# Significant Activity: June 14 – 15



## **Significant Events:**

- Shirley Fire – Kern County, CA

## **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic – No tropical cyclones expected during next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Tropical Storm Cristina
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected through Monday evening

## **Significant Weather:**

- Slight risk for severe thunderstorms – WI & Midwest to Missouri Valley & South-Central Plains
- Scattered rain & thunderstorms – Upper MS Valley/Great Lakes to Central/Southern High Plains
- Isolated rain & thunderstorms – Northern Intermountain/Northern Rockies
- Flash Flooding – Middle Mississippi Valley
- Space Weather: Past 24 hours –Minor (R1) Radio Blackouts; Next 24 hours – Minor (R1) Radio Blackouts
- Red Flag Warnings: UT CO, AZ & NM
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather: CA, NV, UT, CO, AZ & NM

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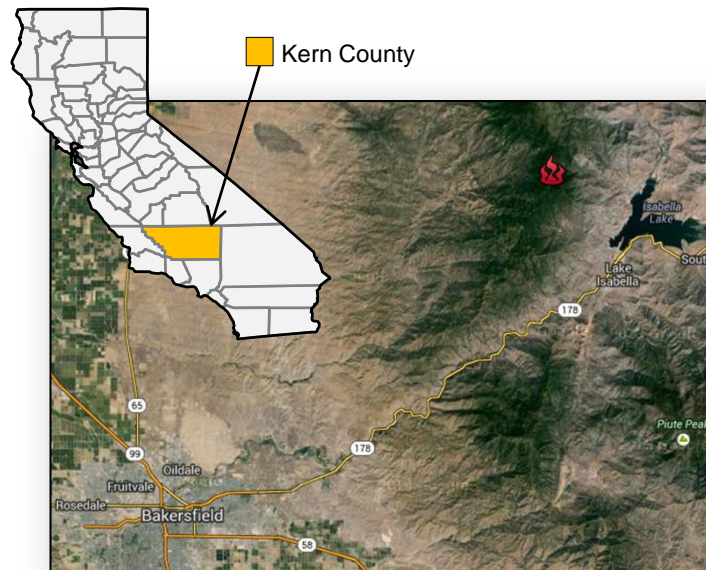

## Situation

- Began June 14, in the Sequoia National Forest, 1 mile from the Wofford Heights (pop. 2,200)
- 500 homes evacuated; no homes destroyed or damaged
- No injuries or fatalities
- One evacuation center opened with 11 occupants

## Response

- Unified Command with the USFS, Kern County FD & BLM on scene
- State EOC remains at Normal Operations; no shortfalls identified
- FEMA Region IX remains at Watch/Steady State
- No FMAG request

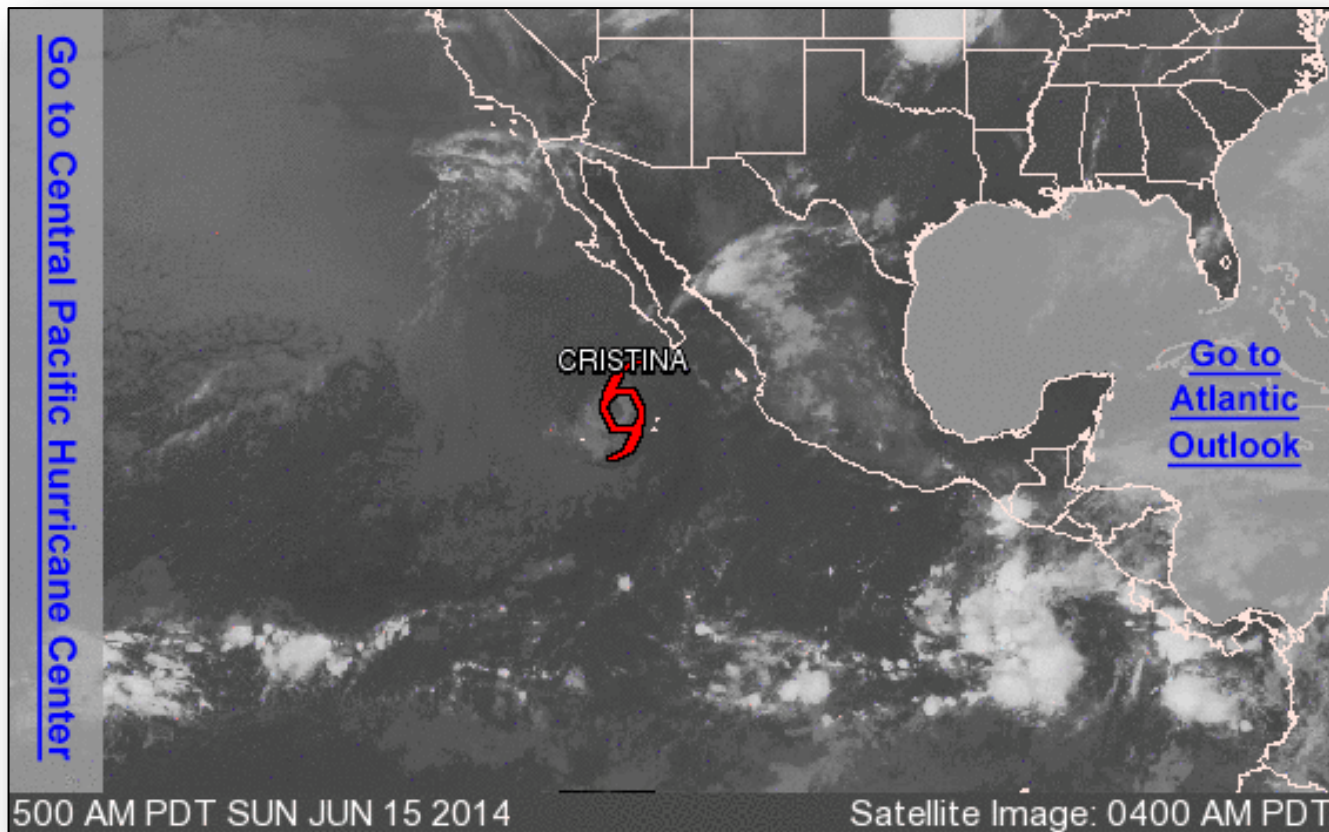

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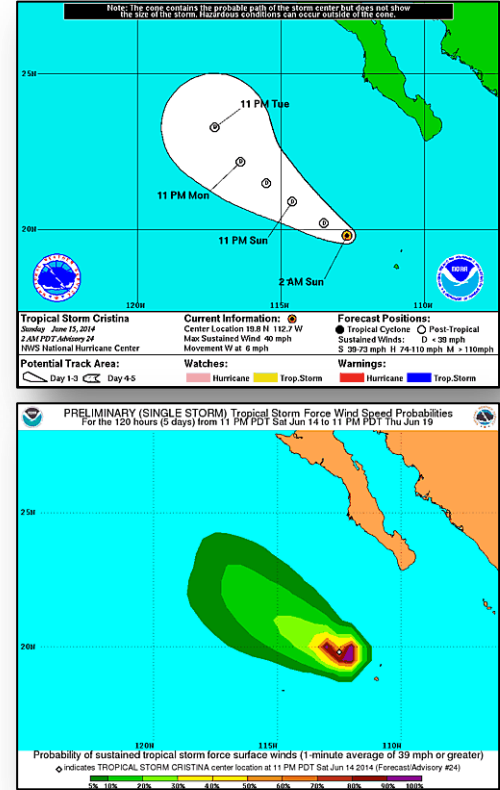


# Eastern Pacific – Tropical Storm Cristina



## As of 5:00 a.m. EDT

- Located 280 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California MX
- Moving W at 6 mph, motion expected to continue this morning
- Turn toward the WNW this afternoon or tonight
- Maximum sustained winds are 40 mph
- Additional weakening forecast in next 48 hours
- Expected to become a remnant low later today
- Tropical storm-force winds extend outward 45 miles
- No coastal watches/warning in effect
- No threat to the U.S.

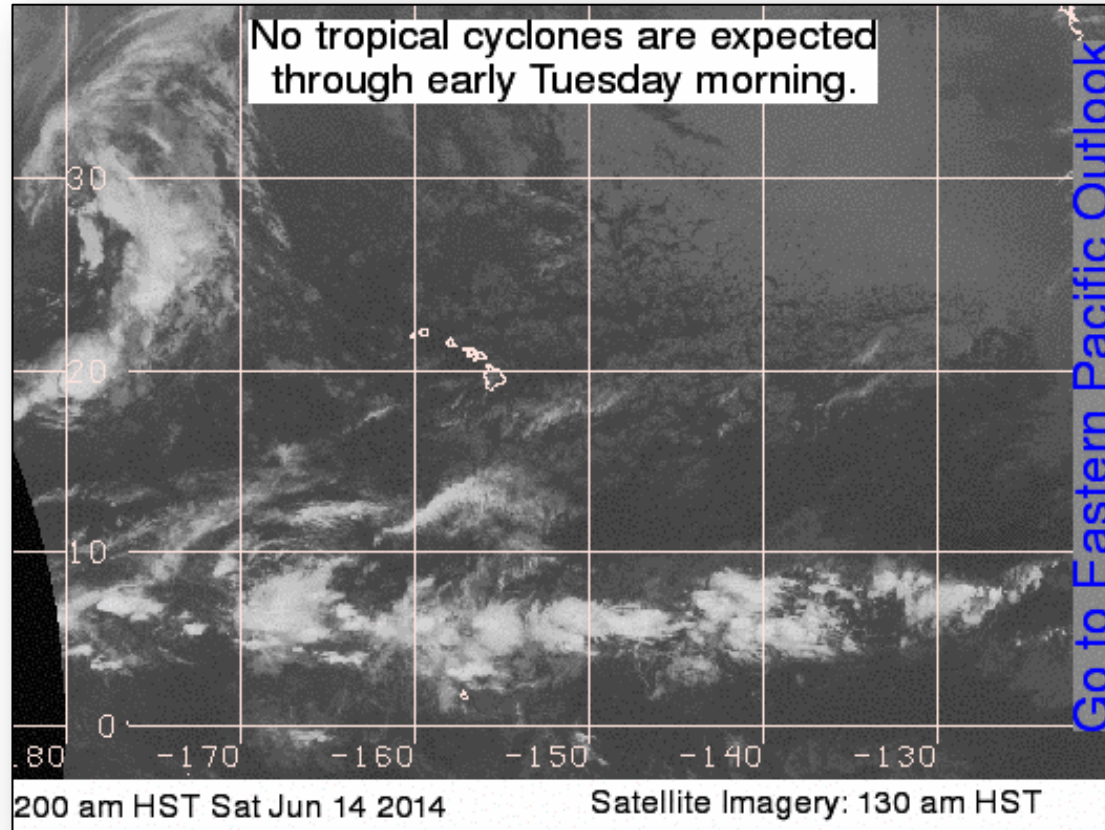

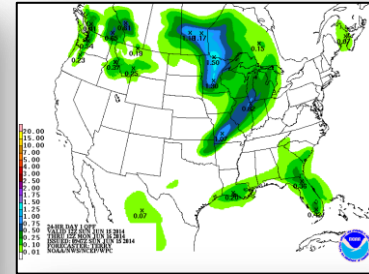
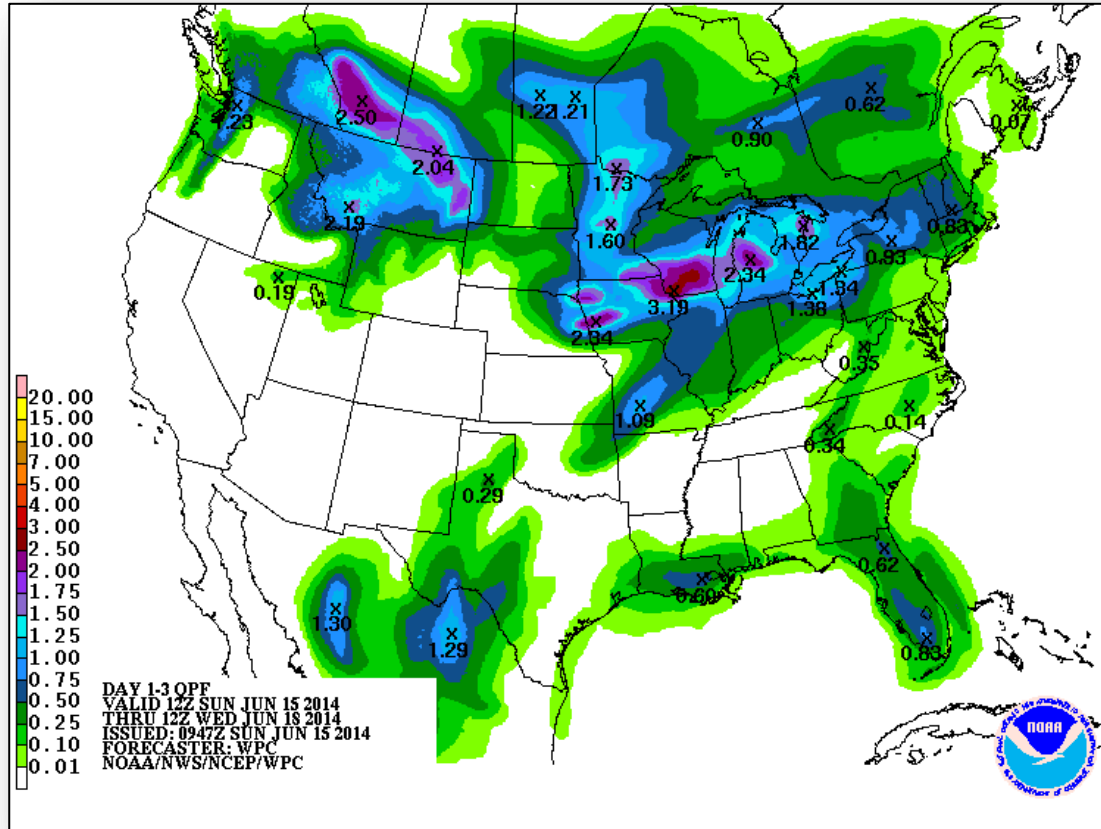
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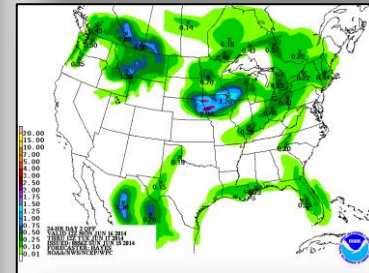
# Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day



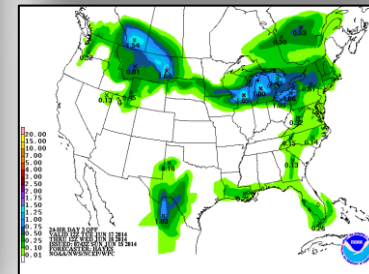

# Critical Fire Weather Areas – Days 1-8



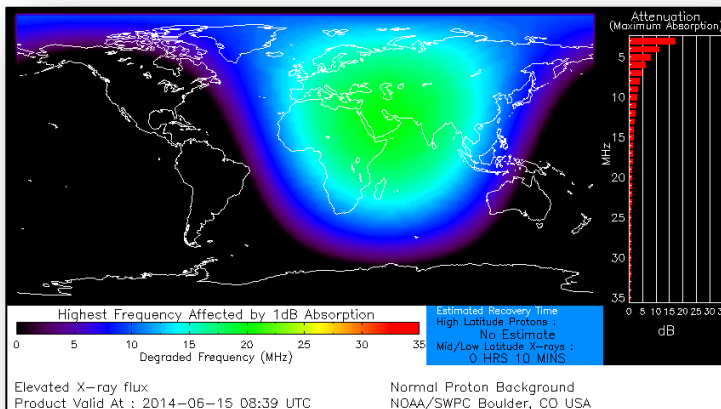
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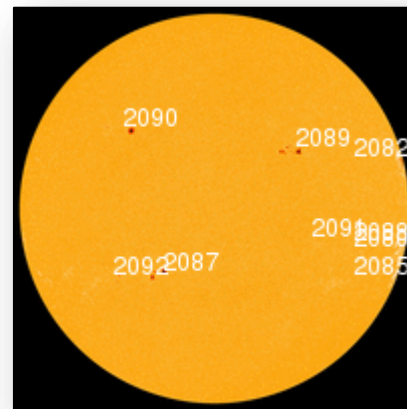
