- No new significant incidents / operations

Hazard Monitoring

- Severe Thunderstorms – Northern Plains, Middle / Upper Mississippi Valleys, Southeastern U.S. and Mid-Atlantic
- Heavy Rain / Flash Flooding – Ohio Valley to Mid-Atlantic
- Critical Fire Weather – Southwest, Central Great Basin, and Central Rockies
- Tropical Activity:
 - Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (20%)
 - Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: Med (50%)
 - Western Pacific: Invest 95W (Med)

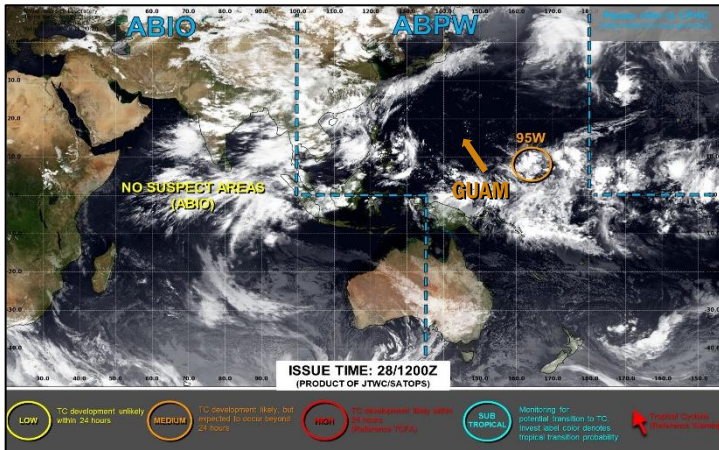

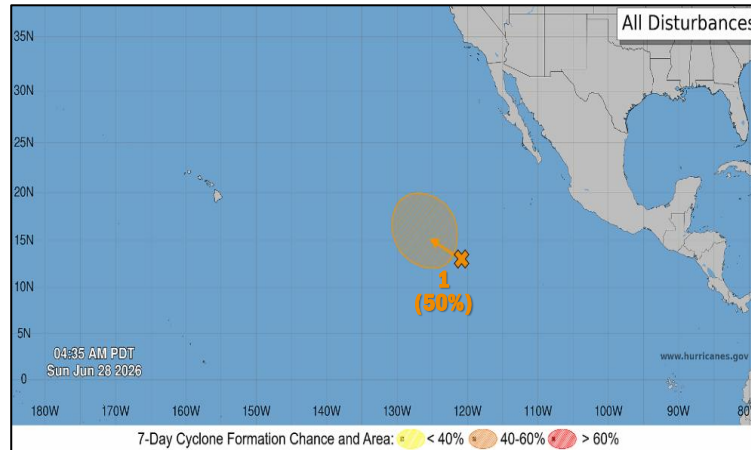

Invest 95W: (JTWC as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Approximately **1,260 miles** ESE of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds **23-29 mph**
- **Favorable environmental development**
- Formation chance – 24-hour: **Med**

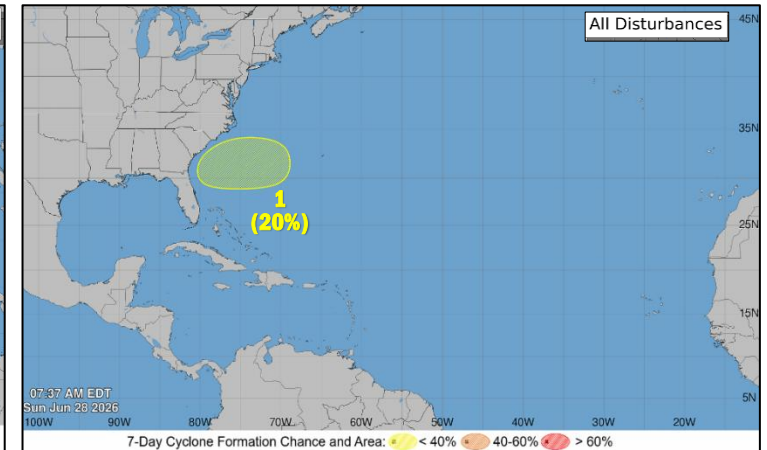
Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles **SW** of the southern tip of the **Baja California Peninsula**
- **Moving W to WNW**
- Gradual development is possible **over the next few days; a tropical depression could form in the middle of next week**
- Conditions are forecast to become less conducive for development by the second half of next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (**20%**); 7-day: Med (**50%**)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

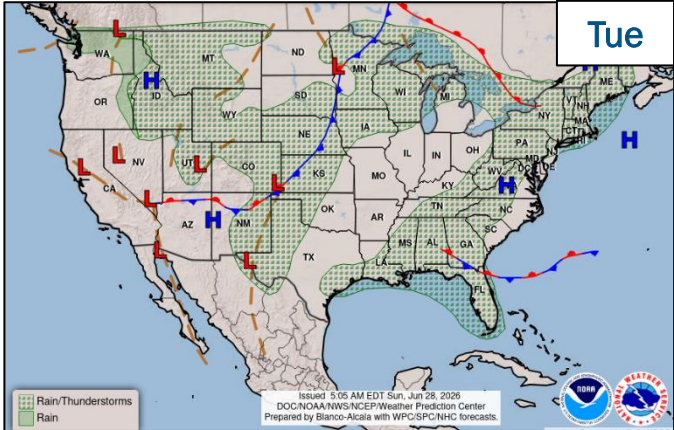
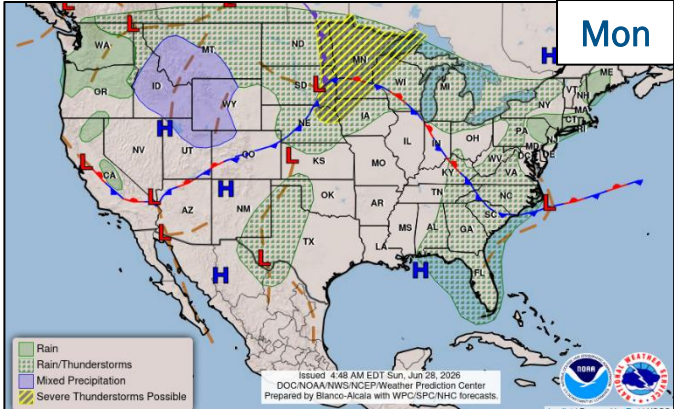
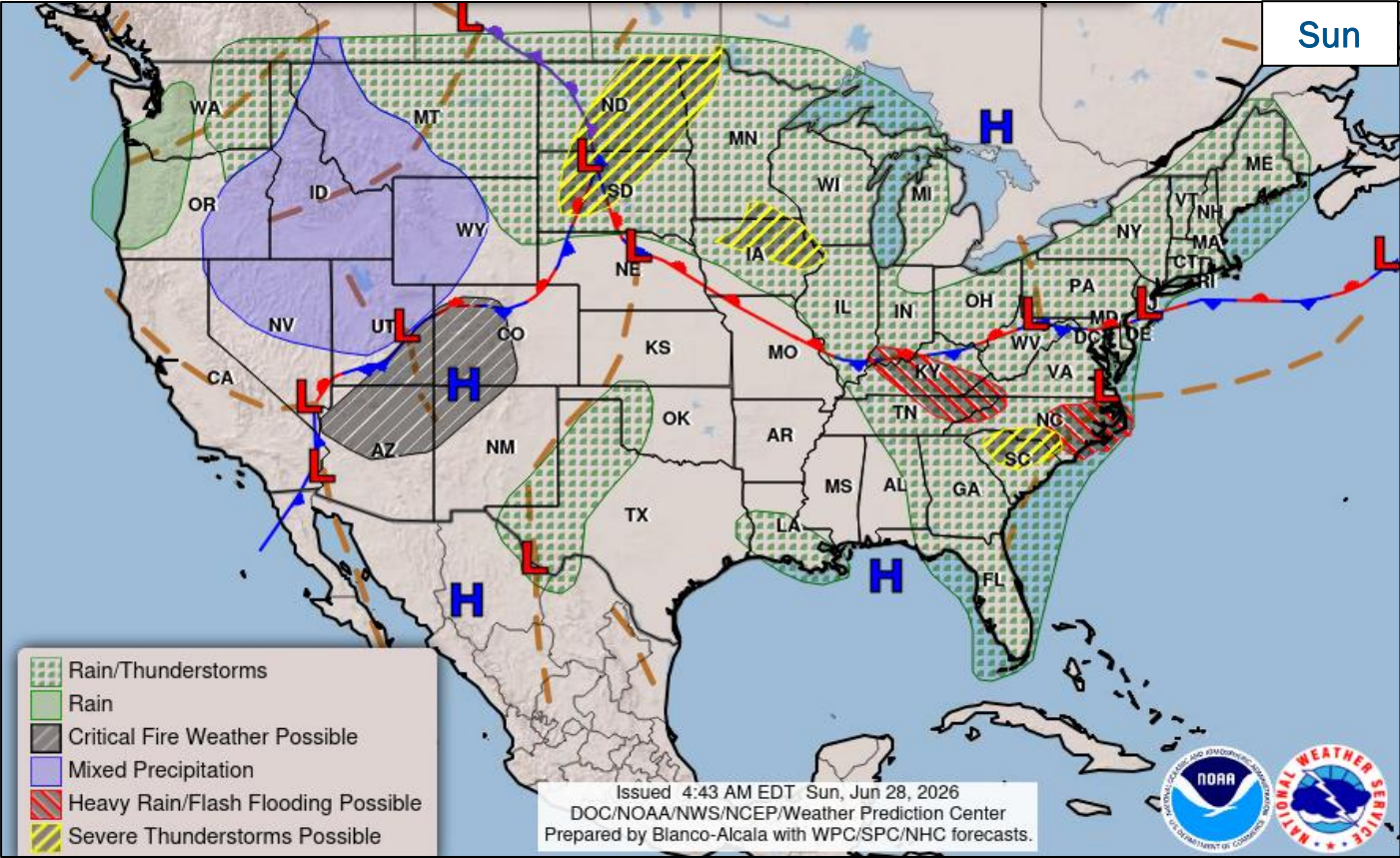
- Located offshore of the southeastern US coast

- Formation chance – 48-hour Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (**20%**)



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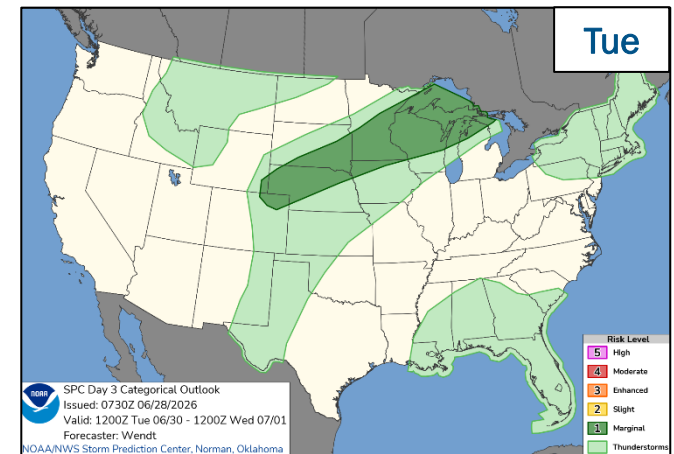
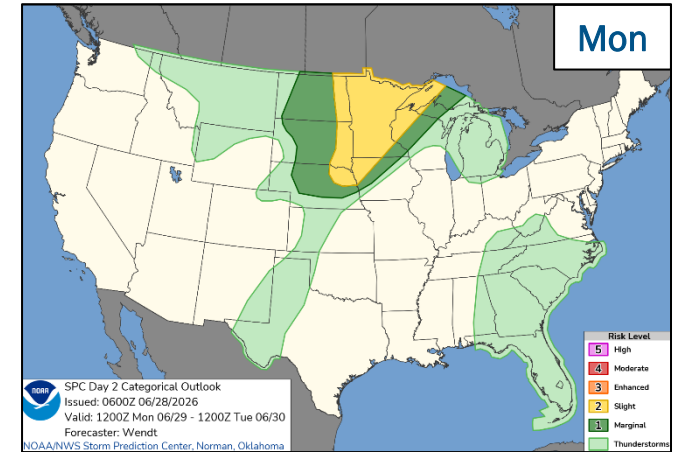
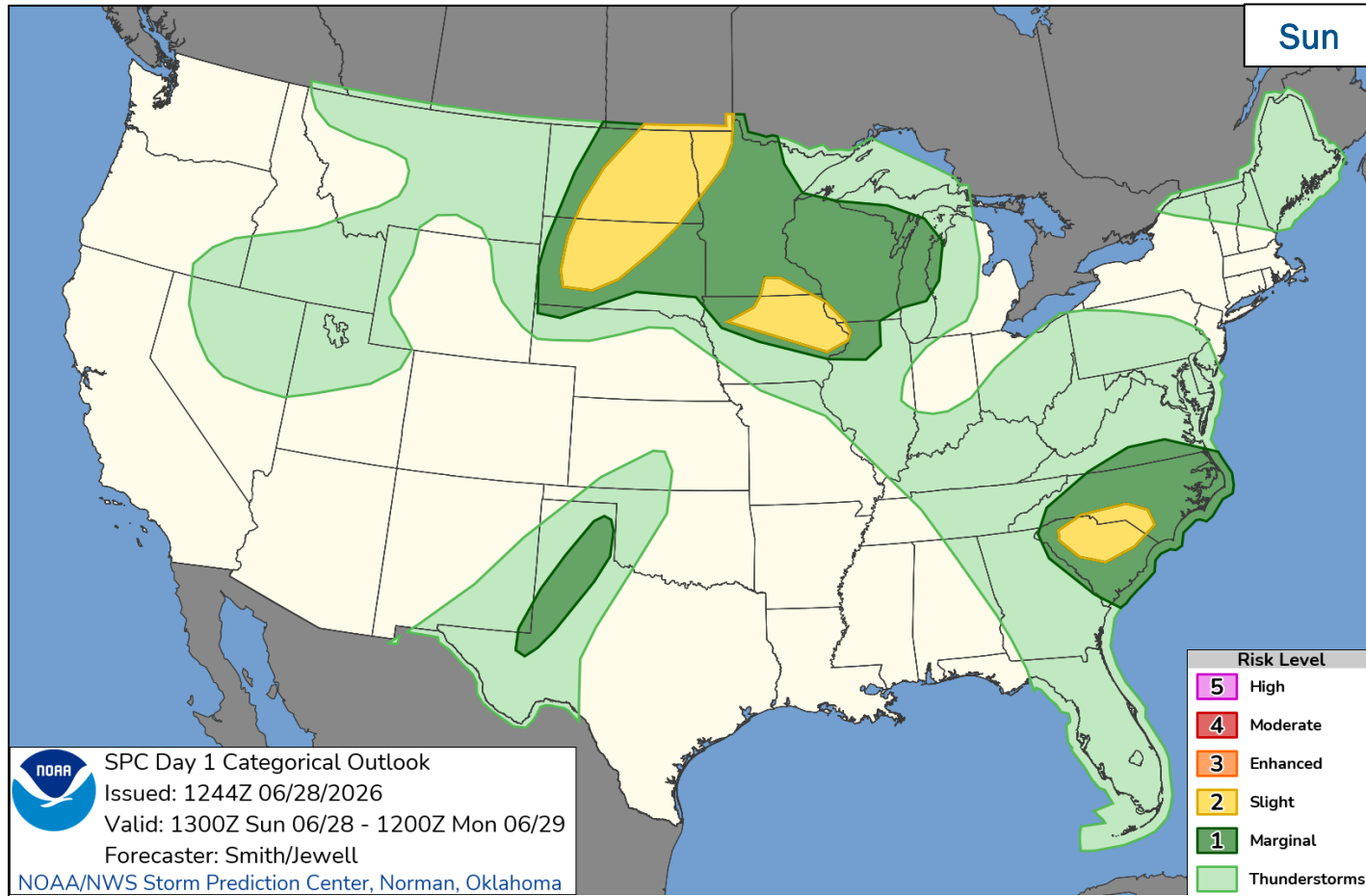
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National Weather Forecast



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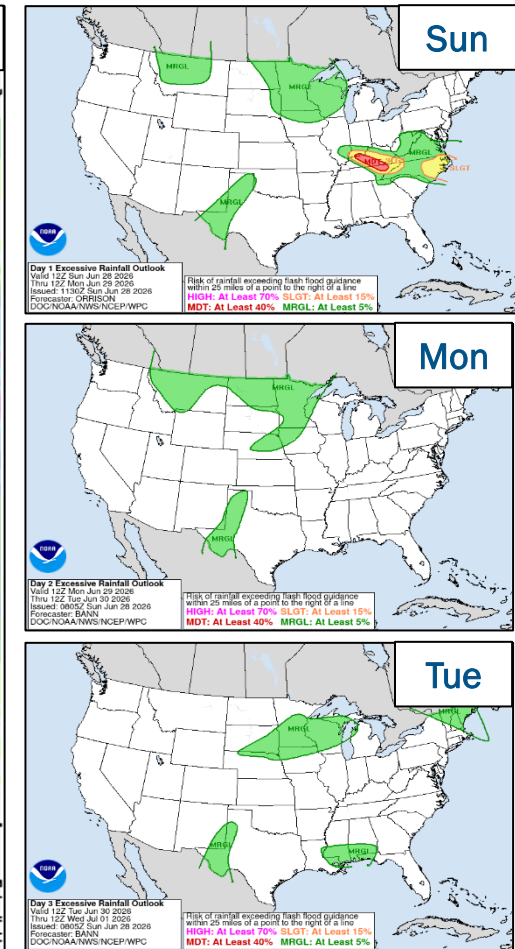
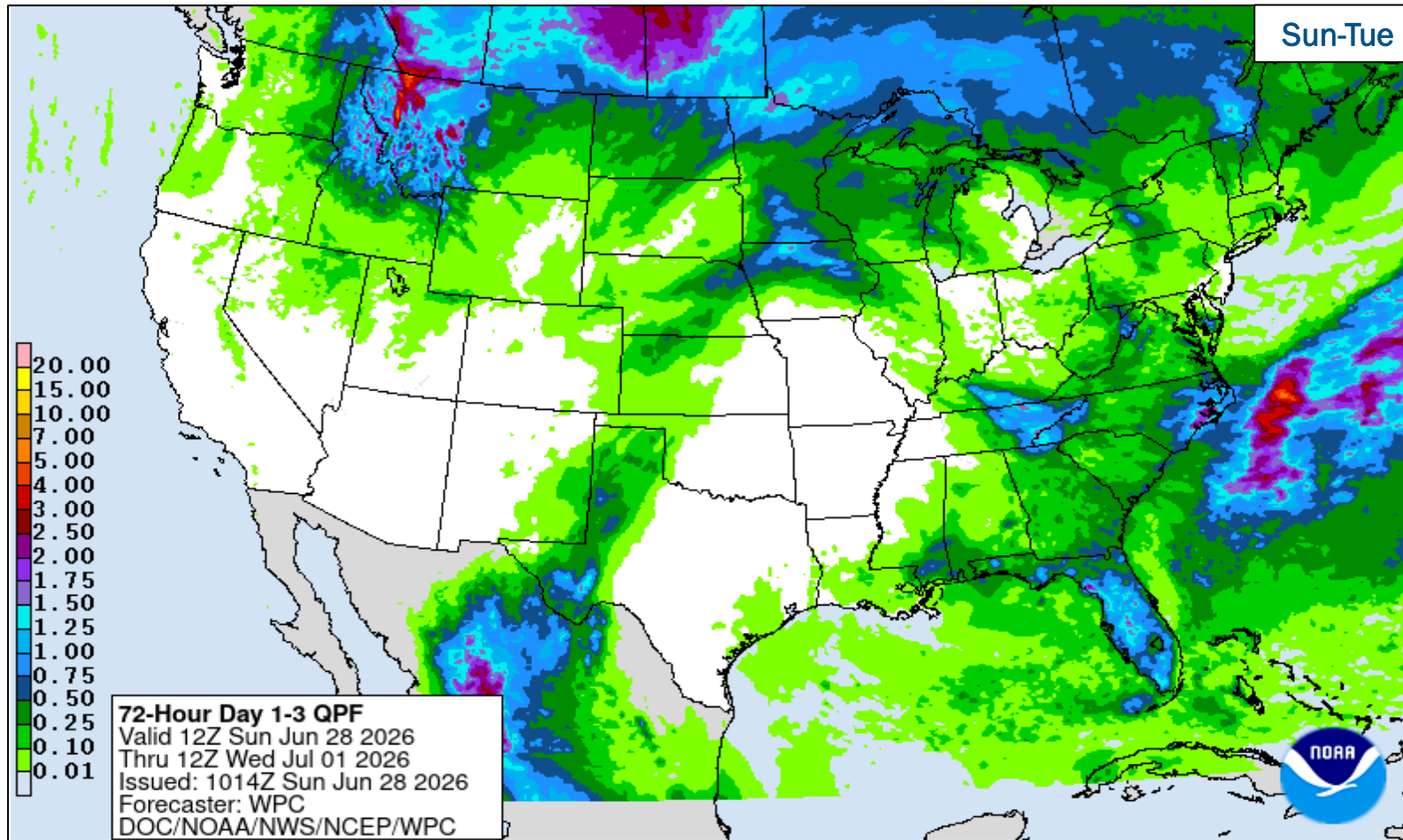
Severe Weather Outlook



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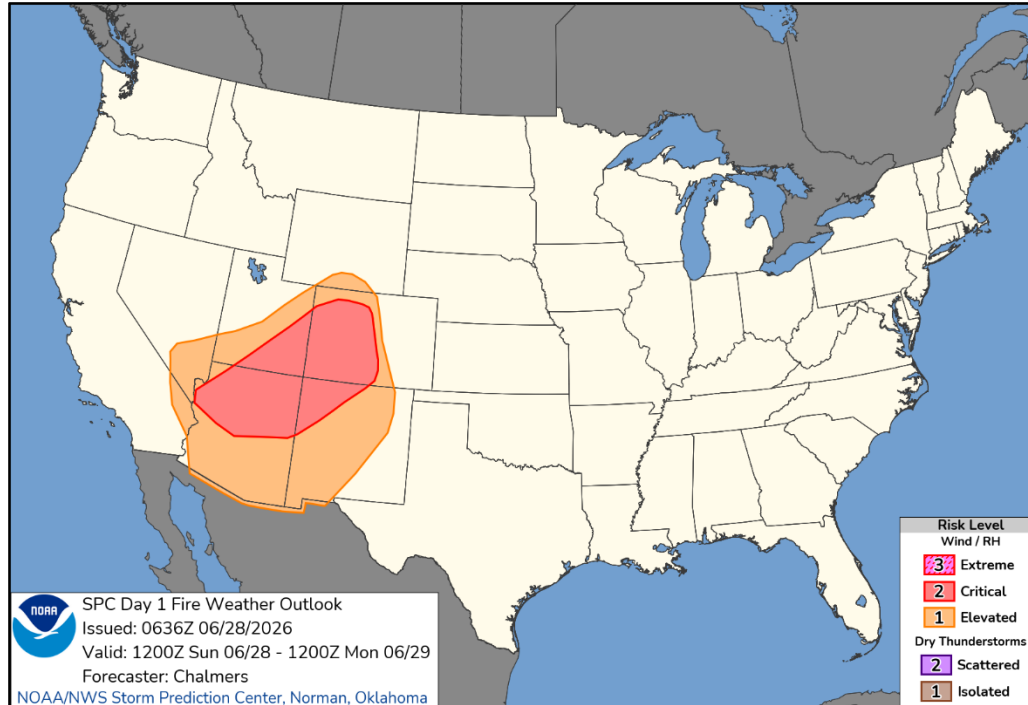
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



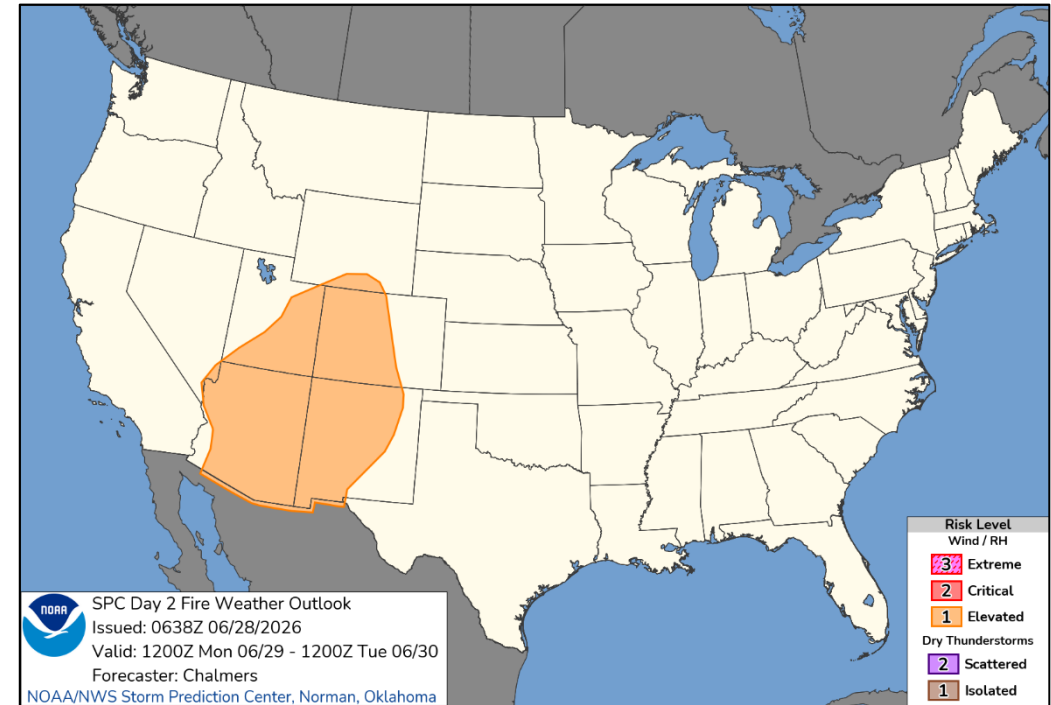

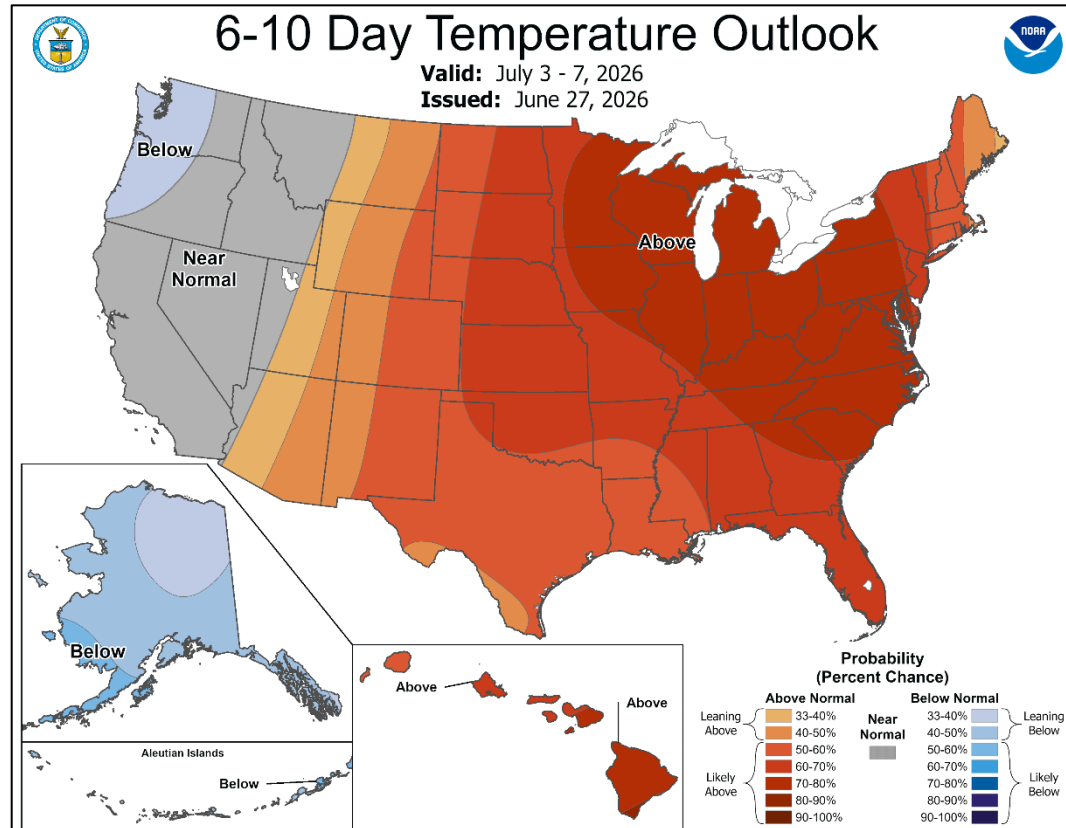

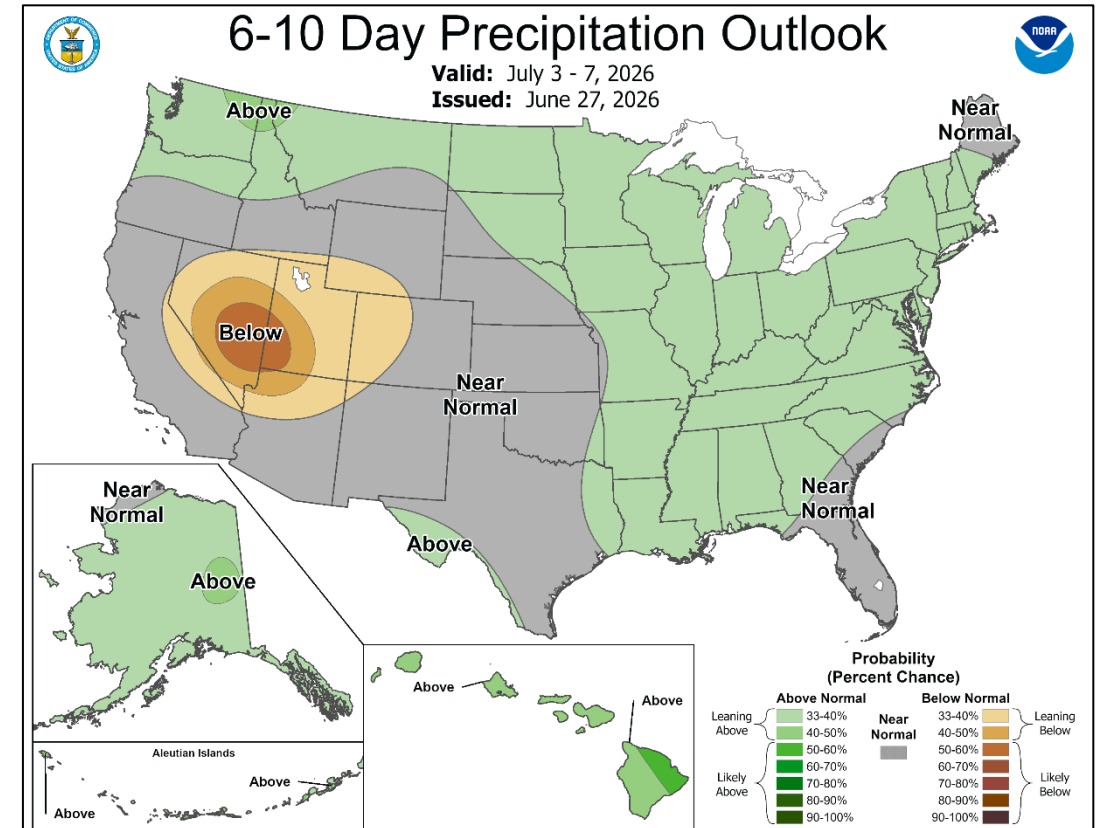
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Long Range Outlooks – Jul 3-7

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability



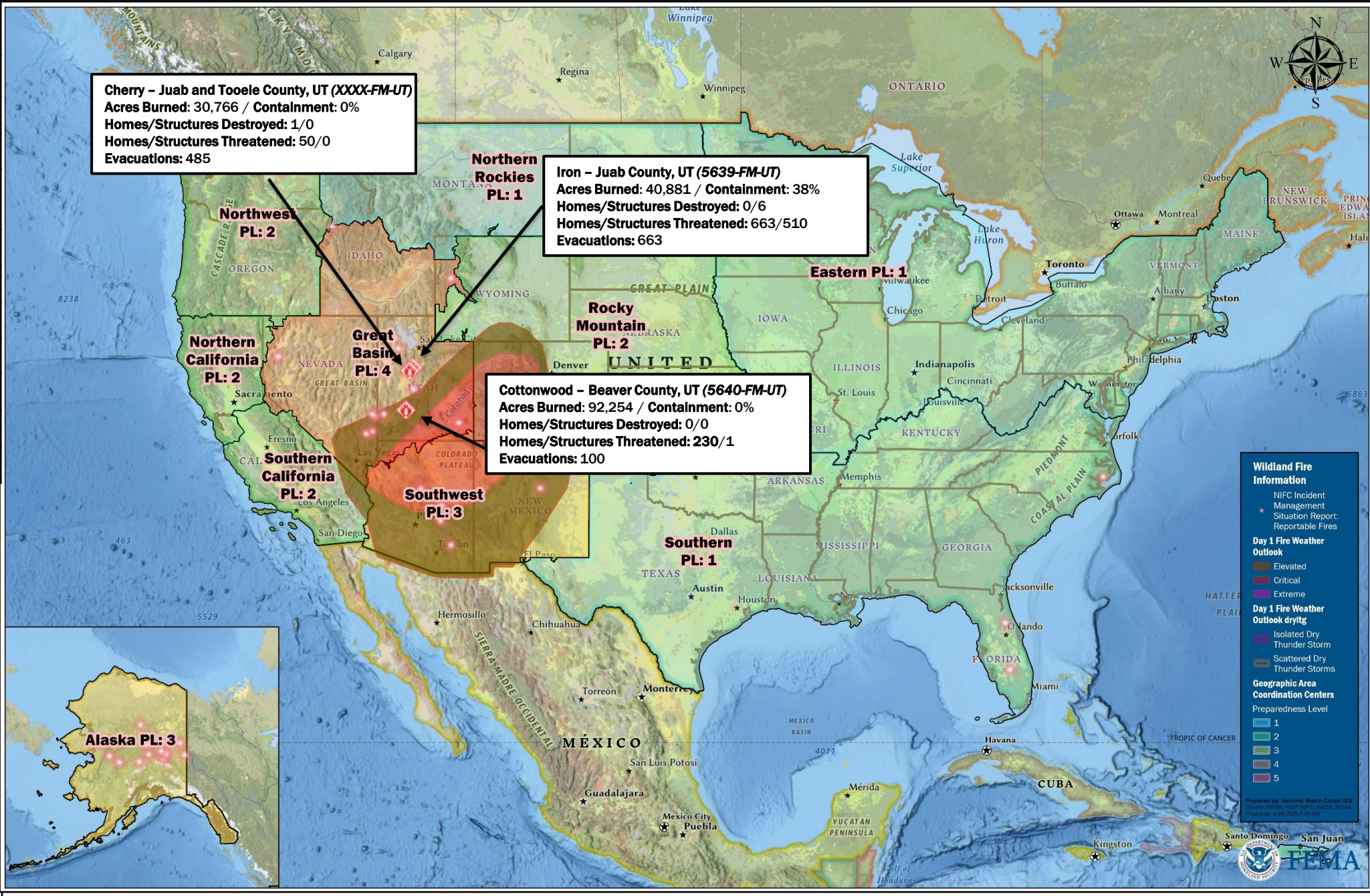

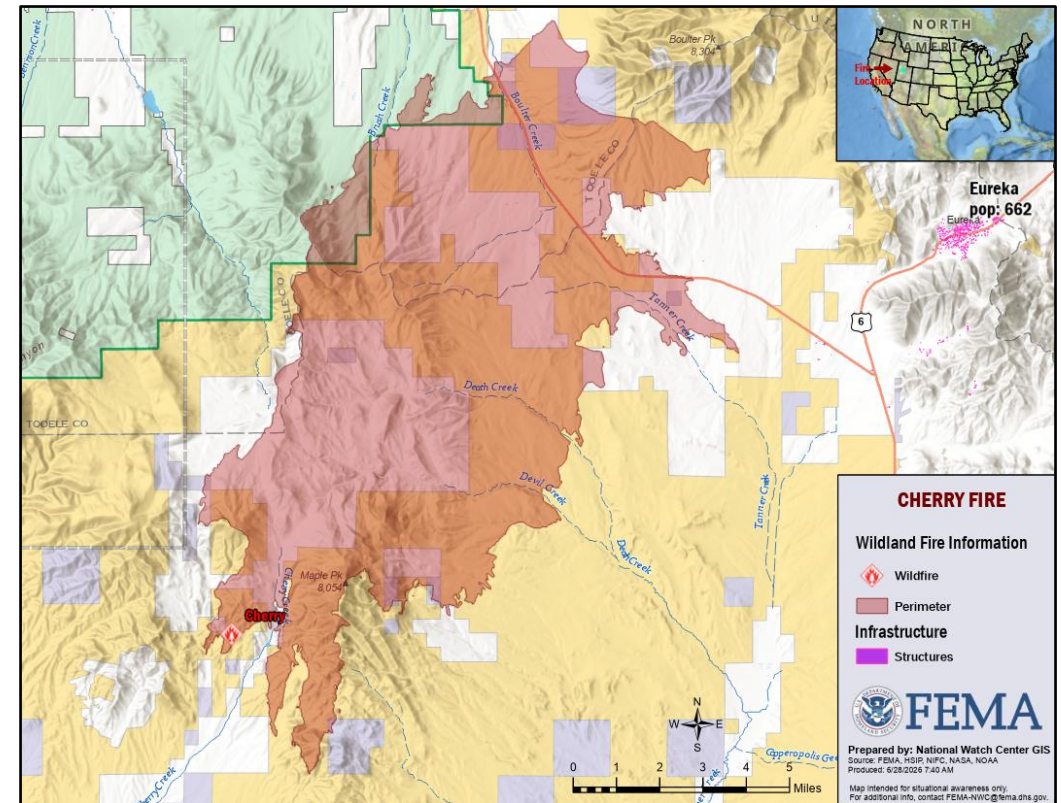

Situation: The Acting FEMA Region 8 Regional Administrator approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Cherry Fire, which has burned approximately 30,766 acres with 0% containment. The Cherry Fire is burning on state and private land in and around Eureka, Mammoth and Tintic Junction, UT (*combined pop. 12k*). The fire is threatening the Mammoth watershed as well as the Eureka Mills Superfund Site. Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

Response:

- FMAG approved Jun 27
- UT SEOC is at Partial Activation (FIFA World Cup and Wildfires)
- FEMA Region 8 Watch is at Enhanced; RRCC is Rostered
- NWC at Enhanced (FIFA World Cup / America 250)
