Significant Activity: Apr 28 – 29



Significant Events: Severe Weather Outbreak – Central U.S. thru MS Valley

Significant Weather:

- Moderate risk of severe thunderstorms portions of MS and AL
- Slight risk of severe thunderstorms Gulf Coast into the Great Lakes & Mid-Atlantic
- Flash Flooding possible Gulf Coast through TN Valley into Northern Mid-Atlantic
- Red Flag Warnings/Elevated/Critical Fire Weather Areas: TX, NM, CA, AZ & NV
- Space Weather: No significant activity occurred or predicted

Tropical Activity: Western Pacific – Typhoon 06W (TAPAH) *FINAL*

FEMA Readiness: RRCCs at FEMA Region IV, VI and VII are activated to Level III

Severe Weather – Plains to MS Valley



April 27, 2014 and continuing


- Severe thunderstorms moving across the Central US and MS Valley
- Strong winds, large hail and numerous tornadoes reported

Impact Summary

- ▲ 91 (+61) tornadoes reported across FEMA Region IV, VI, and VII)
- ▲ 81k (+28k) customers without power across all affected Regions (EAGLE I, 7:15 am)
 - ▲ Majority in Region IV: 74k customers most in GA(46K) and MS(12k)
- ▲ Fatalities: 30 (+11) reported; approximately 200 injuries (FEMA Regions, AR DEM, Media)
- ▲ 11 (+3) ARCs shelters are open with 107 (-95) occupants (ARC midnight shelter report)

FEMA HQ Response

- ▲ NRCC remains activated to Level III, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. EDT
- ▲ NWC activated to Enhanced Watch from 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. EDT
- US&R: IST White and TX-TF1 deployed to Little Rock AFB, AR; NE-TF1on Alert
- ▲ FEMA Log prepared Delta Initial Response Resource (IRR) Package to be ready to be deployed from the Fort Worth Distribution Center upon request
- Delta Package has sufficient meals, water, and other supplies for 15k people for 1 day

Severe Weather – FEMA Region IV



<u>Mississippi</u>

- State EOC is Fully Activated; Governor declared a State of Emergency on April 28
- 43 tornadoes reported across the state
- Numerous reports of damage to homes, business and large trees near Tupelo, MS (pop. 35k)
- Nine fatalities; 80 injuries
- 50 National Guard members are deployed to Tupelo
- One shelter open with 71 occupants (ARC midnight shelter report)

Alabama

- State EOC is Partially Activated; Governor declared a State of Emergency on April 28
- Two fatalities in Limestone County
- 100 Alabama National Guard members are on stand-by

Tennessee


- State EOC is Partially Activated; Governor declared a State of Emergency on April 28
- Two fatalities in Lincoln County
- 20 National Guard members deploying to a location near Fayetteville, TN

<u>Georgia</u>

- State EOC remains at Normal Operations
- Tornado reported across Troup County (pop. 67k)
- 46k customers without power through out the state
- No fatalities or injuries reported

FEMA Region IV Response

- FEMA Region IV RRCC activated to Level III
- FEMA LNOs deployed to TN, AL, and MS (one each)
- IMAT (Team I) Deployed to NC for FEMA-4167-DR-NC; supporting Joint PDAs
- IMAT (Team II) Will deploy to MS today, April 29

Arkansas


- State EOC is Fully Activated
- Governor declared a State of Emergency for 7 counties
- ▲ 14 (-2) fatalities; 130 injuries (AR DEM)
- Heaviest damage appears to be in Faulkner County
 - Towns of Mayflower (pop: 2,298) and Vilonia (pop: 3,924) hardest hit
 - Media reports Approx.100 homes damaged/destroyed
- △ 2 (-5) shelters open with 10 (-191) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Report)
- ▲ 5k(-10k) customers without power (EAGLE-I as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

Oklahoma

- State EOC remains at Normal Operations
- One tornado reported in Quapaw, Oklahoma (pop. 906)
- Governor declared a State of Emergency for Ottawa County
- Two fatalities reported; 5 injuries
- ▲ 52 homes affected; 17 (+5) destroyed; 6 with major damage (FEMA Region VI)
- ▲ 6 Quapaw Tribal properties were affected
- ▲ 1 shelter open with 3 occupants (ARC midnight shelter report)

FEMA Region VI Response

- RRCC is activated to Level III; IMATs are deployed to AR & OK
- 2 IA and 2 PA PDA Teams deployed to AR; PDAs expected to on April 30, 2014



Impacted Counties

Severe Weather – FEMA Region VII



Kansas

- State EOC is Partially Activated
- Governor declared State of Emergency on 27 April 2014
- Most impacted area was Baxter Springs (Cherokee County)
- ▲ No fatalities; 34 (+9) injuries (FEMA Region VII sit-rep, 2:30 a.m.)
- ▲ Approximately 40 home destroyed, with 47 sustaining major damage (ARC)
- ▲ Two shelters open with 18 occupants (FEMA Region VII)

Missouri


- State EOC remains at Normal Operations
- One reported tornado along Kansas/Missouri boarder in Bates County (pop 16k)
- Numerous reports of wind damage to homes and large trees
- No fatalities or injuries reported
- ▲ One shelter open with 7 occupants (ARC midnight shelter report)

lowa

- State EOC remains at Normal Operations
- 1 confirmed fatality
- Numerous reports of wind damage

FEMA Region VII Response

- RRCC is activated to Level III; RWC is at Watch/Steady State
- LNO deployed to Kansas State EOC
- No unmet needs; no requests for FEMA assistance




National Weather Forecast






Convective Outlook – Day 3








Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day






River Forecast






Critical Fire Weather Areas, Days 1 - 8









Western Pacific – Typhoon 06W (FINAL)




As of 3:00 a.m. EDT (Warning #7)

- Located 150 miles SE of Alamagan; moving N at 8 mph
- Expected to turn NW during the next 12 to 24hrs
- Maximum sustained winds 75 mph
- Tropical storm-force winds extend outward up to 100 mph
- CNMI and Guam are monitoring but remain at Normal Operations



Open Field Offices as of April 29, 2014




PA Highlights




