Wildfire Activity – Northern CA, WA & ID

## **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic Disturbance 1 (Low; near 0%)
- Eastern Pacific Disturbance 1 (Medium; 50%); Disturbance 2 (Low; 10%)
- Central Pacific Tropical Storm Julio

### **Significant Weather:**

- Flash Flooding and thunderstorms possible Mid-Atlantic into the Northeast
- Rain and isolated thunderstorms Southwest U.S.
- Critical Fire Weather Pacific Northwest & the Northern Intermountain into Northern CA
- Red Flag Warnings WA, OR, CA, NV, ID & MT
- Space Weather Past 24 hours / Next 24 hours: No significant activity





# 2-Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic






## Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 am EDT)

- Located 750 miles WSW of Cape Verde Islands
- Moving WNW at 15-20 mph
- Environmental conditions not favorable for formation
- Formation chance
  - Next 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
  - Next 5 days: Low (near 0%)








# 2-Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific







#### Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 am EDT)


- Located a few hundred miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10 15 mph
- Environmental conditions remain conducive for development
- Tropical depression could form nest day or two
- · Formation chance
  - Next 48 hours: Medium (50%)
  - Next 5 days: High (90%)

## Disturbance 2 (as of 2:00 am EDT)

- Located 1,500 miles ESE of Big Island of Hawaii
- Moving WNW at 10 15 mph
- · Development, if any, should be slow to occur
- Formation chance
  - Next 48 hours: Low (10%)
  - Next 5 days: Medium (30%)



## Tropical Storm Julio (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 495 miles N of Kahului, Hawaii
- Moving NW at 6 mph
- This motion expected to continue next 24-48 hours
- Gradual turn N and then NE expected next 24-48 hours
- Maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Slow weakening forecast next 48 hours
- Tropical storm force winds extend 115 miles

  - Hazard Mitigation statewide





# Convective Outlook, Days 1-3









# Fire Weather Outlook, Days 1 - 8






- DR 4165 in Georgia received the most public assistance grants over the past week, at \$5.12 million




