Significant Activity: May 26 – 27



Significant Events:

- Hurricane Amanda Eastern Pacific
- Mudslide Colorado
- Wildfires Arizona, California & Alaska

Significant Weather:

- Slight risk of severe thunderstorms Western Gulf Coast
- Heavy rain and Flood Flash Flooding Lower Mississippi Valley and Gulf Coast
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather areas CA & NV
- Red Flag Warnings AK & UT
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours: none observed; next 24 hours: none predicted

FEMA Readiness: No significant changes



Eastern Pacific – Tropical Outlook






Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Amanda (Cat 3)



As of 5:00 a.m. EDT, May 27

- Located 620 miles SSW of the south of Baja California, MX Peninsula
- Maximum sustained winds of 125 mph
- Moving NNW at 5 mph
- Amanda is a Category 3 Hurricane
- Steady or rapid weakening is forecast for the next 48 hours
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward 25 miles
- Tropical Storm Force Winds extend outward 90 miles
- No threat to the U.S. or its territories; No coastal watches or warnings in effect



Mudslide – Mesa County, CO



May 25, 2014 (Final)


- Mudslide along Salt Creek Rd, east of the town of Collbran (pop. 708)
- Unofficial size estimate: 2 miles wide x 4 miles long x 250 ft deep

Impacts

- No structures were damaged; area is very remote
- No major roads were impacted (I-70 is approximately 26 miles N of slide)
- No injuries or fatalities were reported, but 3 individuals are missing
- Several gas wells in area have been shut down as a precaution

Response

- 50 local responders are on scene conducting searches
- A local Unified Command was established (Local FD & Mesa Co. Sheriff's Office)
- CO State EOC is at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region VIII remains at Watch/Steady State
- No requests for FEMA assistance






National Weather Forecast








Convective Outlook, Day 1-3






Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day


River Forecast





Critical Fire Weather Areas – Days 1 - 8







PA Highlights
