## Significant Activity: Mar 3 – Mar 4



**Significant Events:** Winter storm – Central and Northeast U.S. (FINAL)

## **Significant Weather:**

- Severe cold Upper Midwest
- Widespread showers and snow for the Western U.S.
- Red Flag Warnings: None
- Elevated Fire Weather Areas: None
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours minor, R1 radio blackouts occurred; next 24 hours minor, R1 radio blackouts likely

**FEMA Readiness:** NWC and Regions IV & VII returned to Watch/Steady State

# Winter Storm — Central/Northeast U.S. (Final)



#### Feb 28 - continuing

- Over the past several days, a winter storm produced freezing rain and heavy snow across most of the Central Plains and Northeast
- ▲ Cold temperatures will persist across the impact area through Wednesday

#### Impacts:


- ▲ No shortfalls, unmet needs or requests for FEMA assistance
- ▲ No significant/widespread damage has been reported
- ▲ Primary impacts were hazardous travel conditions and isolated power outages
  - ▲ 5 confirmed traffic related fatalities in MO; numerous flight cancelations/delays were reported
  - ▲ 86k customers without power across all affected Regions (peak of 171k)
    - o Region VI: 65k (TX: 56k [+32k] most in Houston metropolitan area)
    - o Region IV: 19k (TN: 14k [-19k]) (\*EAGLE-I: As of 7:30 a.m. EST)
- ▲ Numerous government offices will have delayed reporting today; many schools will remain closed
- ▲ Shelters: 5 open with 5 occupants (TN 3/5; TX 2/0)


#### State/Local Response:

- ▲ State EOCs in LA, VA, TN are MS Partially Activated; all others are at Normal Operations
- Governors in TN, MS, VA, DE and NJ declared a State of Emergency
- Majority of National Guard personnel previously activated have been demobilized

#### **FEMA HQ Response:**

- ▲ All FEMA Regions have returned to Watch/Steady State
- ▲ NRCC is not activated; NWC has returned to Watch/Steady State
- ▲ FSA established at Ft. Campbell, KY with a National ISB team and commodities on-site; however, retrograde is expected to begin today




## Open Field Offices as of March 4, 2014






## National Weather Forecast






# Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day


# River Forecast – 7 Day






# Convective Outlooks Days 1 - 3






# Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8





## Hazard Outlook: March 6 – 10










# Western Pacific – Tropical Storm 03W (Faxai)



## As of 4:00 a.m. EST, Mar 4:

- 437 miles E of Andersen AFB, Guam
- Moving NNE at 17 mph; max sustained winds of 65 mph
- Expected to curve to the NE and accelerate over next couple of days; weakening expected by Wednesday
- Storm will move away from the Mariana Islands
- Elsewhere, no tropical activity affecting the U.S. or its territories




## **PA Highlights**

- On February 28, Recovery issued the Fire Management Assistance Grant Program Guide, which describes the FMAGP declaration process, eligibility, grant management and application procedures, and other related program guidance
- On, February 26, The Federal Register Notice "Amendment to the Public Assistance Program's Simplified Procedures Project Threshold" went into effect, revising the monetary thresholds for processing an application using simplified procedures.
- The PA Division issued "Recovery Policy on Donated Resources".
   The change to the final policy allows the value of mass care and sheltering activities provided by a voluntary agency to be applied to the non-Federal share as a donated resource even when those activities are part of the volunteer agency's mission.




