Mudslide Recovery - Washington



March 22, 2014

• Large mudslide occurred in Snohomish County (pop.746k) near town of Oso (pop. 180)

Impacts

- ▲ 41 (+2) confirmed fatalities; 39 positively identified; 2 (-2) people remain missing
- 43 structures affected (37 destroyed and 6 damaged)

State/Local

- WA State & Snohomish County EOCs remain activated
- ▲ Type III IMT arrived April 21 and the Type II IMT demobilizing April 24
- ▲ 134 (-55) National Guard supporting operations
- Red Cross Family Care Centers open to support response teams

<u>Federal</u>

- USFS IMT and FEMA IST working with the county on a transition plan
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4168-DR approved April 2, 2014
- Three DRCs open; JFO remains operational in Everett, WA
- US&R Status
 - WA TF-1 demobilized Apr 19 and returned to home station
 - IST Blue 10 members will remain onsite through April 23, 2014
 - ▲ 4 (+2) Canine Search Teams will remain deployed until 4/23
- Region X RRCC remains at Watch/Steady State; IMAT deployed; LNO deployed to WA SEOC






National Weather Forecast






Active Watches/Warnings






Convective Outlook – 3 Day






Severe Weather Outlook – Days 4 - 8






Critical Fire Weather Areas, Days 1 - 8






Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day






River Forecast




