Significant Activity: May 6 – 7



Significant Events:

Guthrie Fire - Oklahoma (Final)

Significant Weather:

- Rain and thunderstorms possible Central Rockies, Central/Northern/Southern Plains Mid-Atlantic
- Red Flag Warnings: Central/Southern Plains and Southwest
- Extremely Critical Fire Weather: Eastern OK/TX Panhandles, Northwest OK and South Central KS
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather Areas: Southwest, Central Great Basin and Southern Plains
- Space Weather: No significant activity occurred or predicted

FEMA Readiness: N-IMAT West returned from WA – Fully mission capable/available

Disaster Activity:

- Amendment #1 to FEMA-4174-DR-AR

Situation

• On May 4, the Logan County Wildfire began in Guthrie OK (pop. 10k) as a controlled burn

Impacts

- 1 unconfirmed fatality
- ▲ 30 structures damaged; 6 homes destroyed
- ▲ Evacuations lifted
- ▲ 1 shelter open with 15 occupants

Response

- ▲ State EOC Partially Activated (extended hours) through Friday, May 9
- ▲ Governor declared burn ban for 36 counties; State of Emergency for all 77 counties
- ▲ 15 National Guard personnel supporting wildfire suppression operations
- Region VI remains at Watch/Steady state

 - Hazard Mitigation statewide






Open Field Offices as of May 6, 2014






National Weather Forecast






Precipitation Forecast










Critical Fire Weather Areas - Days 1-8






Convective Outlook – Days 1 - 3





Hazard Outlook: May 8 - 12










