Significant Activity: February 26 – 27



Significant Events: None

Significant Weather:

- Showers and thunderstorms – Central Plains
- Below normal temperatures – eastern two-thirds of US
- Heavy Precipitation/snow – California, Rockies, Ohio Valley into the Northeast
- Freezing rain – Pacific Northwest
- Red Flag Warnings: AL
- Critical Fire Weather Areas: None; Elevated Fire Weather Areas: Southwest
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours – Minor S1 solar radiation storms, R1 radio blackout; next 24 hours – minor G1 geomagnetic storms, R1 radio blackouts, S1 solar radiation storms

FEMA Readiness: No significant changes

Severe Weather – California



Situation:

- Strong storms forecast to bring heavy rain to portions of California through Saturday
- Potential for 1 to 3 inches of rainfall in coastal/valley areas; 3 to 6 inches in the foothills/mountains, with locally higher amounts of up to 8 inches possible

Potential Impacts:



- Mudslides and debris flows in several burn scar areas
- Flooding preparations continue in those areas

State/Local Response:

- Evacuations in effect for Colby Fire burn scar area (near Glendora, pop 51k; LA County)
 - Voluntary evacuations currently affect residents from 1,000 homes
 - Mandatory evacuations to be ordered for this area at noon, today
- 1 evacuation center is open with an unknown number of occupants
- LA County EOC will Partially Activate on Feb 28; State LNO will be onsite
- State EOC is Partially Activated (Day shift only for drought conditions)

FEMA Response:

- FEMA Region IX remains at Watch/Steady State
- No requests for FEMA assistance










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Minimum Temperature Forecast





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
Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day








River Forecast – 7 Day




Convective Outlooks Days 1 – 3



Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 – 8




Hazard Outlook: Mar 01 – Mar 5




