
Colonial Pipeline Cyberattack

<u>Current Situation</u>: Colonial Pipeline, which supplies fuel to the east coast, proactively took certain systems offline to contain a threat from a cybersecurity incident. Currently there are no request for FEMA assistance and no unmet needs.

- Colonial Pipeline runs from Houston, Texas to Linden, NJ
- The company transports 2.5 million barrels per day of gasoline, diesel, jet fuel, and other refined products through 5, 500 miles of pipeline
- Colonial team is working to restore service as soon as possible. They have partnered with the FBI, DHS, and contracted a private Cyber-security provider to address this cyber-attack







Tropical Outlook - Eastern Pacific

- There are no coastal watches and warnings in effect








Severe Weather Outlook





Fire Weather Outlook







