Significant Activity: Apr 1-2



Significant Events:

- Mudslide Snohomish County, WA
- M 8.2 earthquake offshore, northern Chile

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms (slight risk) Middle/Lower Mississippi Valley and Central/Southern Plains
- Heavy rain (Flash Flooding possible) Middle/Lower Mississippi Valley and Ohio Valley
- Snow Northern/Central Rockies and parts of Pacific Northwest
- Red Flag Warnings: NM, CO, TX, OK & KS
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather Areas: Southern Plains to Southwest
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours: R1 minor; next 24 hours: none

FEMA Readiness:

Type II IMATs from Regions II,V, VII, VIII and IX are NMC due to personnel and/or equipment issues

Significant Earthquake – Chile





M 8.2 - offshore of Chile

- At 7:46 p.m. EDT on April 1, 2014
 - 59 miles NW from Iquique, Chile
 - 282 miles SW of La Paz, Bolivia
 - Depth of 12 miles
- USGS Orange PAGER alert issued:
 - 456K people were exposed to Very Strong to Severe shaking
 - Media reports: 5 fatalities, some injuries and localized damage
- Pacific Tsunami Warning Center issued Regional Tsunami Watches/Warnings
 - Tsunami wave observed in Chile (6.9ft) and Peru (1.9ft)
 - All Watches/Warnings have been cancelled
- Tsunami Advisory remains in effect for Hawaii
 - No major tsunami or impacts are expected
 - Sea level changes/strong currents may be a hazard to swimmers and boaters along the coast
 - First wave expected to arrive at 9:24 a.m. EDT, April 2
- HI EOC is at Normal Operations (Monitoring/answering calls from the public)
- FEMA Region IX remains at Normal Operations
- No requests for FEMA assistance

Mudslide – Washington State

March 22, 2014

- A large mudslide occurred in Snohomish County (pop.745,913) town of Oso (pop. 180)
- Multi-jurisdictional team developing long term debris removal plan; once approved highway clearing will begin

<u>Impacts</u>

- ▲ 28 (+4) confirmed fatalities; 20 (+2) injuries (Snohomish County Media Update, April 2, 2014 at 4:30 p.m.)
- 22 people remain missing and/or unaccounted for (WA SEOC, SitRep No.11)
- 36 homes destroyed; 9 homes damaged (FEMA-3370-EM-WA, IOF SitRep No.6)
- ▲ 1 (-1) ARC shelter open with 1 (-1) occupant (ARC 7:00 a.m. EDT Shelter Report, April 2)

State/Local Response


- Governor declared a State of Emergency
- · WA SEOC fully activated; Snohomish, Arlington and Darrington county EOCs activated
- US&R WA TF-1 deployed as State asset (not participating in Capstone Exercise 2014)
- ▲ WA NG 216 (+29) & CO NG 16 deployed members

Federal Response

- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3370-EM-WA approved March 24
- US Forest Service Type 2 IMAT on scene
- US&R IST White deployed to WA; CA-TF7 on alert
- · Region X IMAT at Incident Command Post; LNO at WA EOC
- N-IMAT West, Bothell MERS personnel and MEOV deployed to WA
- NRCC activated (CAPSTONE); NWC at Enhanced Watch (NUWAIX)










Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day










River Forecast – 7 Day






Convective Outlooks Days 1-3






Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8





Hazard Outlook: April 4 – 8











