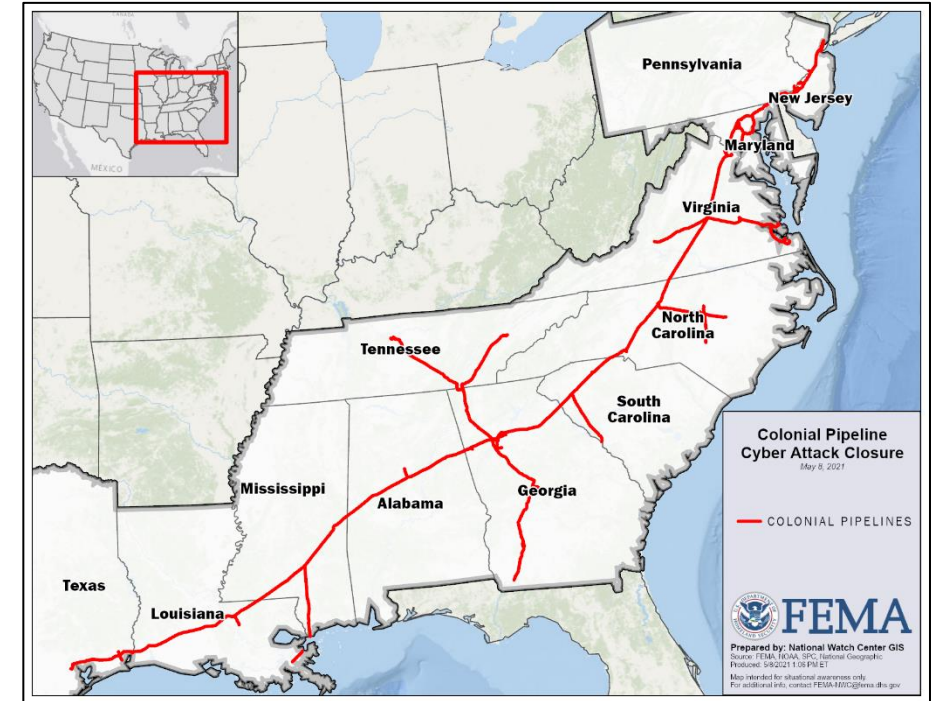
Colonial Pipeline Cyberattack

Current Situation: Colonial Pipeline, which supplies fuel to the east coast, proactively took certain systems offline to contain a threat from a cybersecurity incident. Currently there are no request for FEMA assistance and no unmet needs.

- Colonial Pipeline runs from Houston, Texas to Linden, NJ
- The company transports 2.5 million barrels per day of gasoline, diesel, jet fuel, and other refined products through 5, 500 miles of pipeline
- Colonial team is working to restore service as soon as possible. They have partnered with the FBI, DHS, and contracted a private Cyber-security provider to address this cyber-attack

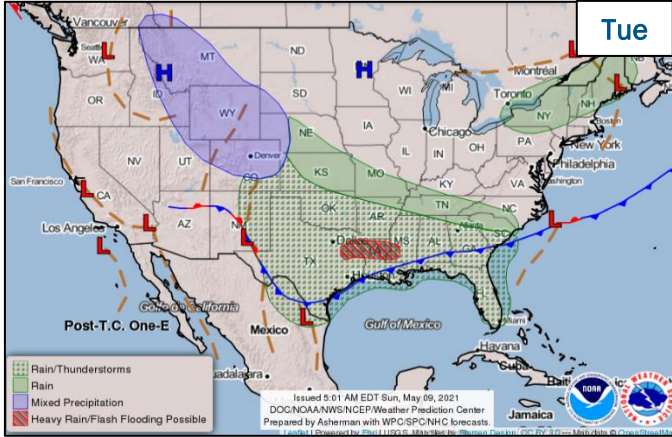
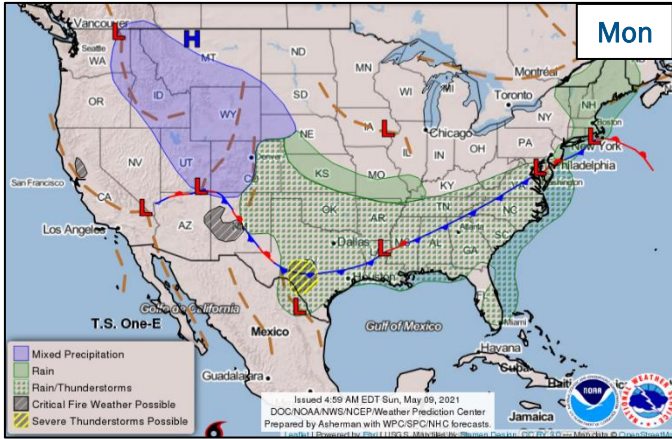
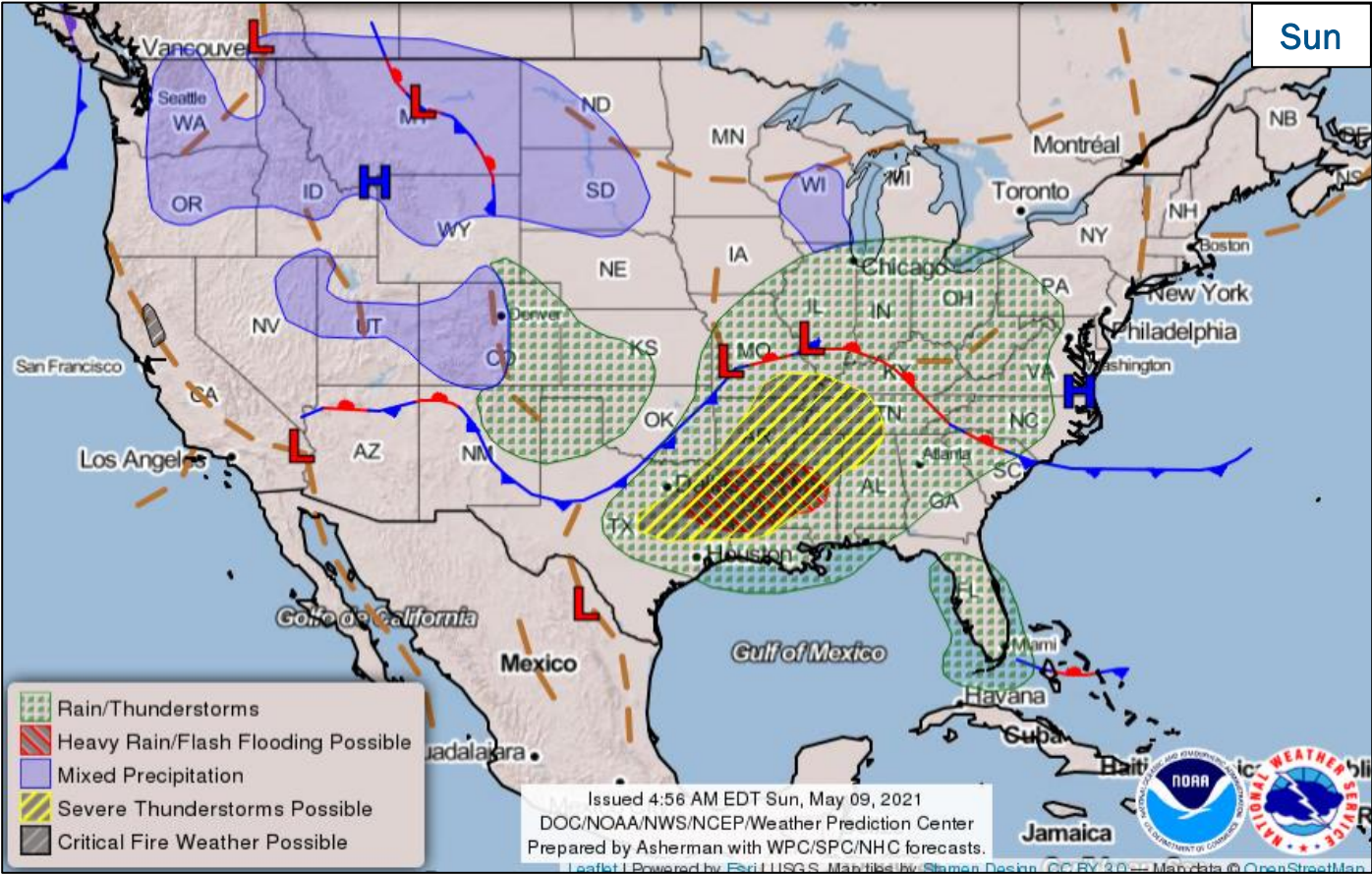
Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific

Tropical Depression One-E (Advisory 1 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles SSE of the Southern Coast of Mexico
- Moving NW at 5 MPH
- Maximum Sustained Wind 35 MPH
- Gradual weakening expected to begin tomorrow and become a remnant by Tuesday
- There are no coastal watches and warnings in effect

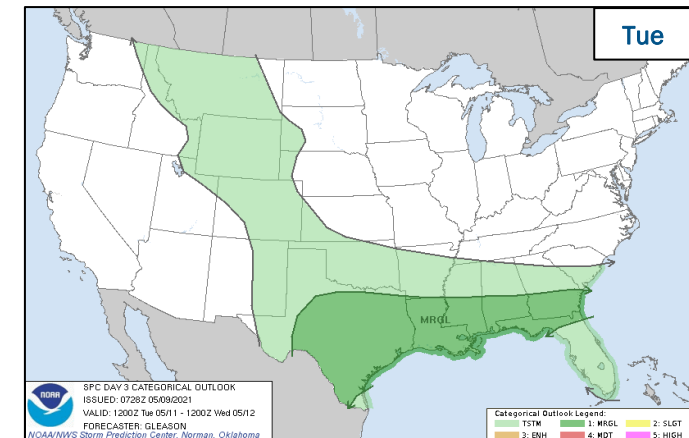
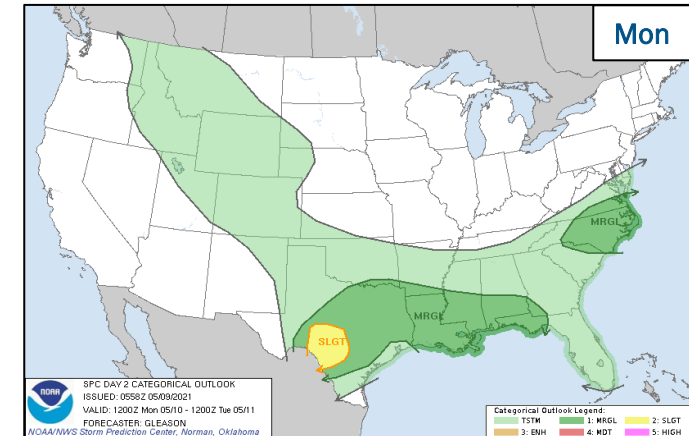
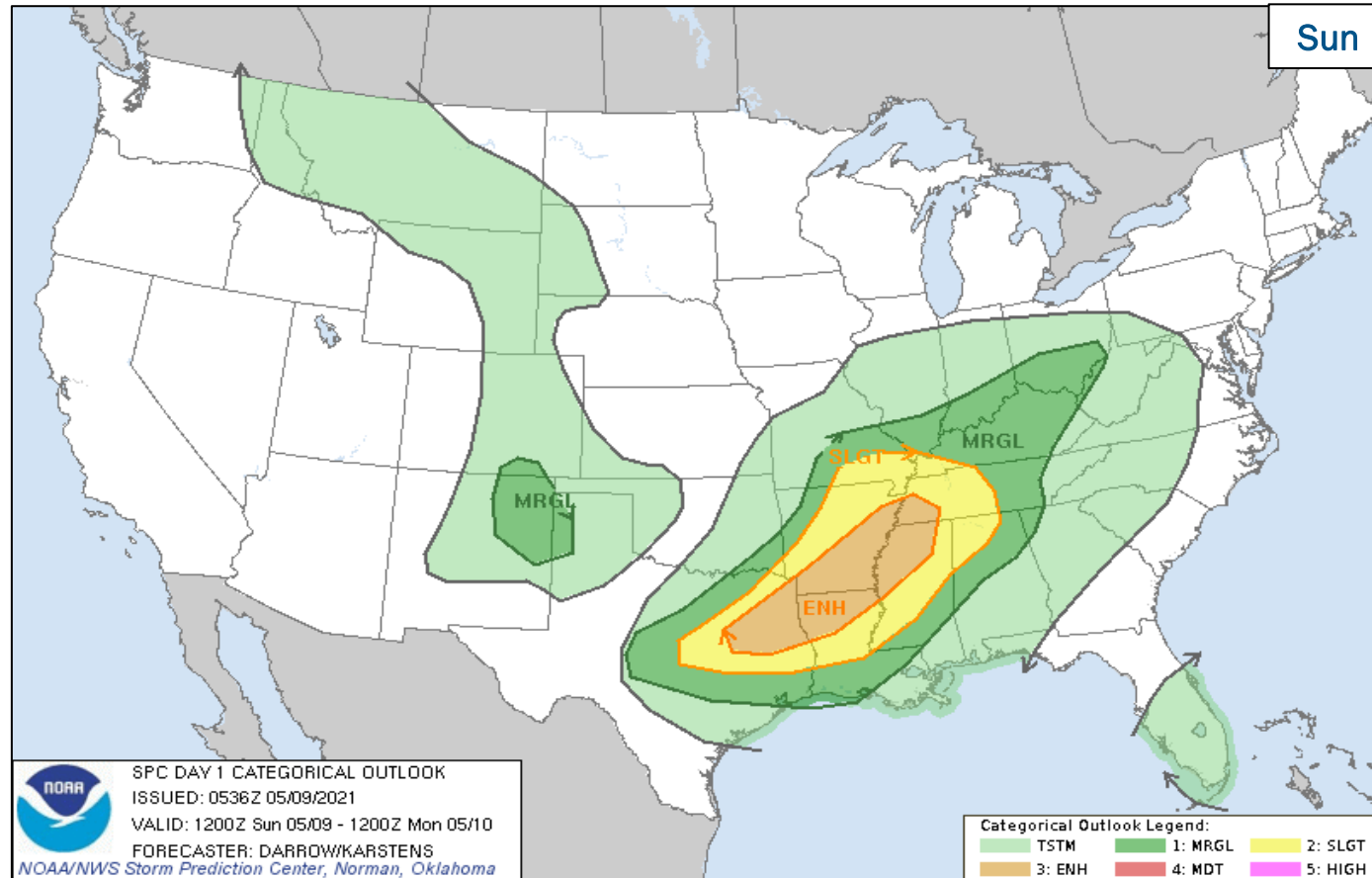


National Weather Forecast

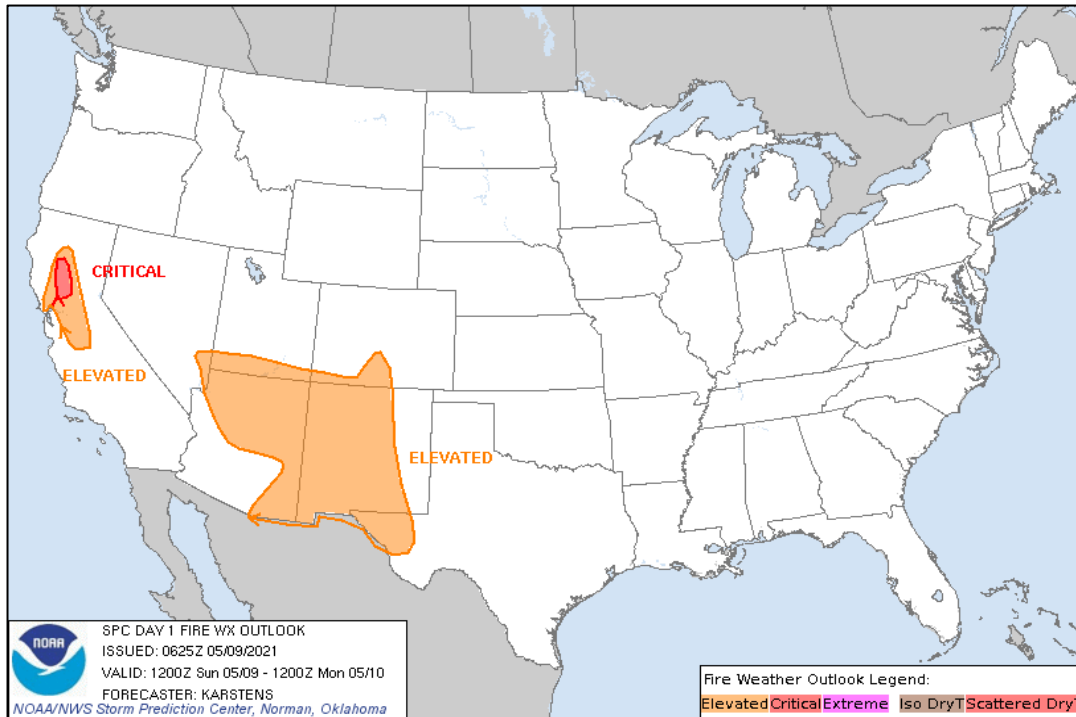
Severe Weather Outlook



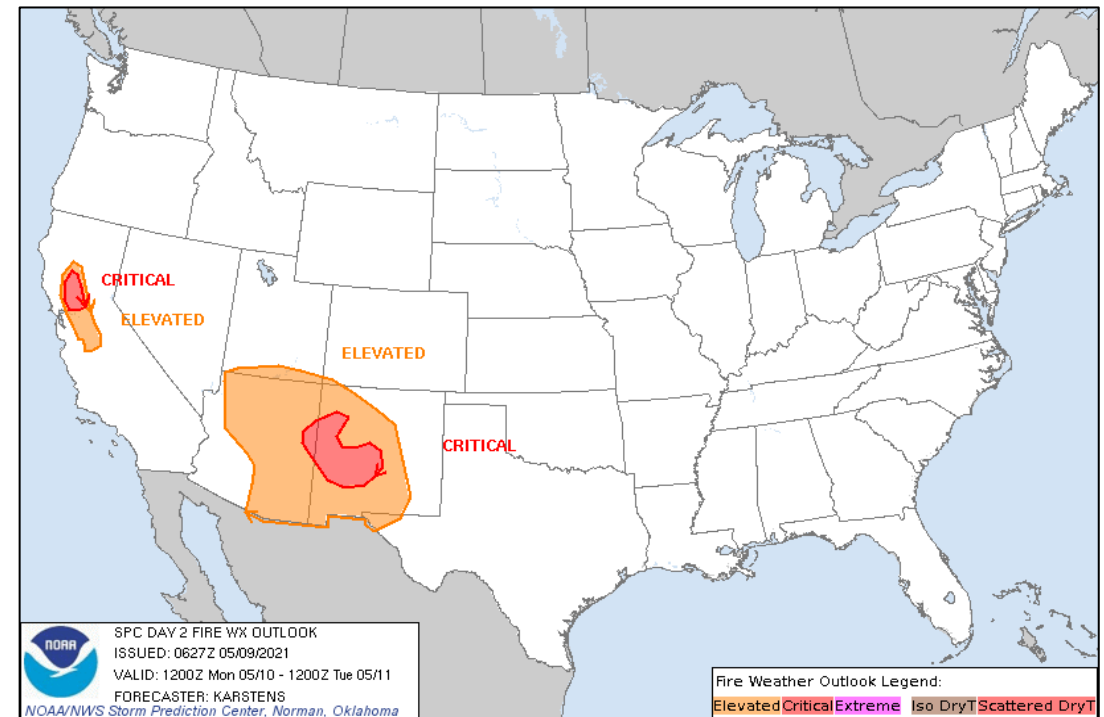

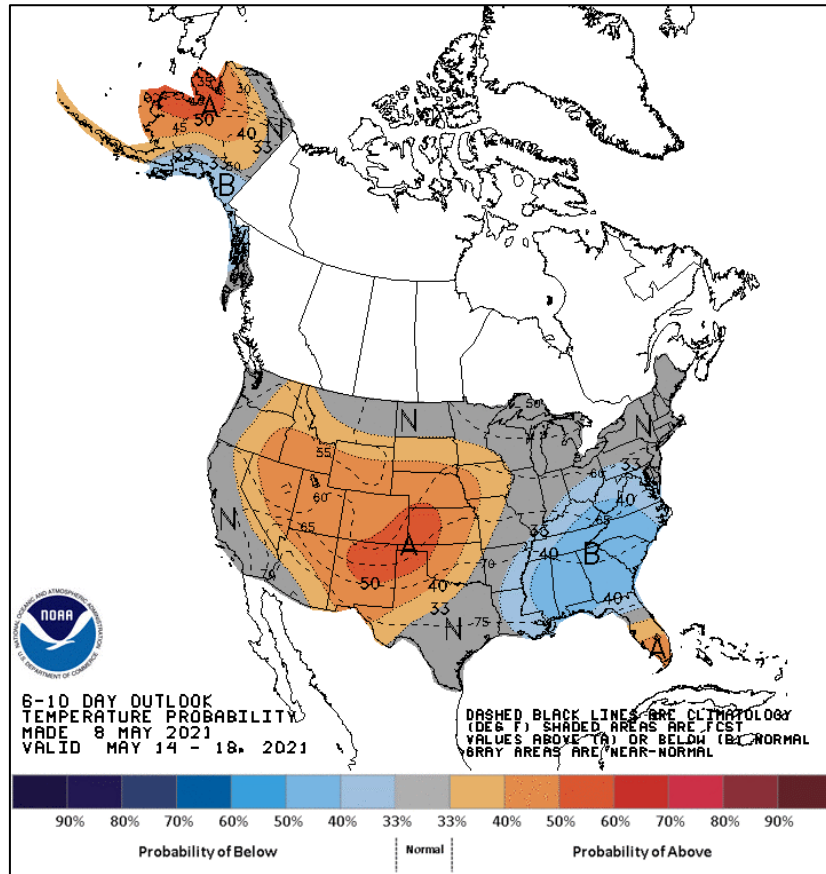

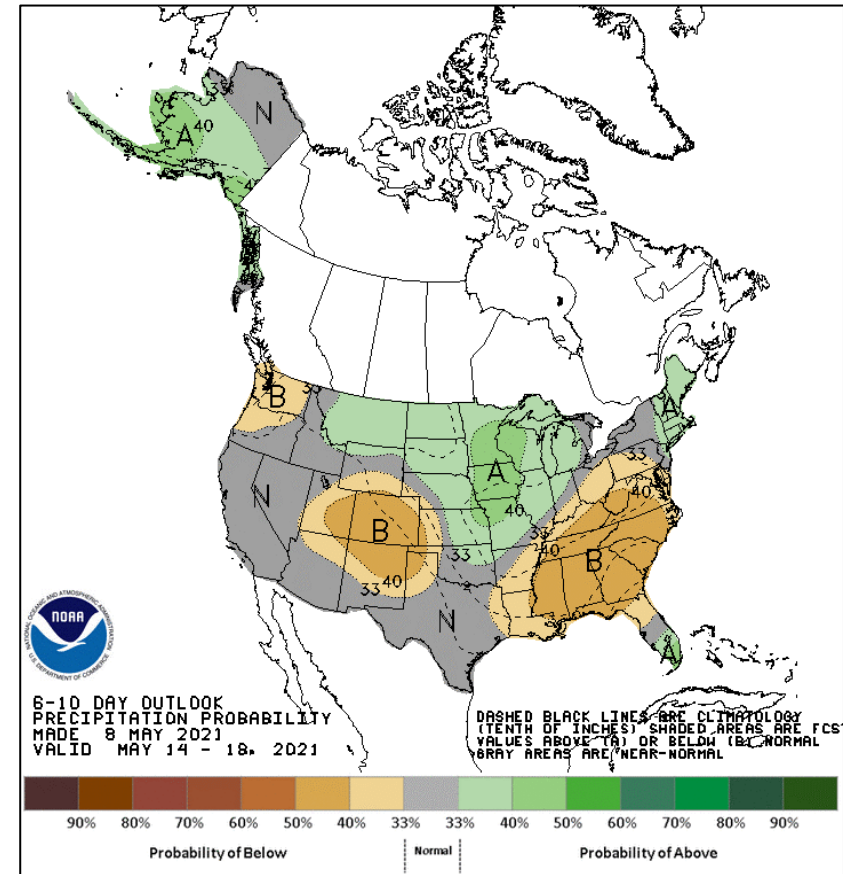
