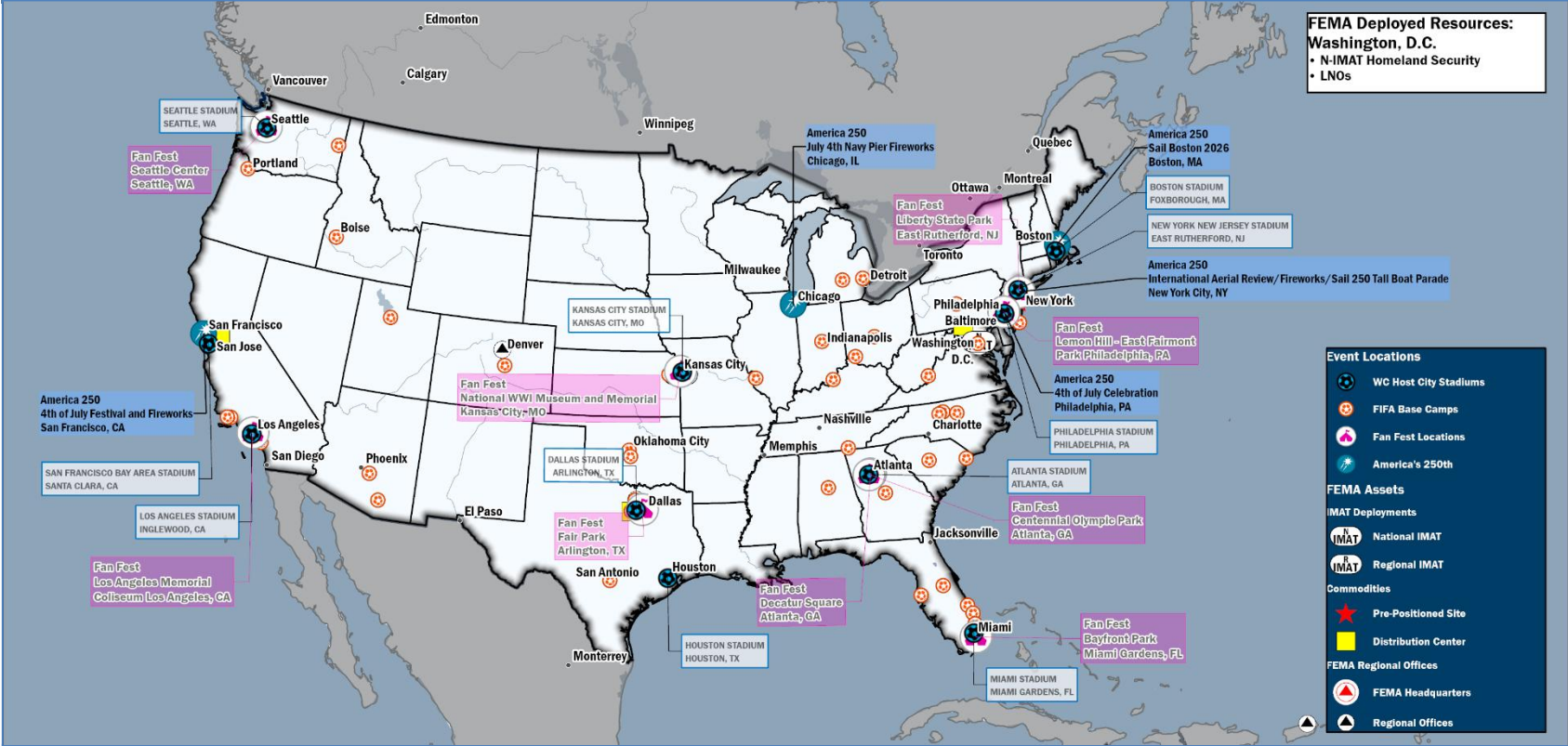

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FIFA 2026 WORLD CUP and AMERICA 250th ACTIVITIES OVERVIEW

June 11 - July 19, 2026



Situation: The FIFA World Cup 2026 will take place across North America from June 11 to July 19, featuring 48 teams competing in 104 matches hosted in three countries.

- 11 U.S. host cities
- 40 U.S. Team Base Camps
- 2 Canadian host cities
- 3 Mexican host cities

The first of 78 matches in the U.S. held across 11 host cities will kick off on Jun 12 in Inglewood, CA. Events throughout the U.S. have been designated as SEAR events by DHS.

The World Cup coincides with other NSSEs and SEAR-designated events celebrating America's 250th.

FEMA is the lead federal consequence management agency.

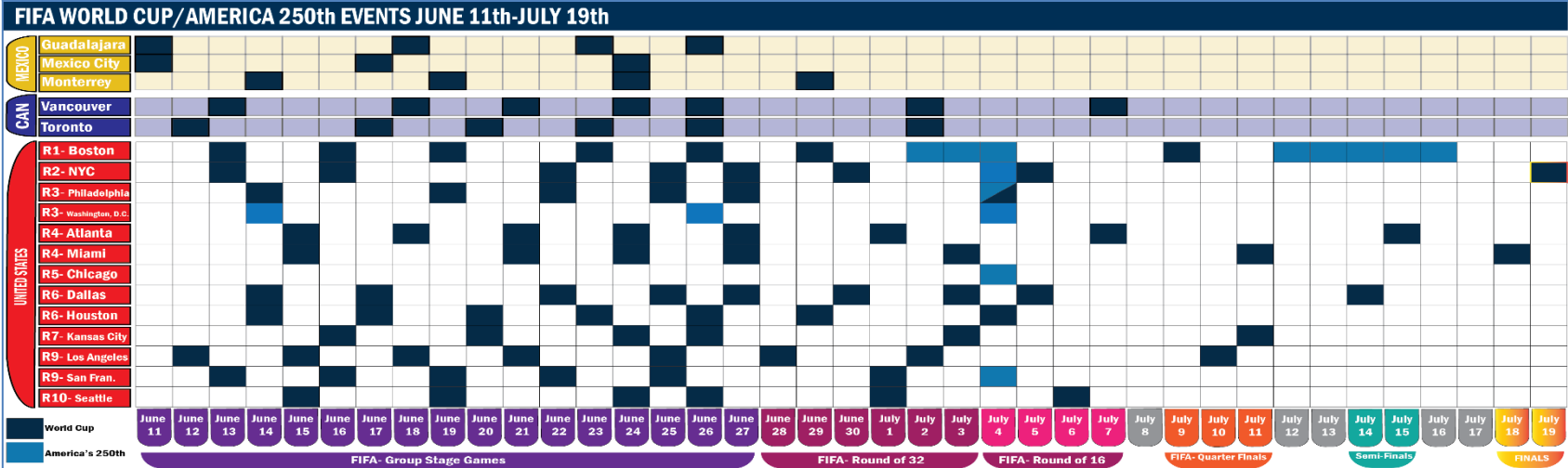
Regional / State Response

- State EOCs throughout the nation are adjusting their posture
- All FEMA Regions are currently at normal operations; however, activation levels are expected to change throughout the event period

FEMA HQ Response / Preparations:

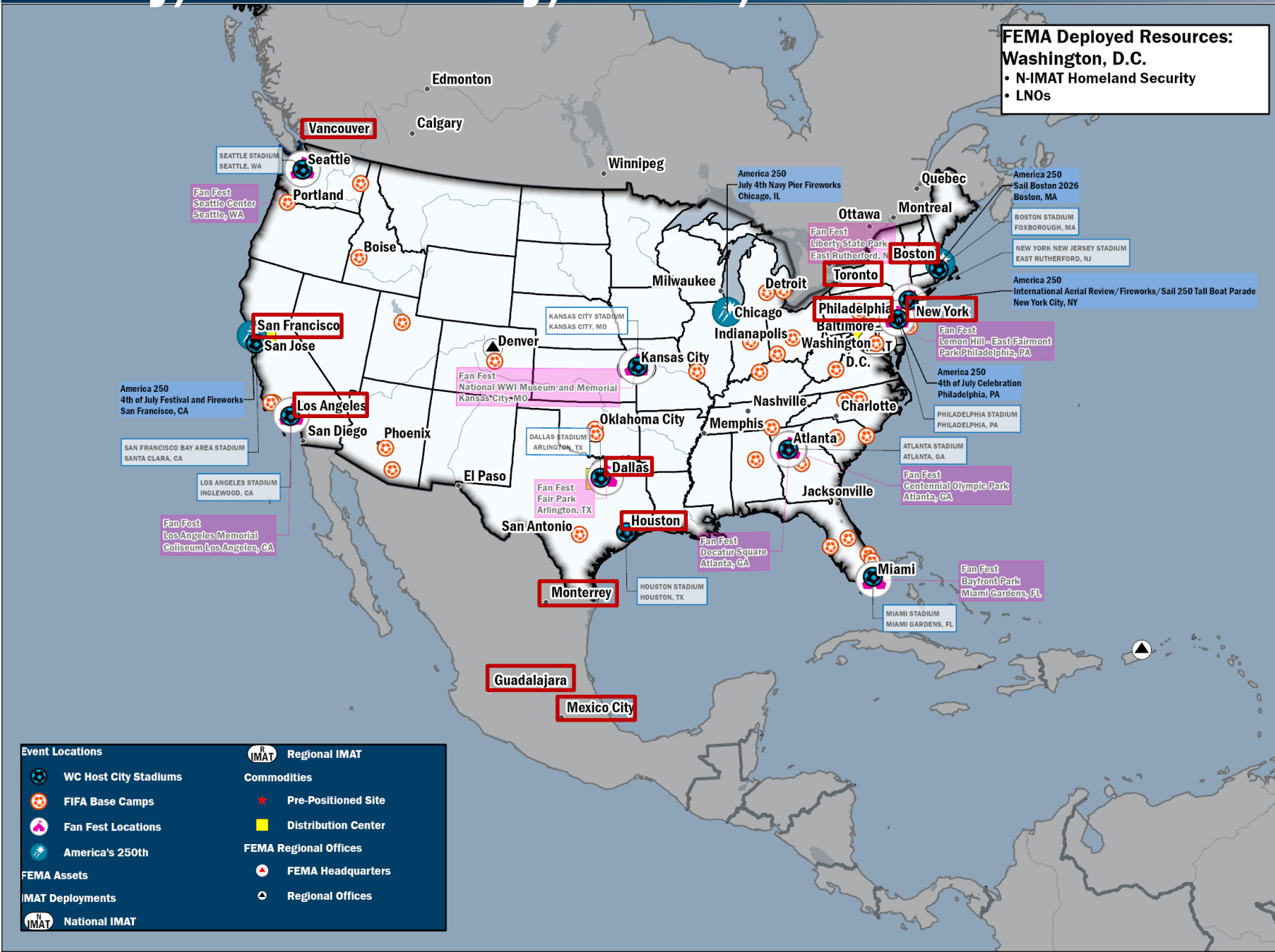
- FEMA NWC at Enhanced Watch, 24/7, augmented by ONCP, NRCC SA, and CBRN Support, with multiple on-call HQ program offices
- N-IMAT HS and FEMA LNOs are deployed to DHS SECC, 24/7
- NRCS, CMCU, and DEST on alert
- DEC is supporting comms/mobile CP requirements, as necessary
- DHS LNOs deployed 24/7 to SECC and National Enhanced Watch

FEMA NWC will maintain communication with all FEMA Regions and SECC, with ongoing updates provided in the FEMA Daily Operations Briefing and the twice-daily FEMA National Situation Report.

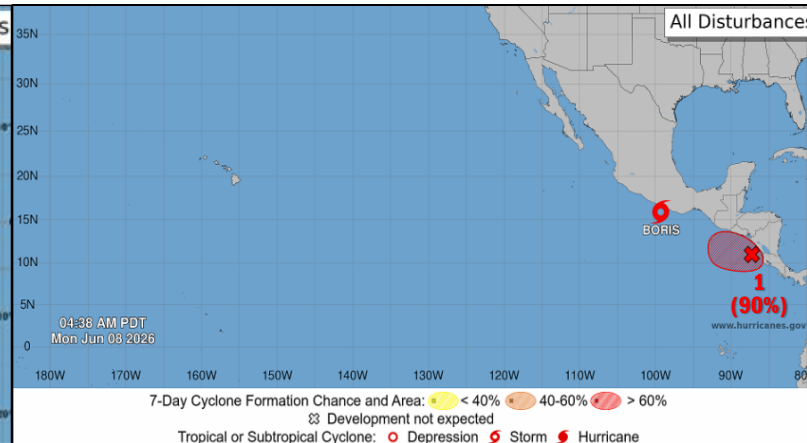
Tropical Outlook

- Offshore - Central America
- Conditions are conducive for further development of this system, and a tropical depression is likely to form during the next day or two while the system moves N towards the coast of Central America
- Formation Chance – 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)

- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days

Situation: (Advisory #4A, as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

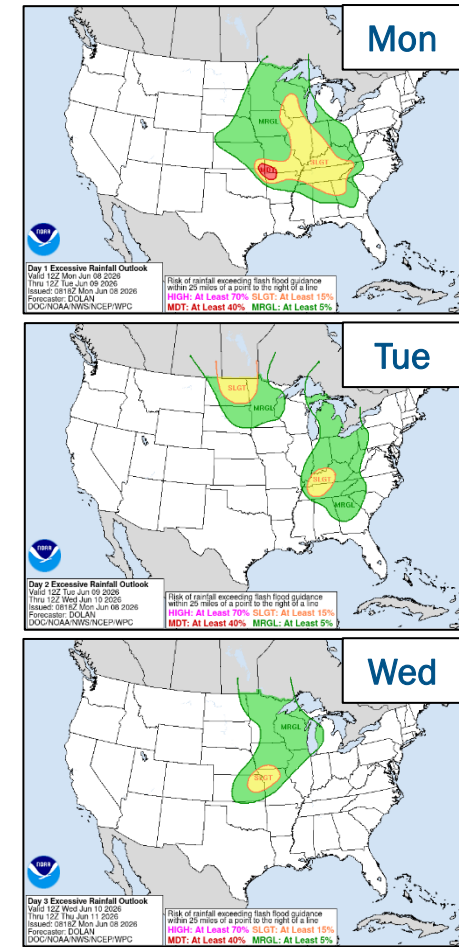
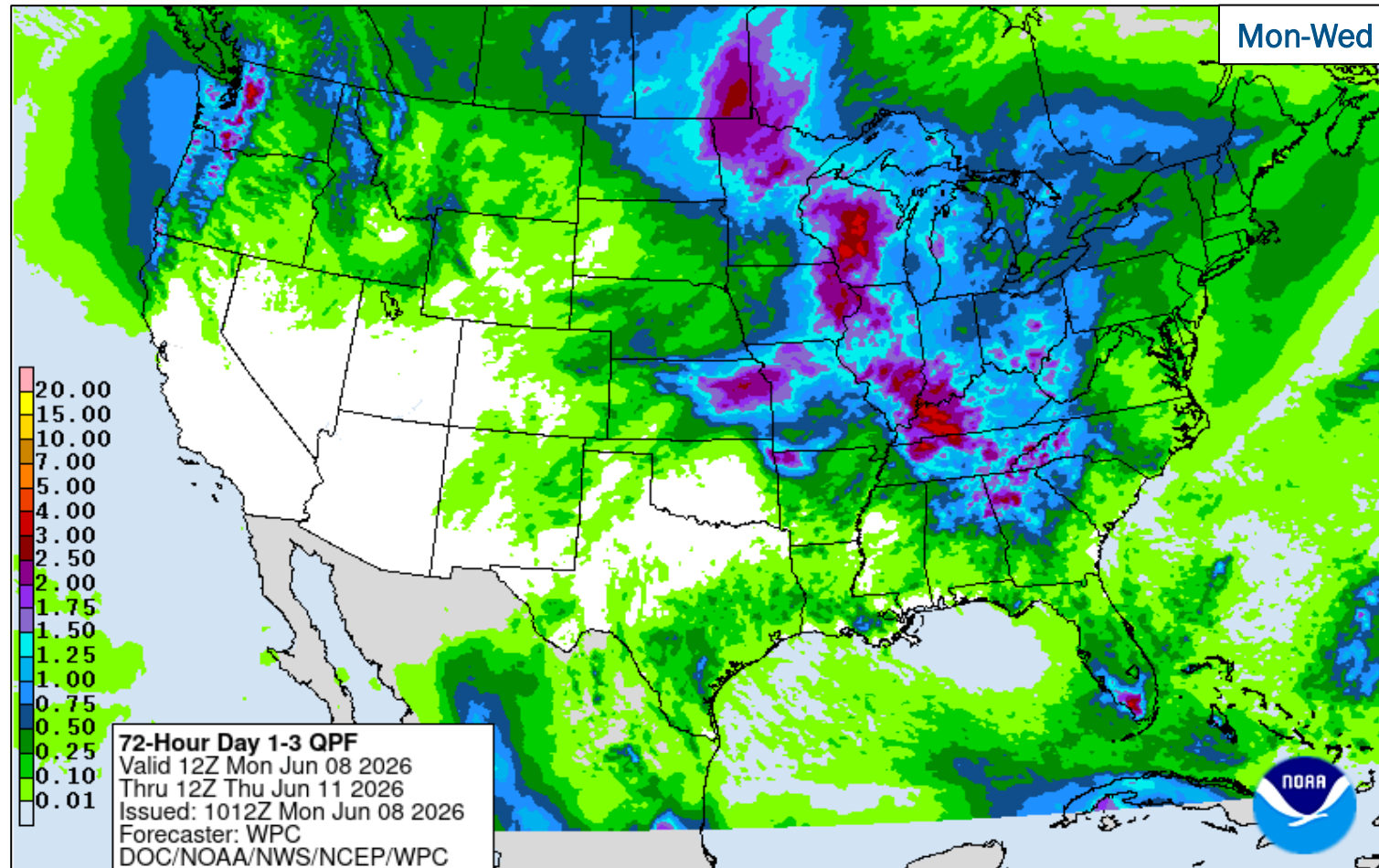
- Located 85 miles SE of Acapulco, Mexico

- System is forecast to dissipate inland by Tuesday



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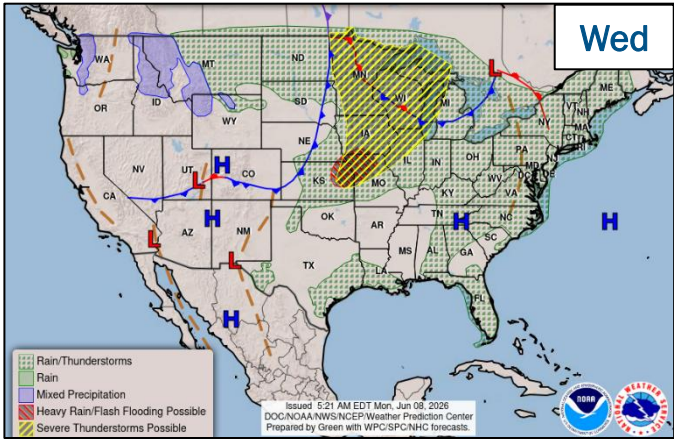
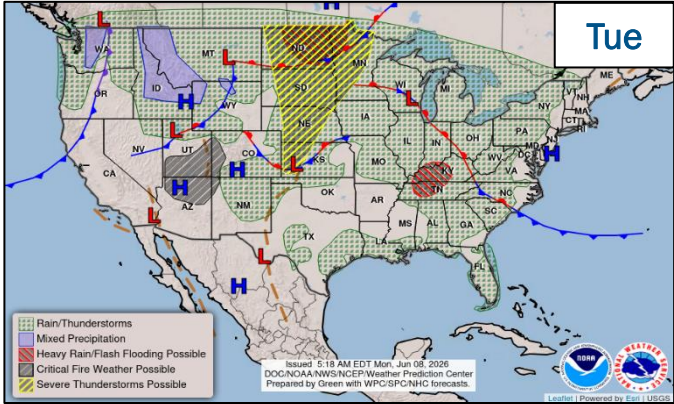
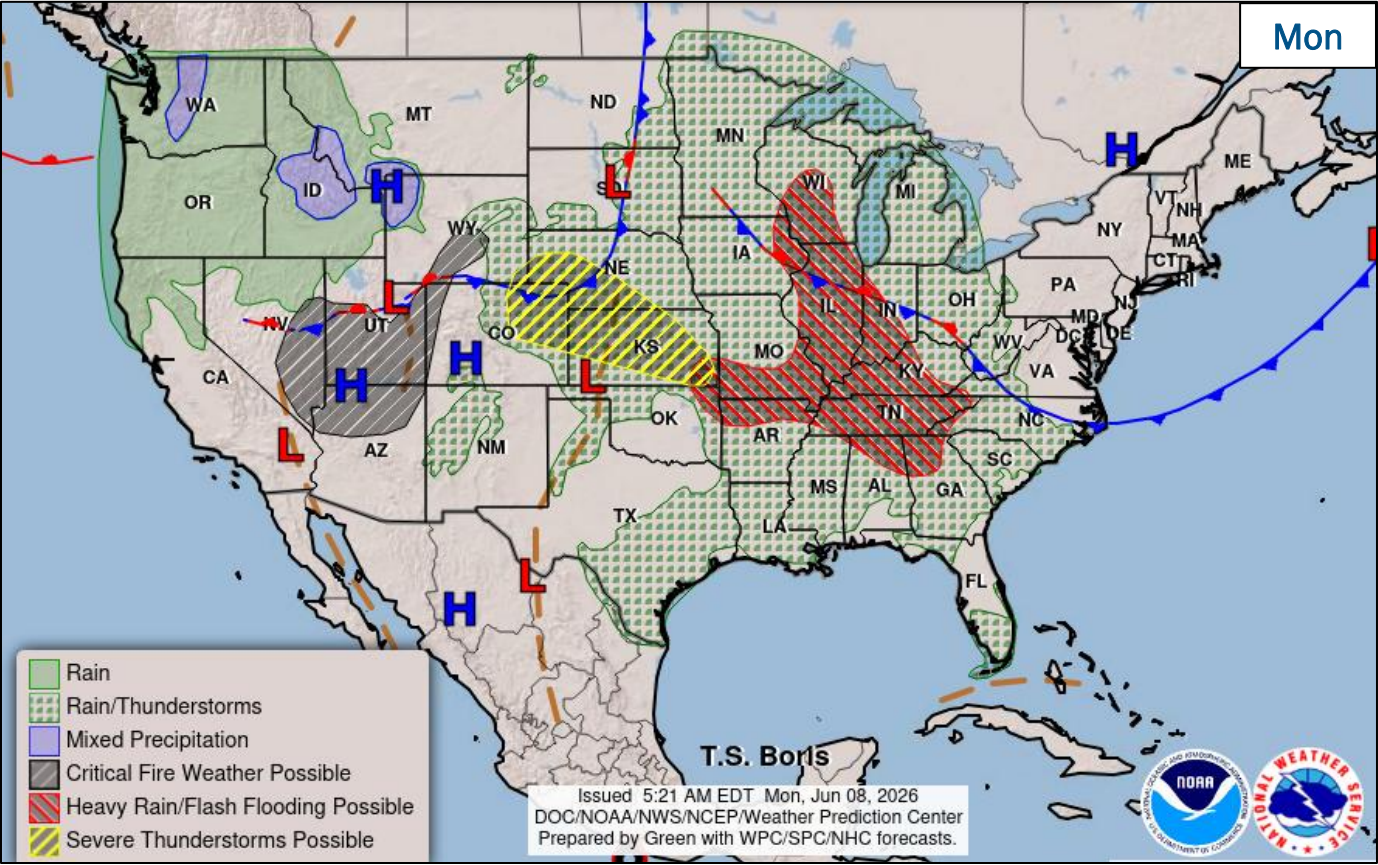
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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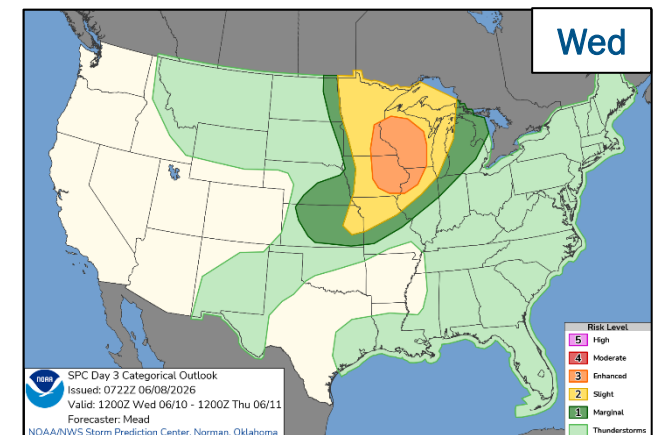
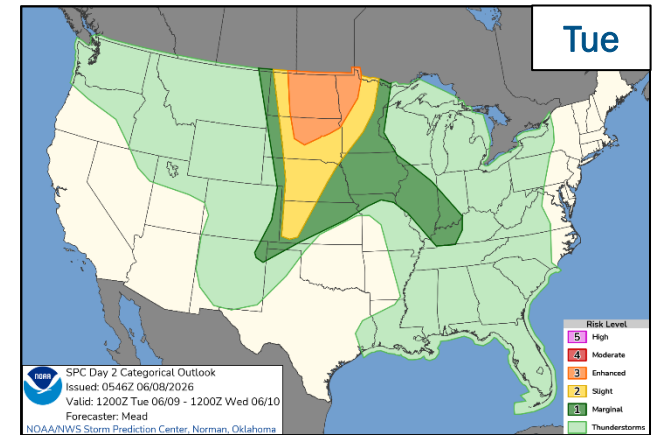
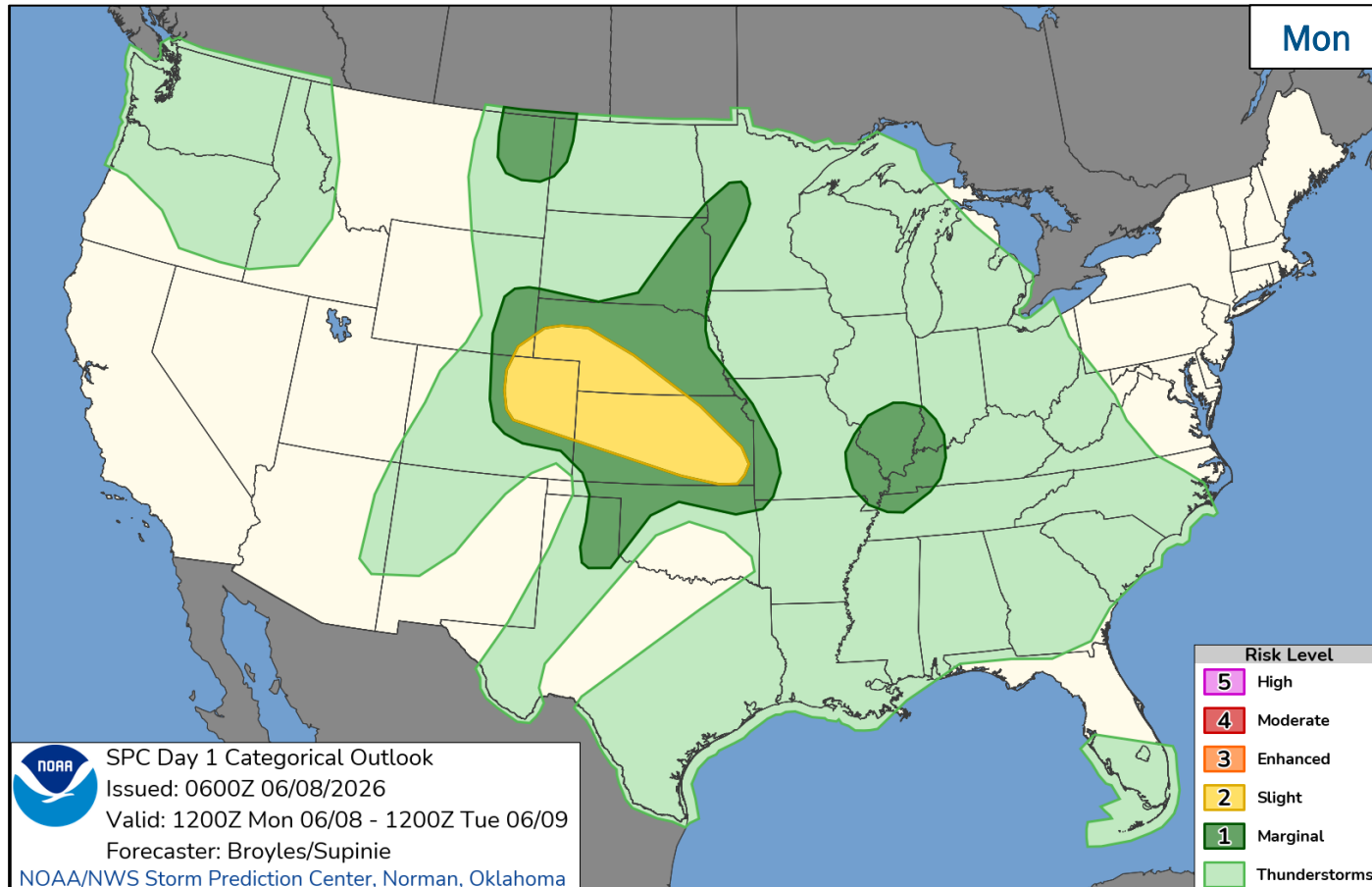

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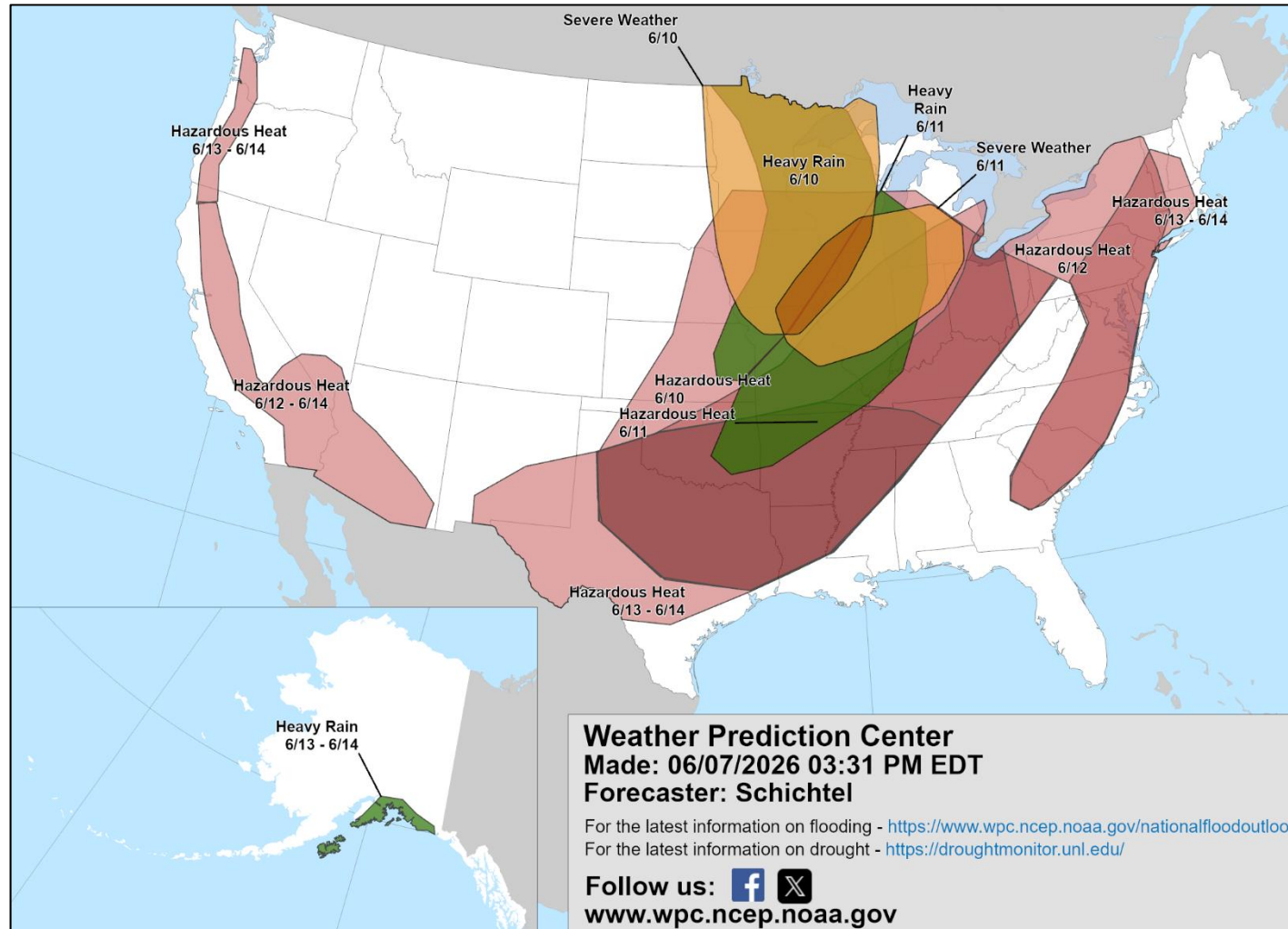
Severe Weather Outlook

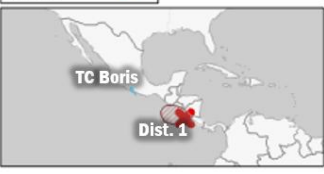
