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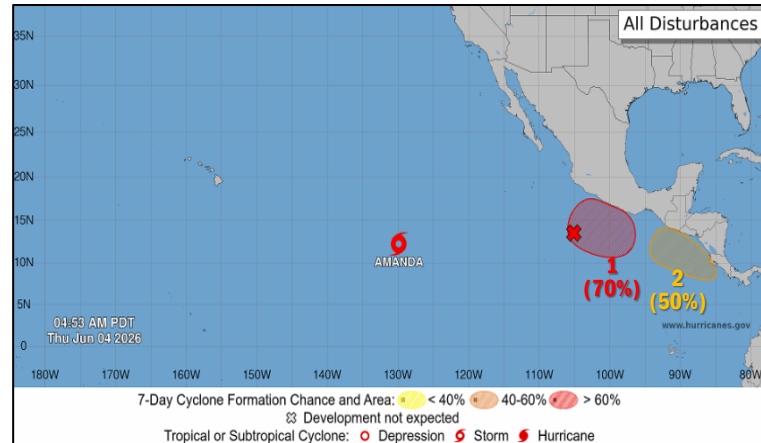

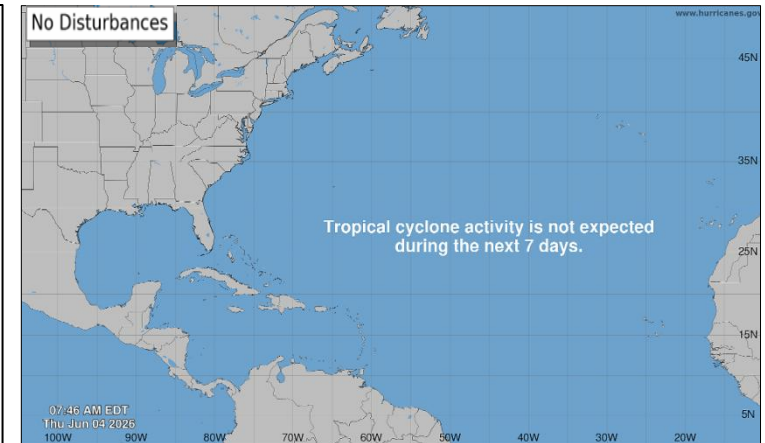
Disturbance 1: ([as of 8:00 a.m. ET](#))

- Offshore of southern and southwestern coast of Mexico
- Moving N or NNE
- Environmental conditions [appear conducive](#) for development of this [system likely to form during the next several days](#); a [tropical depression could form during this time](#)
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (10%); 7-day High (70%)

Disturbance 2: ([as of 8:00 a.m. ET](#))

- Offshore of Central America and southern Mexico
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for gradual development; a tropical depression to form late this weekend or early next week
- Formation Chance – 48-hour Low (near 0%); 7-day Med (50%)

- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days



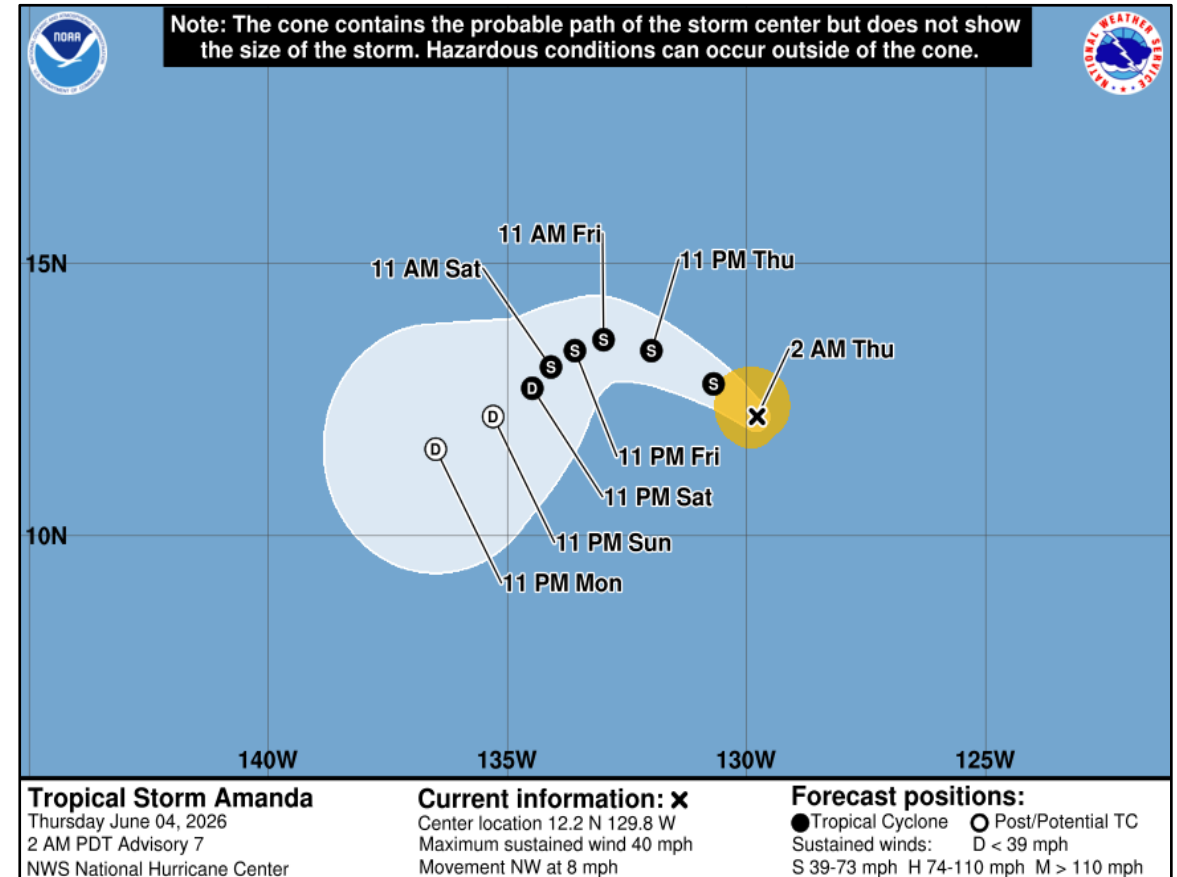
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Tropical Storm Amanda – Eastern Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #7, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

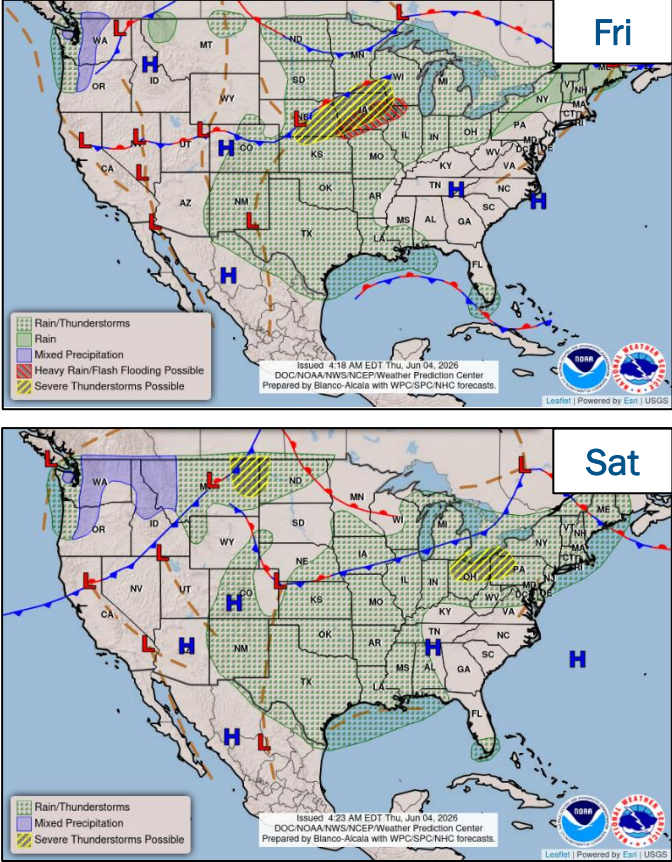
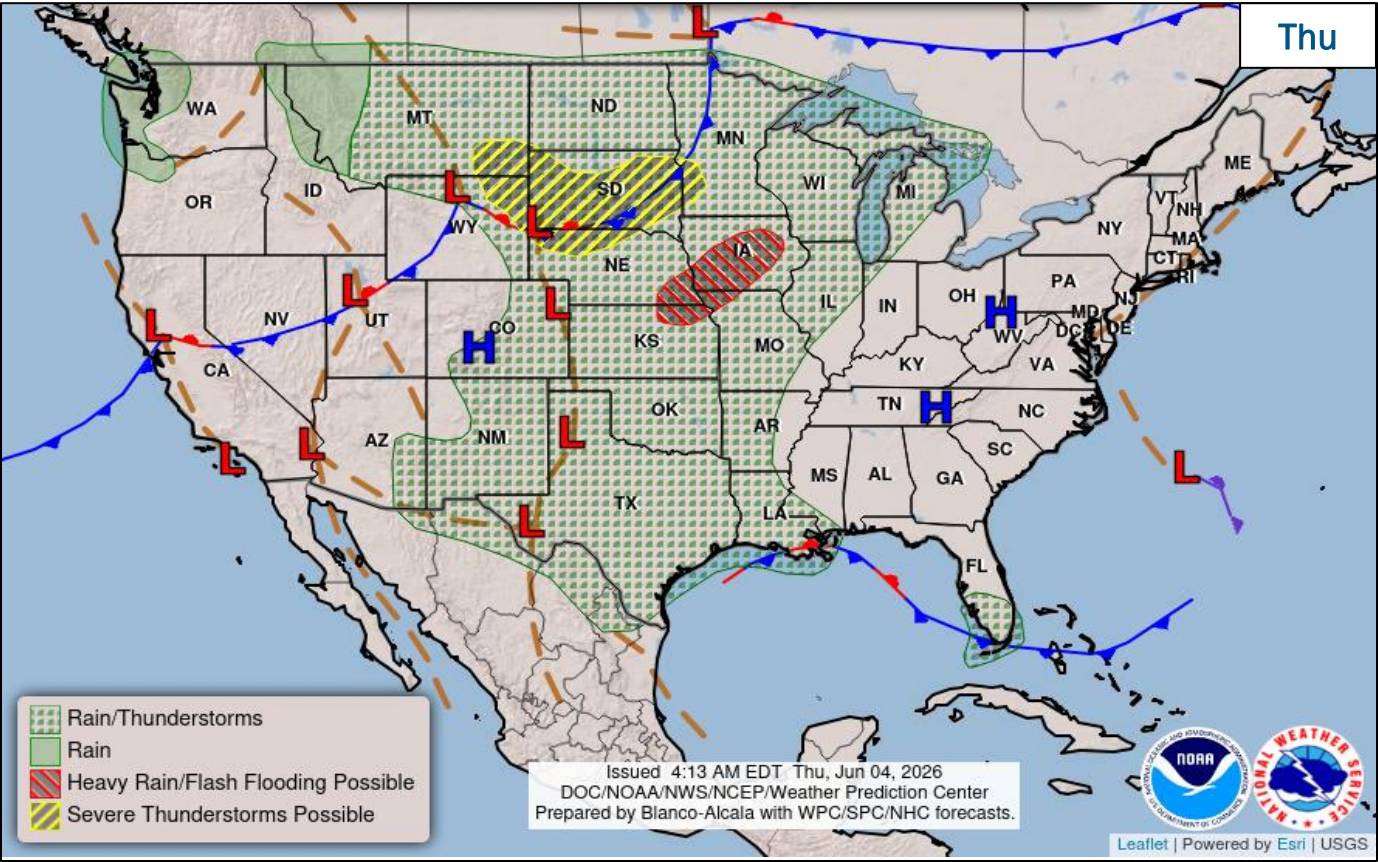
- Located 1,500 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 9 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 40 mph
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 70 miles from the center
- Some strengthening is forecast through tonight; a weakening trend is forecast to begin this weekend
- Tropical Storm Amanda does not pose a threat to land



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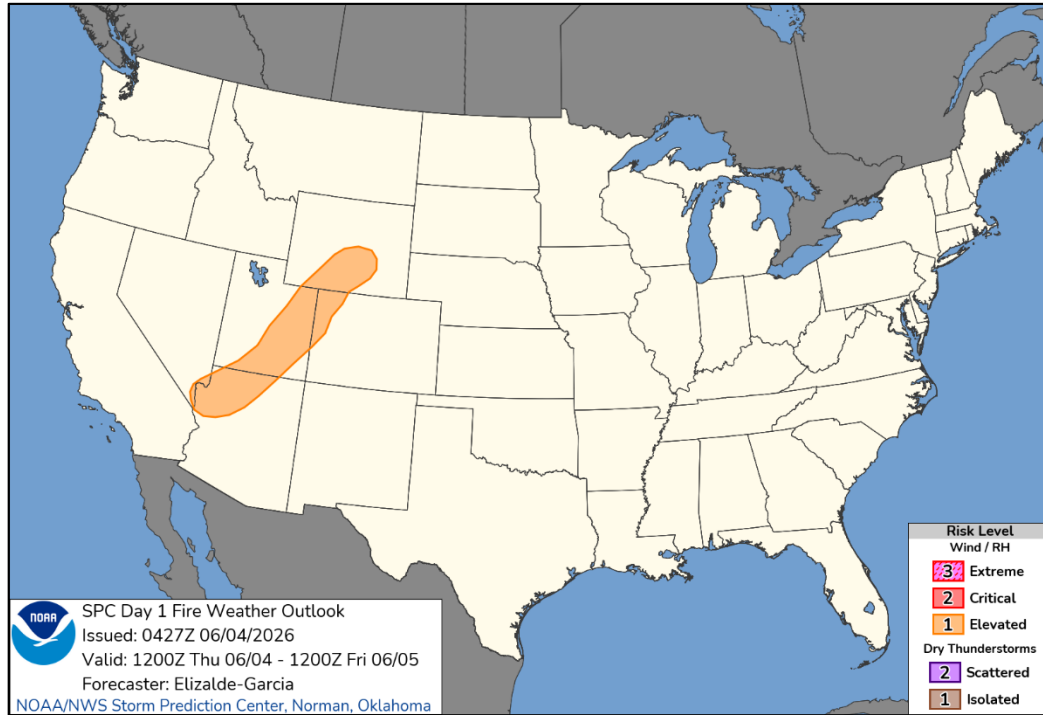

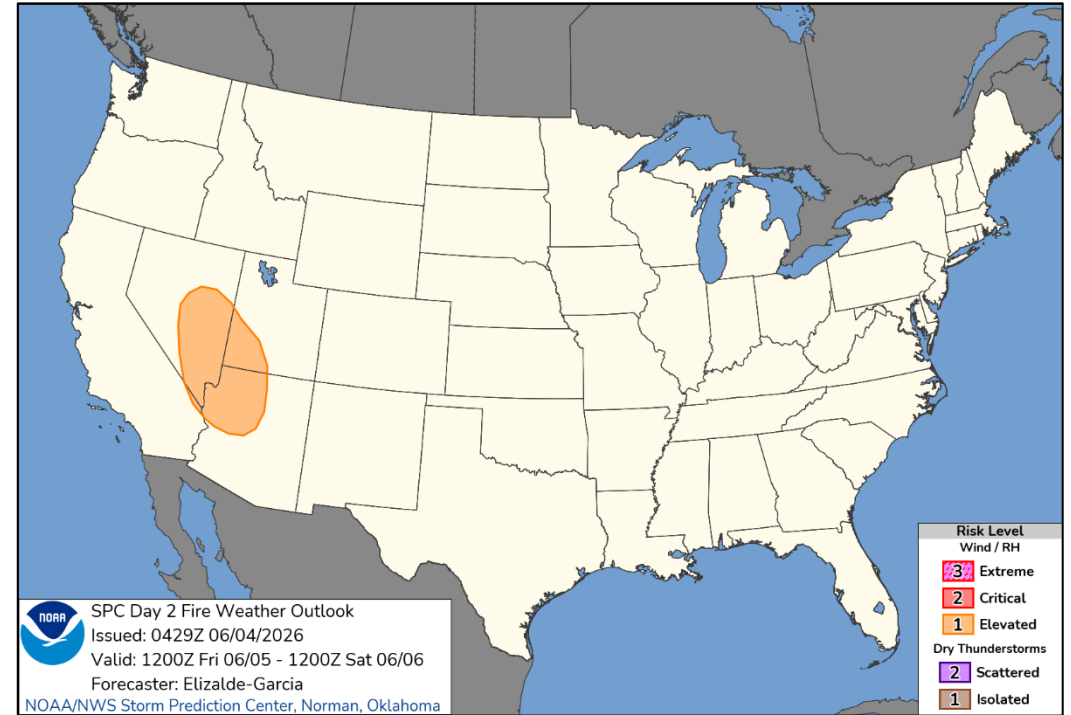


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Fire Weather Outlook

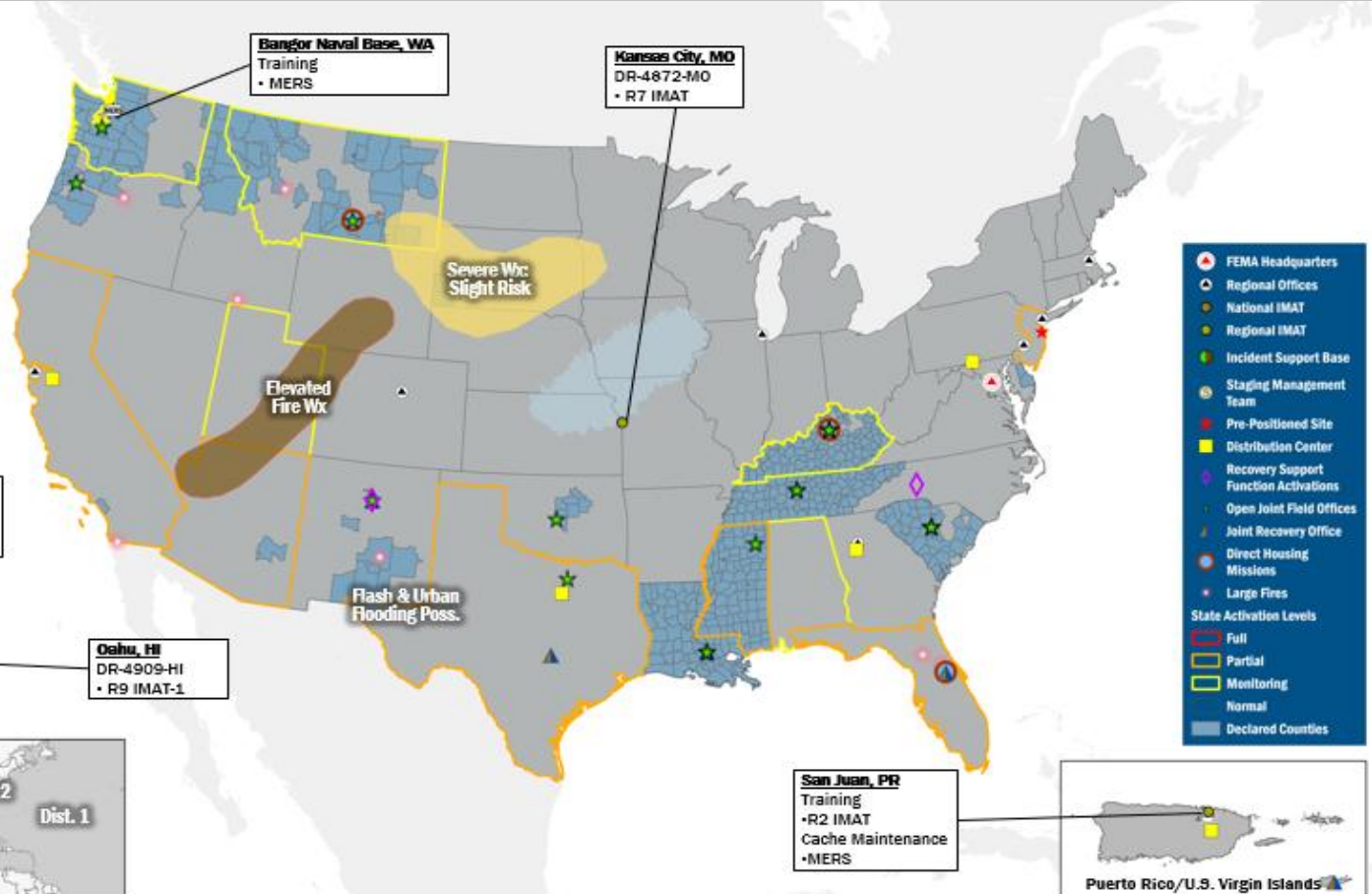
