

FEMA Daily Operations Briefing Sunday, February 16, 2014 8:30 a.m. EST

Significant Activity: February 15 – 16



Significant Events:

• Winter Storm - Southern Plains to Mid-Atlantic / New England

Significant Weather:

- Moderate to heavy rain & mountain snow Pacific Northwest
- Rain and snow Central and Eastern U.S.
- Warming trend for Deep South and Mid-Atlantic
- Red Flag Warnings: TX and NM
- Critical Fire Weather: NM
- Elevated Fire Weather Areas: TX, NM, OK, CO, & AZ
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours Minor, G1 geomagnetic occurred; Next 24 hours Minor, R1 radio blackouts occurred

FEMA Readiness:

- FEMA Region IV deactivated; RWC returned to Watch/Steady State
 - All ESFs released except ESF-3 (On-call through Feb 17)

Winter Storm – Southeast to Mid-Atlantic

FEMA

February 10-14, 2014:

- · A powerful winter storm moved through the Southeast and into the Mid-Atlantic
- ▲ Conditions across the Southeast continue to improve; power outages continue to decrease
- ▲ Warming trend expected over the next week in the south
- ▲ 47k (-112k) customers are without power in Region IV (*DOE EAGLE-I, as of 8:00 a.m. EST, Feb 16)
 - ▲ Most in: SC 33k (-50k); GA 9k (-53k)
 - ▲ Restoration expected for majority of customers expected by Monday, Feb 17 (DOE)

FEMA Region IV:


- ▲ RRCC deactivated on Feb 15; ESF-3 will remain on-call through COB Monday
- RWC returned to Watch/Steady State
- Regional IMATs remain deployed to the EOCs in GA & SC
- · GA EOC remains Fully Activated; EOCs in SC and TN remain Partially Activated
- 13 (-14) shelters open with 224 (-272) occupants; most in SC 8/129; GA-5/95 (NSS; 4:30 a.m. EST, Feb 16)
- ▲ Joint PDAs to begin in SC on Feb 19; Joint PDAs to begin in GA on Feb 17
- ▲ National Guardsmen remain activated in SC (187) and GA (382) (NGB, Feb 16)

FEMA Region I, II and III:

- FEMA Regions I-III remain at Watch/Steady State
- EOCs in VA, PA and WV remain Partially Activated
- · All other State EOCs are either monitoring or remain at Normal Operations
- On February 14, 2014 the Governor of CT requested an emergency Declaration

FEMA Headquarters:

- NRCC is not activated; NWC remains at Watch/Steady State
- · ISB remains operational with commodities on hand at Ft Gordon, GA

Severe Winter Storm – New England (Final) **FEMA**

Situation:


- A fast moving winter storm system moved through the region overnight bringing heavy snow and high winds
- Heaviest snow was over Cape Ann, Cape Cod and southeastern Massachusetts

Impacts:

- No widespread power outages; 12k customers are without power (DOE EAGLE-I as of 8:00 a.m. EST), Feb 16
- No shelters are open
- No fatalities or significant damage identified

Federal, State & Local Response:

- MA State EOC returned to Normal Ops
- FEMA Region I remains at Watch/Steady State
- NRCC is not activated; NWC remains at Watch/Steady State
- No unmet needs or requests for FEMA assistance reported




Open Field Offices as of February 16, 2014






National Weather Forecast






Active Watches/Warnings






Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day






River Forecast – 7 Day






Convective Outlooks Days 1-3






Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8




