COVID-19 Update



Situation: FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 37,056 FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,655 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 20,814,269 cumulative as of June 9.

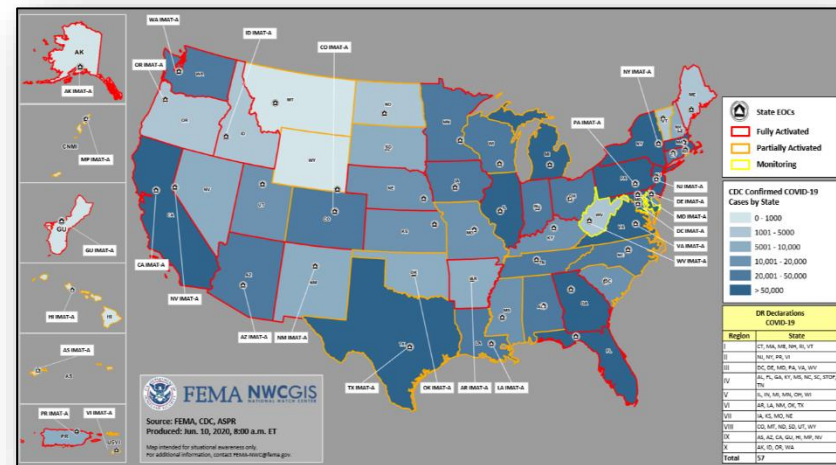

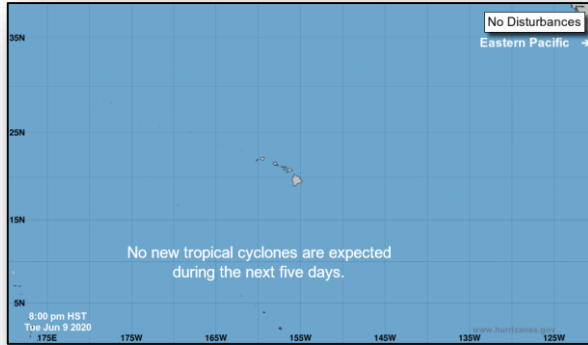

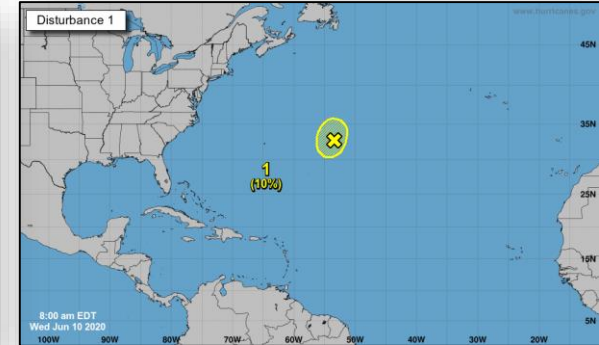

- Development appears unlikely due to unfavorable environmental conditions
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)

Post-Tropical Cyclone Cristobal - FINAL



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Situation:

Cristobal has become extratropical and is expected to bring more heavy rains and severe weather across the Middle and Upper Mississippi Valleys, lower Ohio Valley and into the upper Great Lakes through this morning. Cristobal is forecast to intensify as a post-tropical storm and winds are forecast to reach gale force over the waters of the Great Lakes early today. Flash Flood Watches are in effect for parts of the Midwest and western Great Lakes; Wind Advisories in effect for Chicagoland and areas adjacent to Lakes Michigan and Superior; Gale Warnings in effect for Lake Michigan, eastern Lake Superior and portions of Lake Huron.

NOAA/USGS Forecast River Gauge Levels



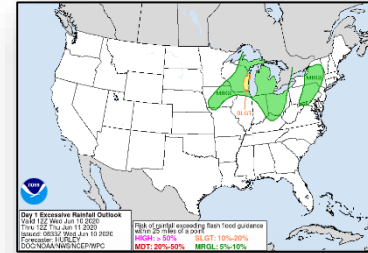
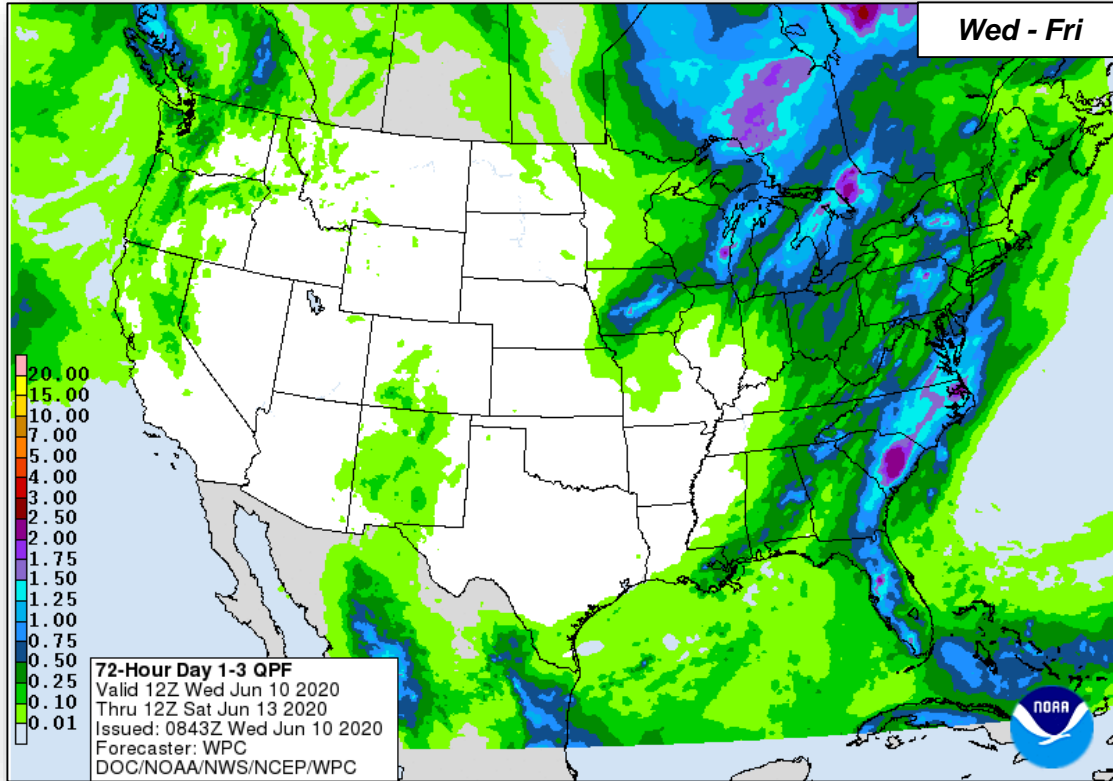
