- Fire began on May 13, approx. 20 miles west of Naples, FL

COVID-19 Update

<u>Situation:</u> FEMA, HHS, and federal partners continue working with state, local, tribal, and territorial governments to execute a Whole-of-America response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Among the 17 states not presently experiencing a decrease in confirmed cases, 7 have no stay-at-home order in place, 1 has local or limited stay-at-home order, and 9 have statewide stay-at-home orders in place. Nationwide testing: 9,301,026 (+179,635) cumulative as of May 13

Community Based Testing Sites:

- 180,060 (+3,923) samples collected at CBTS locations since Mar 20
- 210,500 (+21,106) tests administered by Private-Partnership Testing Sites since Apr 5

Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical Lifeline

- Public Health: multiple states are reporting a "mystery illness" in children possibly linked to COVID-19
- Medical Care: CA: San Diego and Imperial County hospitals are showing an uptick in COVID-19 patients arriving from Mexico; Mexicali and Tijuana (Mexico) are reporting their hospitals are at or near capacity, which is resulting in border crossings in San Diego and Imperial counties for health-related services


Food, Water, Shelter:

 Meat processing at 73% capacity, creating a backlog of 300k pigs that need to be depopulated; de-population will need to begin by May 18

Transportation:

 As of May 11, 25 cruise ships from 11 cruise lines have submitted attestations to disembark 5,714 crew (including 156 U.S. residents) at U.S. ports; a total of 72 outbreaks on cruise ships with 1,823 cases and 28 deaths have occurred as of May 11



Disturbance 1 (As of 7:25 p.m. ET)


- Expected to develop in a couple of days near or just north of the Bahamas
