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Flash Flood Warning – Lower Mississippi Valley to Southeast – FINAL

Situation and Analysis: Heavy, post-tropical cyclone Arthur rainfall has caused flooding, road closures, power outages, and damage to homes, businesses, and public infrastructure across multiple states. Storm remnants brought heavy precipitation across the Southeastern U.S. Flood risks and advisories remain along the Gulf of America coast through the weekend. Storm cleanup operations continue. (NOAA NWS as of 3:00 p.m. ET) There are no requests for federal assistance.

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA R4 Final Update as of 10:45 a.m. ET, Jun 20)

Safety and Security:

- AL: Mobile US&R TF 1 on Standby
- MS: US&R TF is preparing for demobilization

Food, Hydration, Shelter: (ARC Shelter Report, as of 6:48 am, Jun 21)

- MS: 4 (+1) shelters open / 39 (+8) occupants
- LA: 2 (+1) shelter open / 25 (+2) occupants

Health and Medical: (MEMA, as of 4:30 p.m. ET, Jun 19)

- MS: 1 fatality reported

Energy: (Eagle-I, as of 8:00 a.m. ET, Jun 21)

- Minimal power outages throughout the Region (<1%)

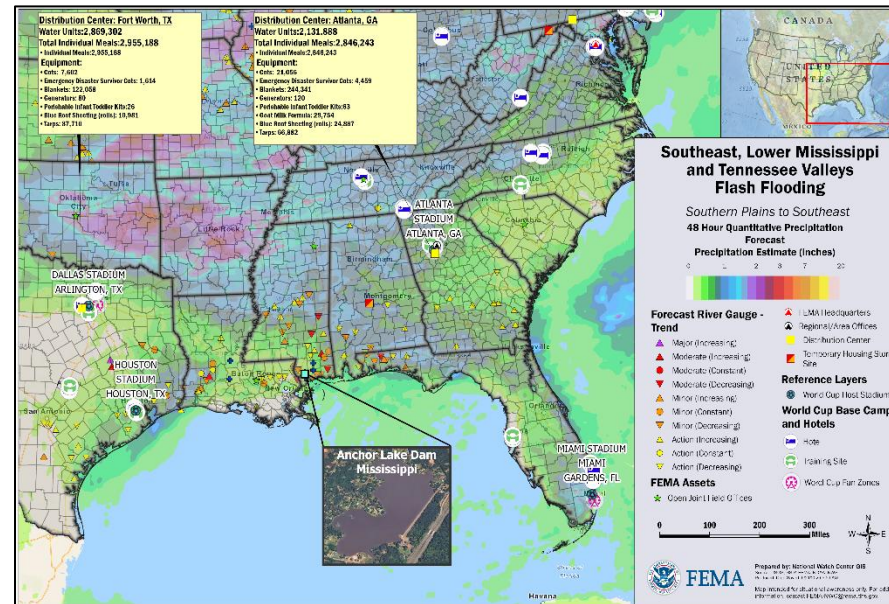
Transportation:

- MS: Numerous road closures in Scott, Stone, Pearl River, Hancock, and George Counties; none impeding local Emergency Services

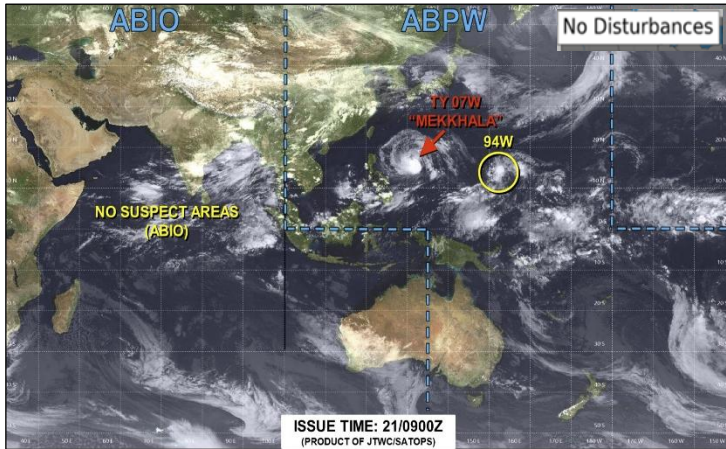

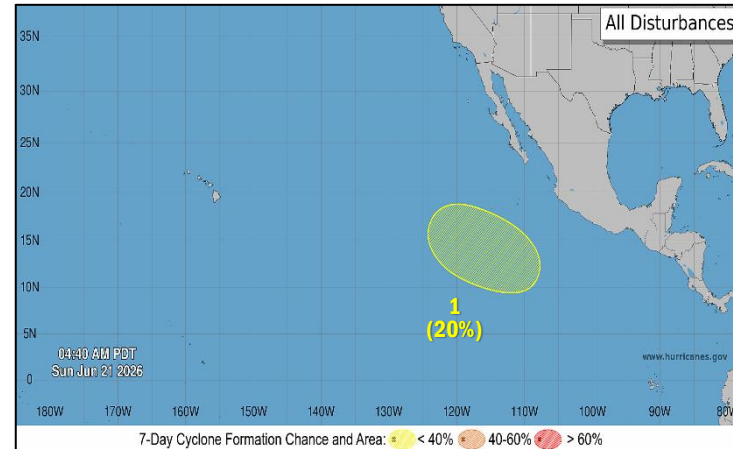

- Formation chance – Low

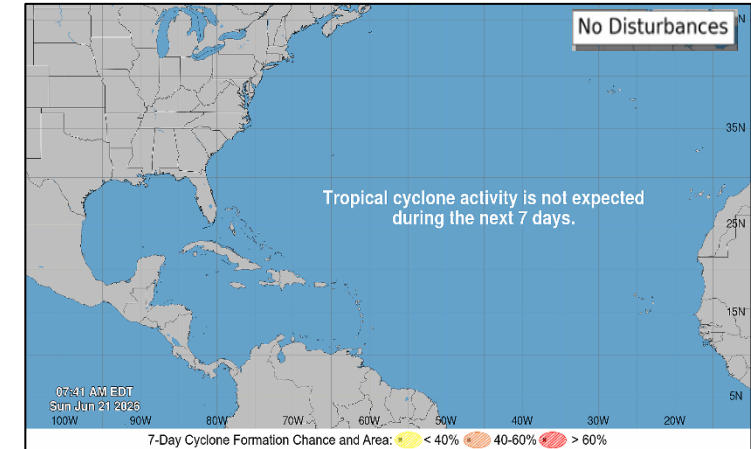
Eastern and Central Pacific

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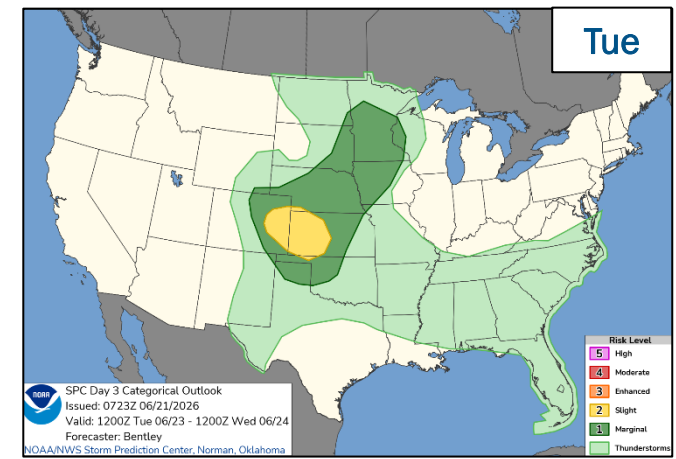
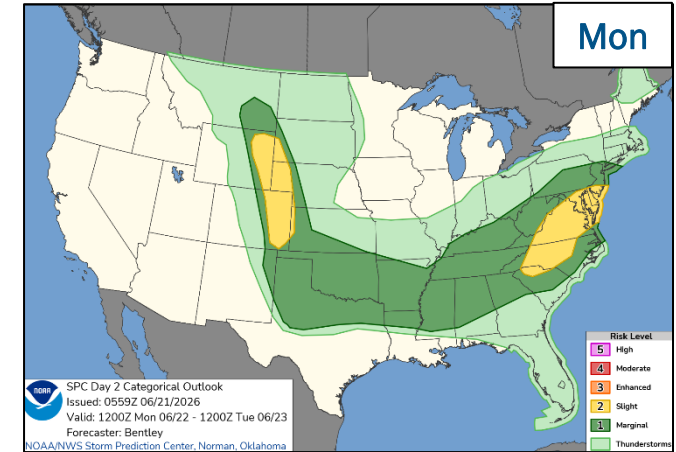
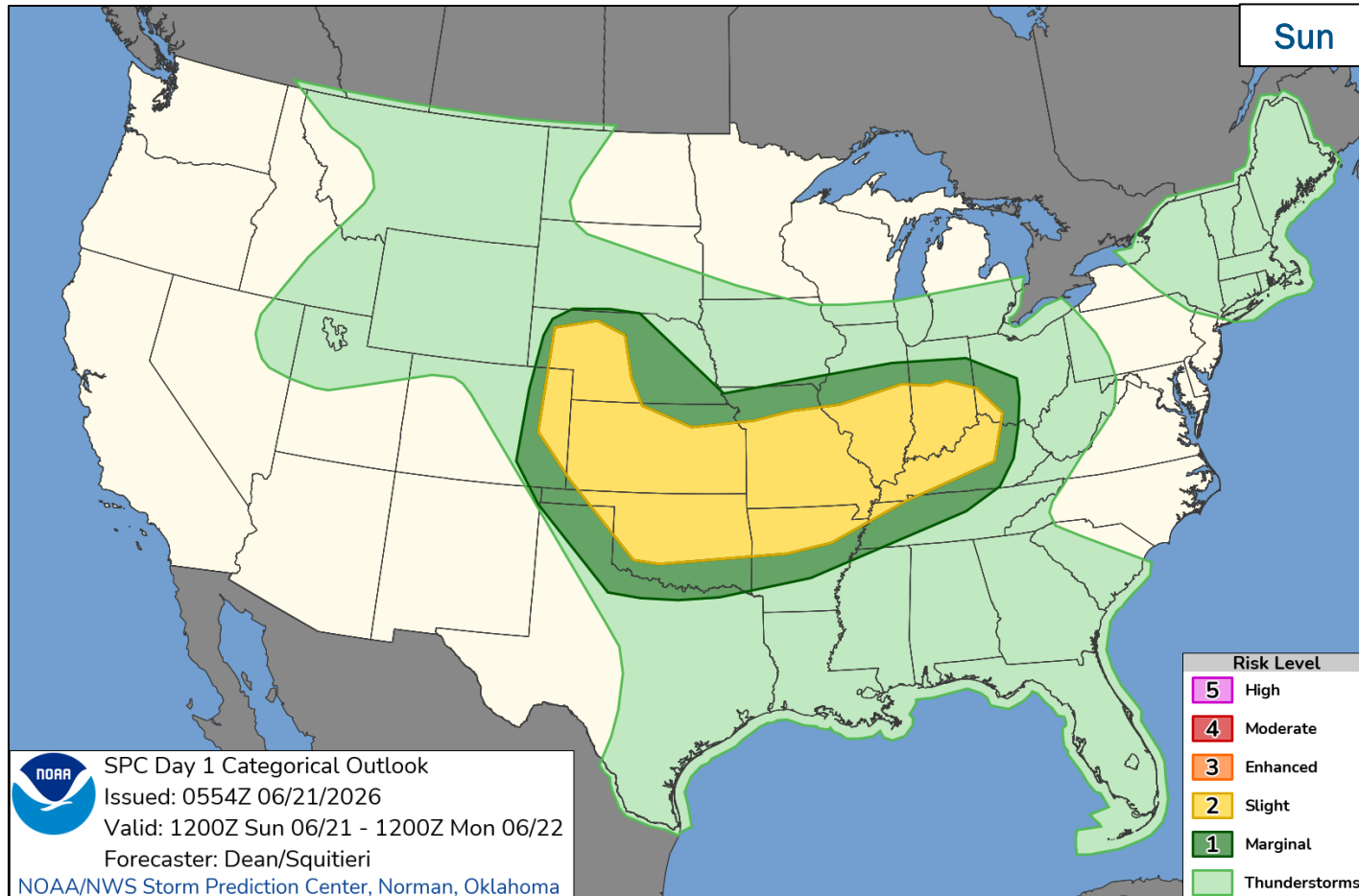
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National Weather Forecast



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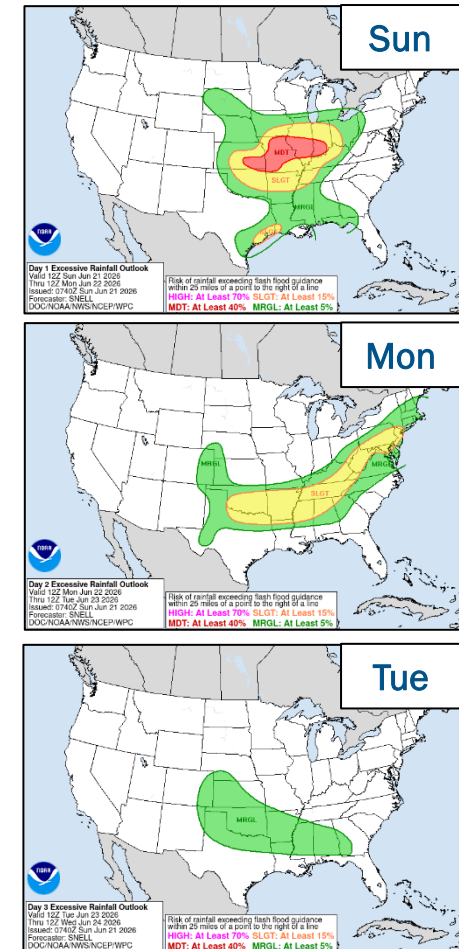
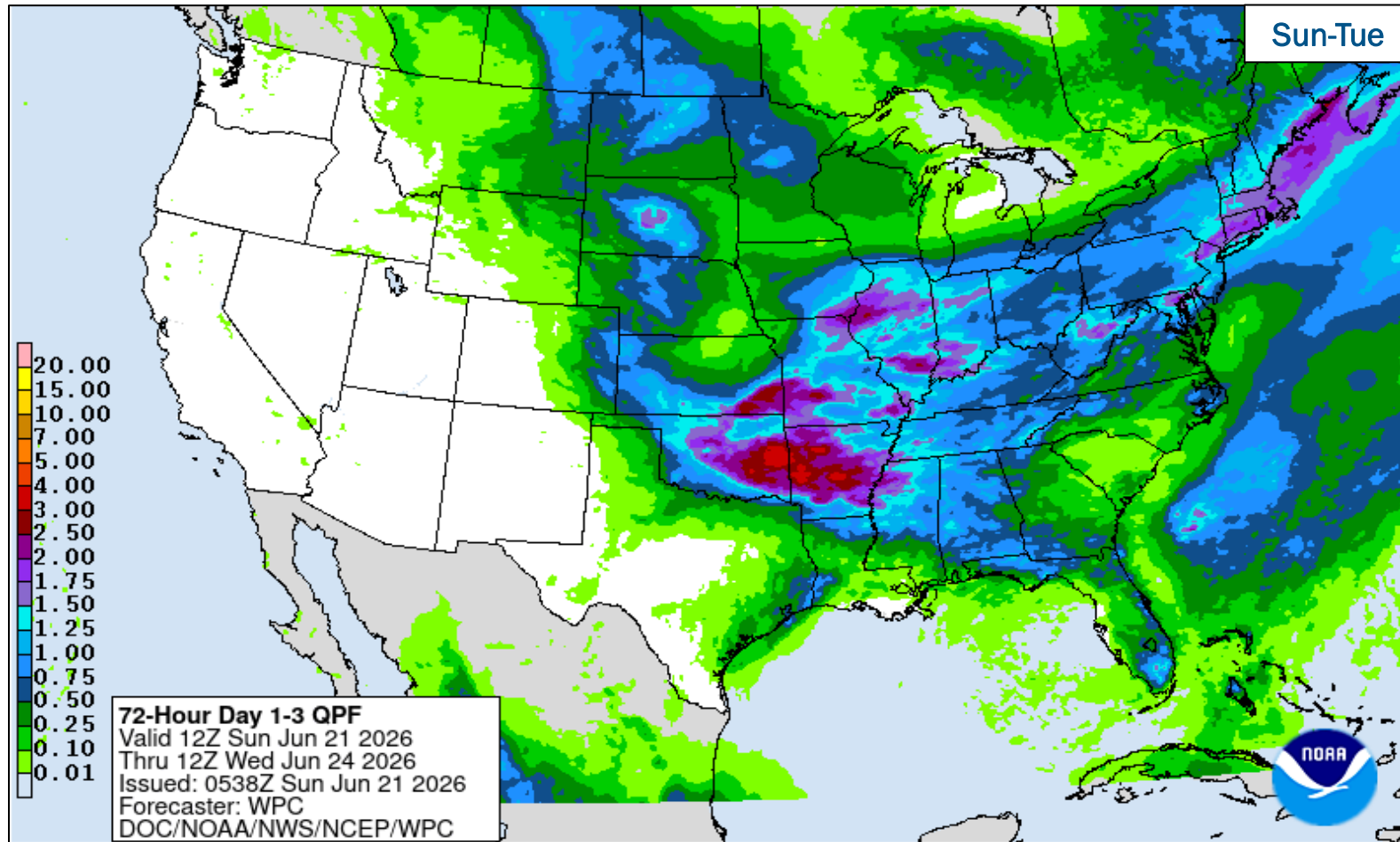
Severe Weather Outlook

Situation: The Acting FEMA Region 8 Regional Administrator approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Iron Fire, which has burned approximately 19,250 acres with 0% containment. The Iron Fire is burning on federal, state, and private land in and around the City of Eureka (pop. 2,350). Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

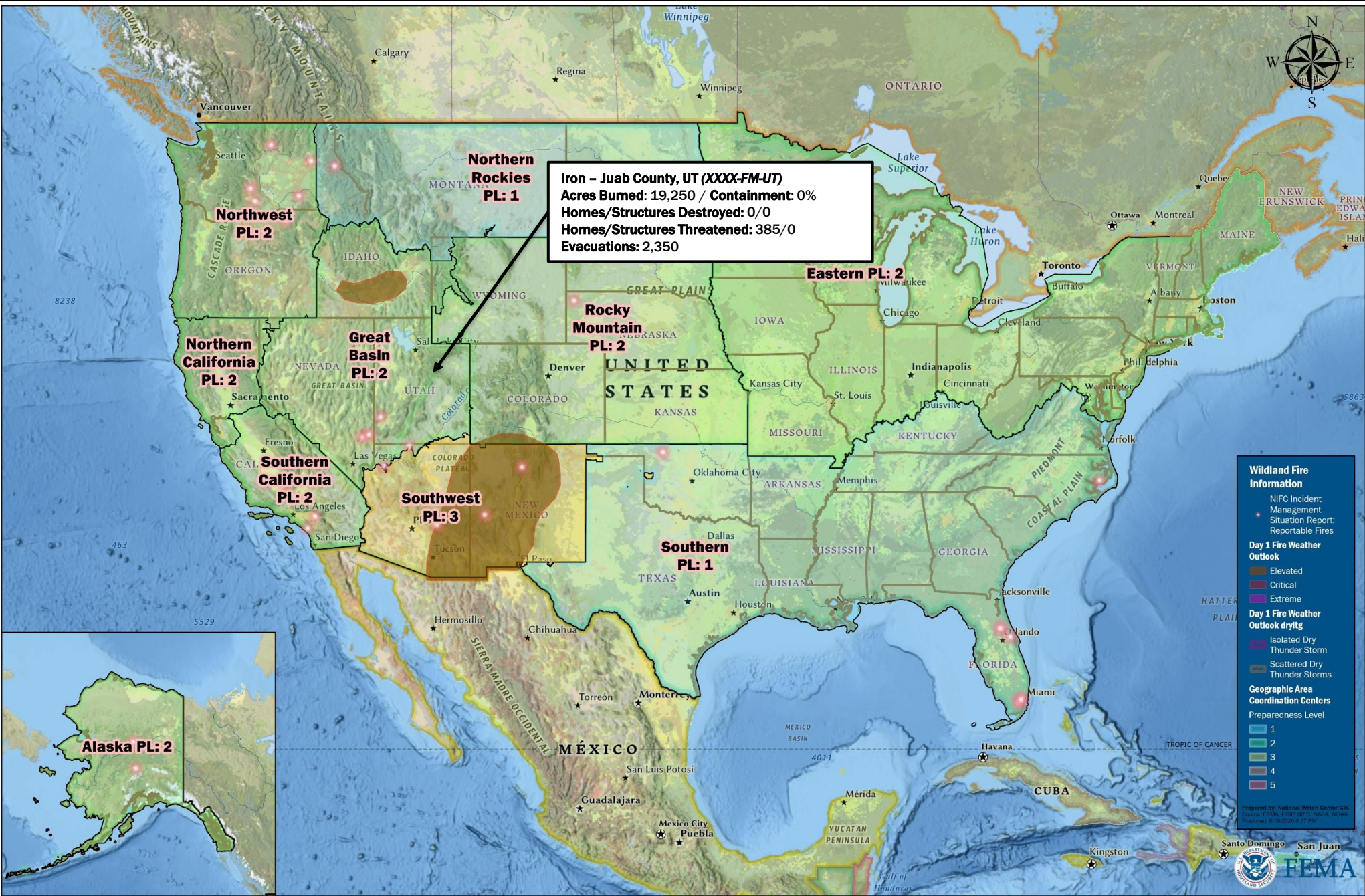

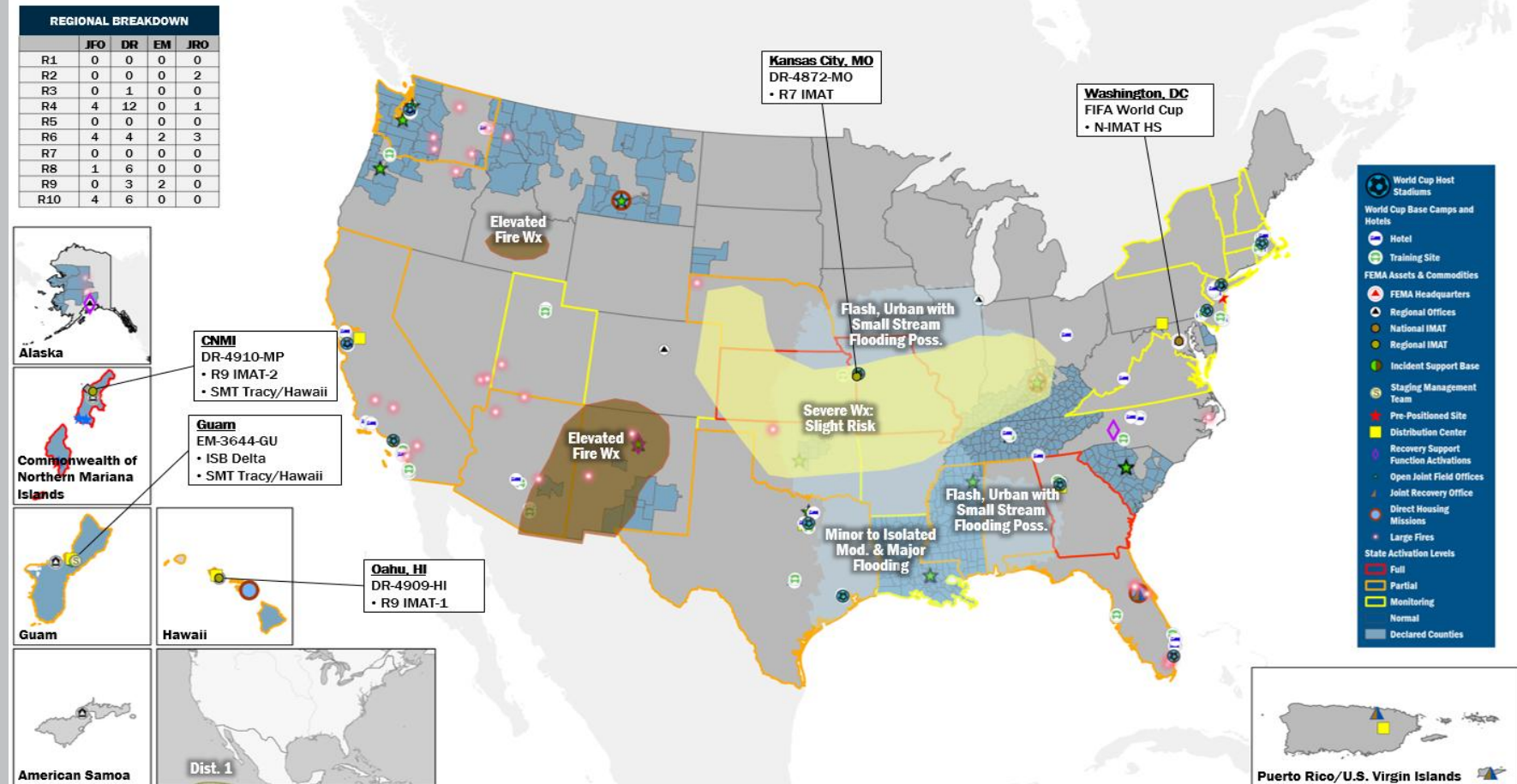
