# Significant Activity: June 13 – 14



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**Significant Events:** None

**Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic – No tropical cyclones expected during next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Cristina (Cat 1)
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected through Sunday night

**Significant Weather:**

- Moderate risk of severe thunderstorms – Central Plains
- Flash flooding – Central Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Severe thunderstorms – Northern/Southern Plains into the Upper Mississippi Valley
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours – None; Next 24 hours – Minor (R1) Radio Blackouts
- Red Flag Warnings: CO, UT, AZ & NM
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather & Dry Thunderstorms: TX, AZ, NM, CO, & WY

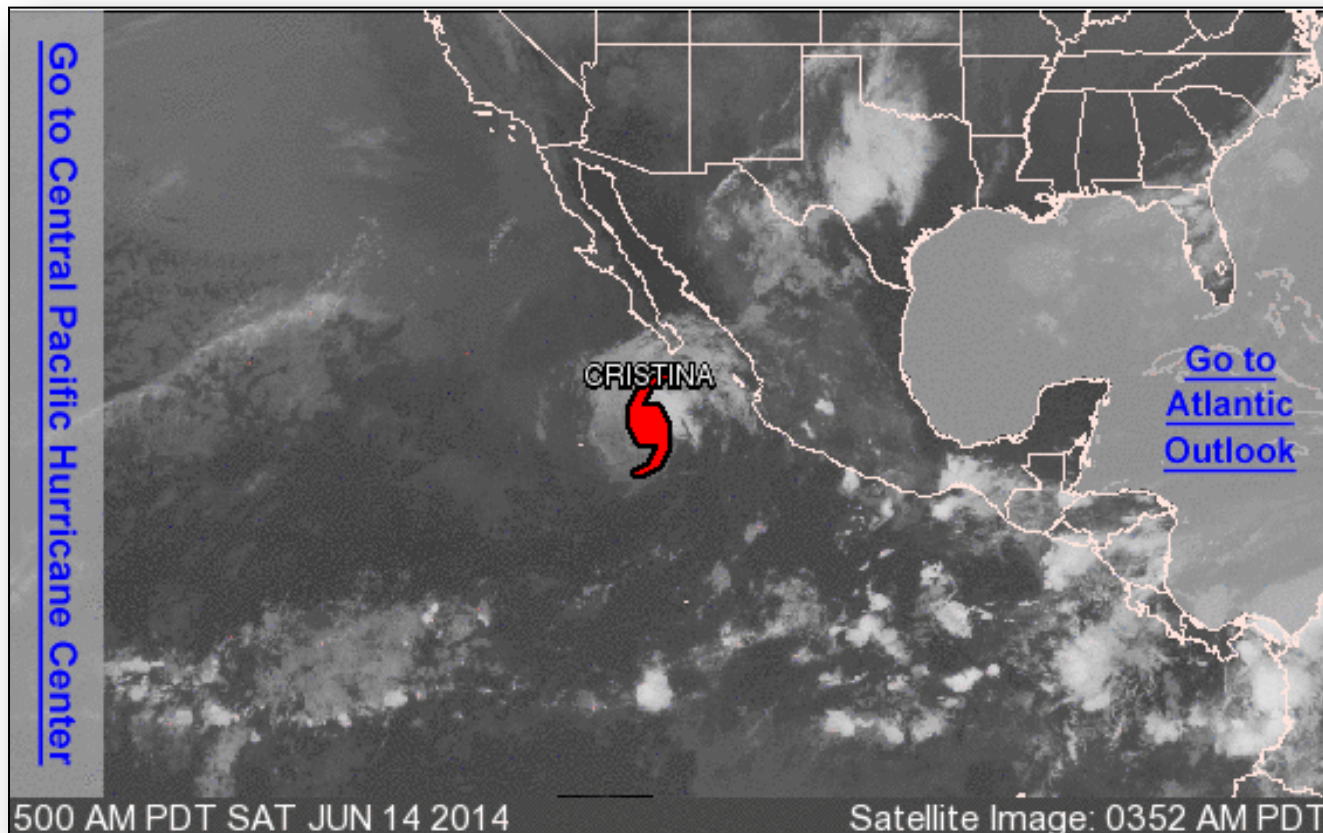

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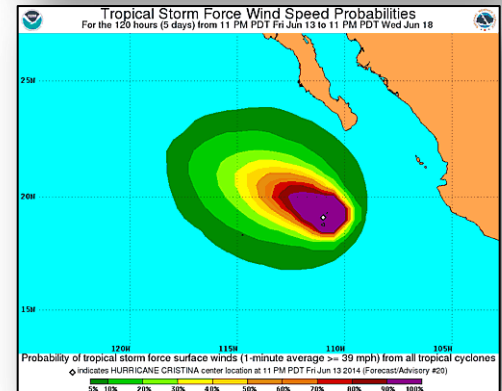
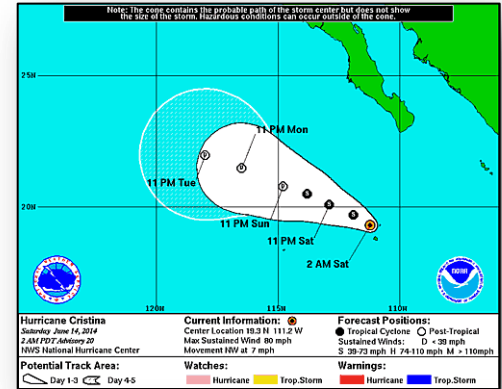


# Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Cristina (Cat 1)



## As of 5:00 a.m. EDT

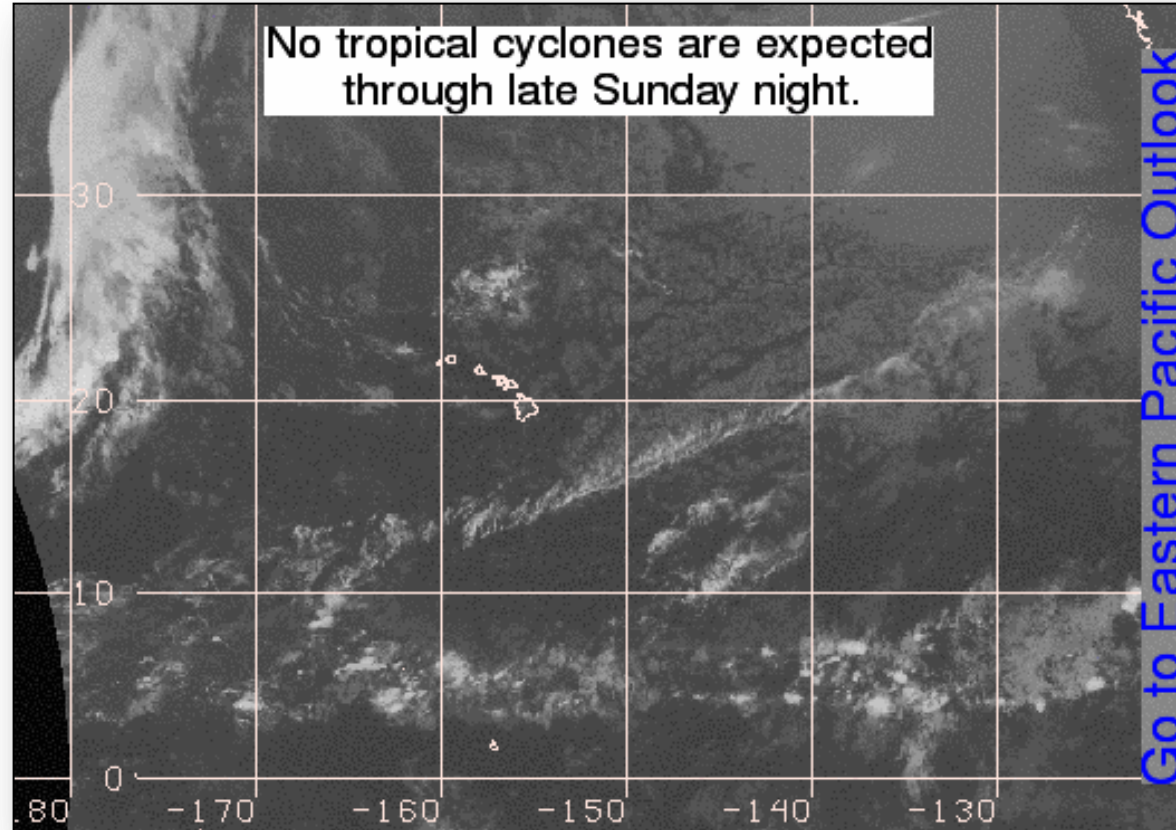
- Located 260 miles SWW of the southern tip of Baja California, MX
- Maximum sustained winds are 80 mph (Cat 1)
- Moving NW at 7 mph; expected to continue WNW movement
- Weakening to a tropical storm later today
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 15 miles
- Tropical storm-force winds extend outward 90 miles
- No threat to the U.S.; no coastal watches/warning in effect

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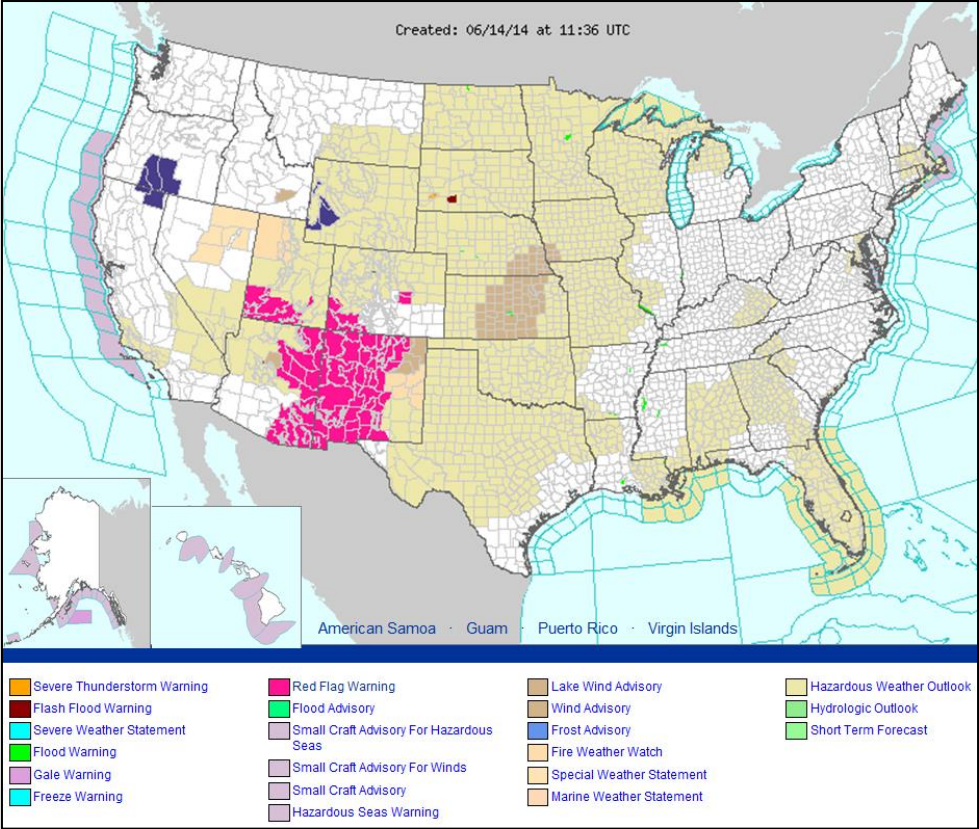

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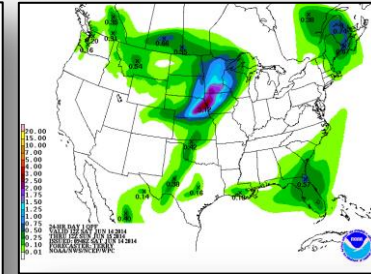
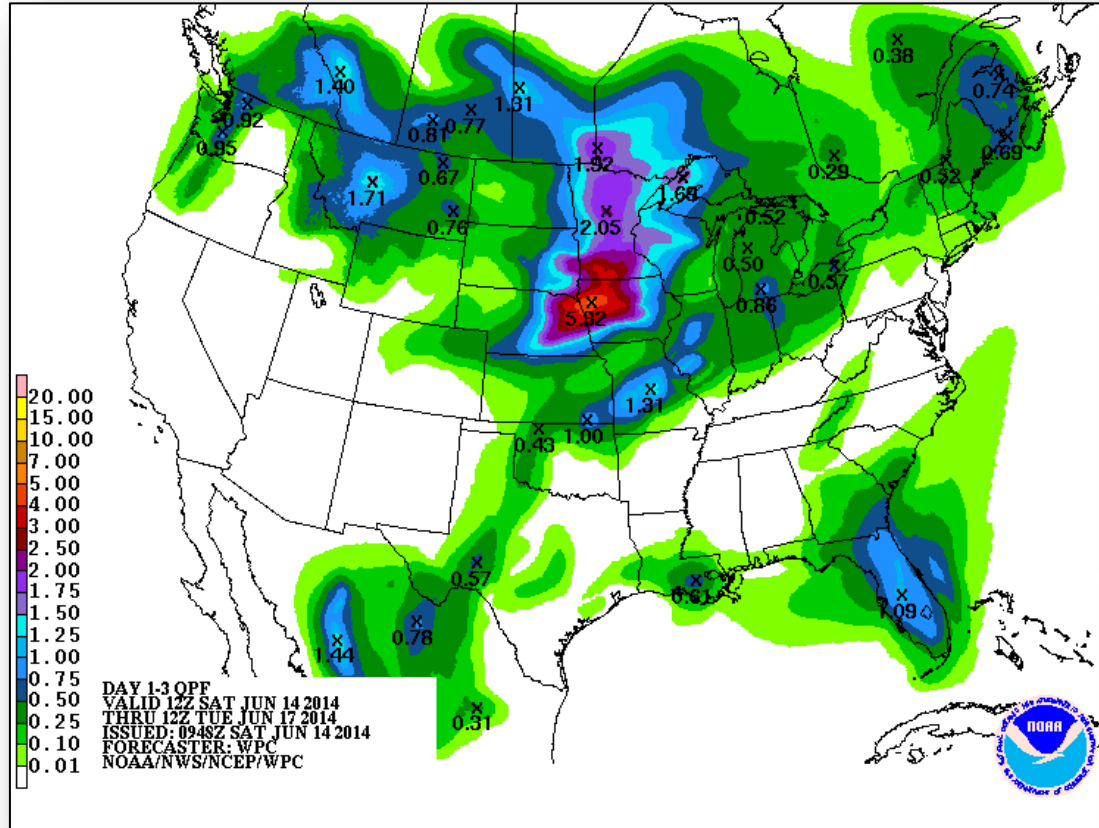




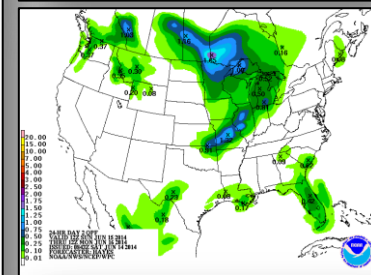
# Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day



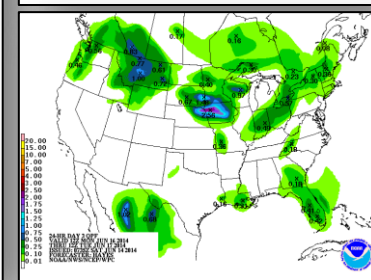

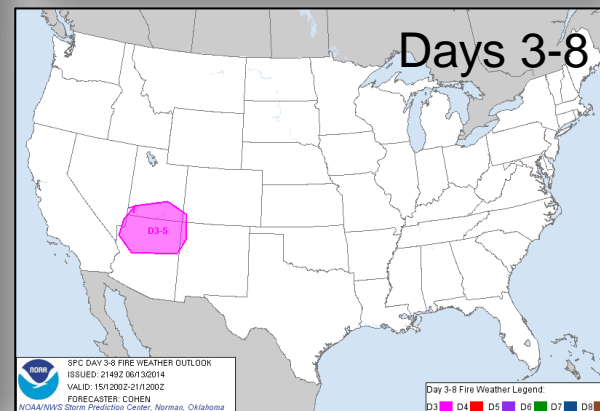
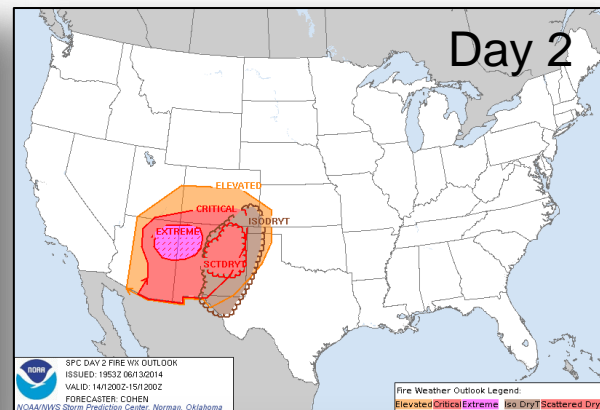
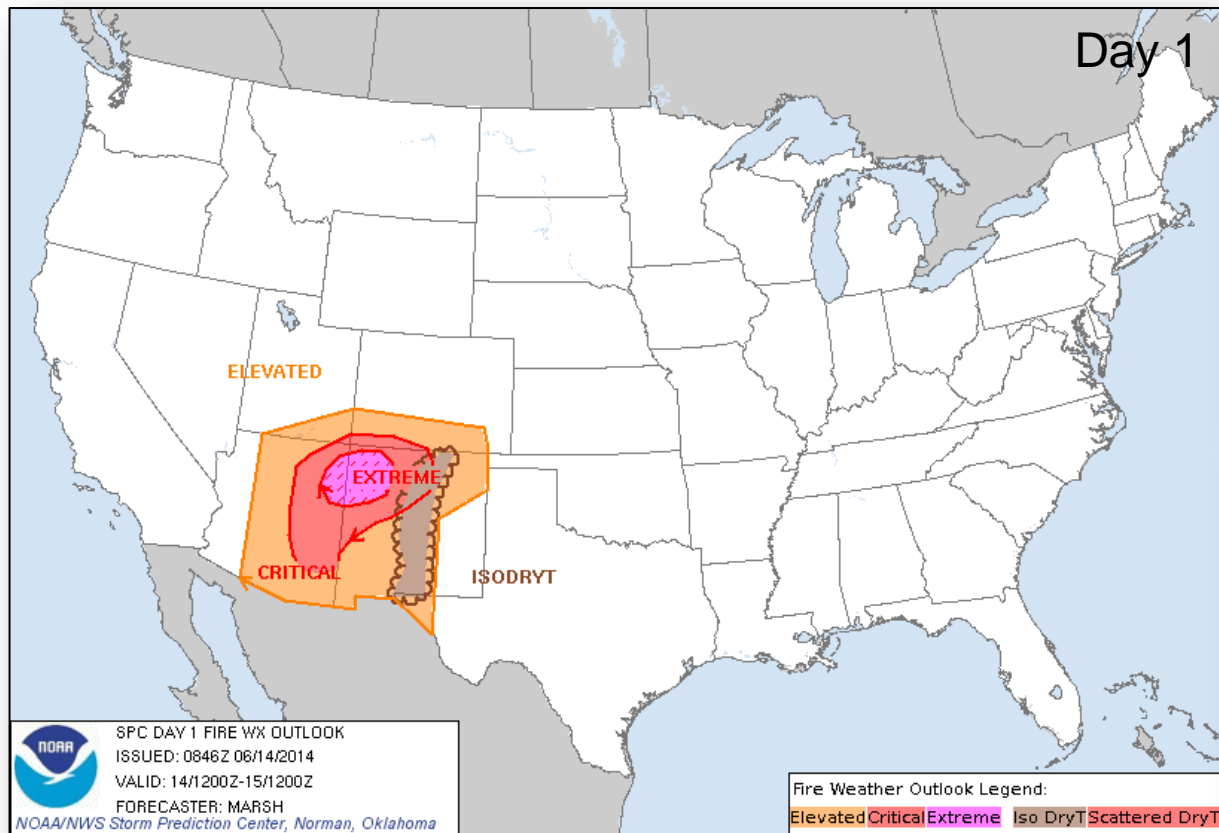




# Critical Fire Weather Areas – Days 1-8



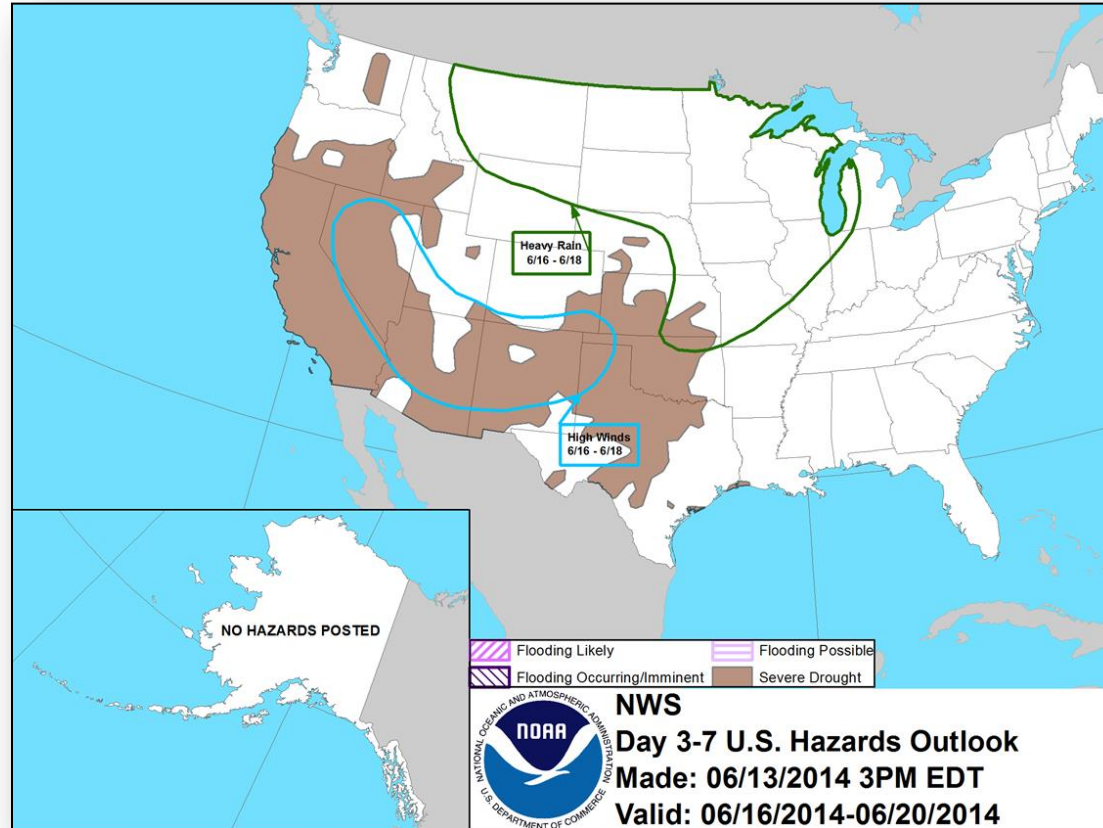

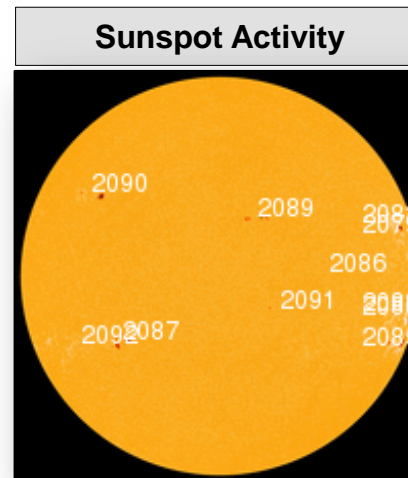
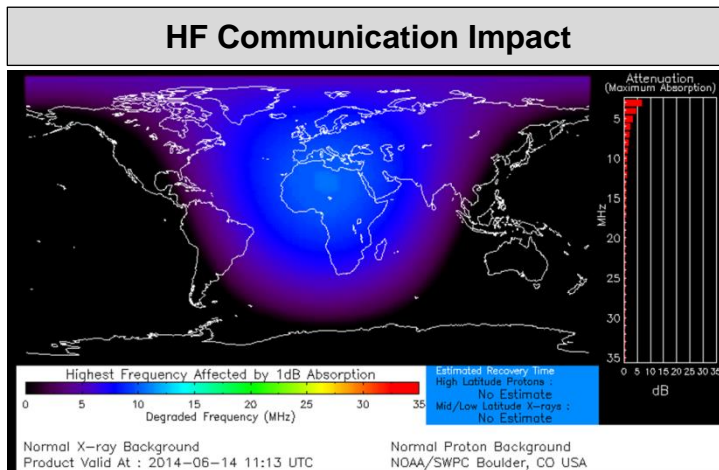
