Significant Activity: Apr 19 - 20



Significant Events:

- M 7.5 Earthquake offshore Papua New Guinea
- Mudslide Recovery Snohomish County, WA (mudslide occurred 4 weeks ago)


Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible west-central Texas (primary risks: hail, gusty winds)
- Rain / snow mix Pacific Northwest into Northern Rockies
- Heavy rainfall coastal Carolinas, Southern Plains
- Showers and thunderstorms Central Rockies to Central/Southern Plains & Great Lakes
- Red Flag Warnings: None
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather Areas: None
- Space Weather: Minor (S1) space weather past 24 hours; Moderate space weather predicted next 24 hours with geomagnetic storms reaching G2 & radio blackouts reaching R1 likely

FEMA Readiness: No significant changes

Significant Earthquake – Papua New Guinea





M 7.5 - Panguna, Papua New Guinea

- Occurred 9:28 a.m. EDT, April 19, 2014
 - 47 miles SW of Panguna, Papua New Guinea
 - Approx. 1,560 miles from Guam
 - Depth of 19 miles
- No reports of damage/injuries
- Pacific Wide Tsunami not generated:
 - Very small local tsunami observed Solomon Islands
 - No adverse impacts reported
- USGS issued a Green PAGER alert, indicating:
 - 17k residents exposed to Very Strong shaking (MMI: VII)
 - Low likelihood of shaking-related fatalities or injuries
- 4 significant earthquakes (M6.5 M7.5) past week

Mudslide Recovery - Washington

FEMA

March 22, 2014

Large mudslide occurred in Snohomish County (pop.746k) near town of Oso (pop. 180)

Impacts

- 39 confirmed fatalities; 4 people remain missing
- 43 structures affected (37 destroyed and 6 damaged)

State/Local

- WA State & Snohomish County EOCs remain activated
- 189 National Guard supporting operations
- Red Cross Family Care Centers are open to support response teams

Federal

- USFS IMT and FEMA IST are working with the County on a transition plan
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4168-DR approved April 2, 2014
- Three DRCs open; JFO remains operational in Everett, WA
- US&R Status
 - ▲ WA TF-1 demobilized Apr 19 and returned to home station
 - IST Blue -10 members will remain onsite through April 23, 2014
 - 2 Canine Search Teams will remain deployed until 4/23
- Region X RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State; IMAT deployed; LNO deployed to WA SEOC




Open Field Offices as of April 20, 2014






National Weather Forecast






Active Watches/Warnings






Convective Outlook – 3 Day






Critical Fire Weather Areas, Days 1 - 8






Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day





River Forecast






