



- 48-hour formation chance: Low (10%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (10%)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Over the Bay of Campeche
- Slow development possible over the next several days
- Tropical depression could form late in the week
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (10%)
- 5-day formation chance: Medium (50%)




Current Disturbances and Five-Day Cyclone Formation Chance:

Eastern Pacific – Tropical Storm Carlos




- 1,265 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California

- Tropical-storm-force wind extend out up to 25 miles













Severe Weather Outlook







Precipitation Forecast








6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




