Significant Activity: June 5 - 6



Significant Events:

- Severe Weather Central Plains to Mid-Atlantic (FINAL)
- Atlantic Invest 90L

Significant Weather:

- Slight risk of severe thunderstorms Central Plains to Southeast
- Heat wave for the Desert Southwest
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather Areas: CA, AZ & NM
- Red Flag Warnings: AK, OR & CA
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours None observed; next 24 hours none predicted

National IMAT East deployed to Florida will demobilize today

Severe Weather – Plains to Mid-Atlantic



Situation – June 5 & 6 (FINAL)


- Heavy rain, strong winds & large hail impacted Regions III, IV, VI & VII
- NWS Reports 2 preliminary tornadoes, over 200 wind & 100 hail events

Impacts:

- No significant/widespread damage reported
 - Minor damage to structures in northern AR & central TN
 - Localized flooding in WV; several homes and bridges damaged
- 3 fatalities: 2 in AR (storms) & 1 in TN (flooding)
- 43k (peak 140k) customers remain without power across affected regions
 - Most in AR (12k) and TN (10k)
- No shelters are open
- Local damage assessments continue in the affected areas


Response:

- All State EOCs remain at Normal Ops except TN (Partial Activation); no unmet needs
- All FEMA regions remain at Normal Ops
- No requests for FEMA assistance



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic






Atlantic – Invest 90L


As of 8:00 a.m. EDT

- Increased thunderstorm activity over the southern Bay of Campeche
- Unfavorable for significant development
- Air Force reconnaissance aircraft scheduled to investigate this afternoon
- Extremely heavy rainfall & life-threatening flash floods/mud slides over southeastern Mexico
- Chance of development into a tropical cyclone:
 - Next 48 hours: Medium (50%)
 - Next 5 days: Medium (50%)




Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






National Weather Forecast





Active Watches/Warnings






Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day




River Forecast






Convective Outlook, Day 1-3






Critical Fire Weather Areas – Days 1-8






Hazard Outlook: June 8 - 12





U.S. Drought Monitor – as of June 3





