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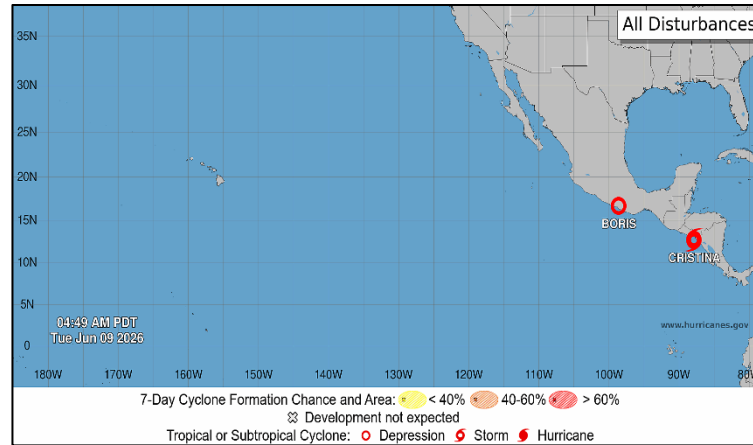

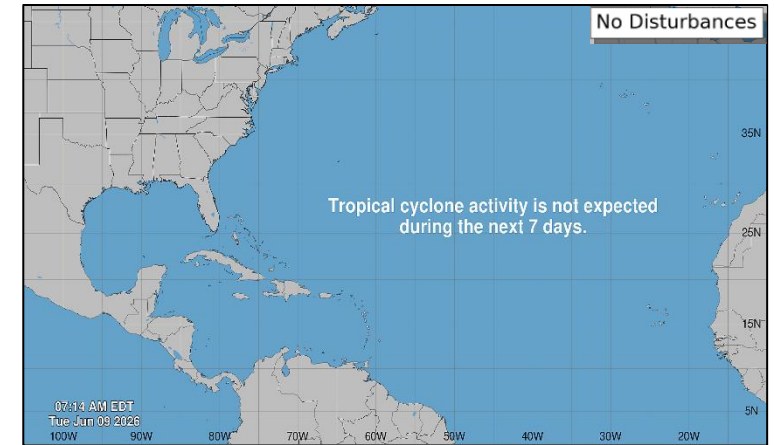

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Tropical Depression Boris – Eastern Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #9A, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located **95 miles E** of Acapulco, Mexico
- Moving **NNW** at **6 mph**
- Maximum sustained winds **35 mph**
- Additional weakening is expected, and Boris is forecast to dissipate later today

Situation: *(Advisory #5A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)*

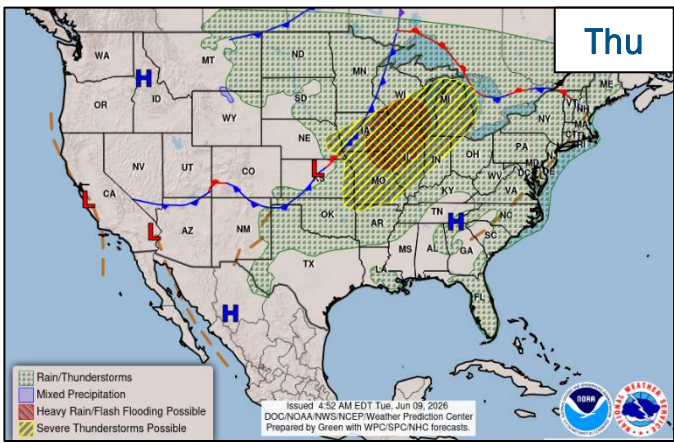
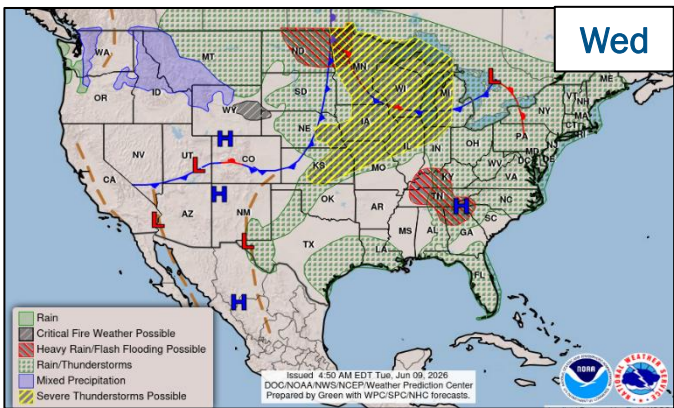
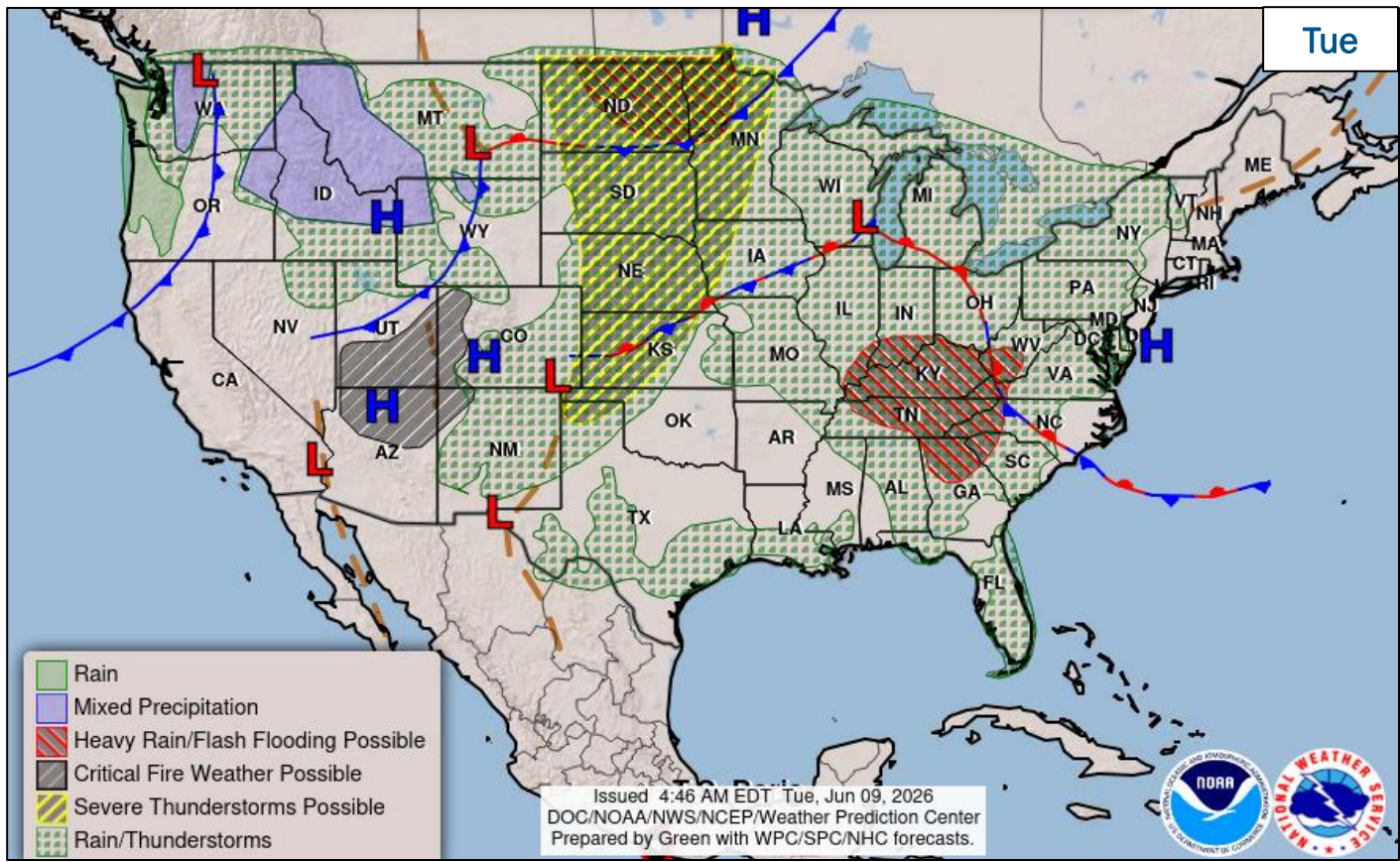
- Located **110 miles WNW** of Managua, Nicaragua
- Moving **NW** at 3 mph
- Maximum sustained winds **40 mph**
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 80 miles mainly to the south of the center
- Little change in strength is forecast today, followed by some weakening through midweek



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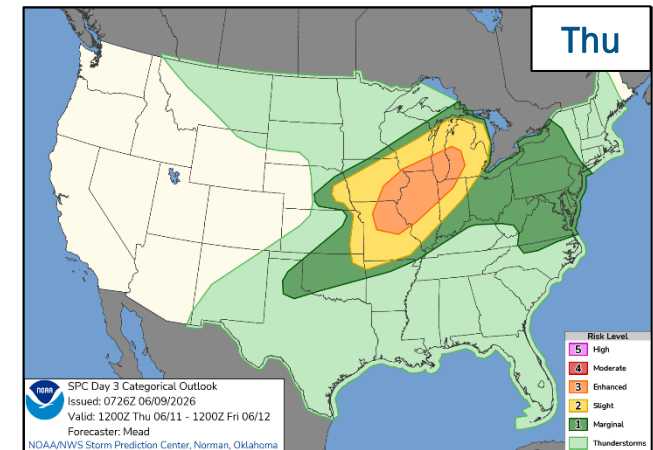
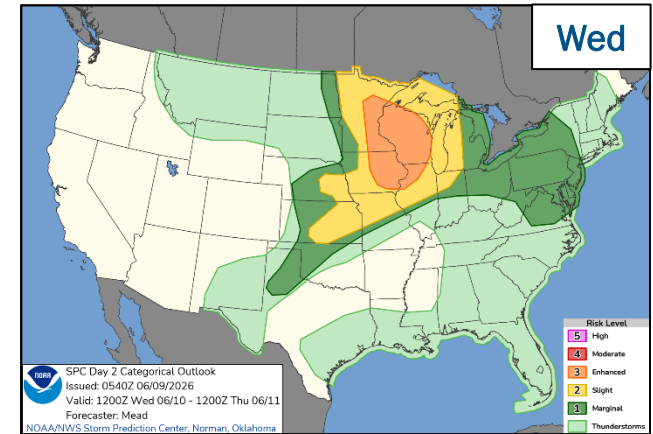
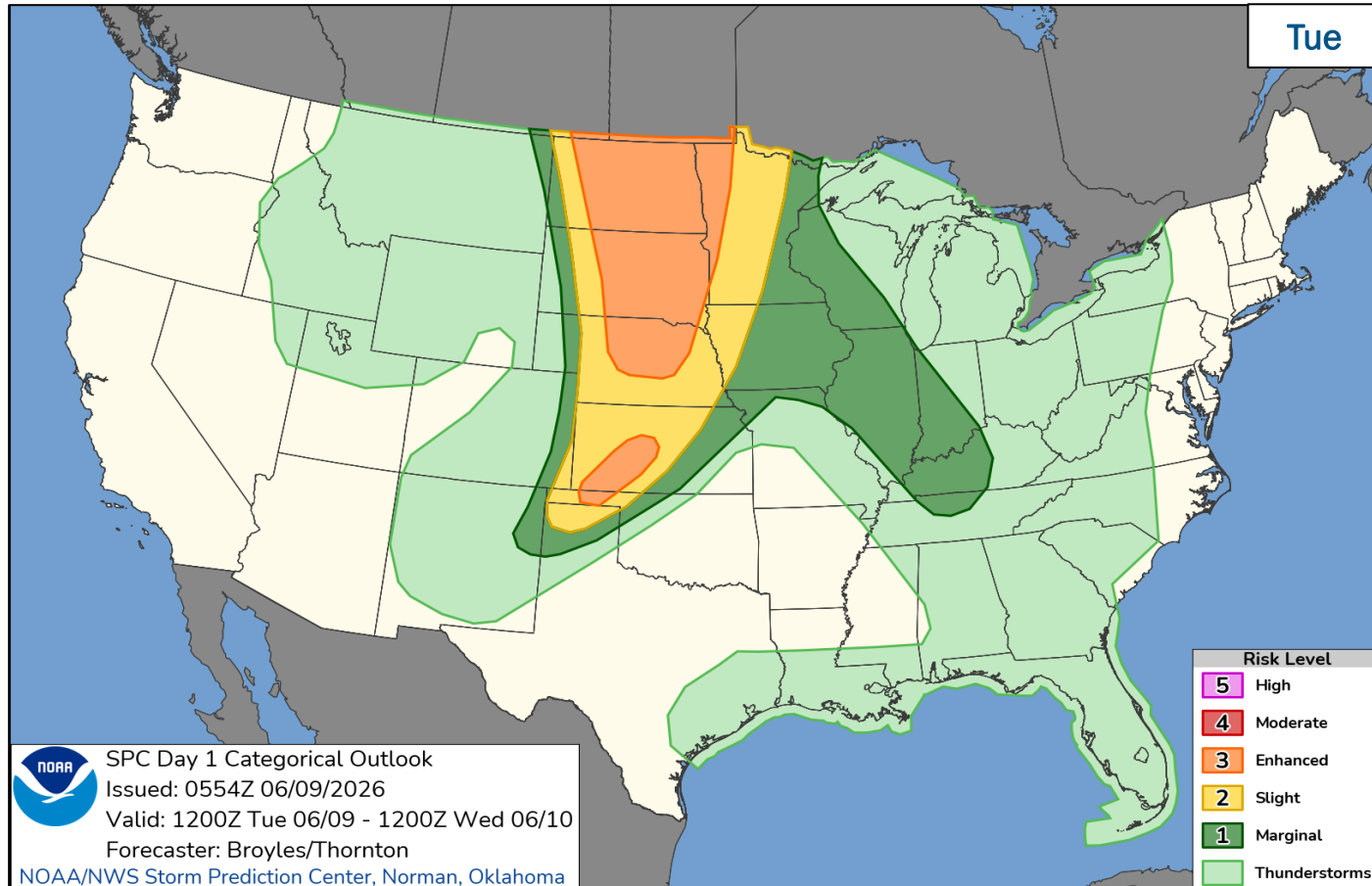
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National Weather Forecast



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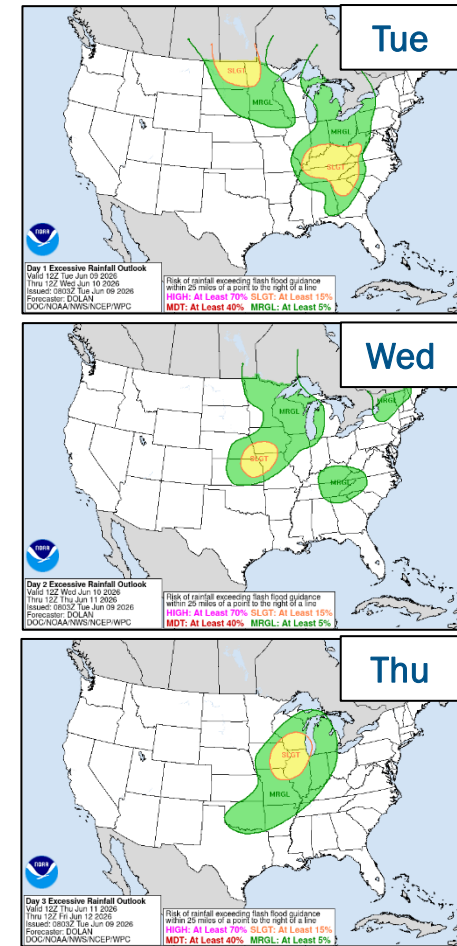
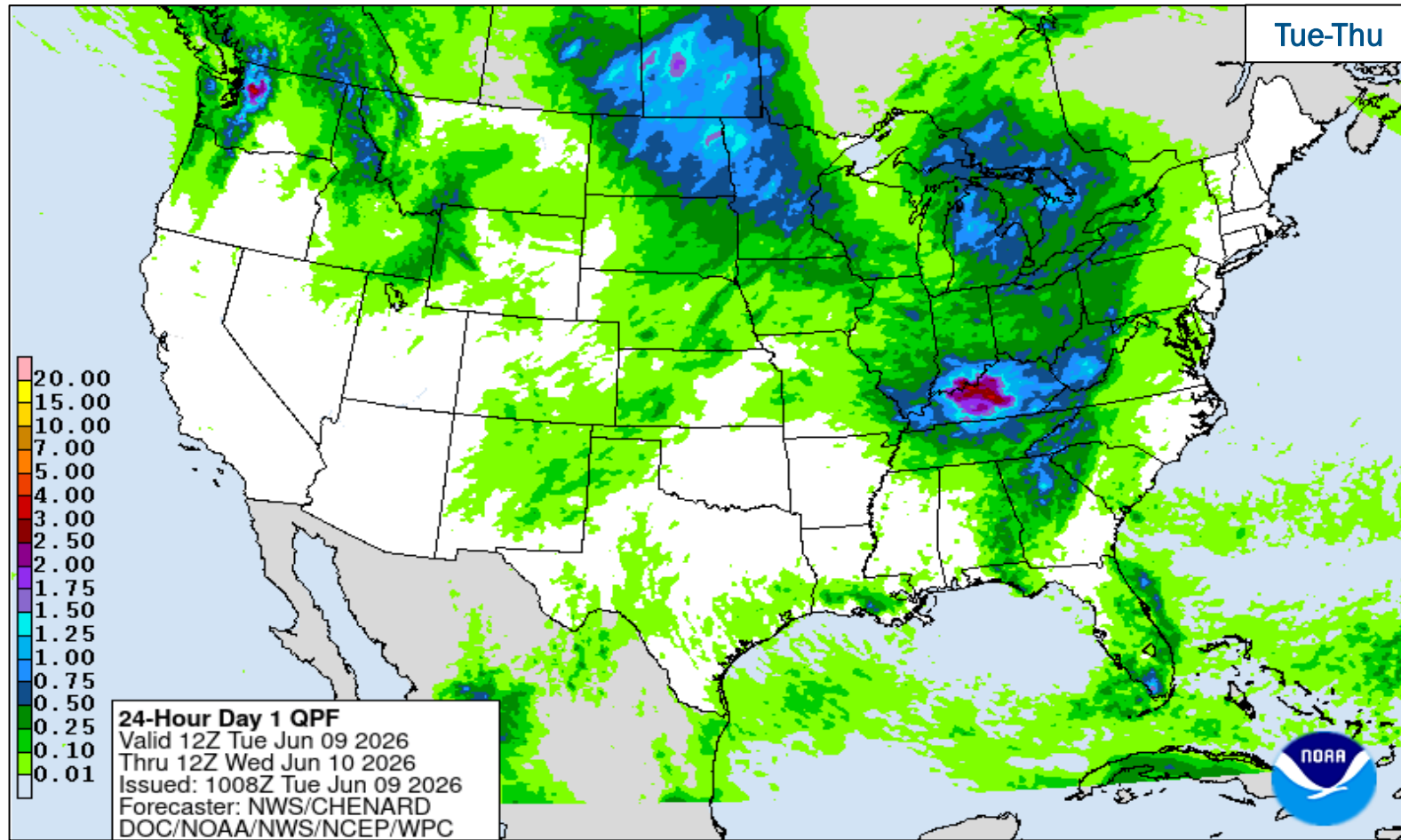
Severe Weather Outlook



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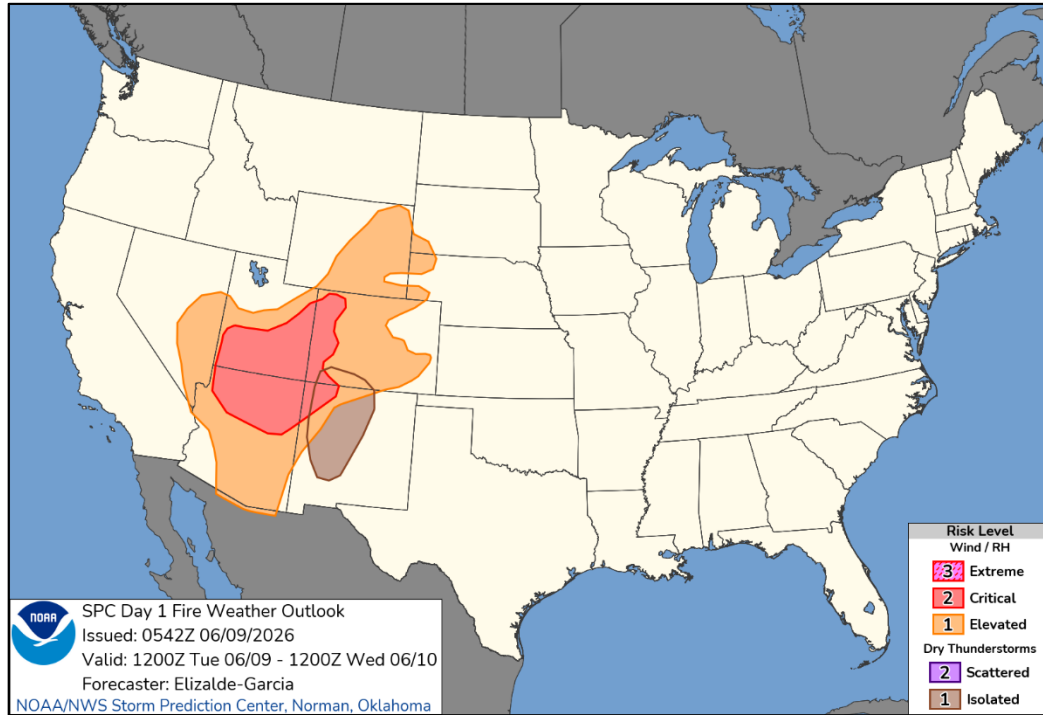
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



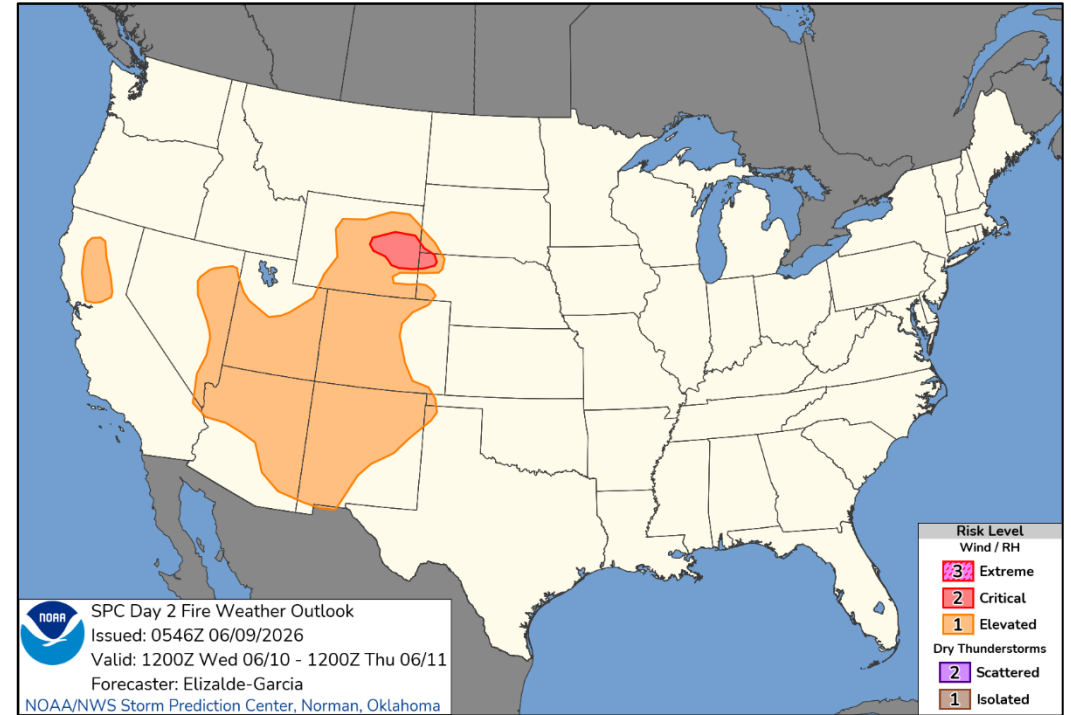

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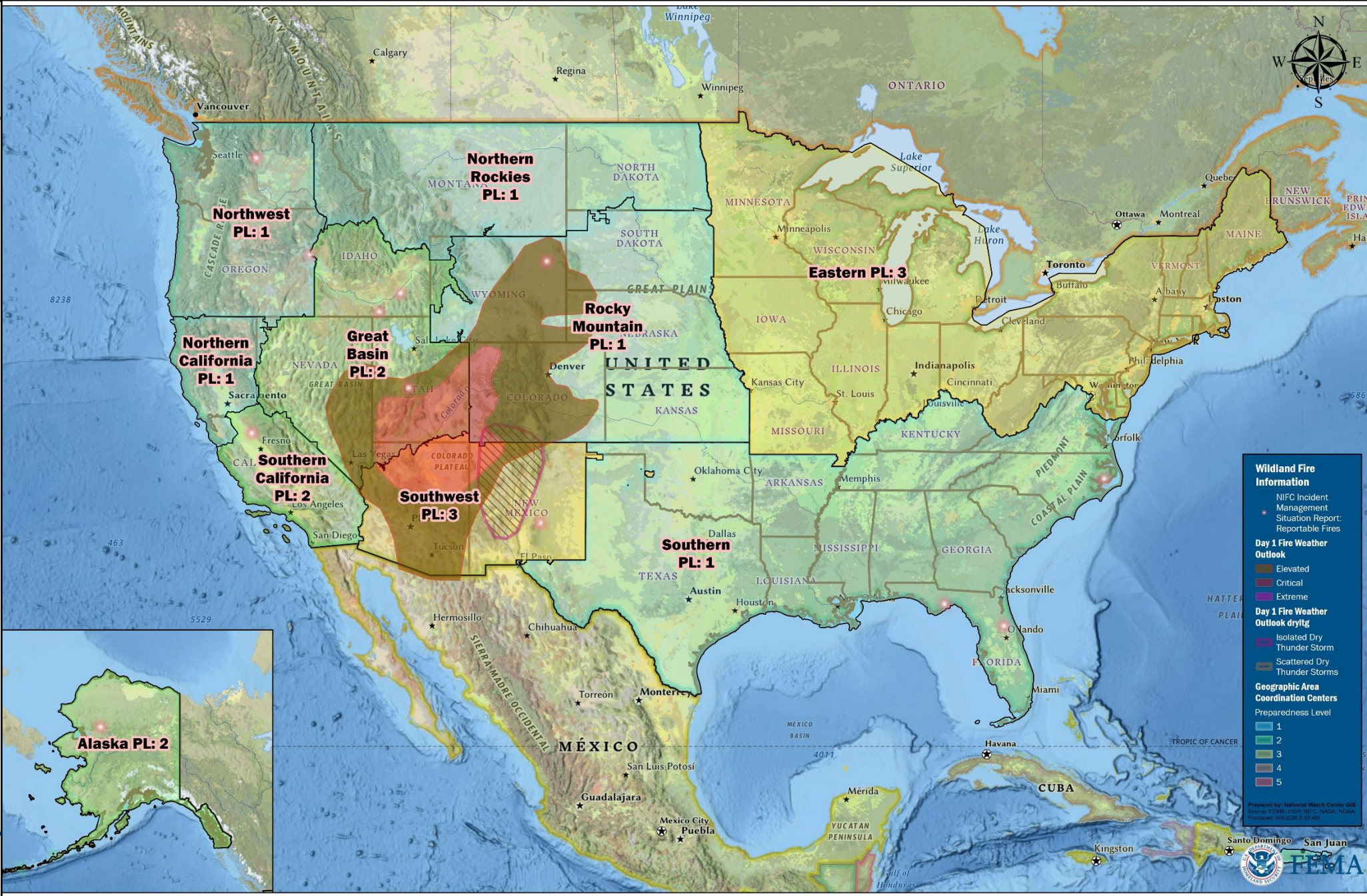

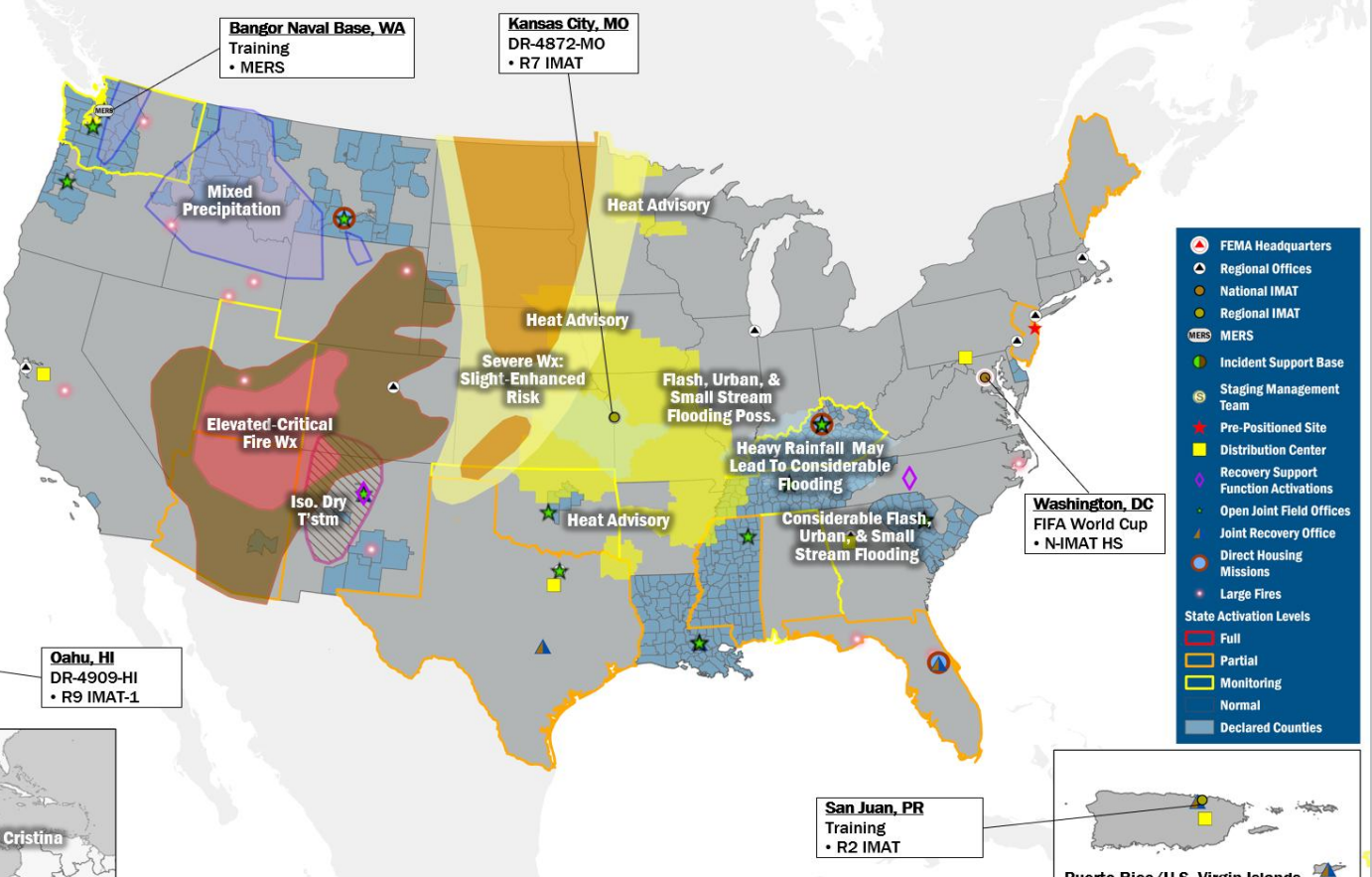
