### Hurricane Dorian

#### **Situation**

The center of Dorian should move near or over the coast of NC in the next several hours and move southeast of extreme southeastern New England tonight and Saturday morning. Tornadoes are possible this morning across eastern NC into southeastern VA. Life-threatening storm surge and dangerous winds are expected for portions of the NC coast, southeast VA, and the southern Chesapeake Bay.
