

COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to work requirements supporting state, tribal, and territorial requests; including establishing federally-supported community-based testing sites and coordinating regional support for evaluation of alternate care facilities.

Impacts:

- Numerous states have implemented state wide curfews; directed the closure of non essential business and food operations restricted to carry out/delivery only
- Large gatherings being discouraged; recommended gathering sizes of groups of 10 individuals or less
- 118k U.S. public and private schools are closed, scheduled to close, or were closed and later reopened; affecting at least 54 million school students (edweek.org)
- 13 (+2) U.S. airports implemented Enhanced Health Screenings

 (FEMA COVID 19 SLB, as of 5:00 p.m. ET)

State / Local Response:

- Navajo Nation issued Stay at Home orders for all residents
- CA, NY, and NJ Gov. issued Stay at Home Executive Orders
- Iowa & Washington requested Major Disaster Declarations
- All state Emergency Operations Centers activated for COVID-19




National Weather Forecast





Severe Weather Outlook






