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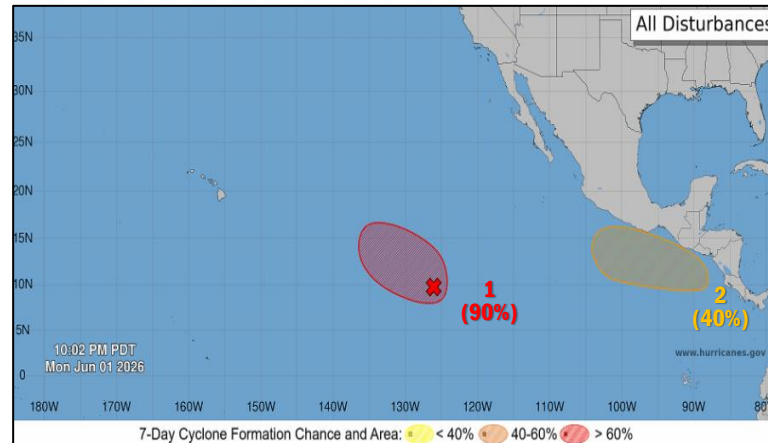
Tropical Outlook

Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (90E): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Well SW of the Baja California Peninsula
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for a tropical depression to form during the **next day or two**
- Formation Chance – 48-hour **High 70%**; 7-day High (90%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- S of the southern coast of Mexico
- Moving WNW around 10 mph
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for a tropical depression to form **early next week**
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (near 0%); 7-day **Med (40%)**

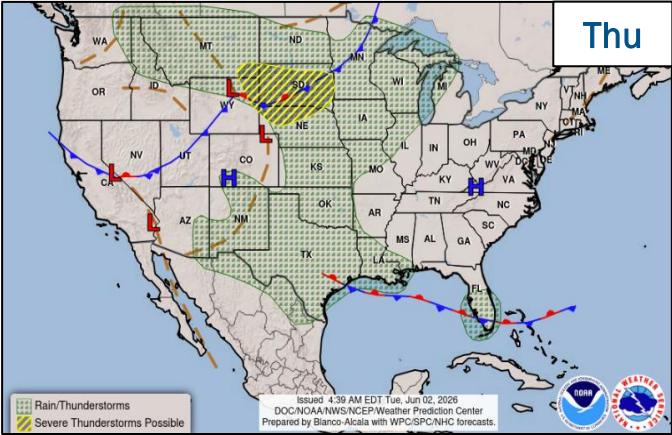
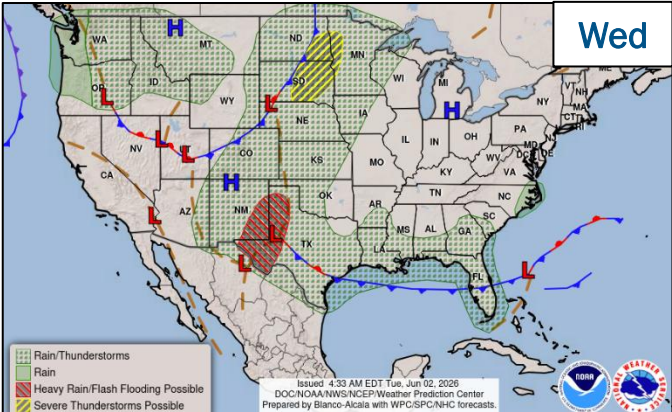
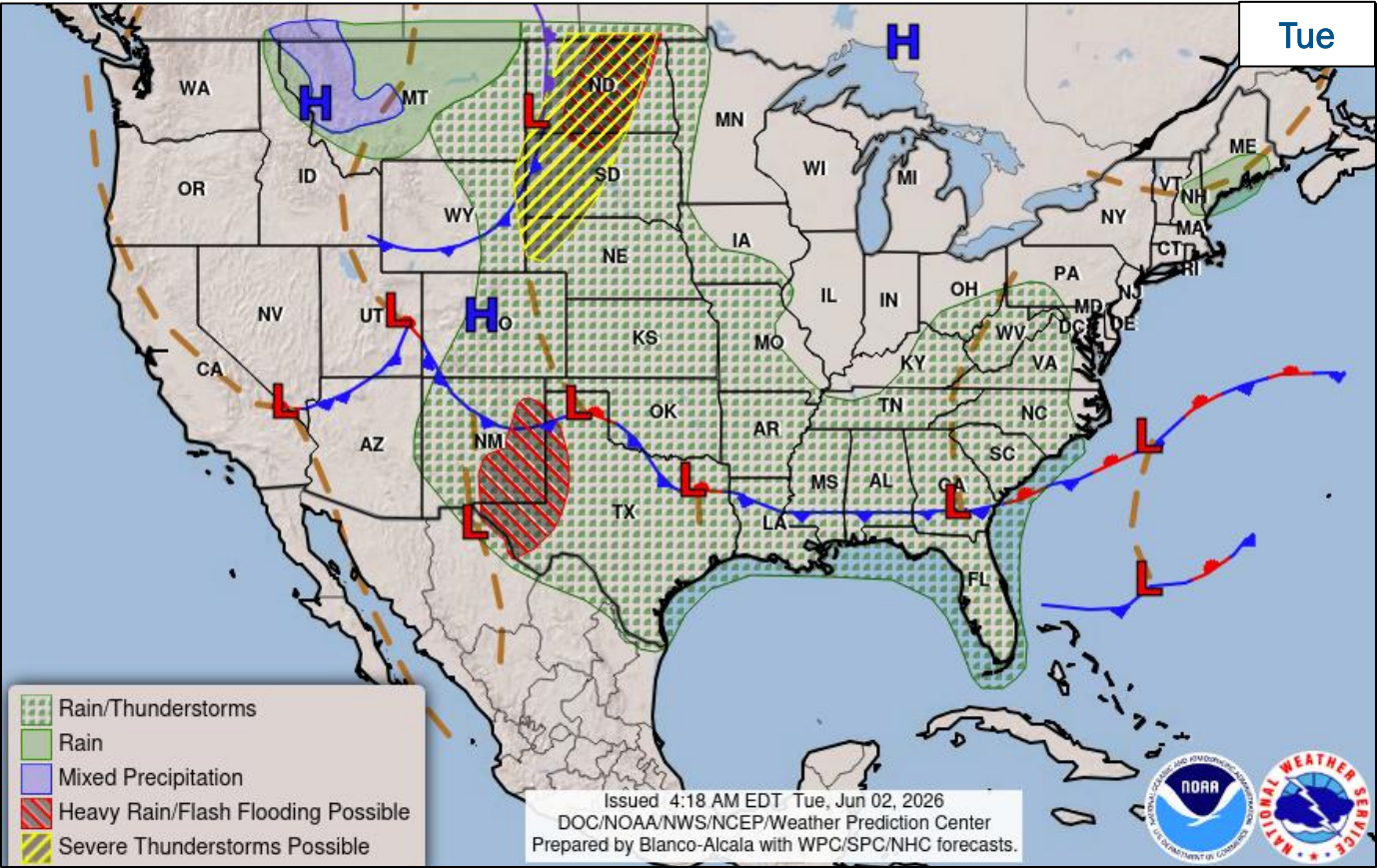

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National Weather Forecast



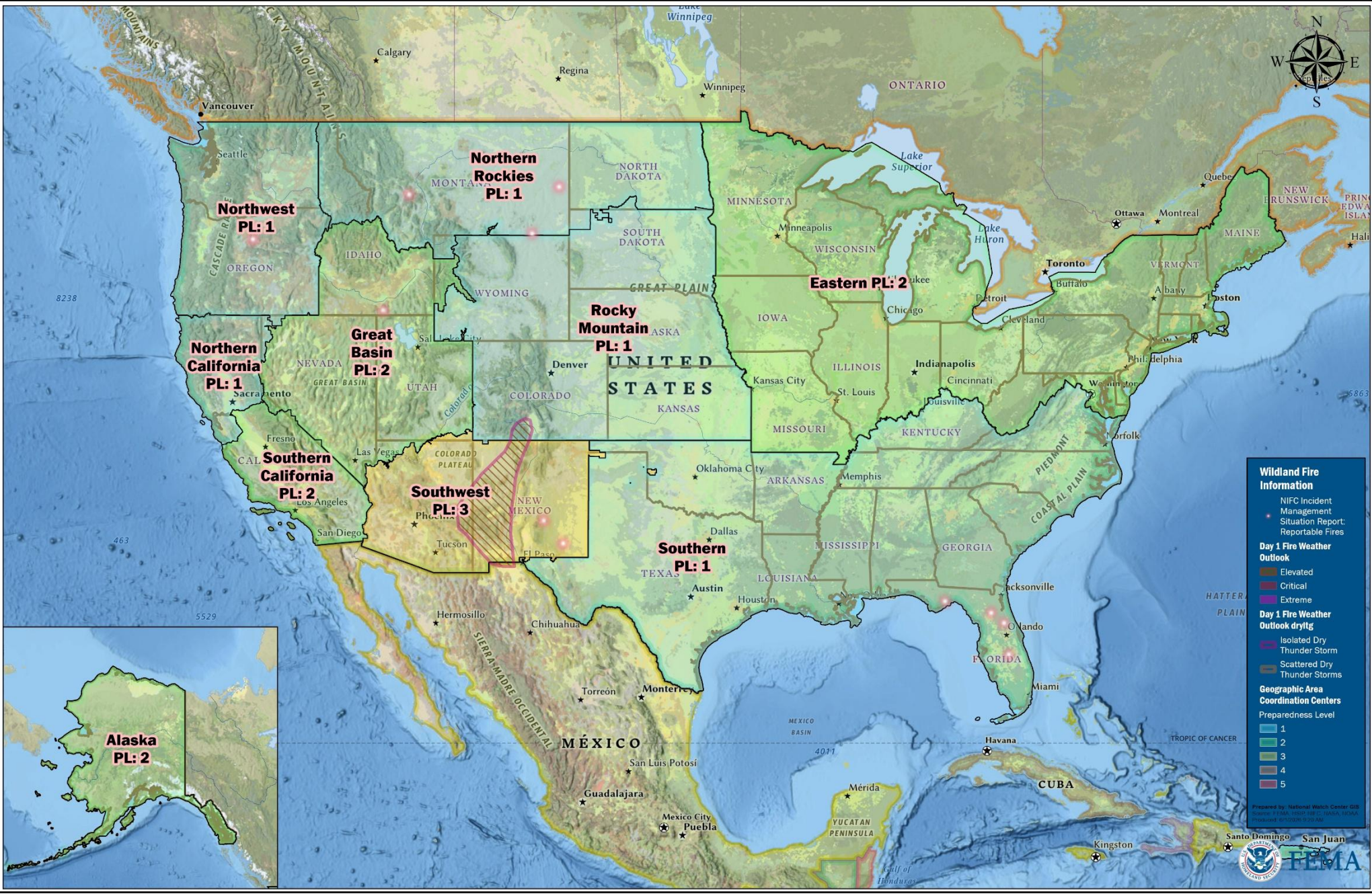

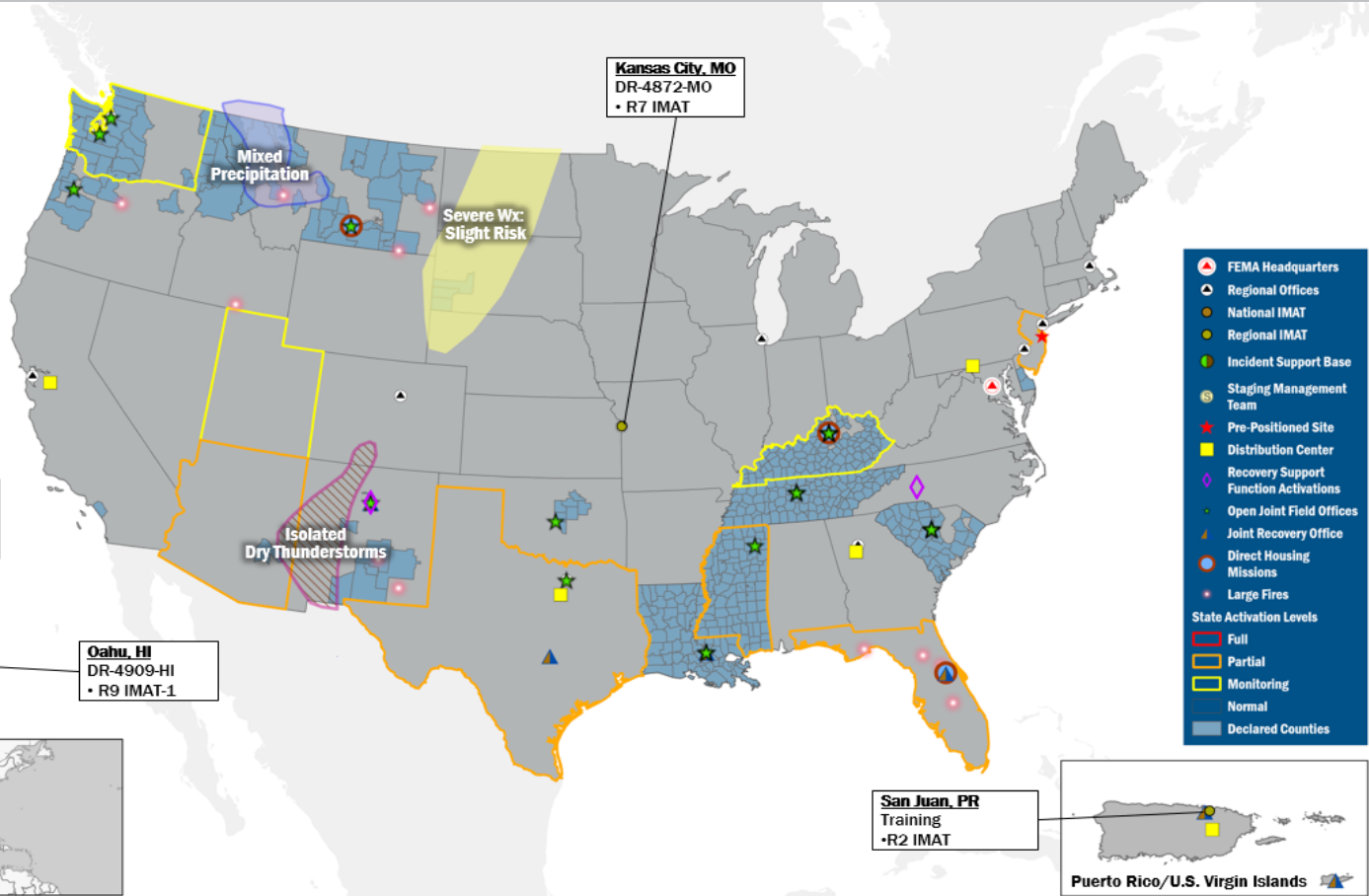
