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Flash Flood Warning – Lower Mississippi Valley to Southeast

Situation and Analysis: Showers and storms expected in the region through Saturday afternoon as disturbances move through portions of the Southeastern U.S. Risks of severe weather in the form of heavy rainfall and damaging winds for areas around the I-10 highway pose marginal risk for areas south to southwest of the Houston Metro area. Flash Flood warnings are in effect in the Lower Mississippi Valley, with State dams being monitored and fortified for overflow. (National Water Center, as of 11:34 p.m. ET, Jun 19) Weakening post-tropical storm conditions are expected to limit damage potential.

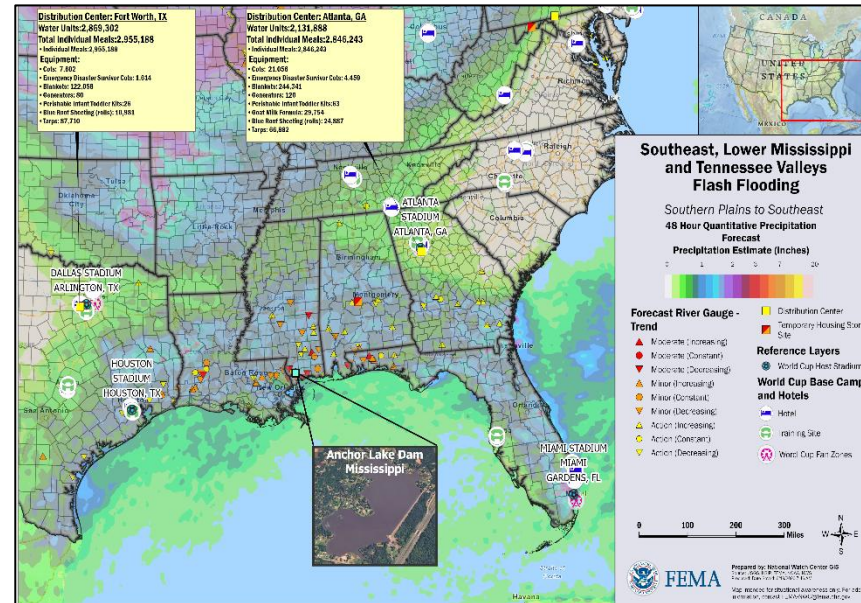

Transportation:

- MS: Numerous road closures reported in Scott, Stone, Pearl River, Hancock, and George Counties; none impeding local Emergency Services

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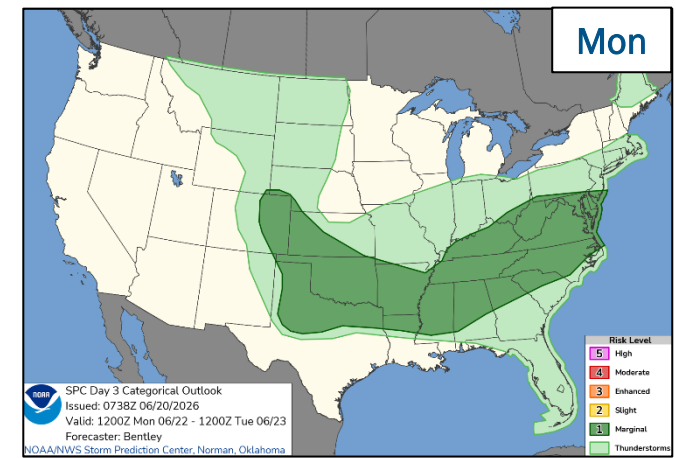
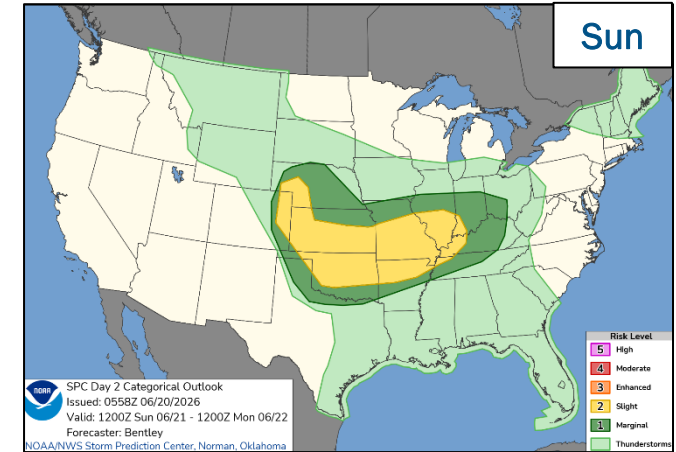
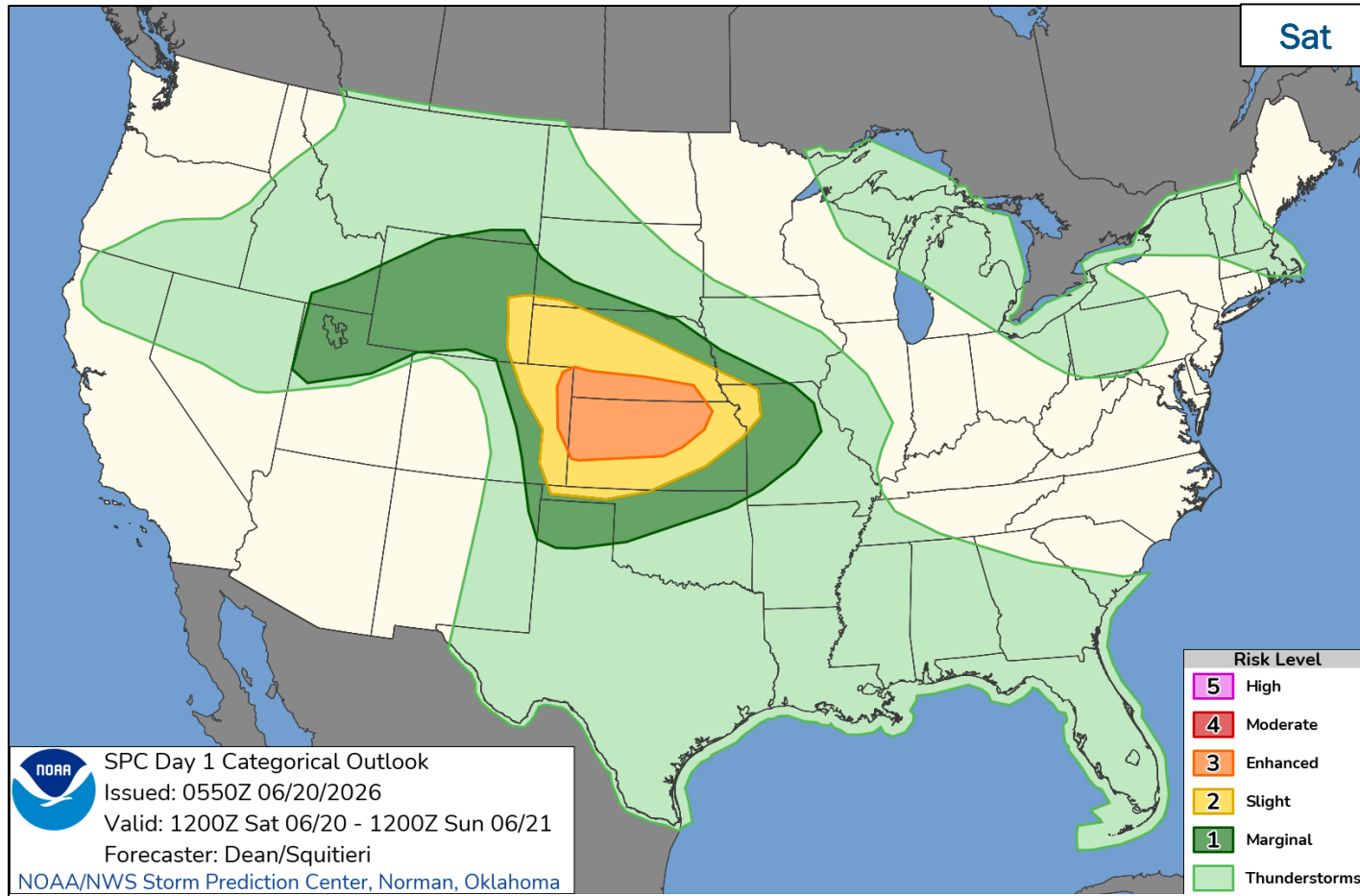
National Weather Forecast



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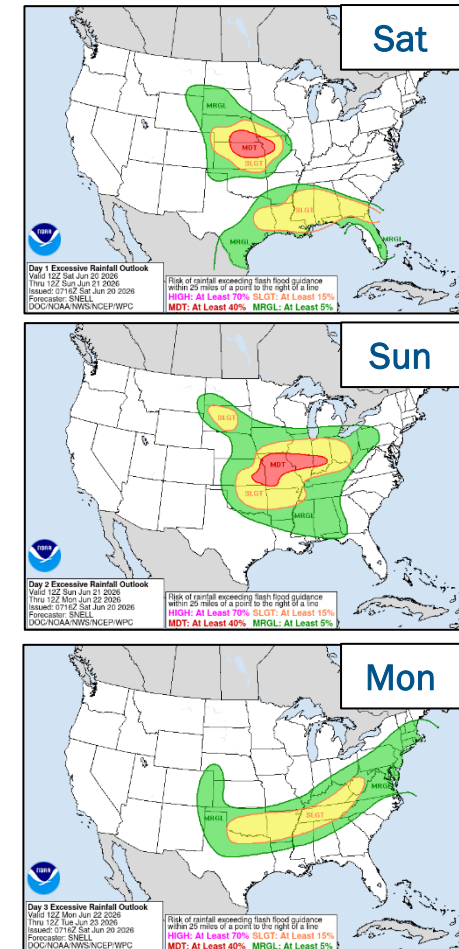
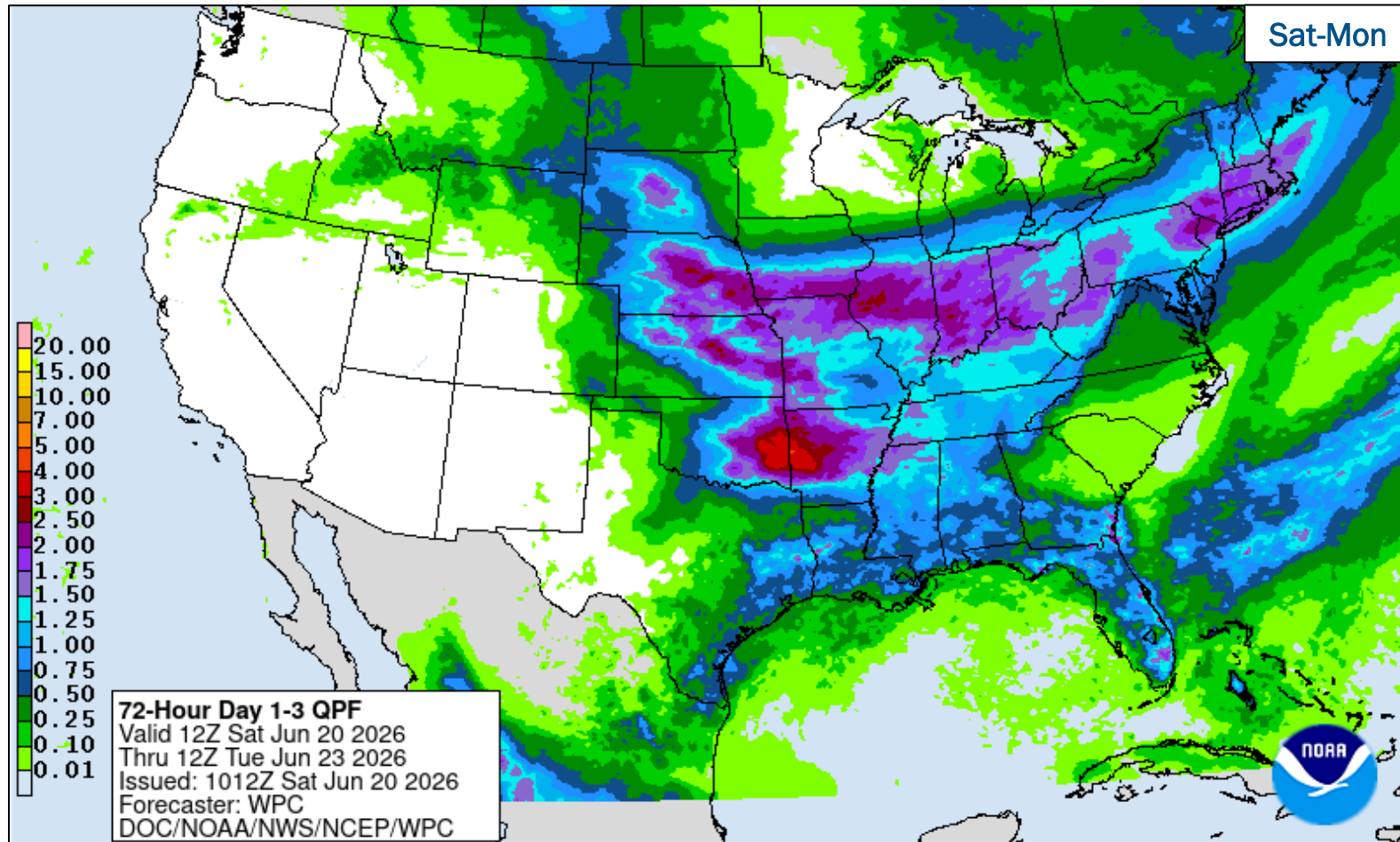
Severe Weather Outlook



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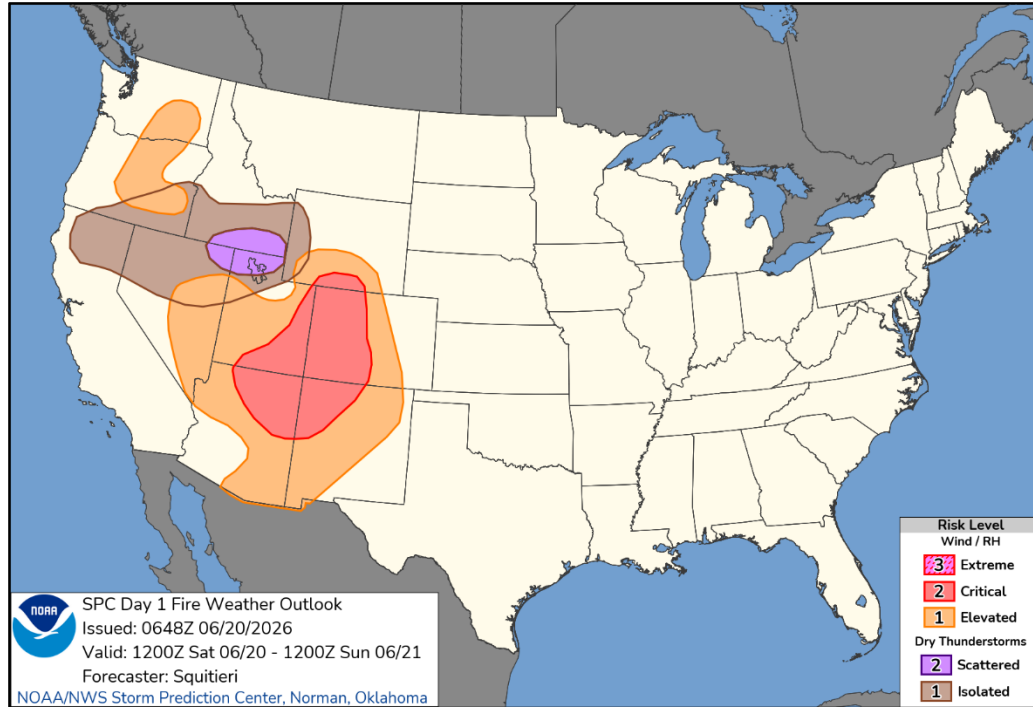
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



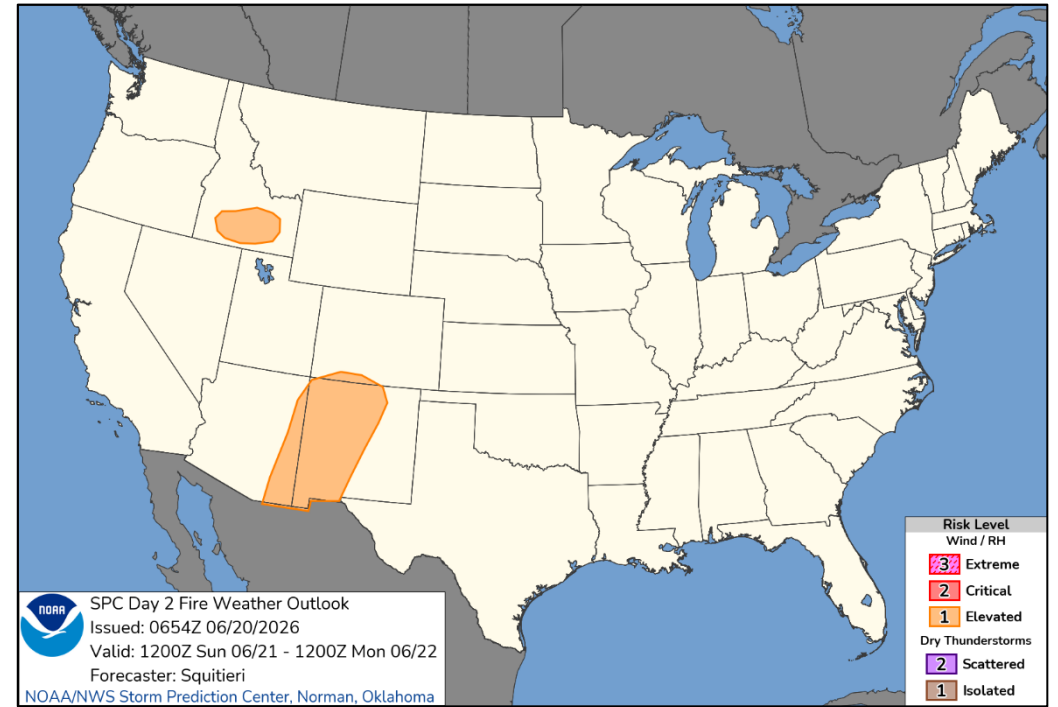

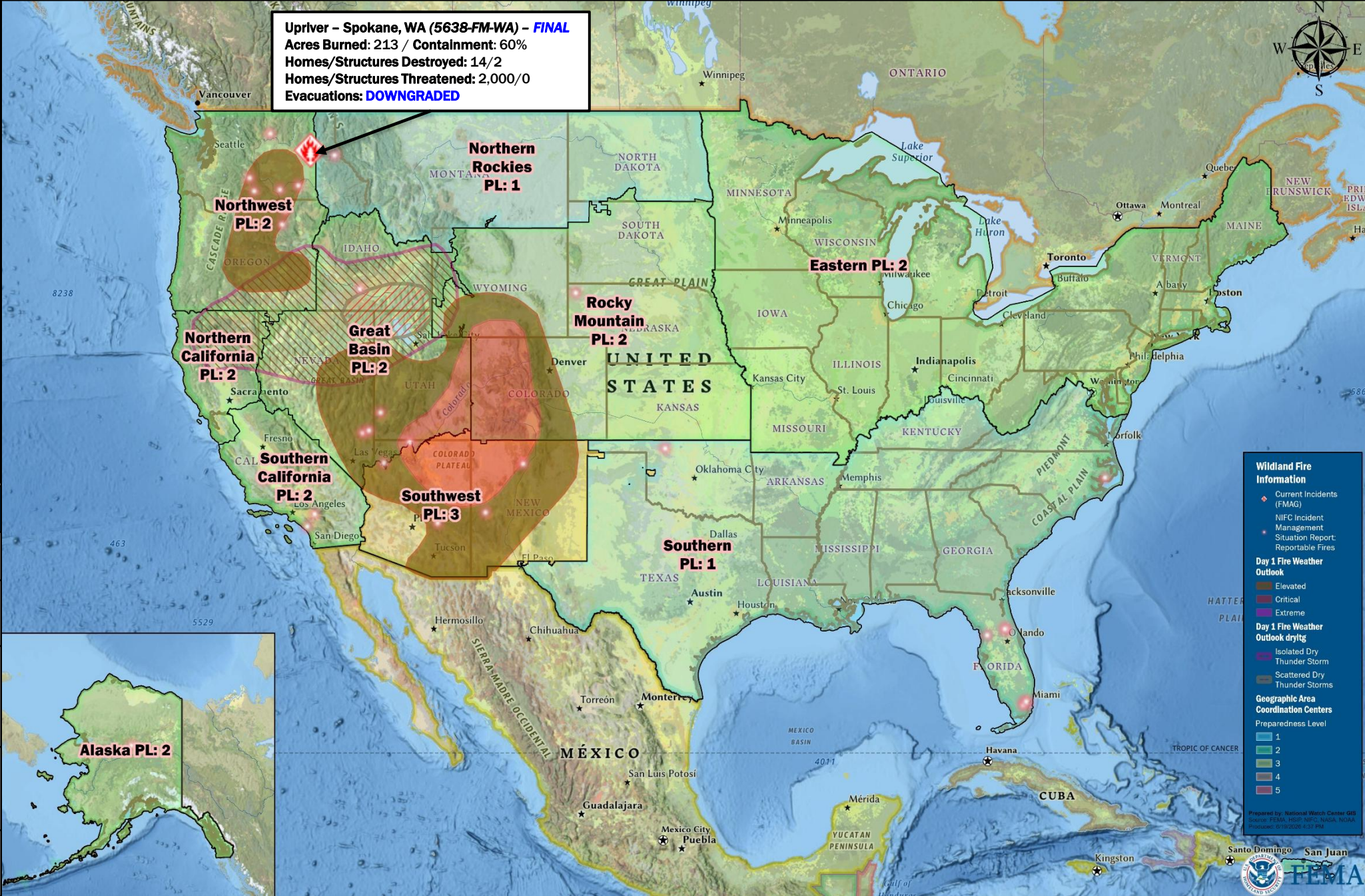

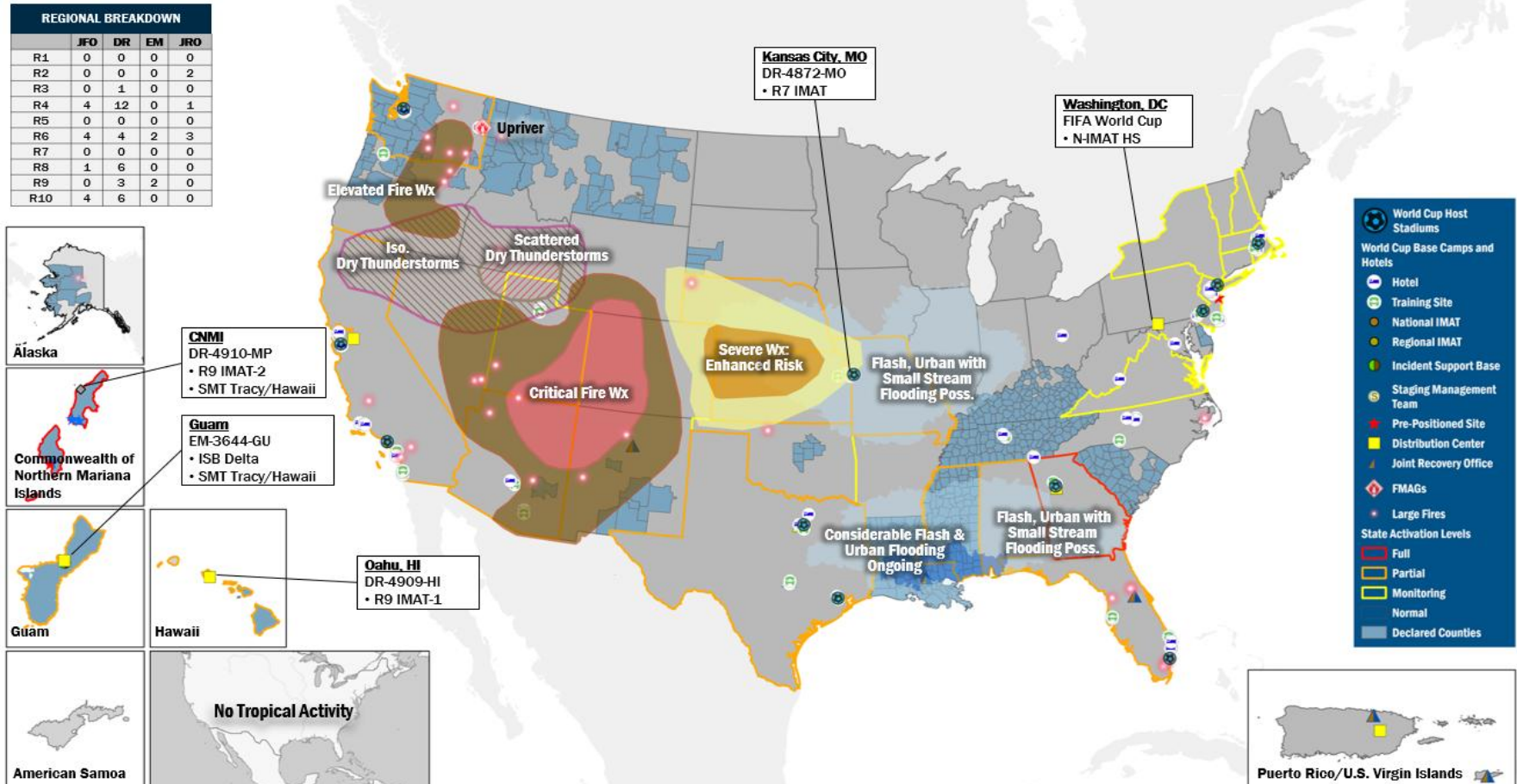
