- Severe thunderstorms possible – Southern Plains; Mid-Atlantic and Central Appalachians
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible – Southern Plains



Situation:

- Fire began May 27 and is burning on local and private land in and around Bagdad, AZ (pop 1774)
- Winds are blowing the fire towards the threatened homes; all of the threatened homes are primary residences
- Also threatening 15 businesses, a fire station, a school, and transmission lines
- Power lines were de-energized and power is out in Bagdad; 911 services were restored following an outage

Response:

- FMAG approved May 27
- AZ EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC and the NWC continue to monitor





Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 950 miles SSW of southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Moving W or WNW at 10 mph
- Some slow development is possible next few days
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (20%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (30%)




Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles S of the coast of Acapulco, Mexico
- Moving slowly W or WNW
- Some gradual development possible next several days
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (30%)



Severe Weather Outlook
