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# National Current Ops / Monitoring

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## New Significant Incidents / Ongoing Ops

- COVID-19

## Hazard Monitoring

- Excessive rainfall and flash flooding possible – Southern Plains and Lower Mississippi Valley
- Severe weather possible – Northern Plains
- Critical fire weather – NV and UT
- Tropical Activity:
  - Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low 20%
  - Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: Medium 60%; Disturbance 2: Medium 40%

- FMAGs Approved: Mammoth Fire and Telegraph Fire

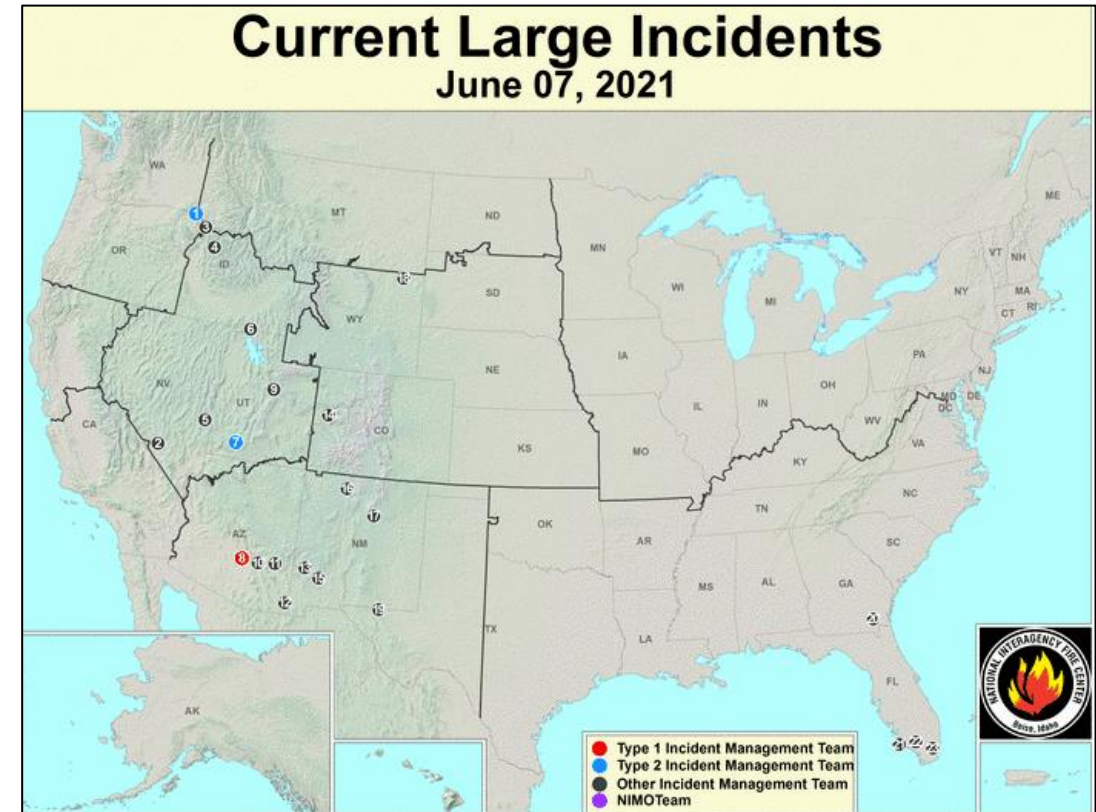


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# National Fire Activity

## National Preparedness Level: 2

Initial Attack Activity:	Light (150 fires)
New large fires:	3
Large fires contained:	4
Uncontained large fires:	13
NIMOs committed:	0
Type 1 IMTs committed:	1
Type 2 IMTs committed:	3



**Preparedness Level 2:** At this stage, several geographic areas are experiencing high to extreme fire danger, though they are able to manage fire activity without requesting many wildland fire suppression resources from other areas. Few of the country's IMTs are assigned to wildland fire incidents.

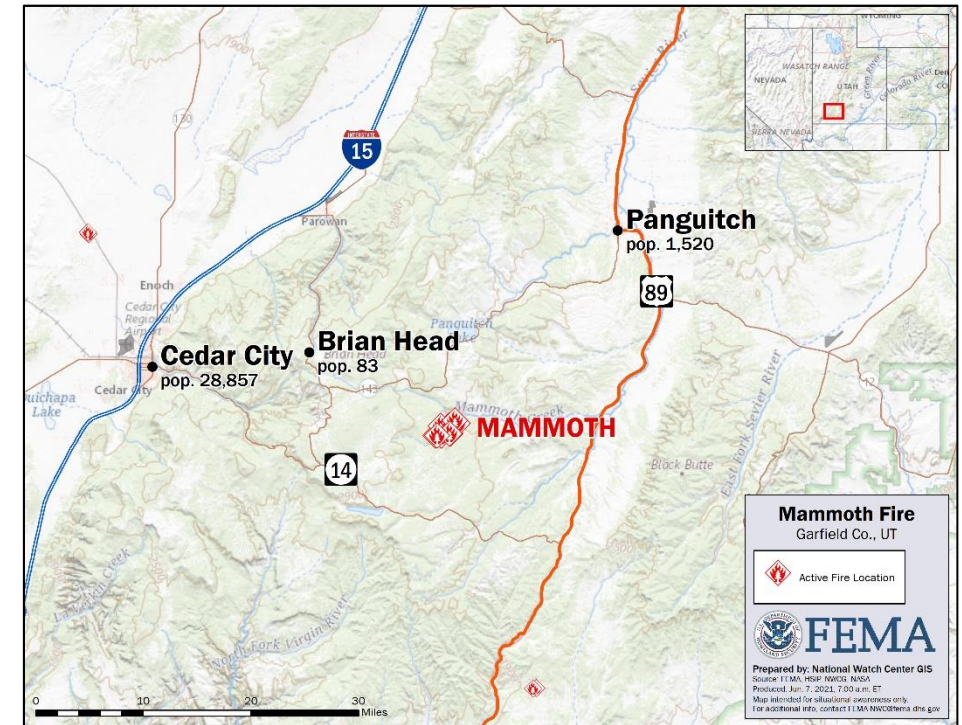

## Situation:

- The fire began on June 5 and is burning on Federal land and currently moving to State, and Private land around Mammoth Creek Village near the city of Panguitch, Utah (pop 1,785)
- No open shelters /CVCs in the area

- Region VIII RRCC at Level III (COVID)
- FMAG was approved on June 5

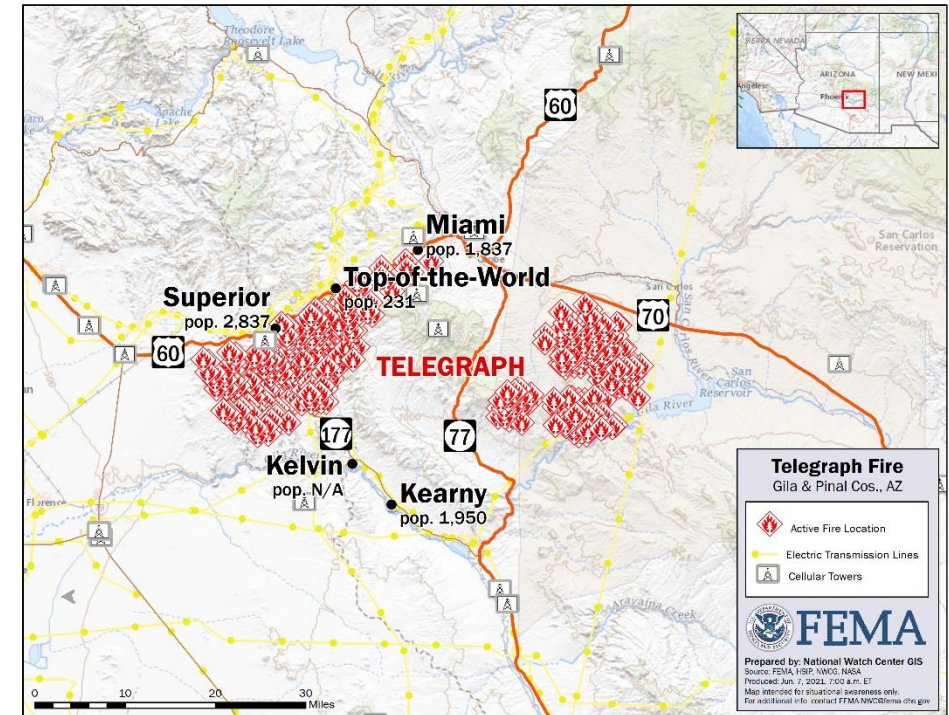

## Situation:

- The fire began June 4 and has burned 41,109 acres of State and Private land
- Threatening homes in and around the communities of Top of the World, Kearny, Superior, Kelvin, Riverside, Miami, and Dripping Springs, AZ (pop. 10k)
  - 5 mines, critical area watershed, power distribution lines, and cell towers
- 200 residents evacuated, 3,500 residents under evacuation warning
- Local shelters are open
- No CVCs in the area

## Response:

- Region IX RRCC is Rostered
- FMAG was approved on June 6



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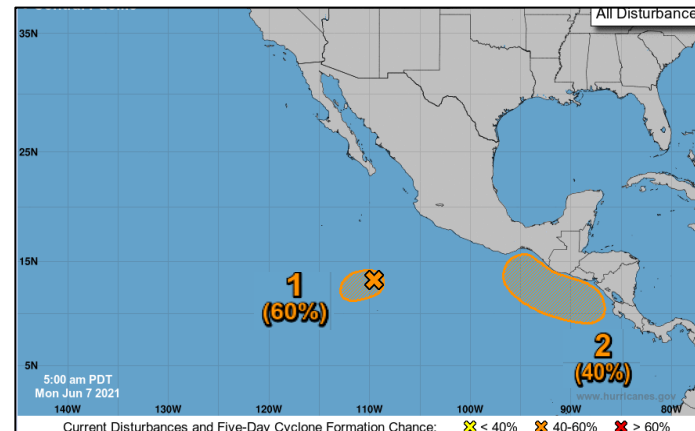

## Eastern Pacific



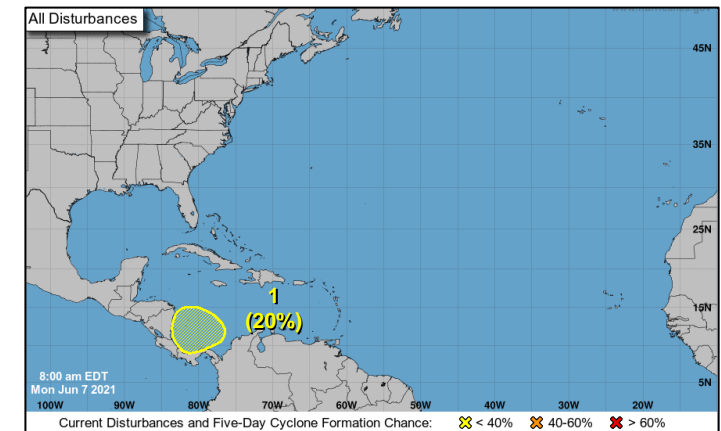
### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 400 miles SSE of Socorro Island
- Moving WSW
- A tropical depression has the potential to form tonight
- 48-hour formation chance: Medium (60%)
- 5-day formation chance: Medium (60%)

### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A couple hundred miles S of the coasts of southern Mexico, El Salvador and Guatemala in a few days
- A tropical depression could form by the end of the week
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day formation chance: Medium (40%)

## Atlantic



### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to develop over the SW Caribbean Sea by Thursday or Friday
- Gradual development possible
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (near 0%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (20%)

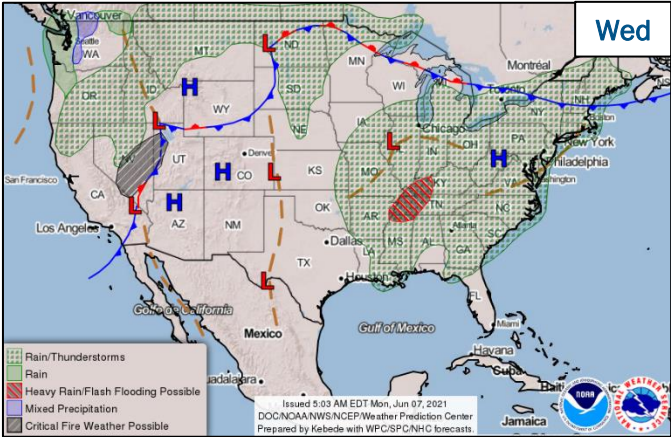
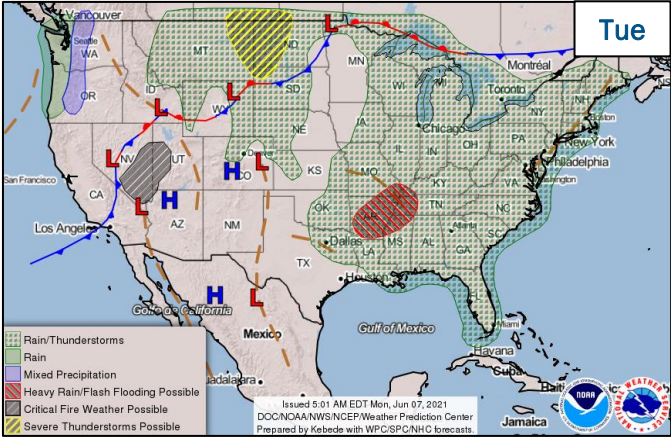
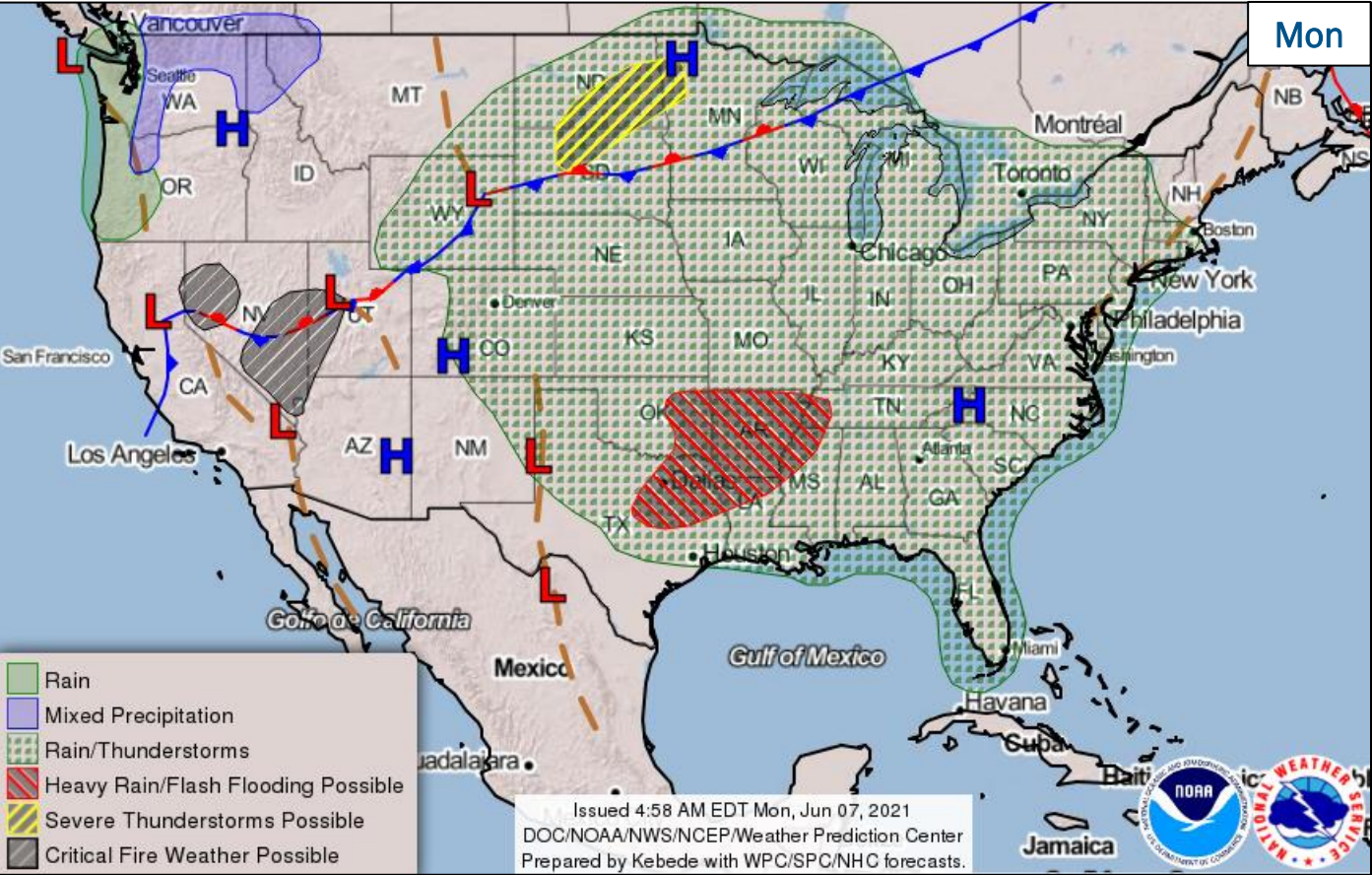


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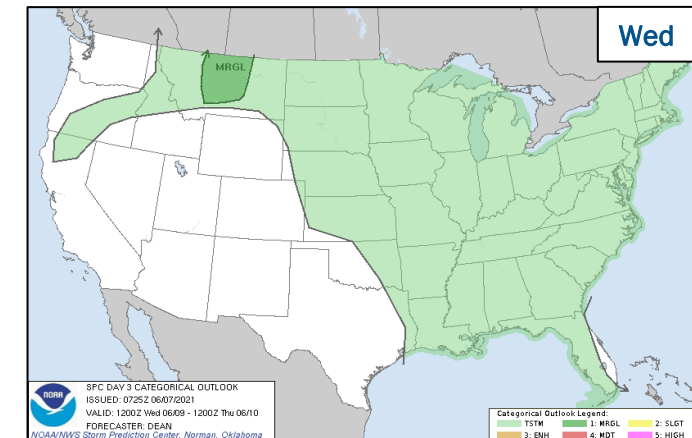
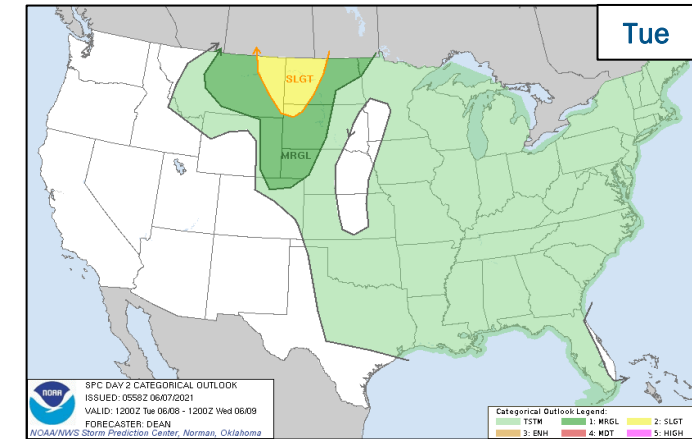
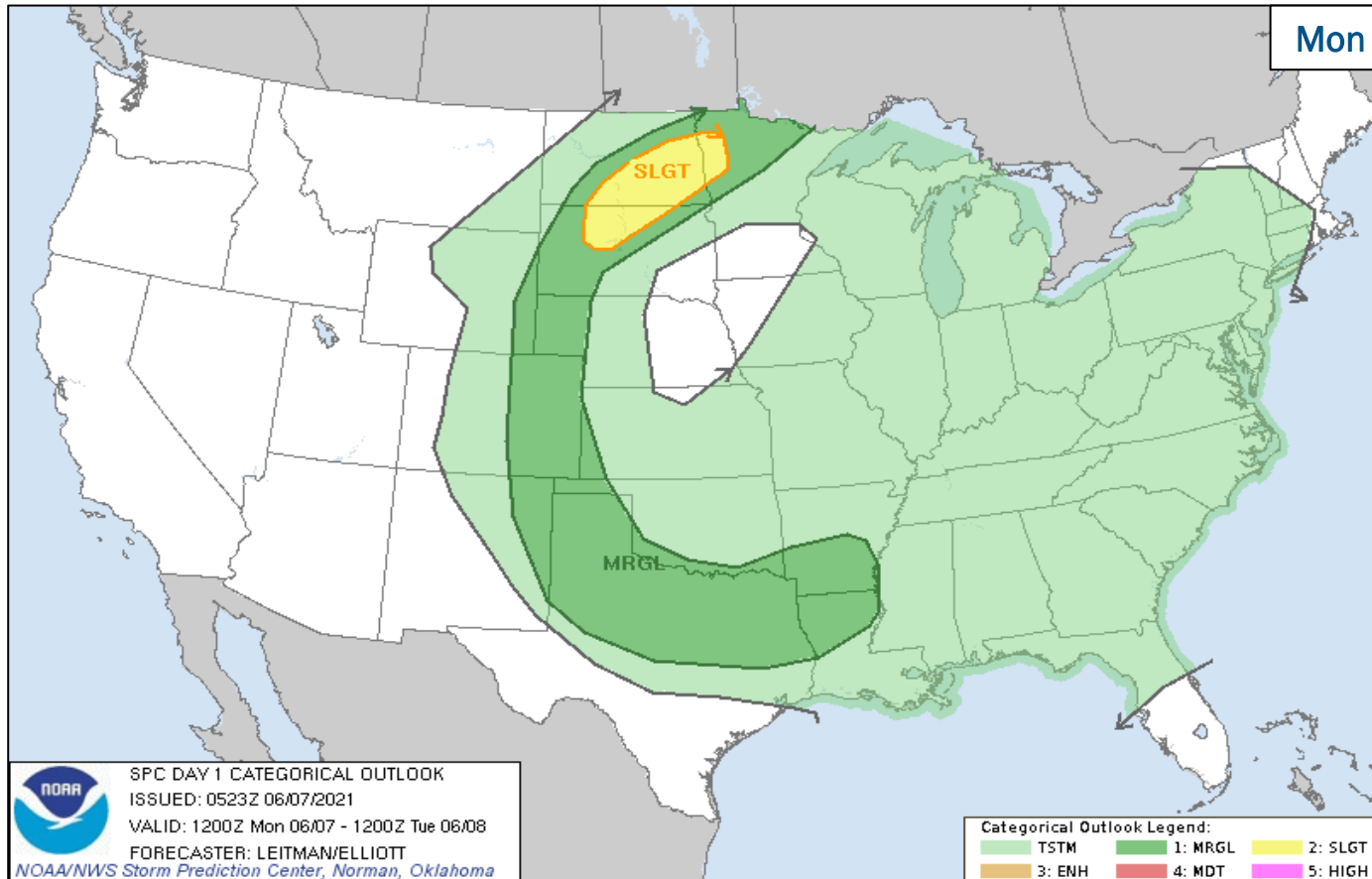

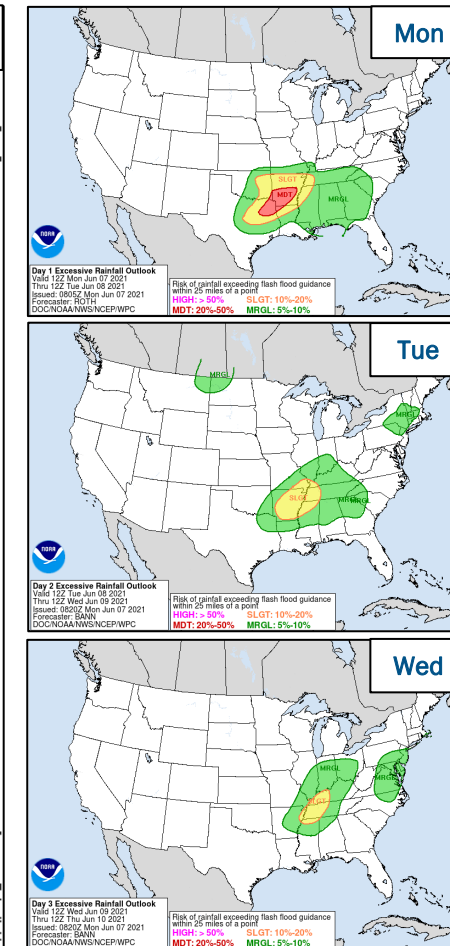
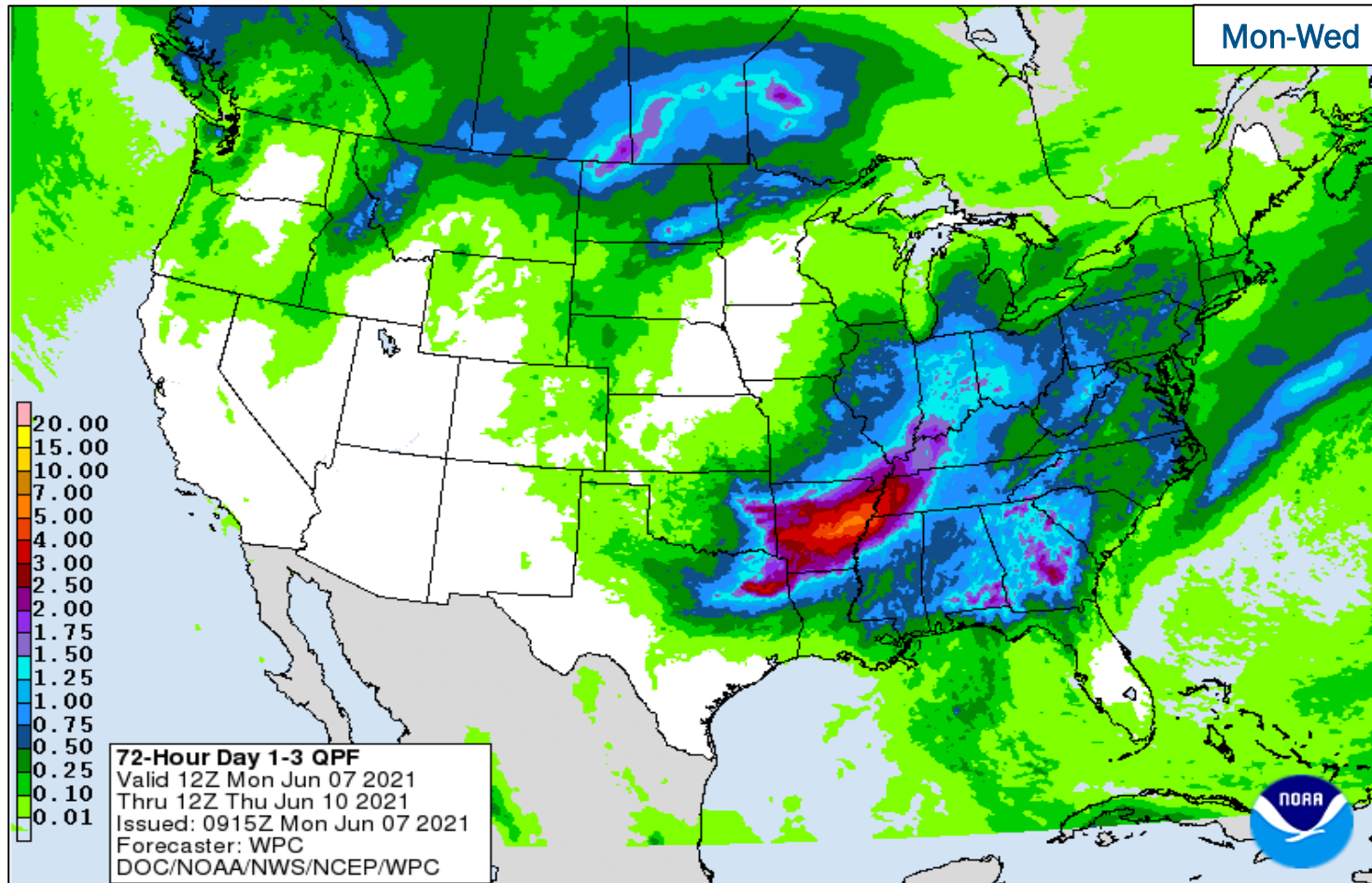


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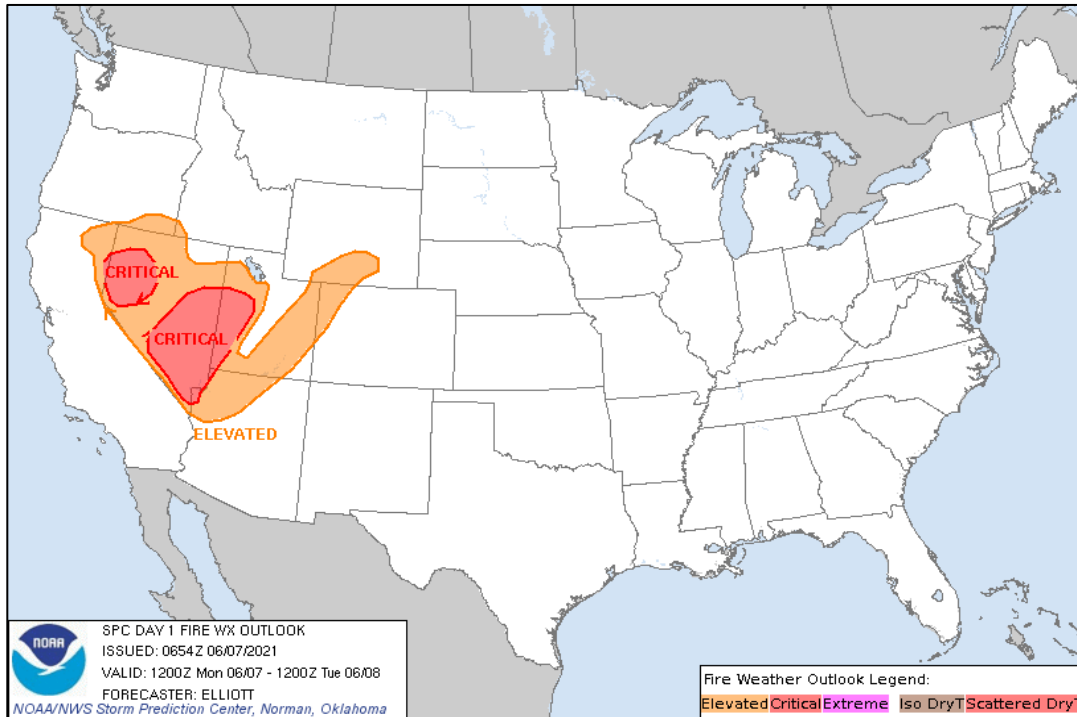
# Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



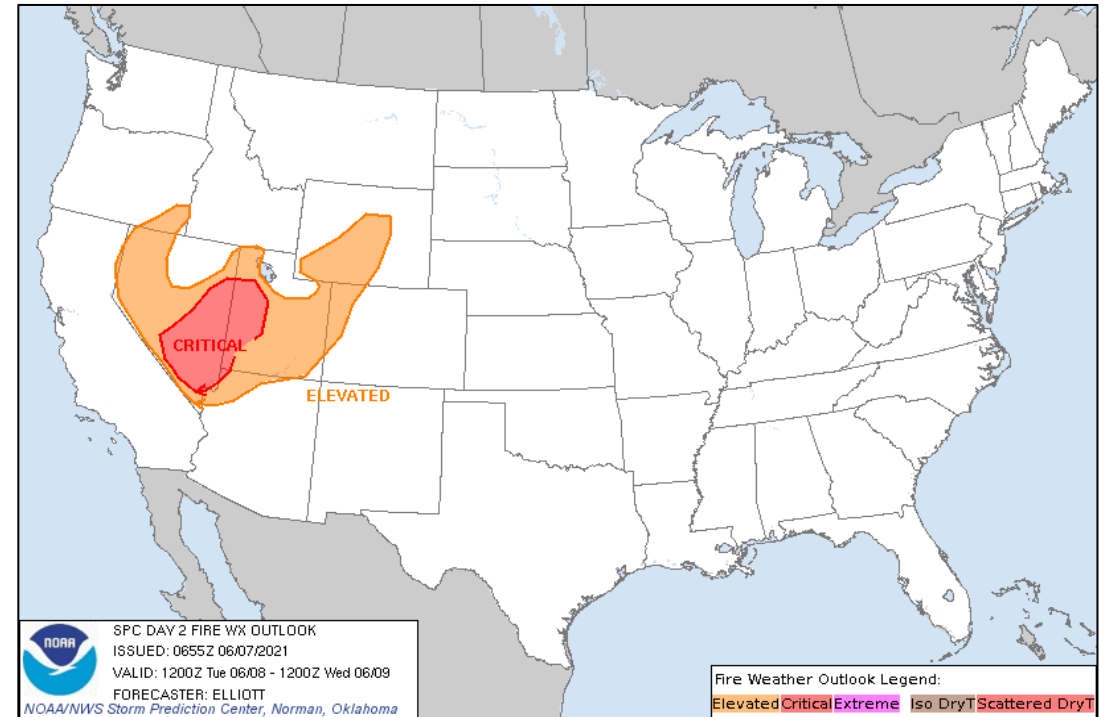

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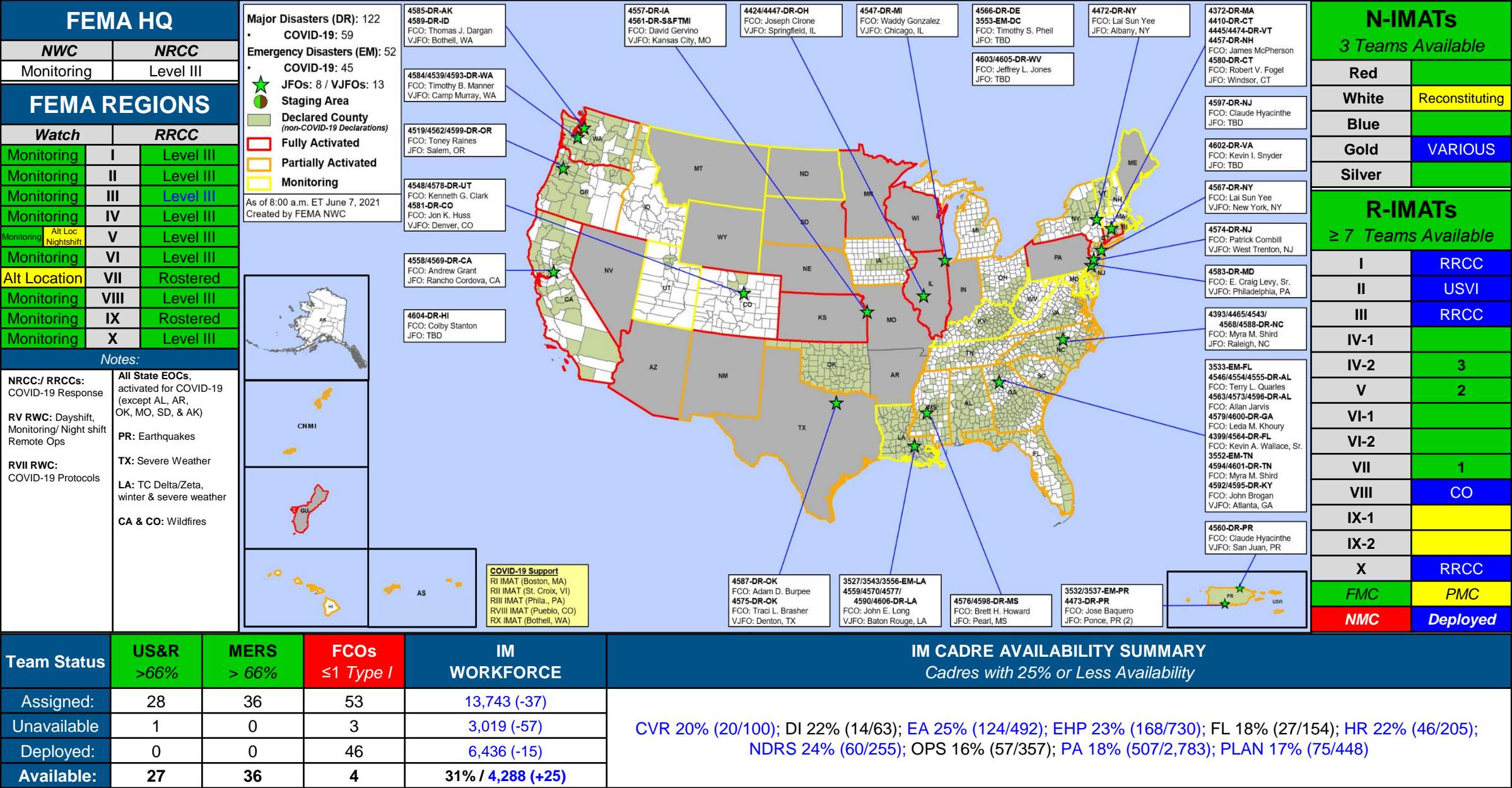
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# U.S. Monthly Drought Outlook
