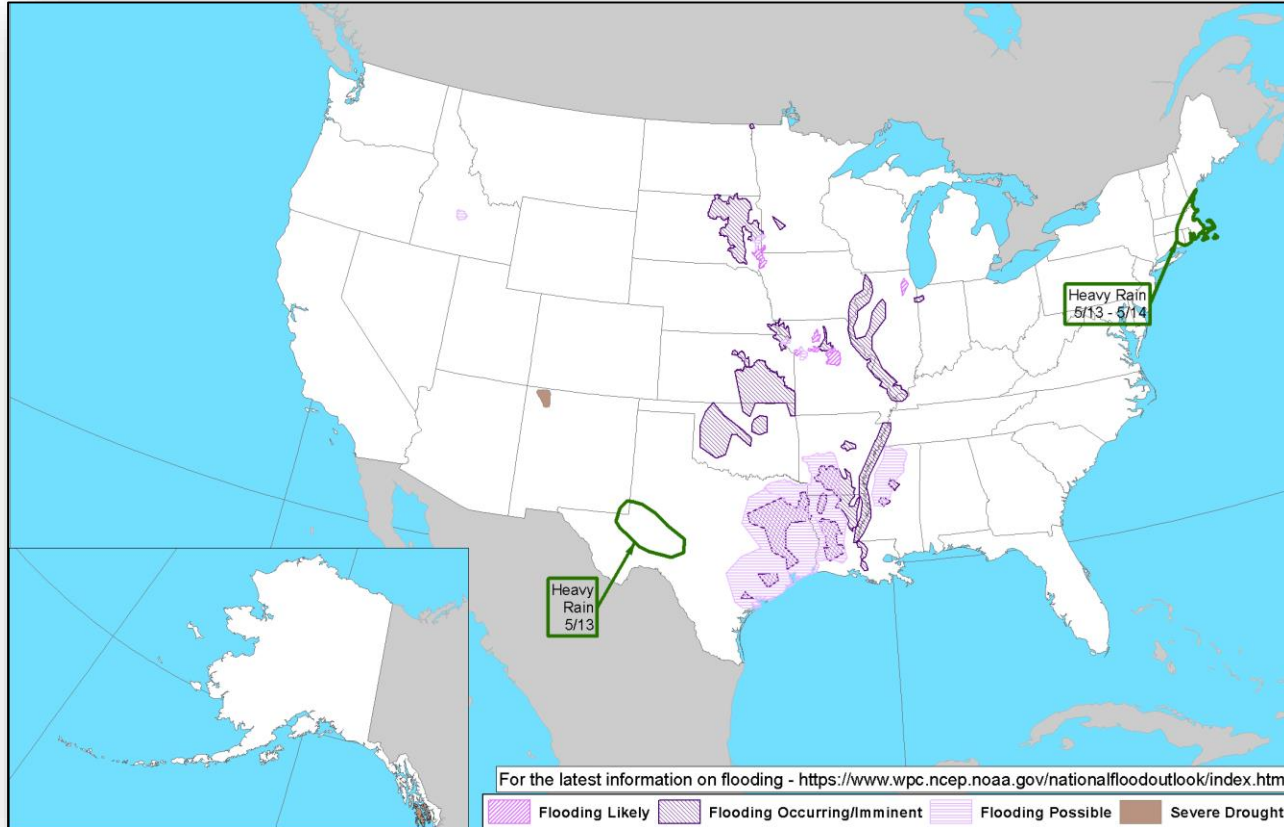

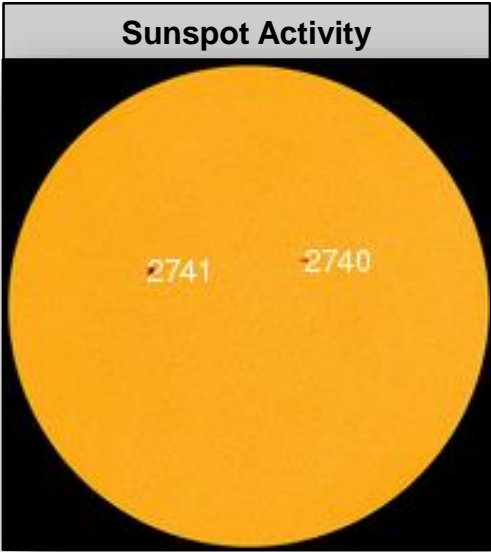
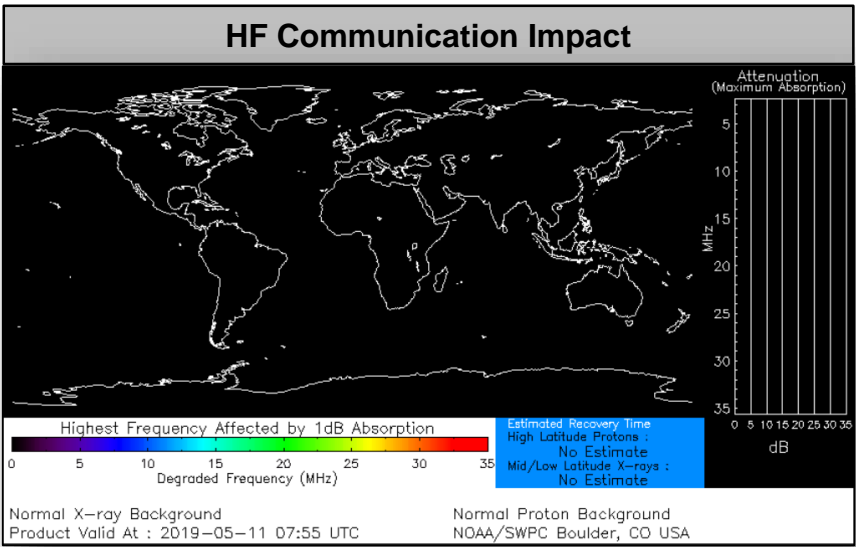

Saturday, May 11 – Complete a Written Plan

Being prepared, before a hurricane threatens, makes you resilient to the hurricane impacts of wind and water; it will mean the difference between your being a hurricane victim and a hurricane survivor

- The time to prepare for a hurricane is before the season begins, when you have the time and are not under pressure
- If you wait until a hurricane is on your doorstep, the odds are that you will be under duress and will make the wrong decisions
- Take the time now to write down your hurricane plan:
 - Know where you will ride out the storm and get your supplies now
 - You don't want to be standing in long lines when a hurricane warning is issued, the supplies you need will probably be sold out by the time you reach the front of the line
