Significant Events:

- Severe Weather – Gulf Coast and Southeast (Final)
- Mudslide Recovery – Snohomish County, WA

Significant Weather:

- Rain and thunderstorms – Southeastern U.S
- Red Flag Warnings – TX
- Elevated Fire Weather Areas – TX, OK, & KS
- Critical Fire Weather Areas – None
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours: none; next 24 hours: none

FEMA Readiness: Type II IMATs from Regions V, VII, and IX are NMC due to personnel and/or equipment issues

Disaster Activity: None

Severe Weather – Gulf Coast & Southeast (Final)



Situation - April 6-7, 2014 (Final)

- Severe thunderstorms moved across the central Gulf Coast and Southeast
- Heavy rain, strong winds, large hail and several preliminary tornadoes were reported
- Rainfall totals: MS 2-8"; AL 3-7"; AR 2-4"; GA, LA and TX 2-6"

Impacts:

- No significant/widespread damage reported
- Flooding caused numerous road closures across the region

Mississippi - Covington County

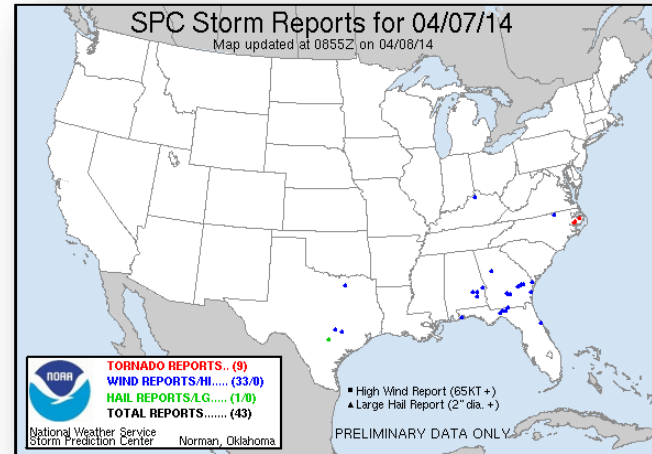
- ▲ NWS surveys indicate that an EF-2 tornado touched down near Hot Coffee, MS (pop. 10k)
- ▲ 61 homes were damaged (28 homes destroyed/major damage; 33 minor/affected)
- ▲ 7 injuries reported; no fatalities
- ▲ Local damage assessments continue
- ▲ One shelter open with zero occupants

North Carolina – Beaufort County

- ▲ Unconfirmed tornadoes were reported in Belhaven, NC (pop. 1,600)
- ▲ No significant damage was officially reported; some downed trees and power lines
- ▲ 2 injuries/no fatalities
- ▲ Local damage assessments continue

Response:

- All State EOCs and FEMA Regions remain at Normal Operations
- No requests for FEMA assistance



Mudslide Recovery – Washington State



March 22, 2014

- A large mudslide occurred in Snohomish County (pop. 745,913) near the town of Oso (pop. 180)

Impacts

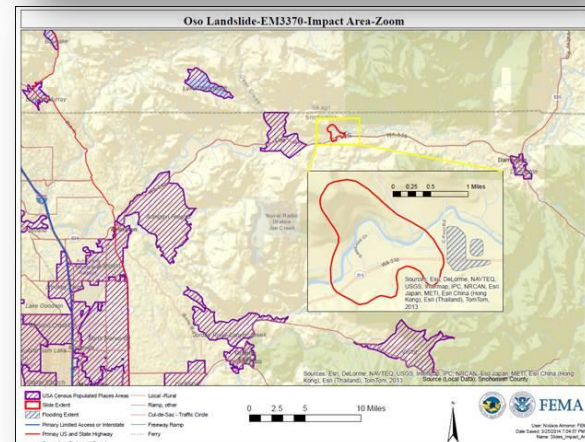
- ▲ 33 (+3) confirmed fatalities; 12 (-1) people remain missing and/or unaccounted for
- 43 homes affected; 36 destroyed & 7 damaged
- 1 ARC shelter open with 0 occupants (*ARC Midnight shelter report, April 8*)

State/Local Response

- WA EOC fully activated; Snohomish county EOC remains activated
- Governor declared a State of Emergency; National Guard remains activated
- ▲ 308 (-51) National Guardsmen are supporting operations (292 WA & 16 NC)
- US&R WA TF-1 deployed as a State Asset

Federal Response

- ▲ 3 Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs) opened on Apr 7; locations are Arlington, Oso and Darrington
- ▲ Joint Field Office (JFO) is scheduled to open today, April 8
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4168-DR was approved April 2, 2014
- US Forest Service Type 2 IMT on scene; US&R IST Blue is deployed to WA
- US&R CA-TF7 and 20 FEMA Canine Search Teams deployed to WA
- Region X RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State; IMAT deployed to ICP; LNO deployed to WA SEOC
- Bothell MOC continues to monitor 24/7; 3 MCOVs deployed to WA
- N-IMAT West remains deployed to WA; NWC at Watch/Steady State

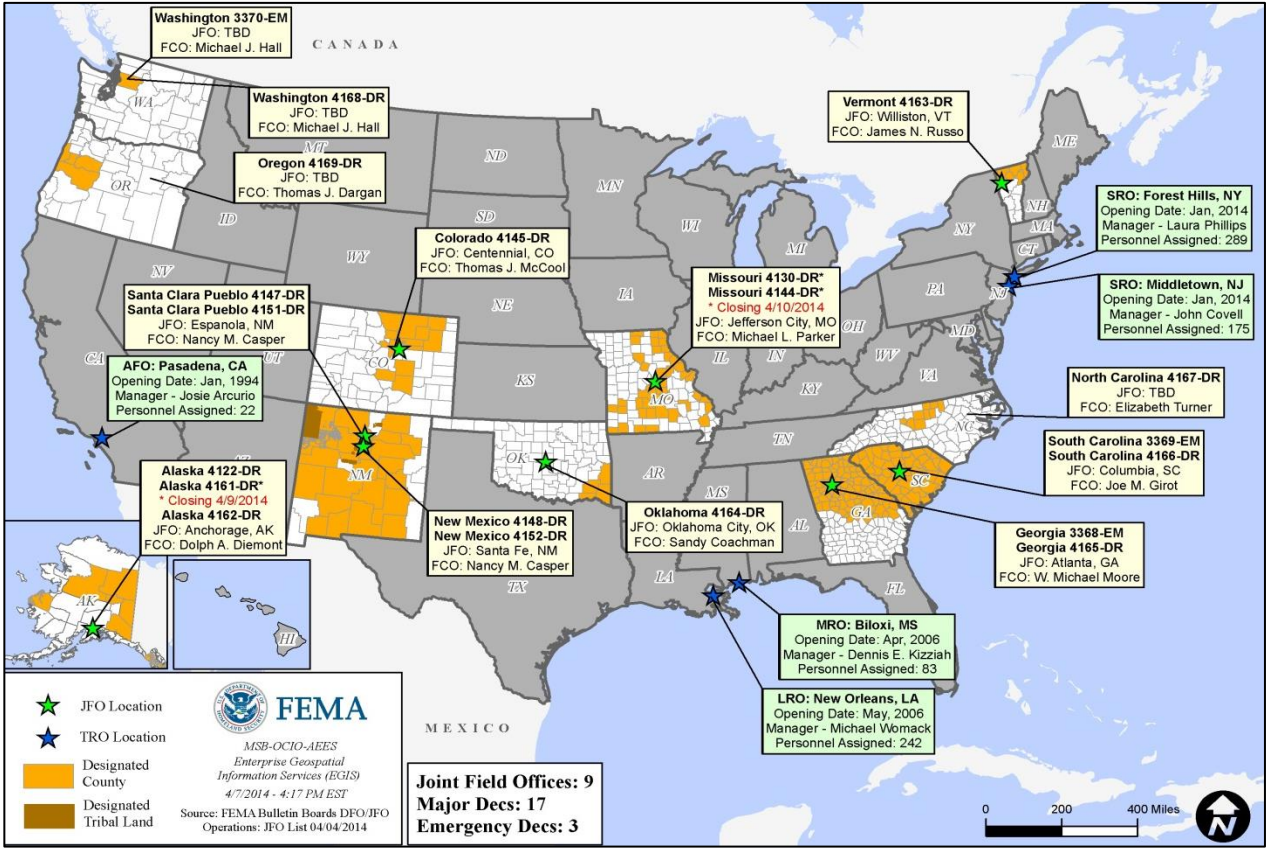

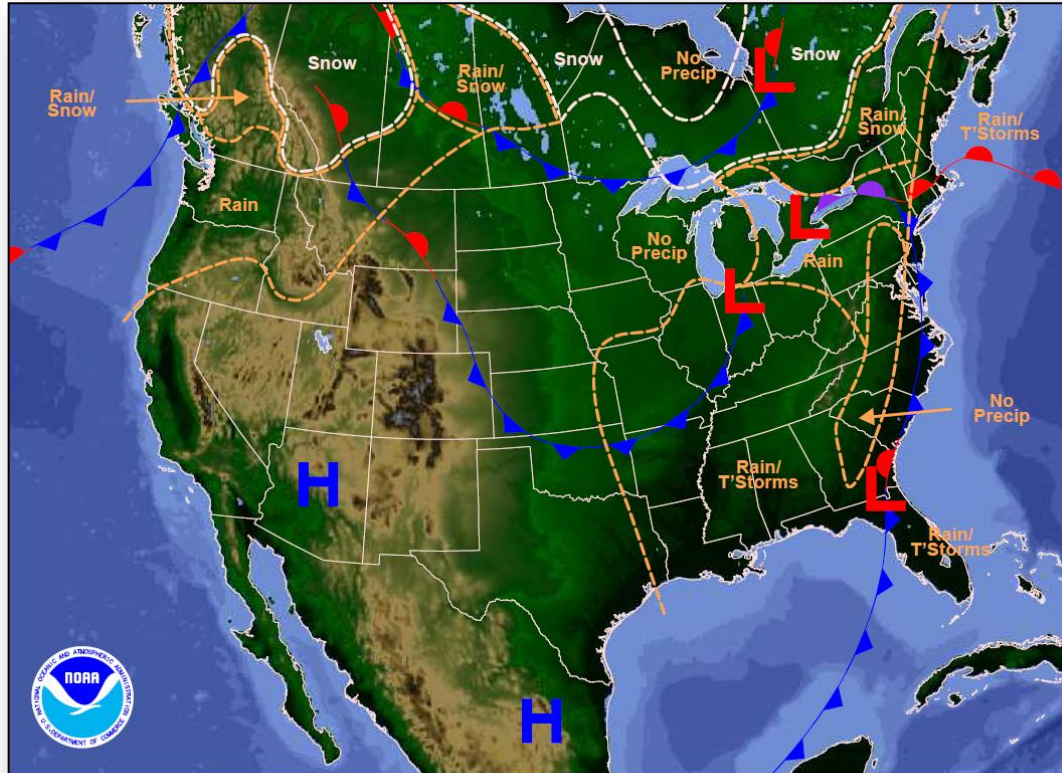
Open Field Offices as of April 8, 2014

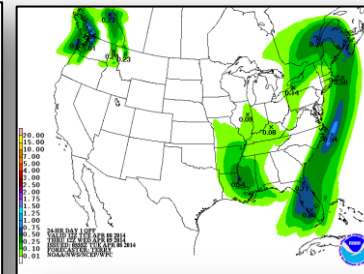
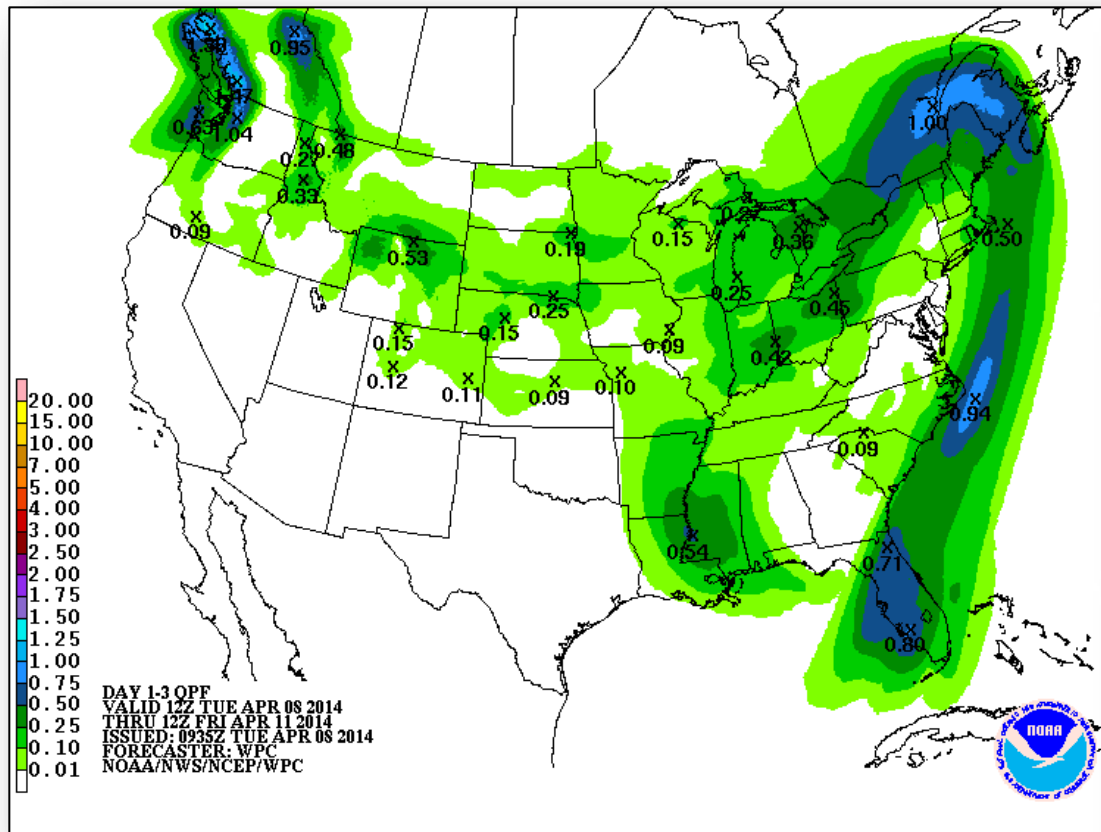
Convective Outlooks Day 1



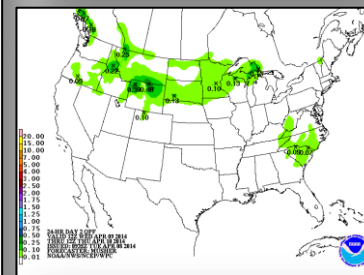
Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day



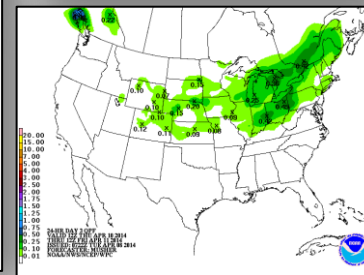

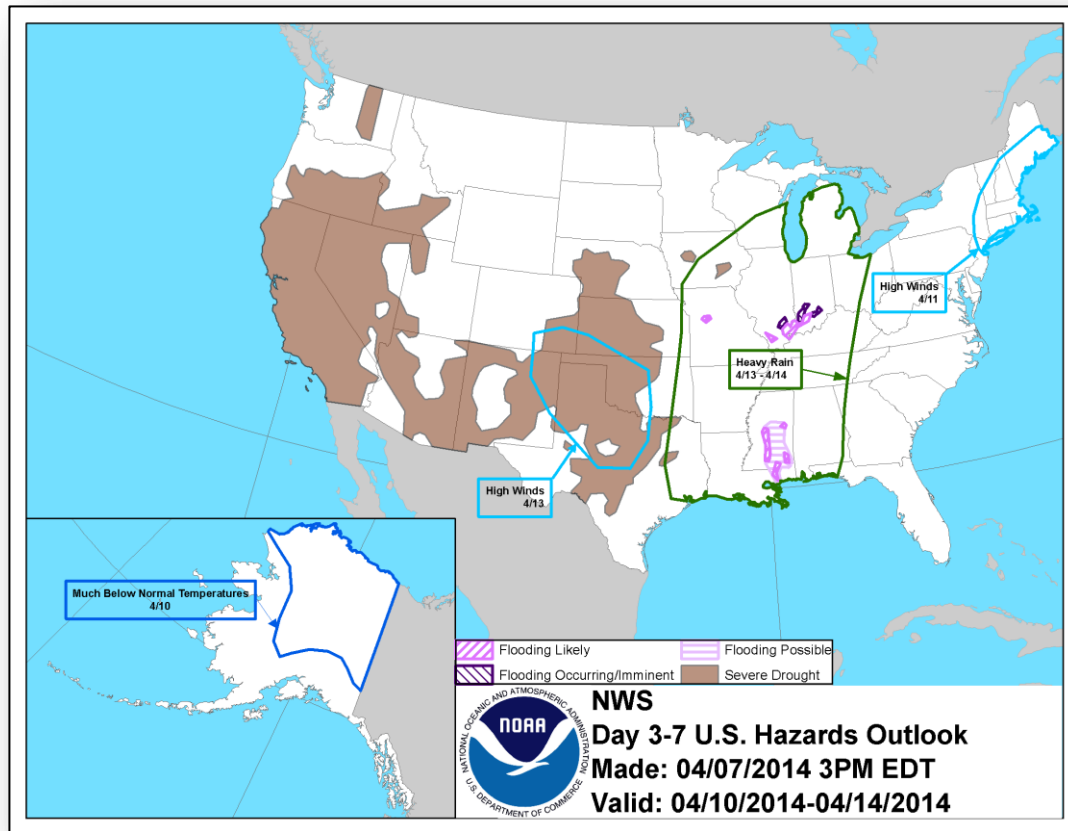
River Forecast – 7 Day



Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 – 8

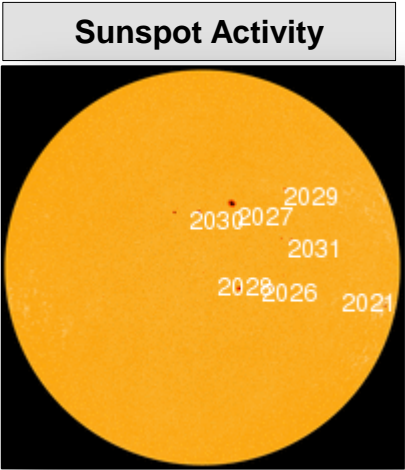
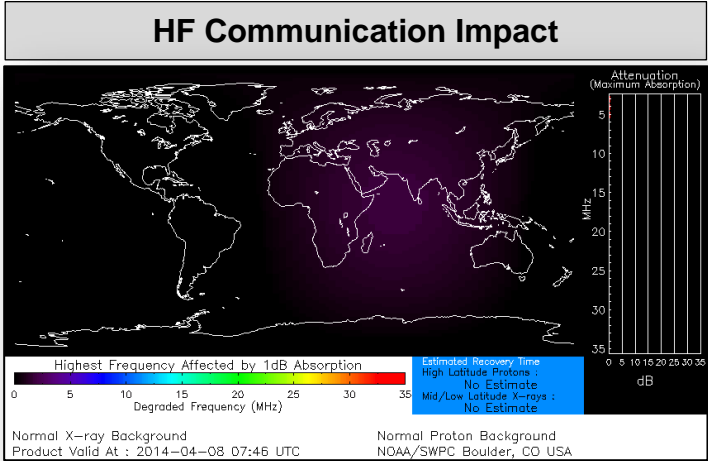

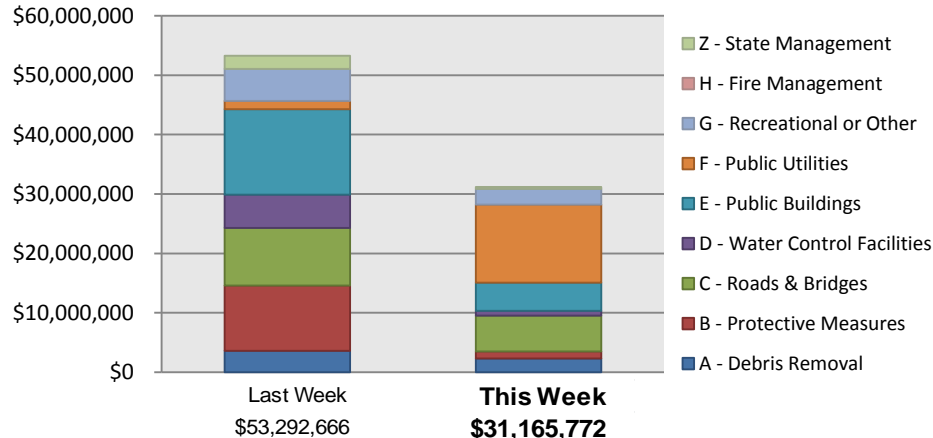

Public Assistance Obligated per Category In the Past 2 Weeks - 3/25/2014 through 4/7/2014



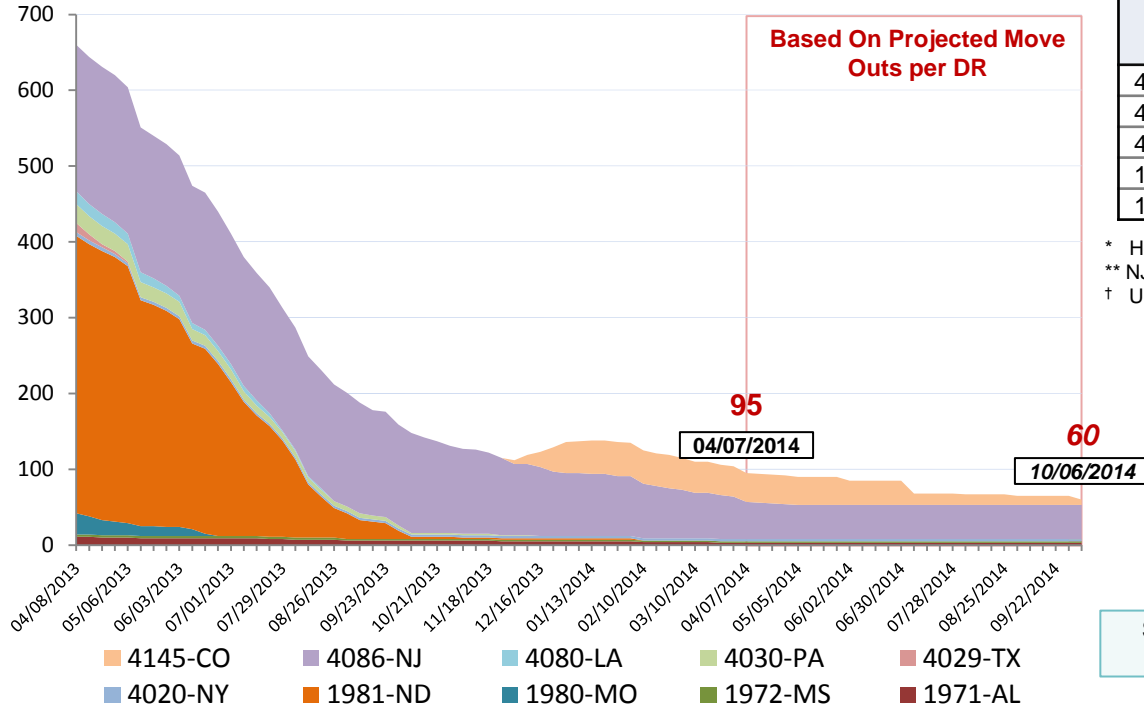
PA Highlights

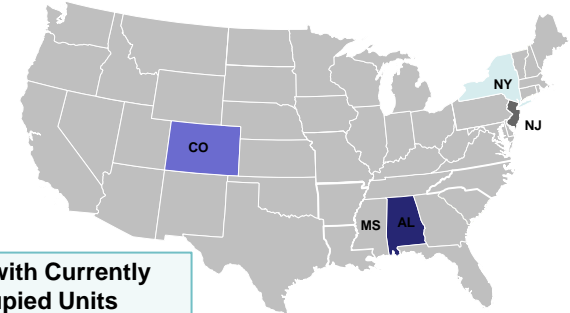

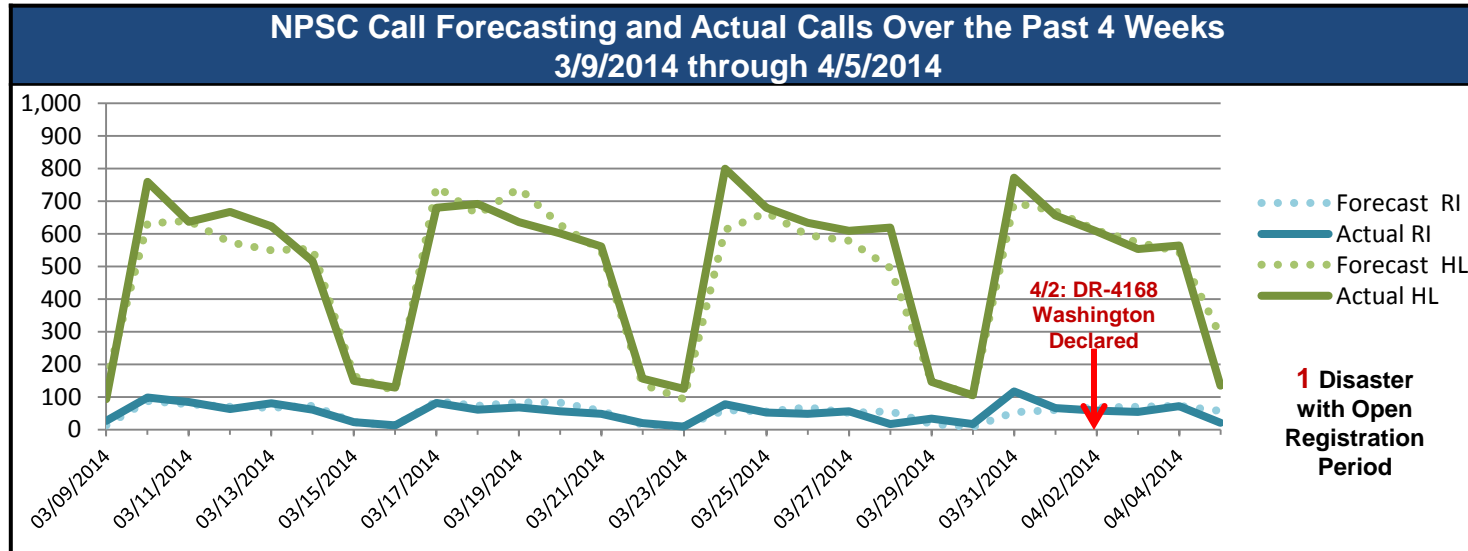


States with Currently Occupied Units

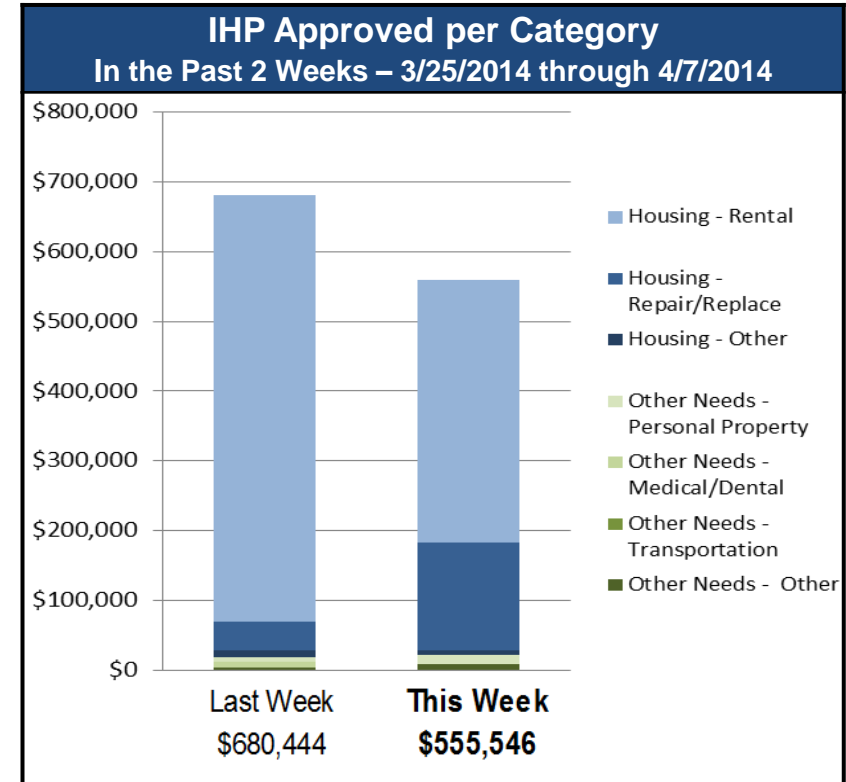
