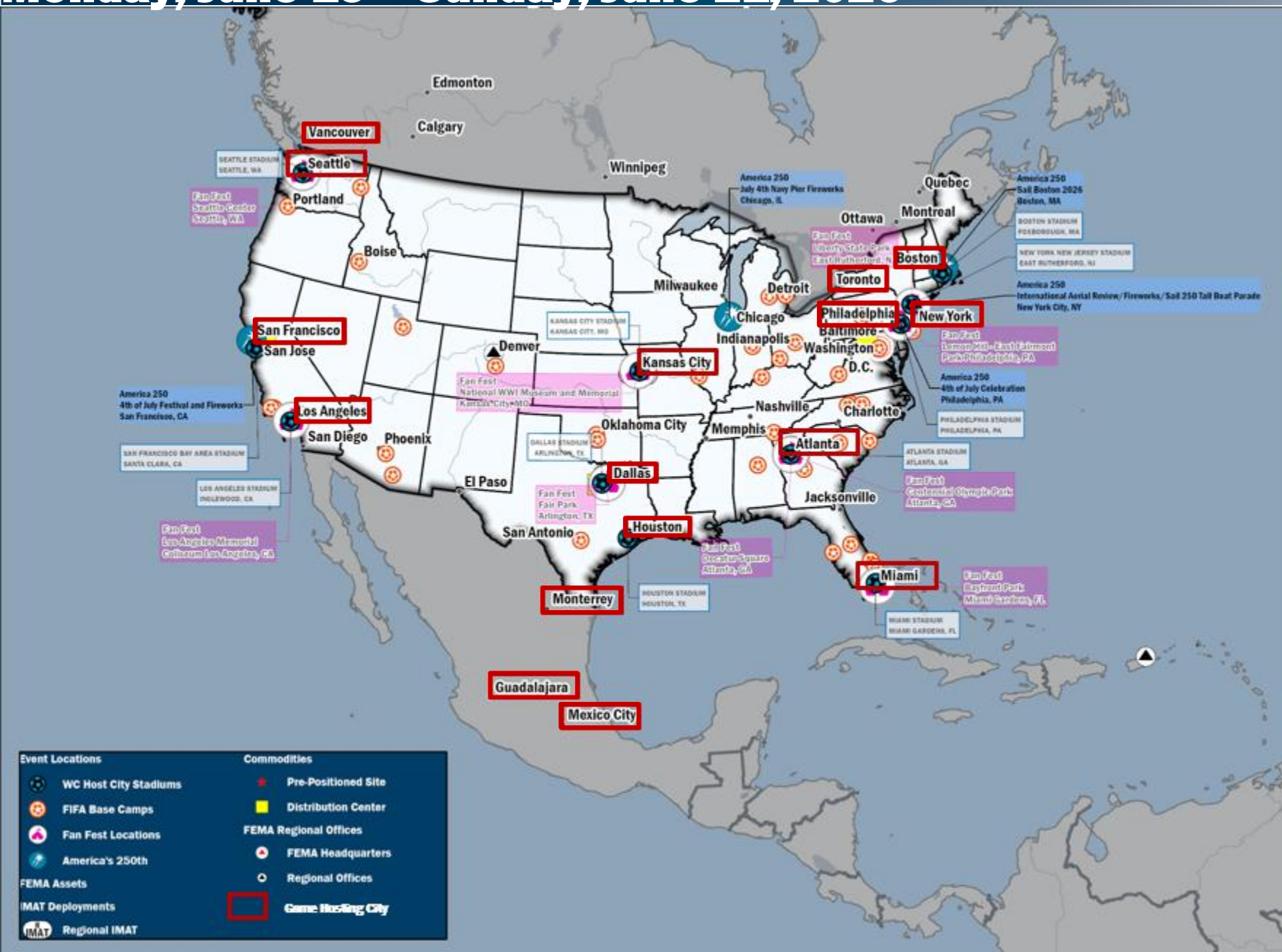

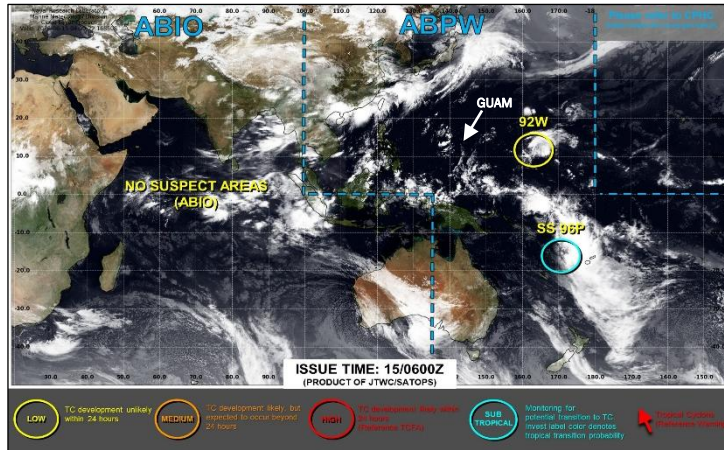

Tropical Outlook

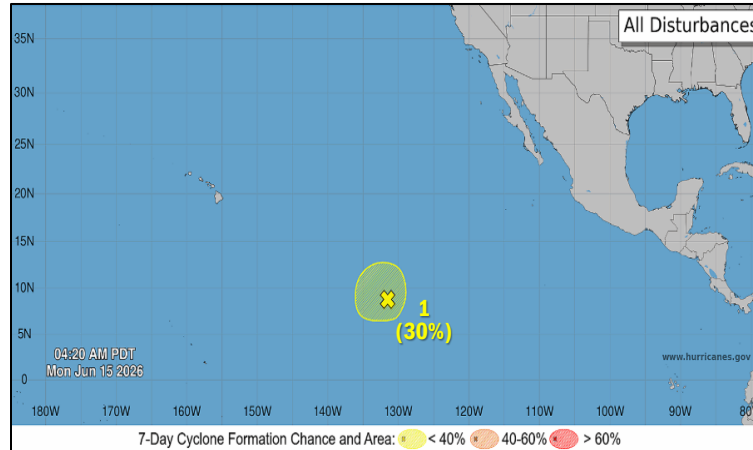
Western Pacific



Invest 92W: (as of 1:30 a.m. ET)

- Located 1188 miles E of Guam
- Forecast to pass through the Marianas between Thursday and Friday evenings
- Marginally favorable environment for development
- Slow development within the next 24-48 hours with a WNW track
- Maximum sustained surface winds of 21-26 mph
- Potential for the development of a significant tropical cyclone within the next 24 hours remains low

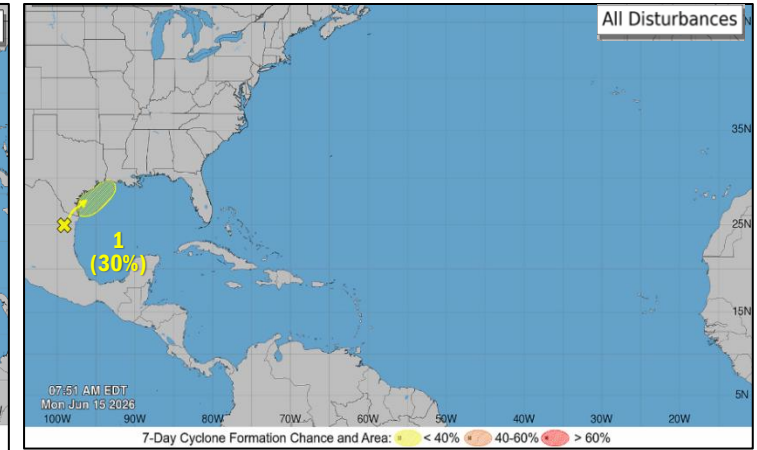
Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (EP93): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well SW of the Baja California Peninsula
- Moving N to NW at 5-10 mph
- Environmental conditions could support some development during the next day or so
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Low (30%)

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

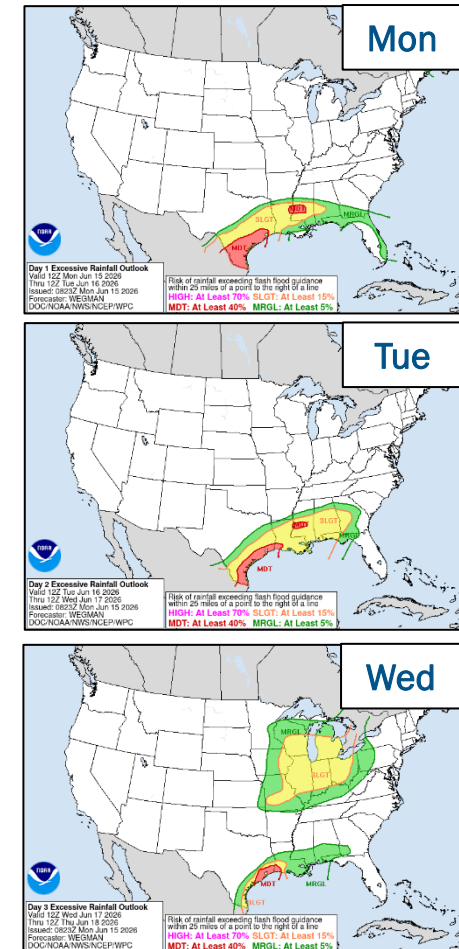
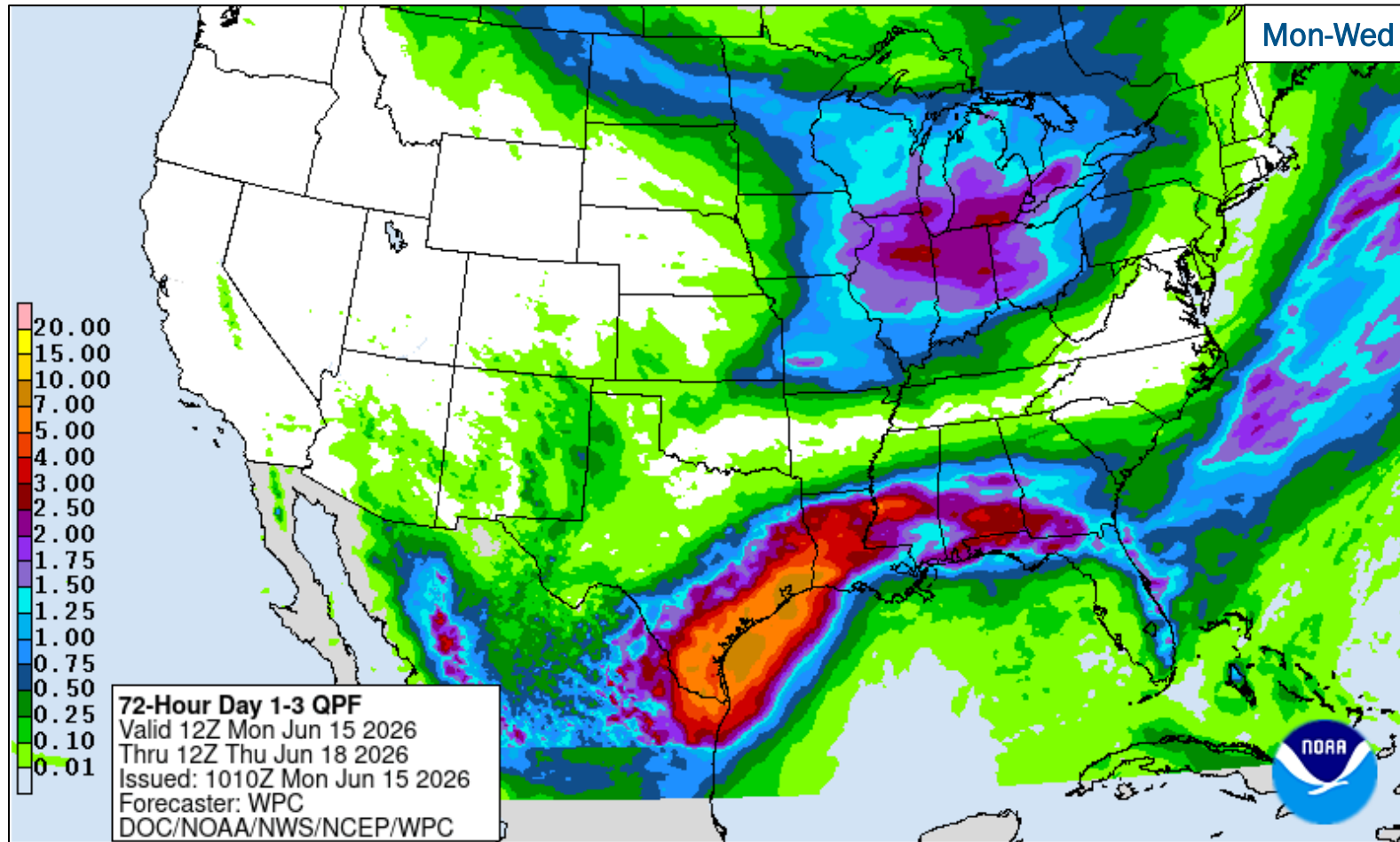
- Located over northeastern Mexico
- Moving NW
- Development is not expected during the next day or so while the trough remains inland; the system could then re-emerge over the northwestern Gulf late Tuesday or Wednesday, where conditions may support some development around midweek
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (20%); 7-day: Low (30%)



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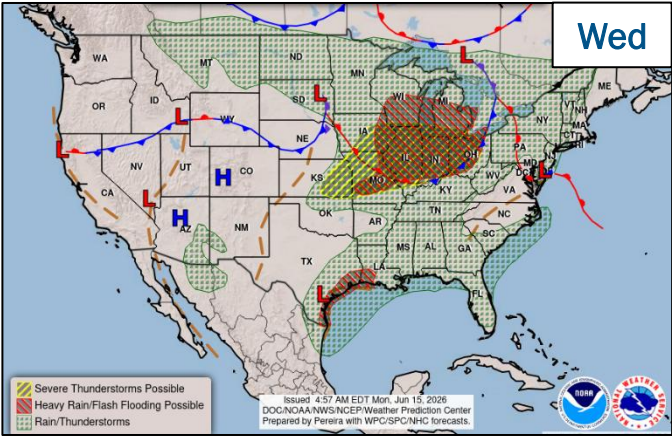
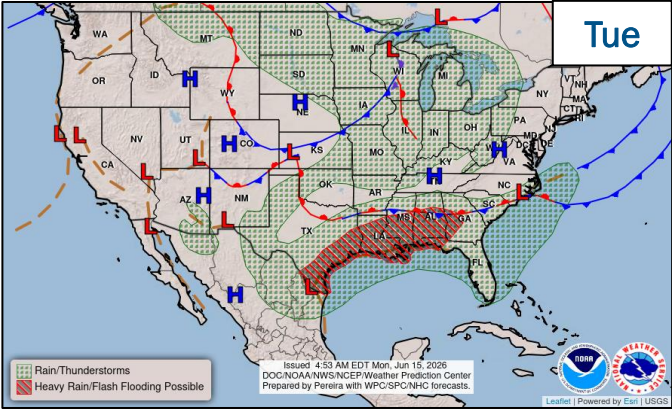
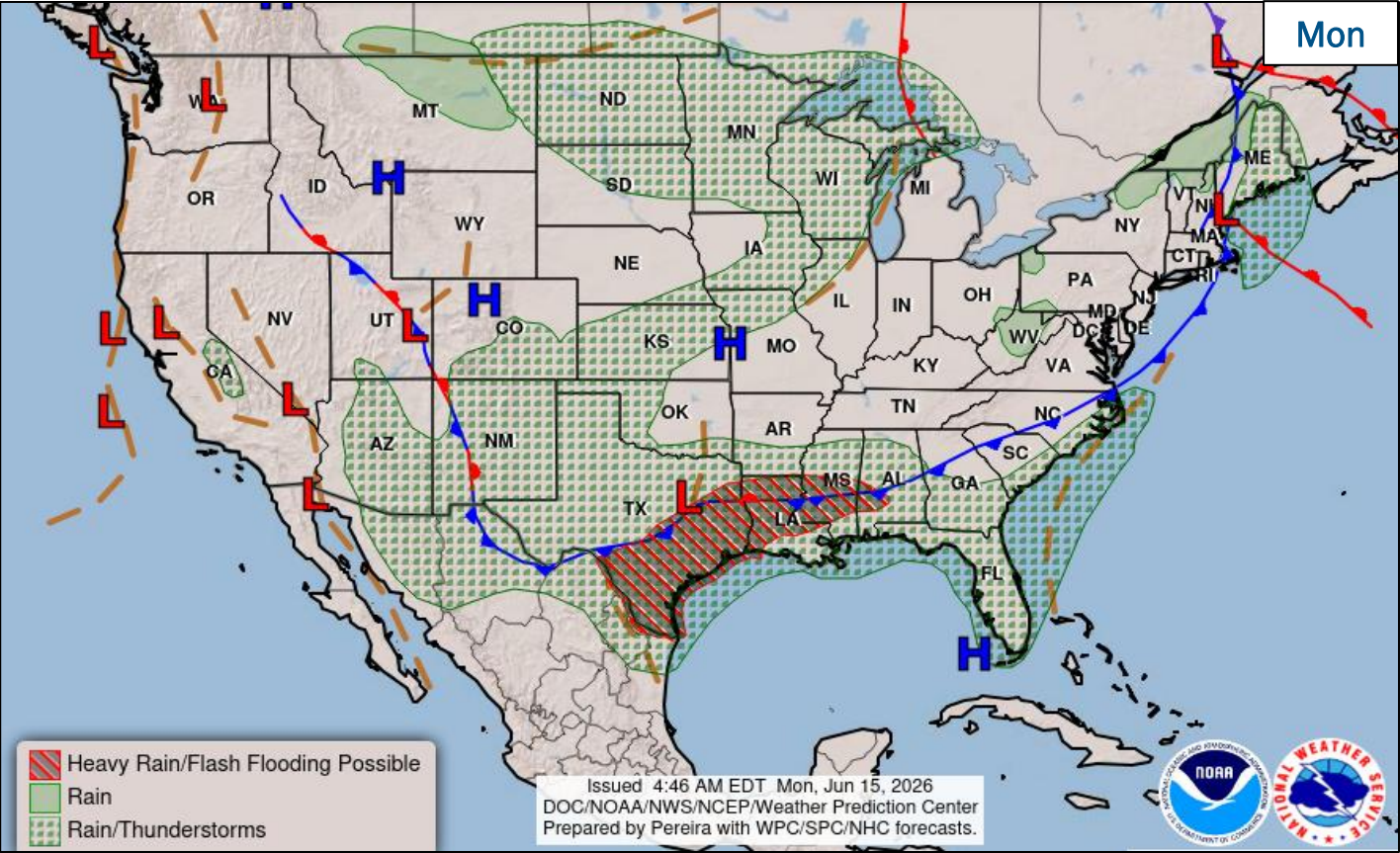
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

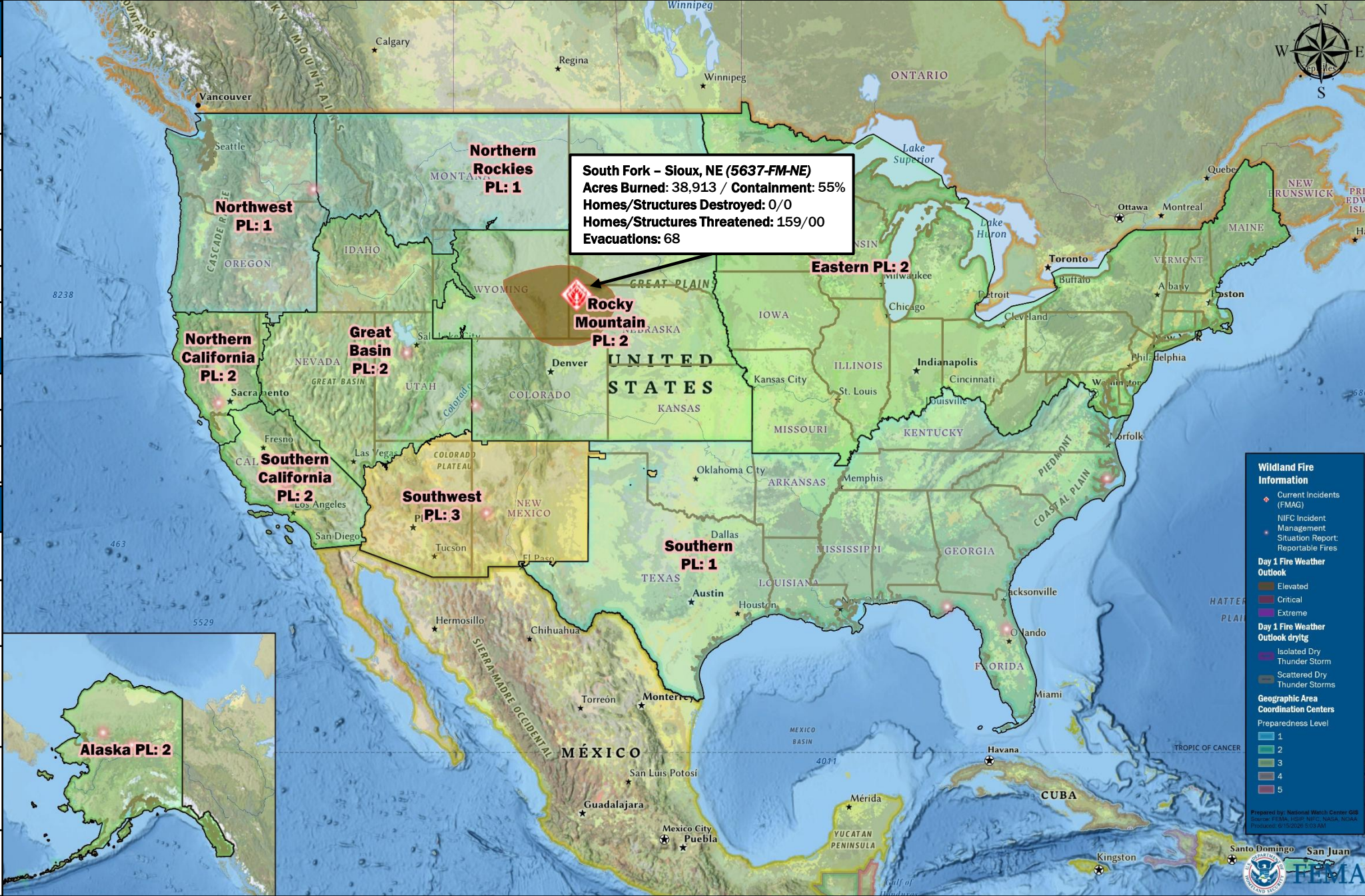

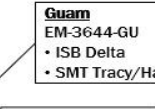
