- Flash Flood Watches in effect – Middle Mississippi Valley to the Mid-Atlantic

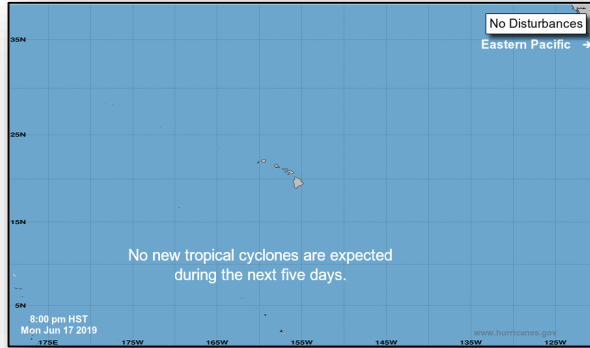

National Weather Forecast



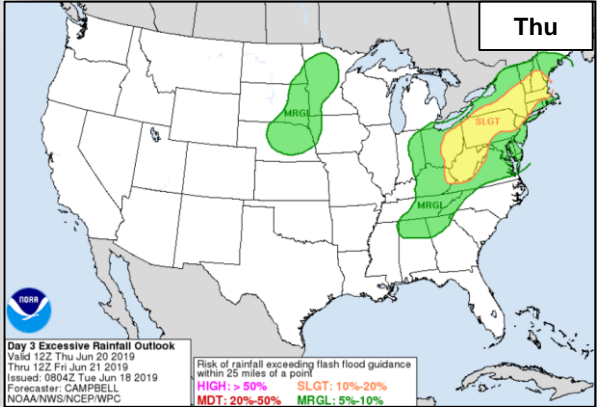
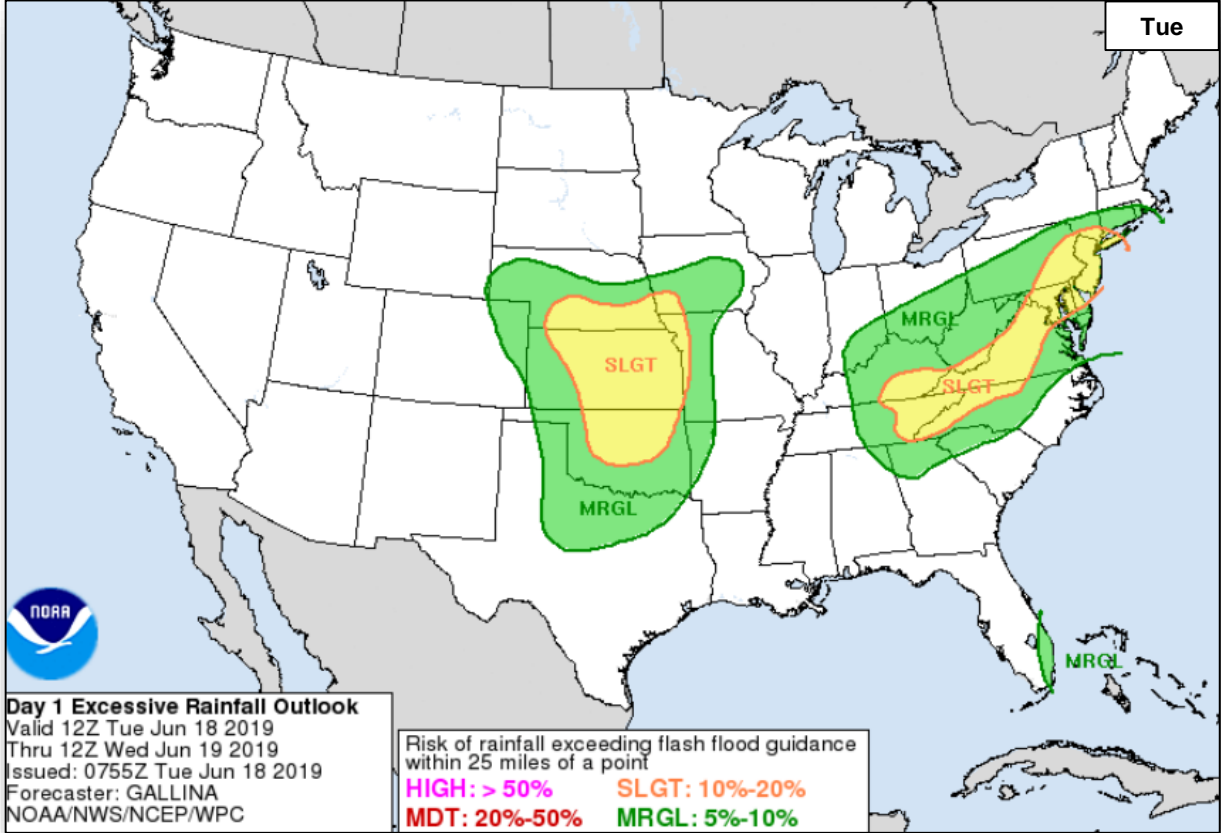

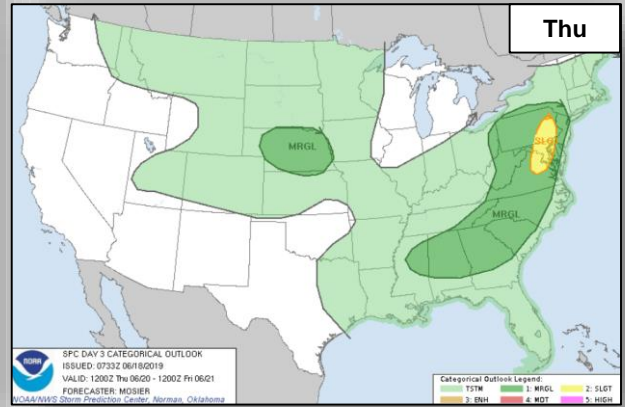
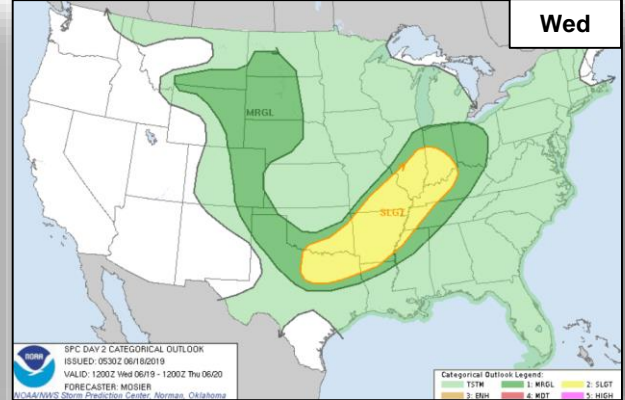
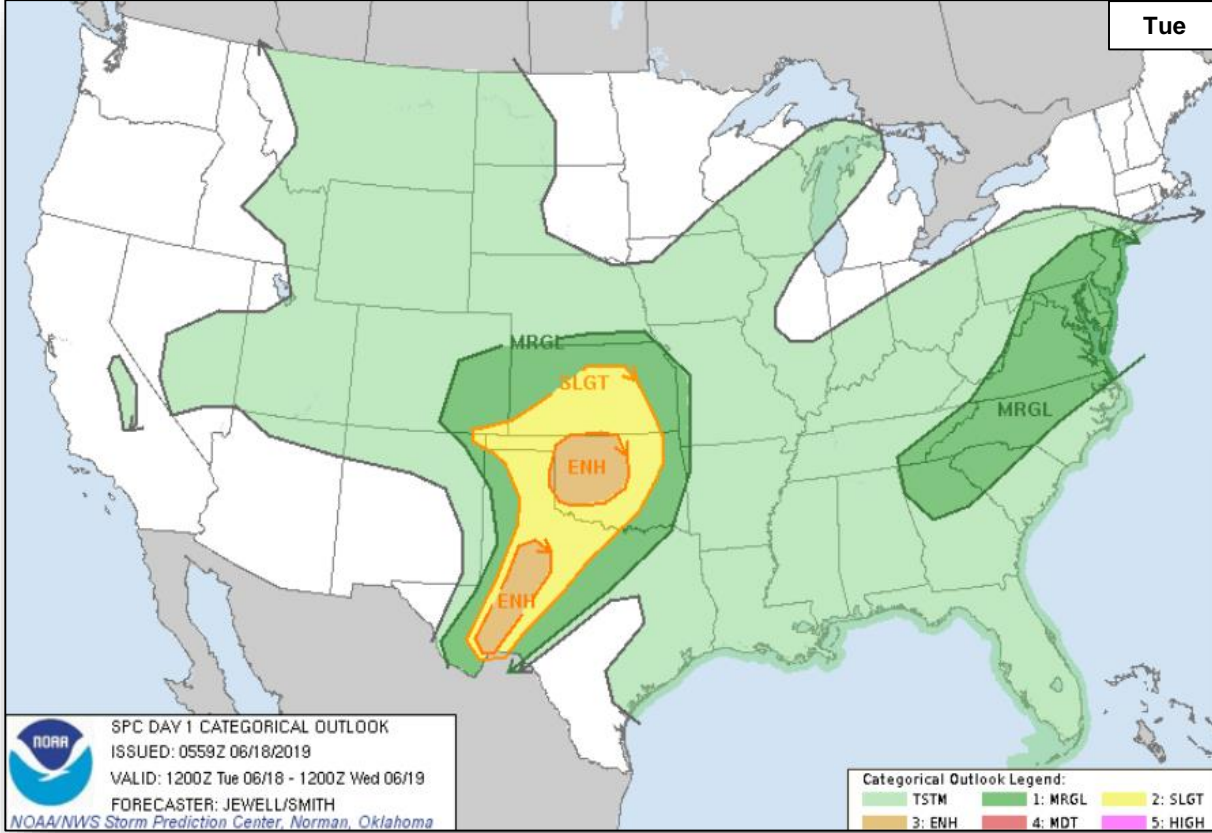
Excessive Rainfall Outlook

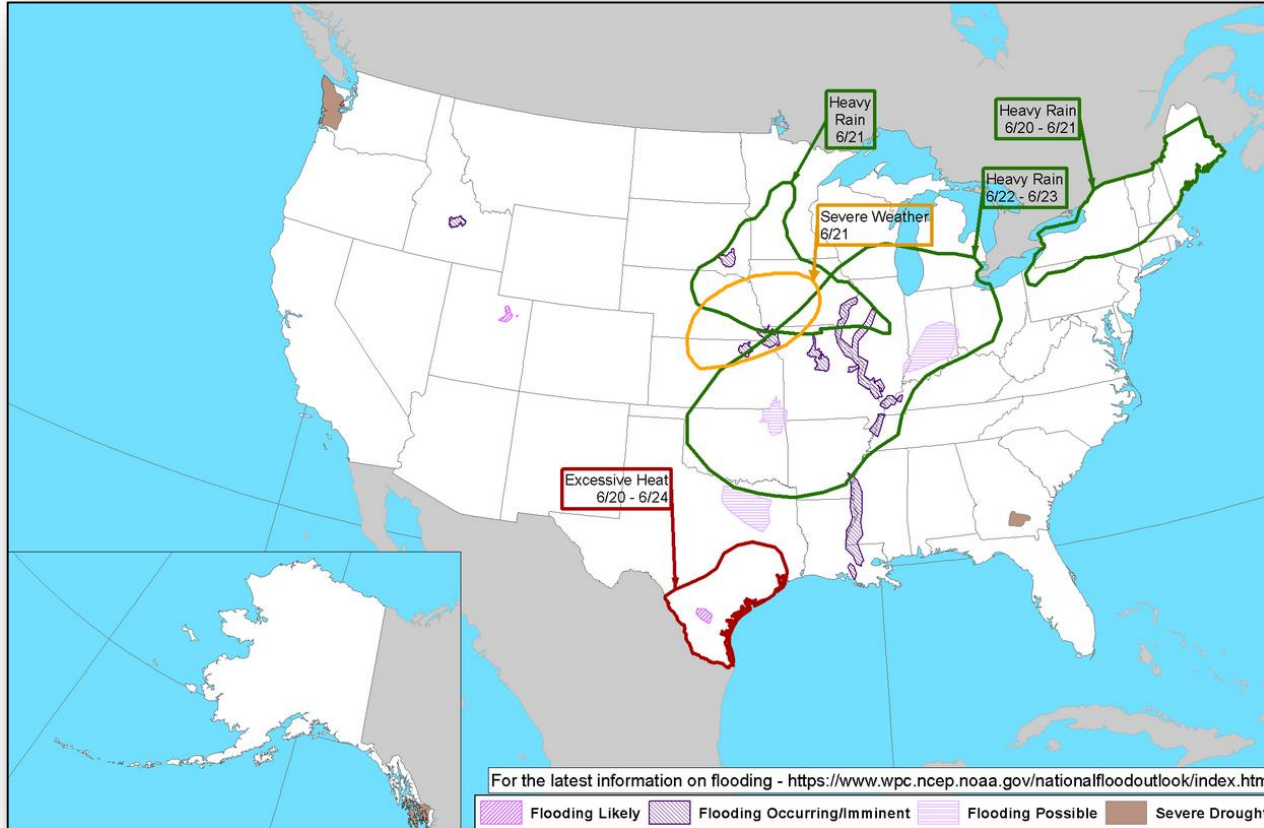
Severe Weather Outlook

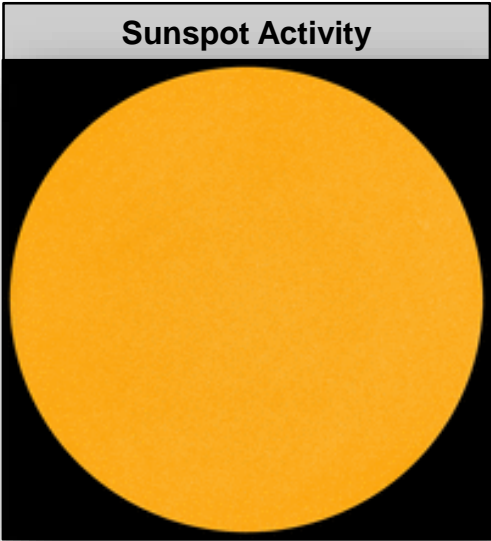
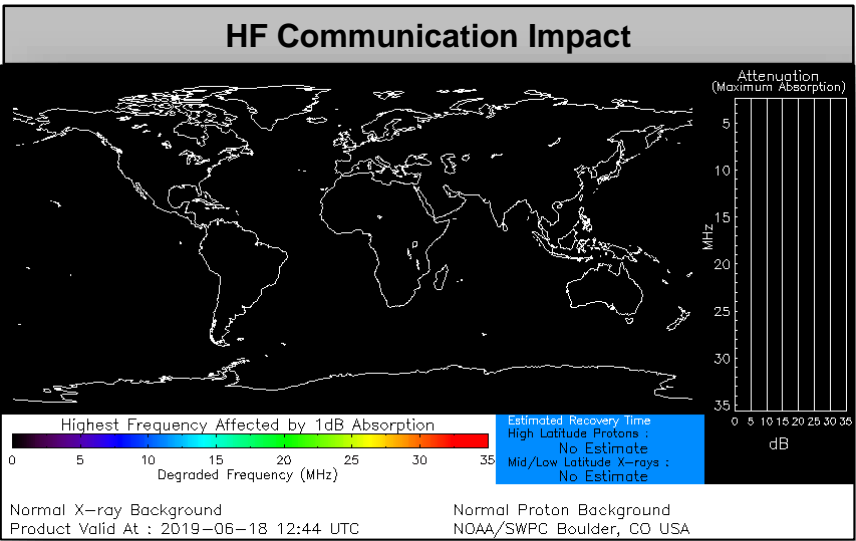

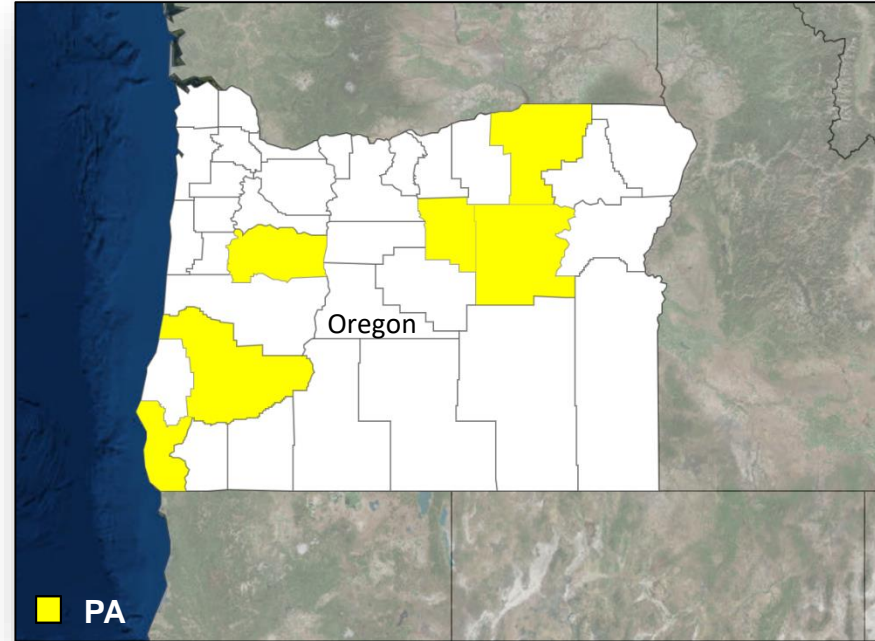

 - Hazard Mitigation statewide



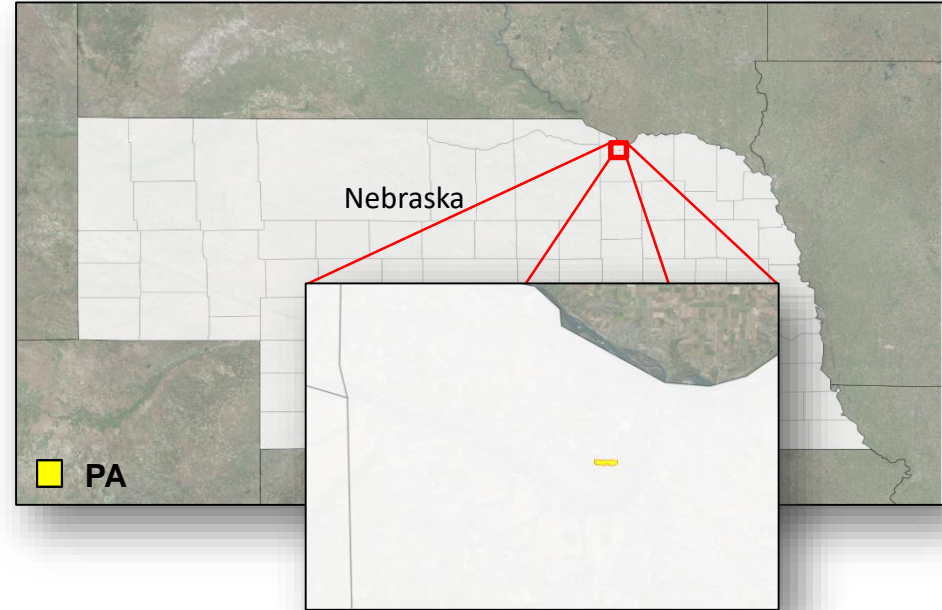
Declaration Approved

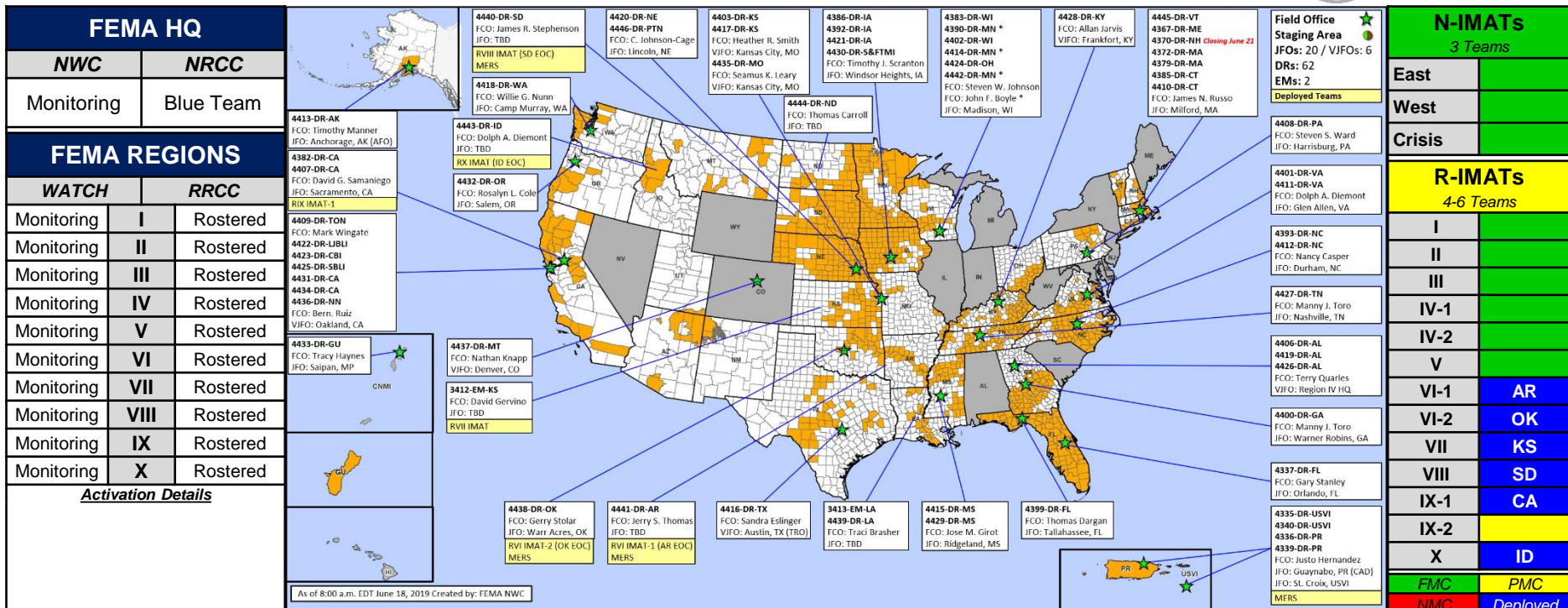
