- Red Flag Warnings: WA, OR, NV, & ID

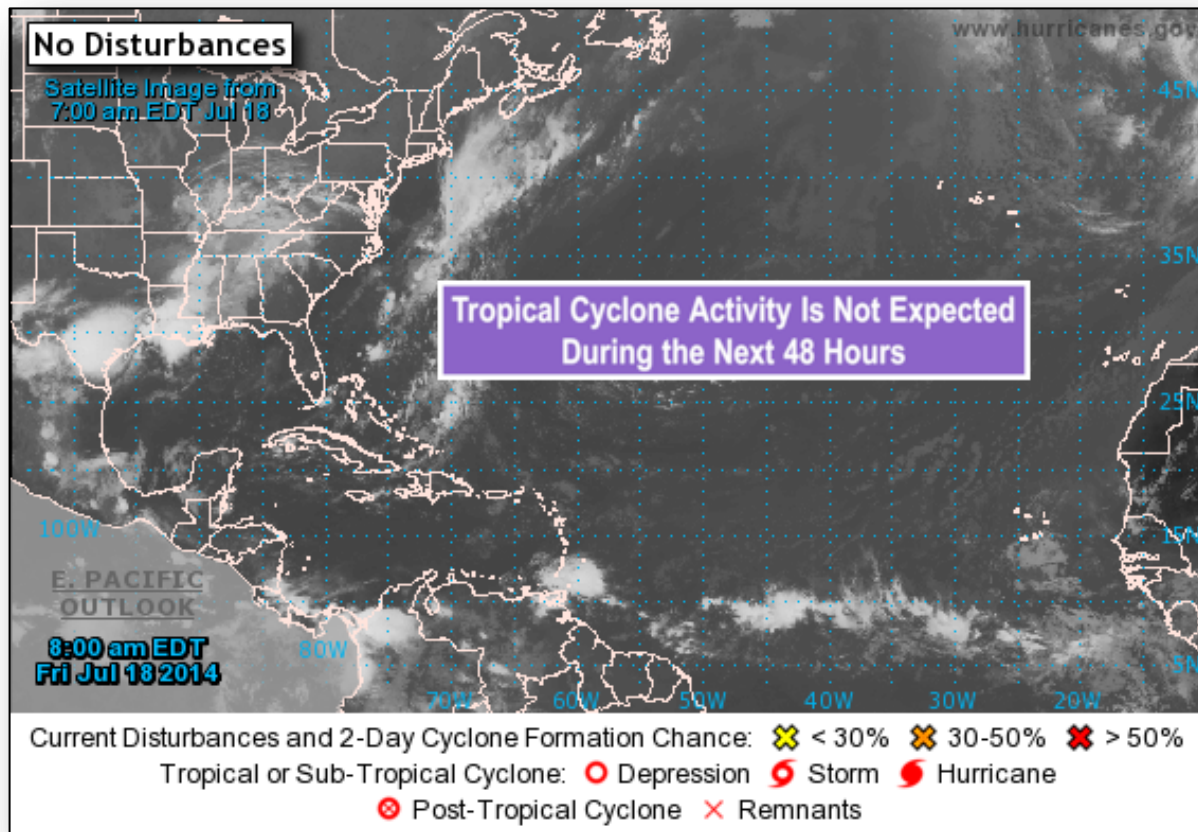

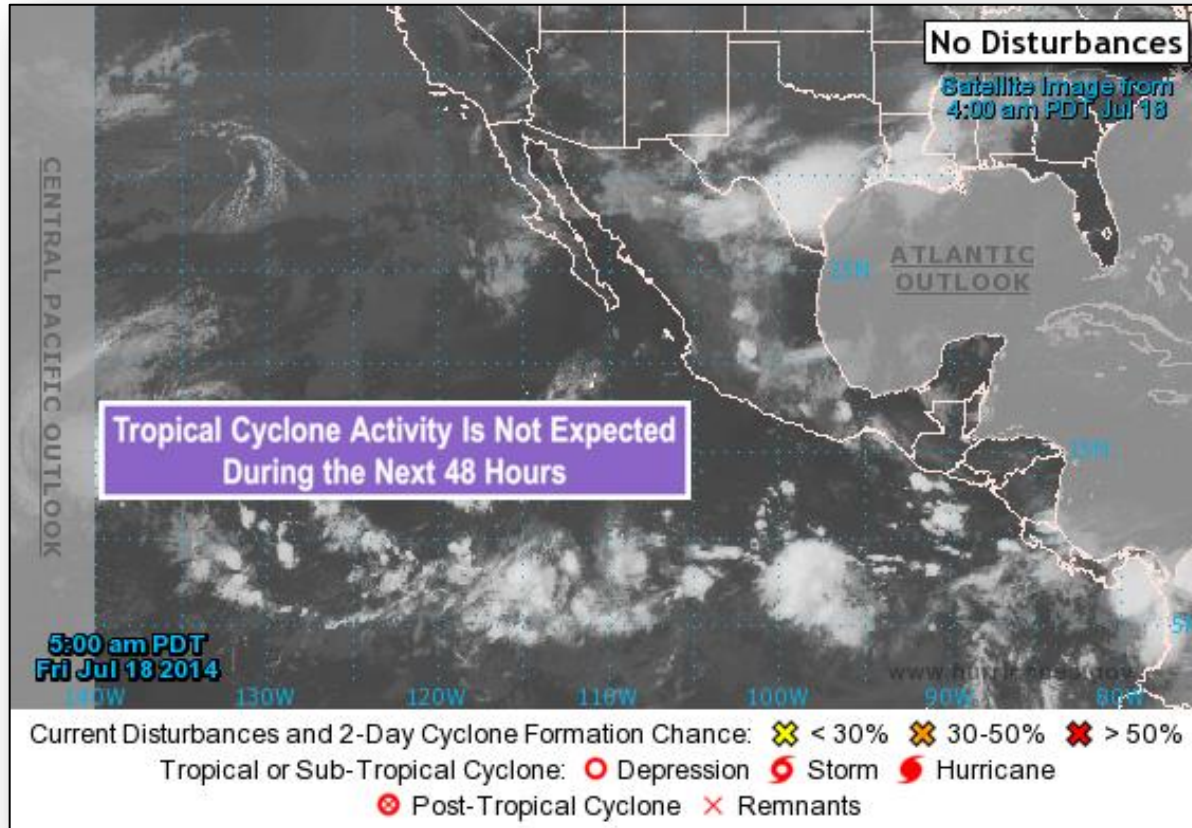
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Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



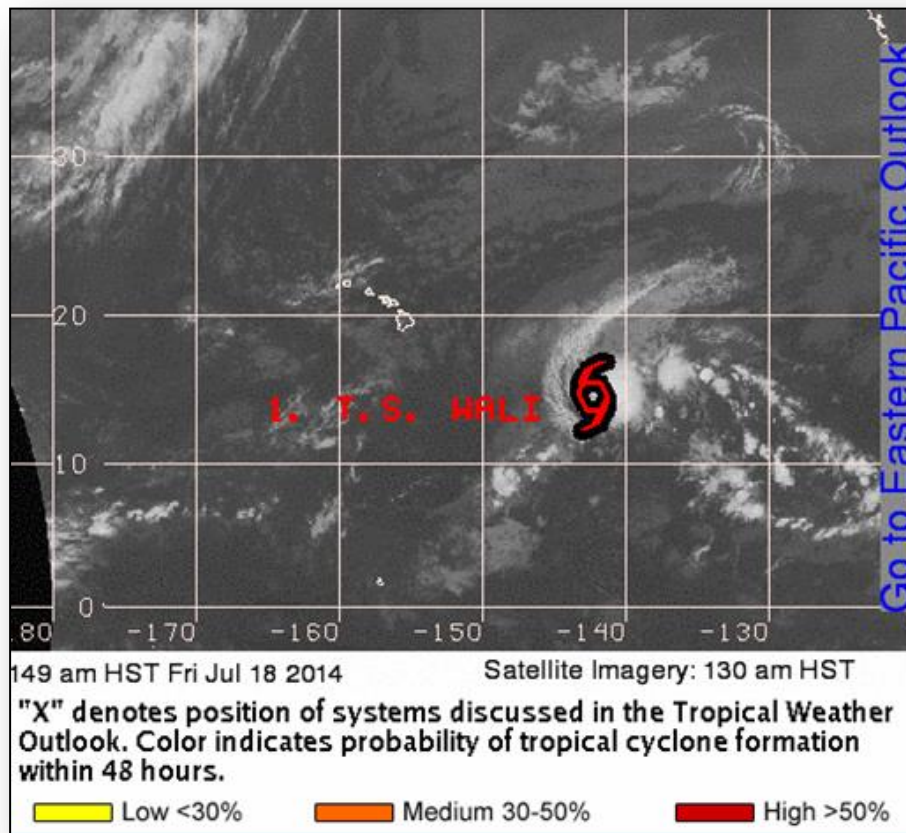

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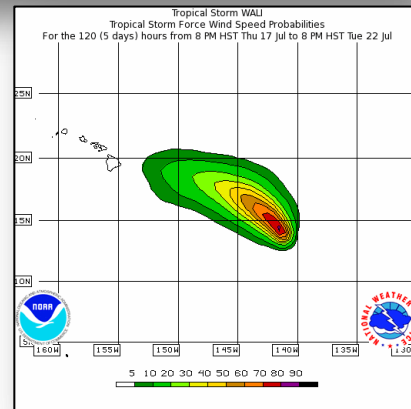
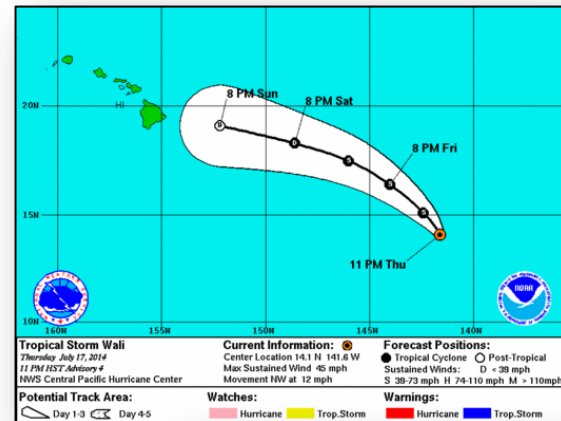


Central Pacific – Tropical Storm Wali



As of 5:00 a.m. EDT

- Located 970 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Moving NW at 12 mph
- This motion expected to continue next 24 hours with slight turn W on Saturday
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Slight intensification expected next 12-24 hours with weakening expected thereafter
- Tropical storm force winds extend 70 miles
- Flash Flood Watch will be in effect from 6:00 pm HST, July 19, to 6:00 pm HST, July 21 for all Hawaiian Islands
- HI State EOC remains at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region IX remains at Watch/Steady State

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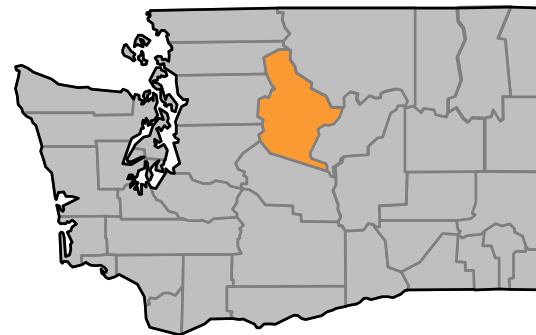

- Located 3 miles south of Nason Creek community
- ▲ Mandatory evacuations in effect for 860 homes
- U.S. Highway 2 closed in both directions; local roads, bridges and railroad lines threatened
- ▲ 4 shelters open with 67 occupants

- Governor declared State of Emergency on July 15
- ▲ WA EOC will go to Full Activation at 10:00 a.m. EDT
- FEMA Region X at Watch/Steady State

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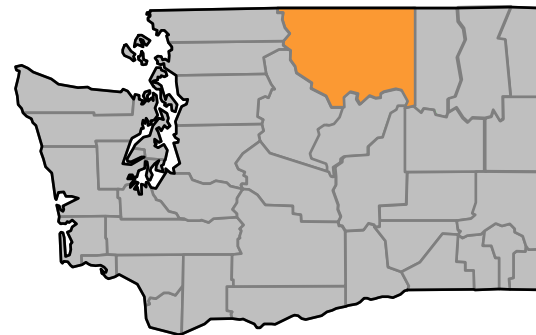

- Fire has damaged or threatened electrical distribution lines and a substation
- ▲ 4 shelters open with 67 occupants

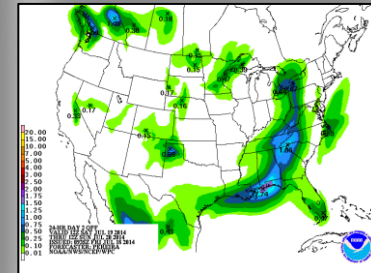
Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day



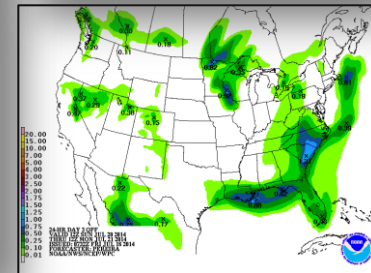

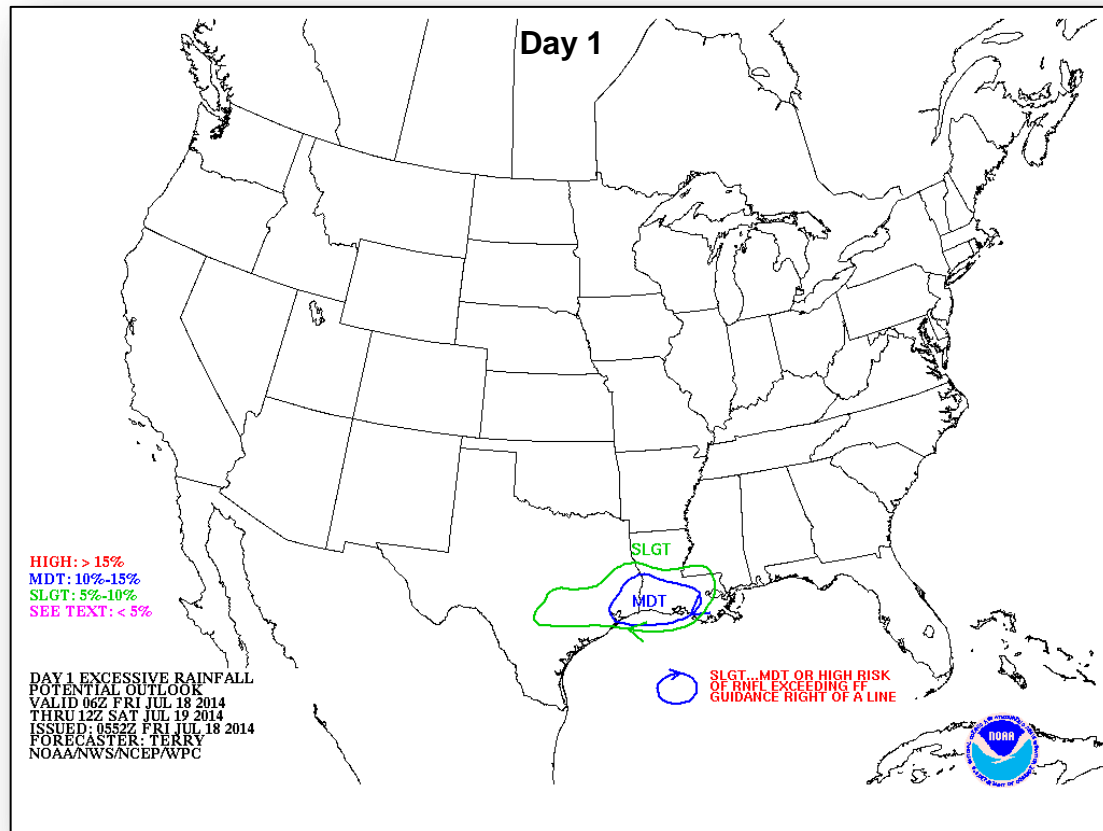

Excessive Rainfall Outlook, Days 1-3



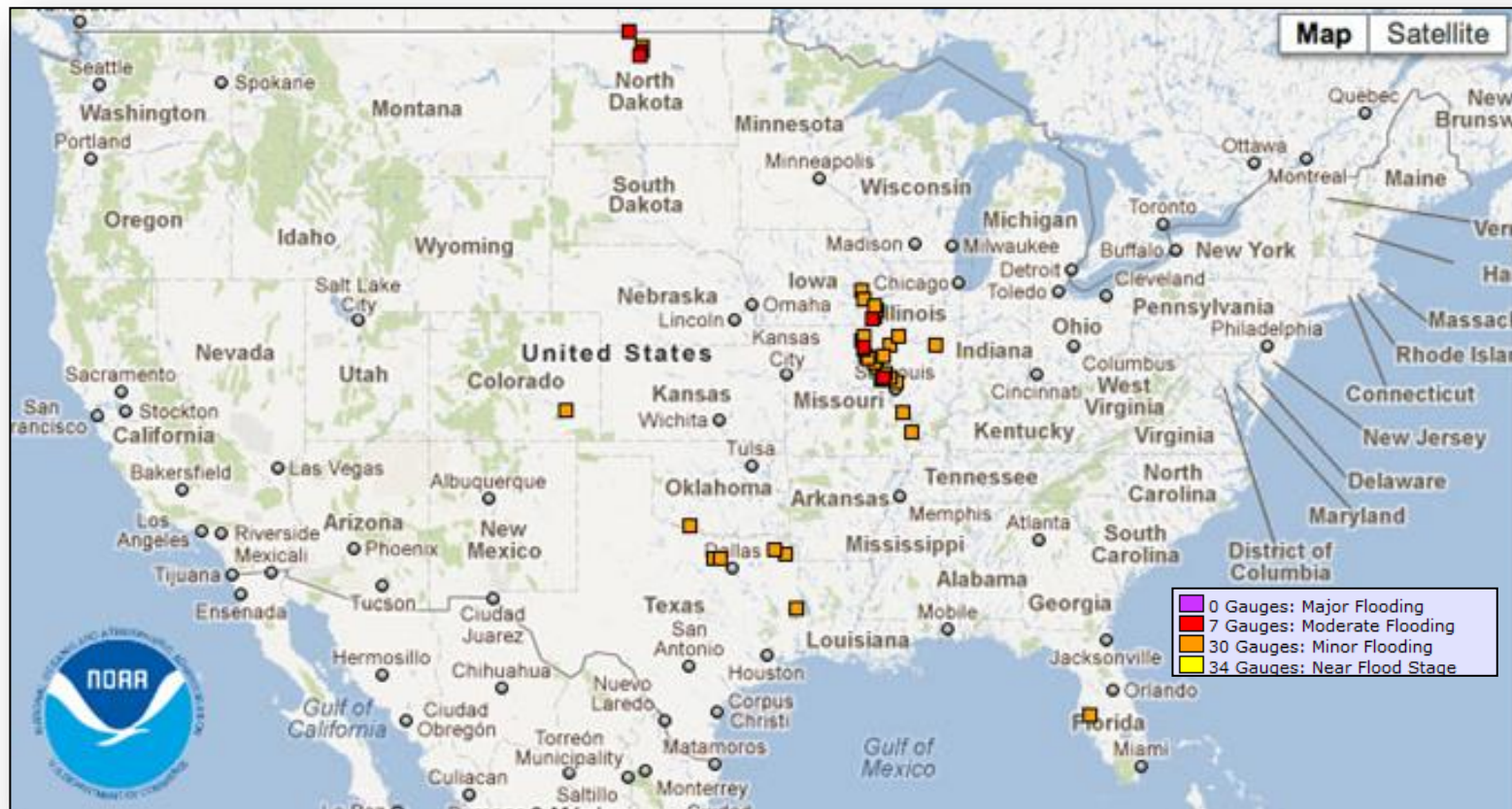
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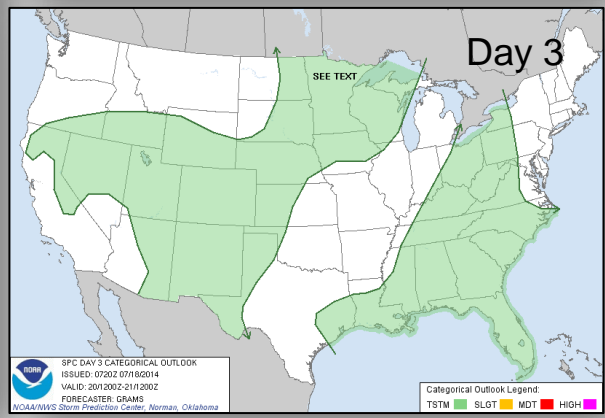
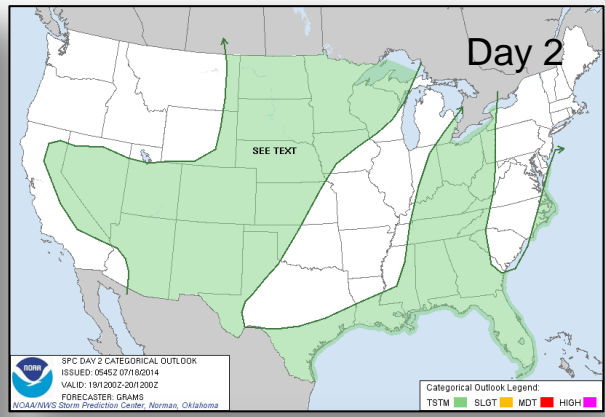
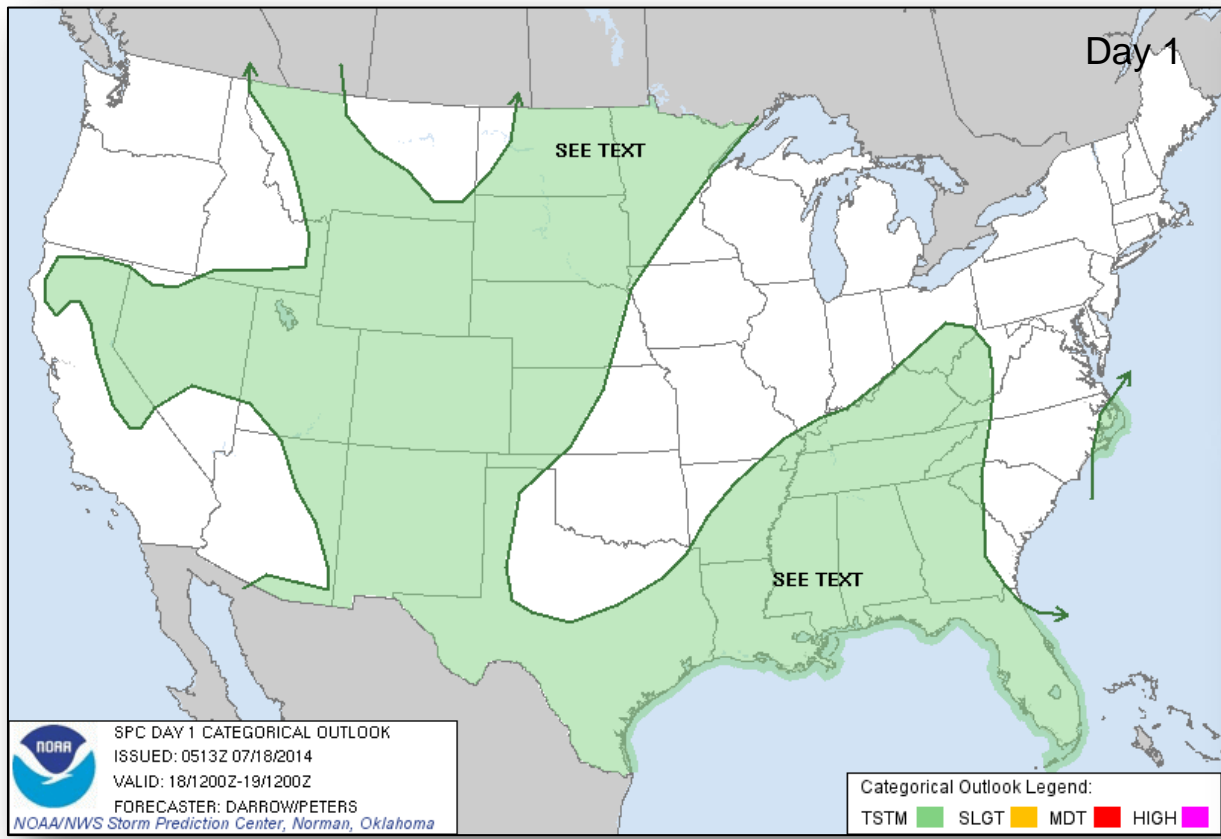

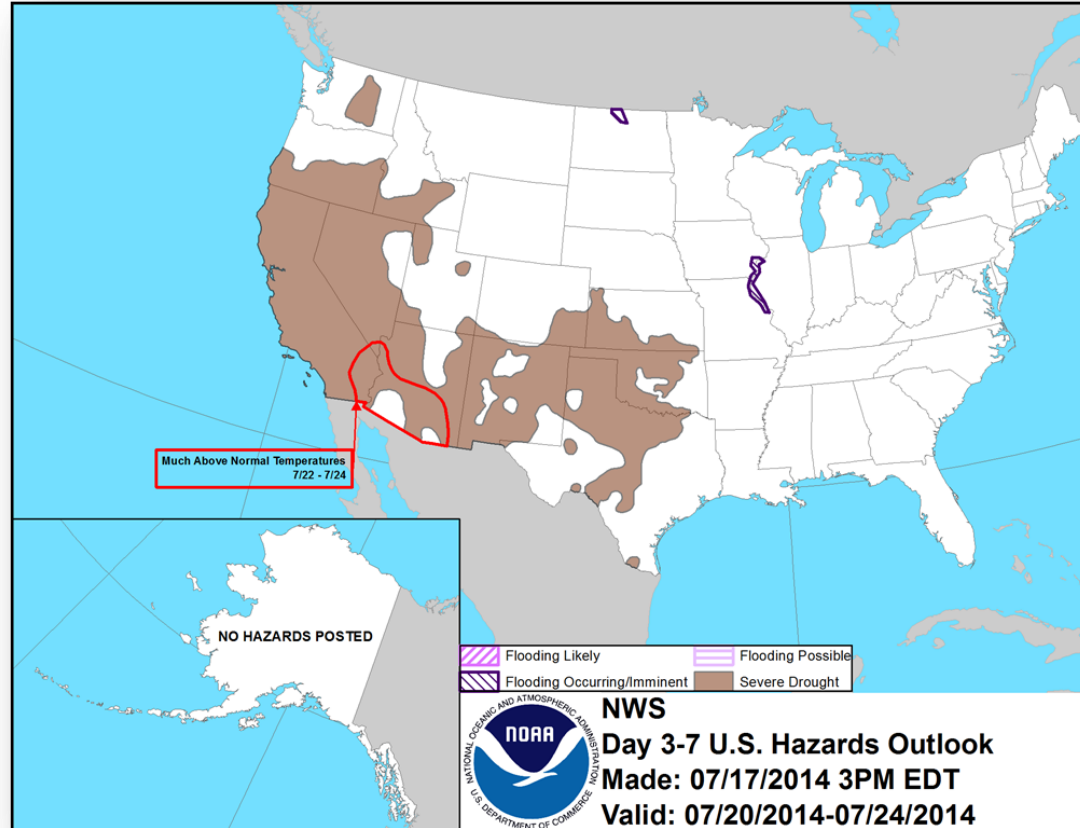
Critical Fire Weather Areas, Days 1 – 8



Hazard Outlook: July 20 – 24



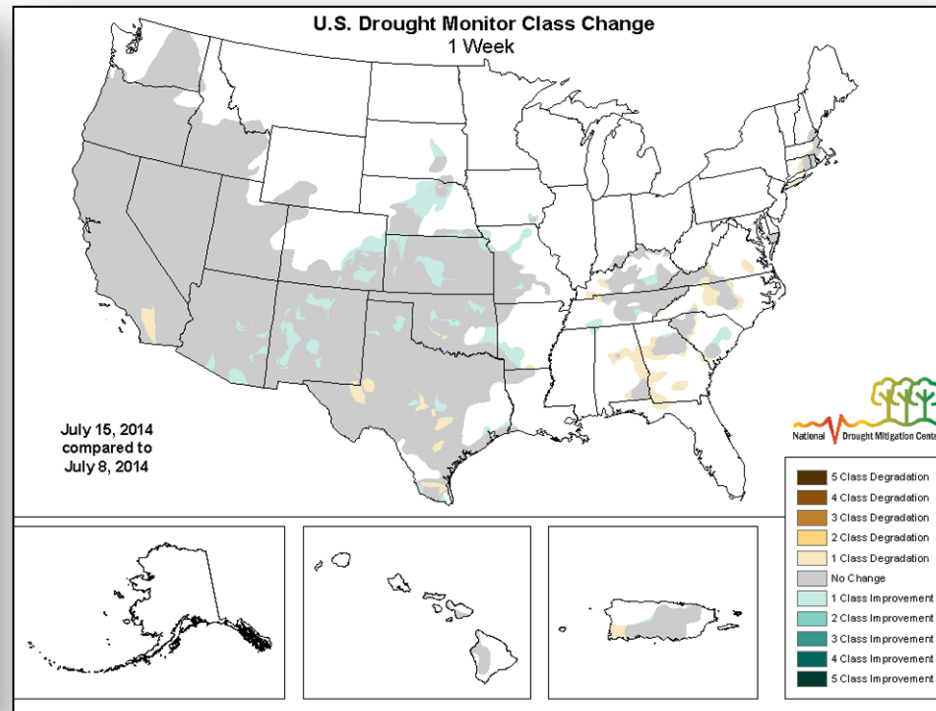
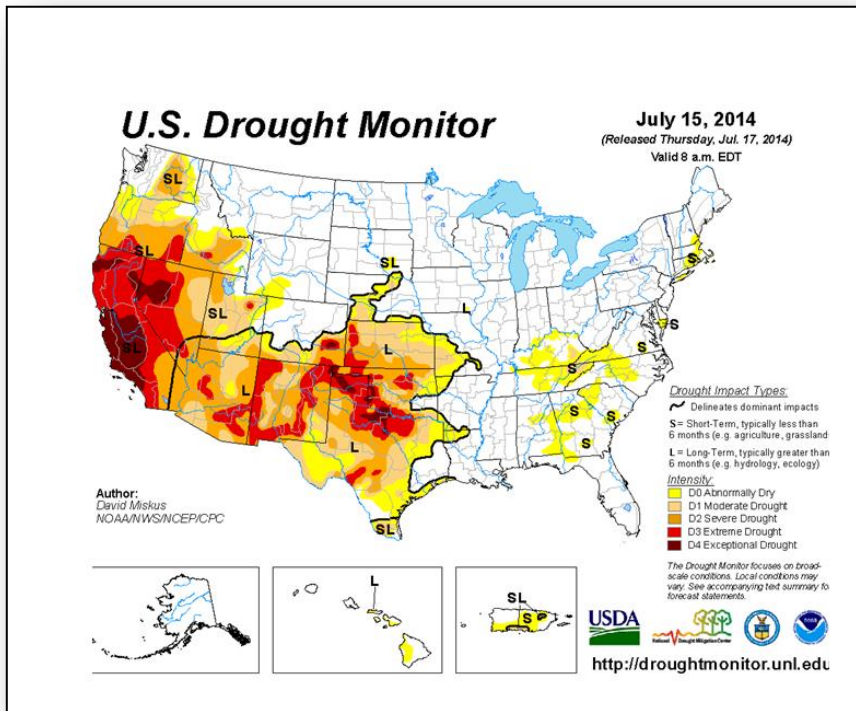
