FEMA

Significant Events:

• Winter Weather – Mid-Atlantic to Northeast

Significant Weather:

- Heavy snow possible Mid-Atlantic to Northeast
- Freezing rain Southern Appalachians and Southern Plains
- Rain and thunderstorms Gulf Coast to Southeast
- Snow Northwest, Rockies, Great Basin and Central Plains
- Red Flag Warnings/Critical Fire Weather Areas: None
- Space Weather: Minor/R1 radio blackouts past 24 hours; Minor/R1 radio blackouts predicted next 24 hours
- Earthquake: None

Winter Storm – Mid-Atlantic to Northeast



Situation (February 2 - 3)

- Fast moving low pressure will bring wintry weather from the Ohio River Valley to Mid-Atlantic and Northeast today
- The storm system is expected to bring an area of moderate to heavy snowfall from eastern Kentucky to Long Island; 4-8 inches of snow possible with locally higher amounts



- No requests for FEMA assistance






Open Field Offices as of February 3, 2014






Winter Precipitation Forecast











High Temperatures – Day 3






Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day






River Forecast – 7 Day






Convective Outlooks Days 1 – 3





Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 – 8







