





National Weather Forecast










Upper & Middle Mississippi River Flooding Updates





- All points in the Upper and Middle Mississippi River should fall below Major by the end of this week.

Lower Mississippi River Flooding Updates




- Major flooding is occurring along the Mississippi River at Cape Girardeau and forecast to fall to Moderate flood early next week.

Hazards Outlook – June 28 – July 2









