Tropical Storm Barry – Gulf Coast



<u>Situation</u>: Life-threatening storm surge inundation continues along the coast of southern and southeastern Louisiana, portions of Lake Pontchartrain and portions of coastal Mississippi where Storm Surge Warnings remain in effect. Life-threatening, significant flash flooding and river flooding will become increasingly likely across portions of south-central and southeast Louisiana into Mississippi today as Barry moves farther inland.

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security:

- LA: Evacuations: Mandatory: 7 (+3) Parishes; Voluntary: 9 (-3) Parishes
- Bus evacuation contracts activated; additional buses pre-staged
- LA: 118 of the 120 pumps in New Orleans are operational
- Levees in lower Plaquemines, Terrebonne, and St. Mary's Parishes experienced minor to major overtopping; structural risks not anticipated; mandatory evacuations in effect for Terrebonne

Food, Water, and Sheltering:

- LA: Shelters: 23 (+8) open / 298 (+257) occupants
- MS: 1 (-2) shelter open with 15 (+7) occupants; 10 shelters on stand-by (ARC Shelter Count as of 6:44 am EDT)
- Staggered delivery of 2.7M liters water and 1.4M meals to ISB Roseland begins today. Schedule: Sunday and Monday 1.2M liters water and 615k meals; Tuesday 375k meals and 600k liters of water; Wednesday 455k meals and 820k liters water
- Grocers and retail Industry partners executing business continuity plans; working to reroute shipments around affected routes and hubs

Health and Medical:

- 262 hospitals fully operational; 22 on generators with no fuel concerns; generators used only as precaution to prevent power surge
- 4 HHS Region 6 Regional Incident Support Teams (RIST) members deployed to FEMA Region VI
- TX: 2 DMATs (CA-9 and PA-1), with 2 DMAT Caches, deployed to Dallas Ft. Worth Staging Area

Energy*:

6-10 Day Temperature Probability


