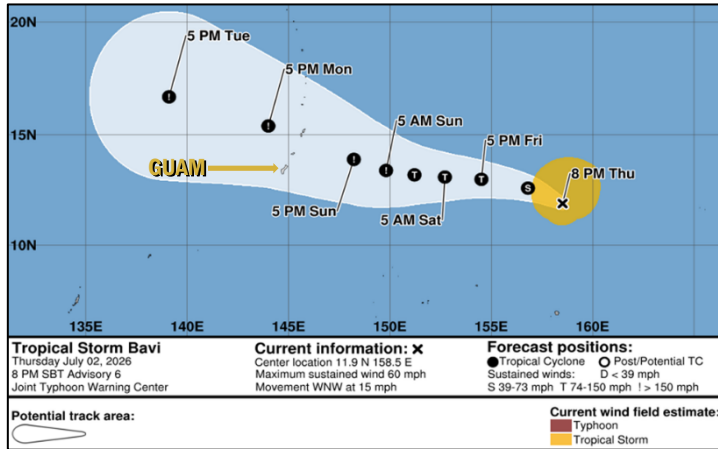

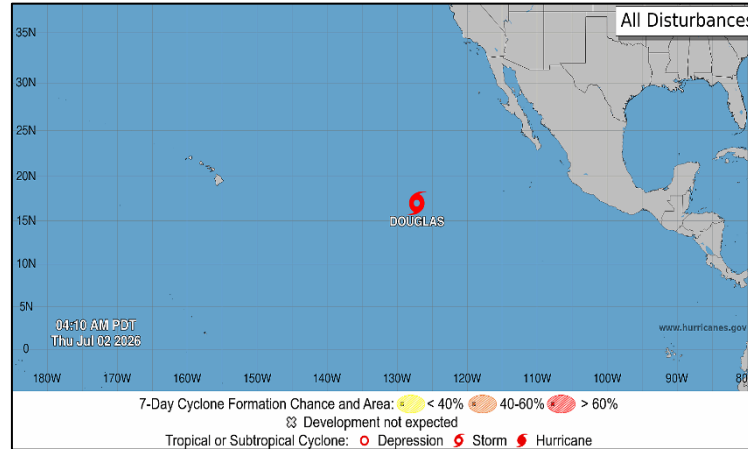

- Tropical cyclone activity is not expected during the next 7 days

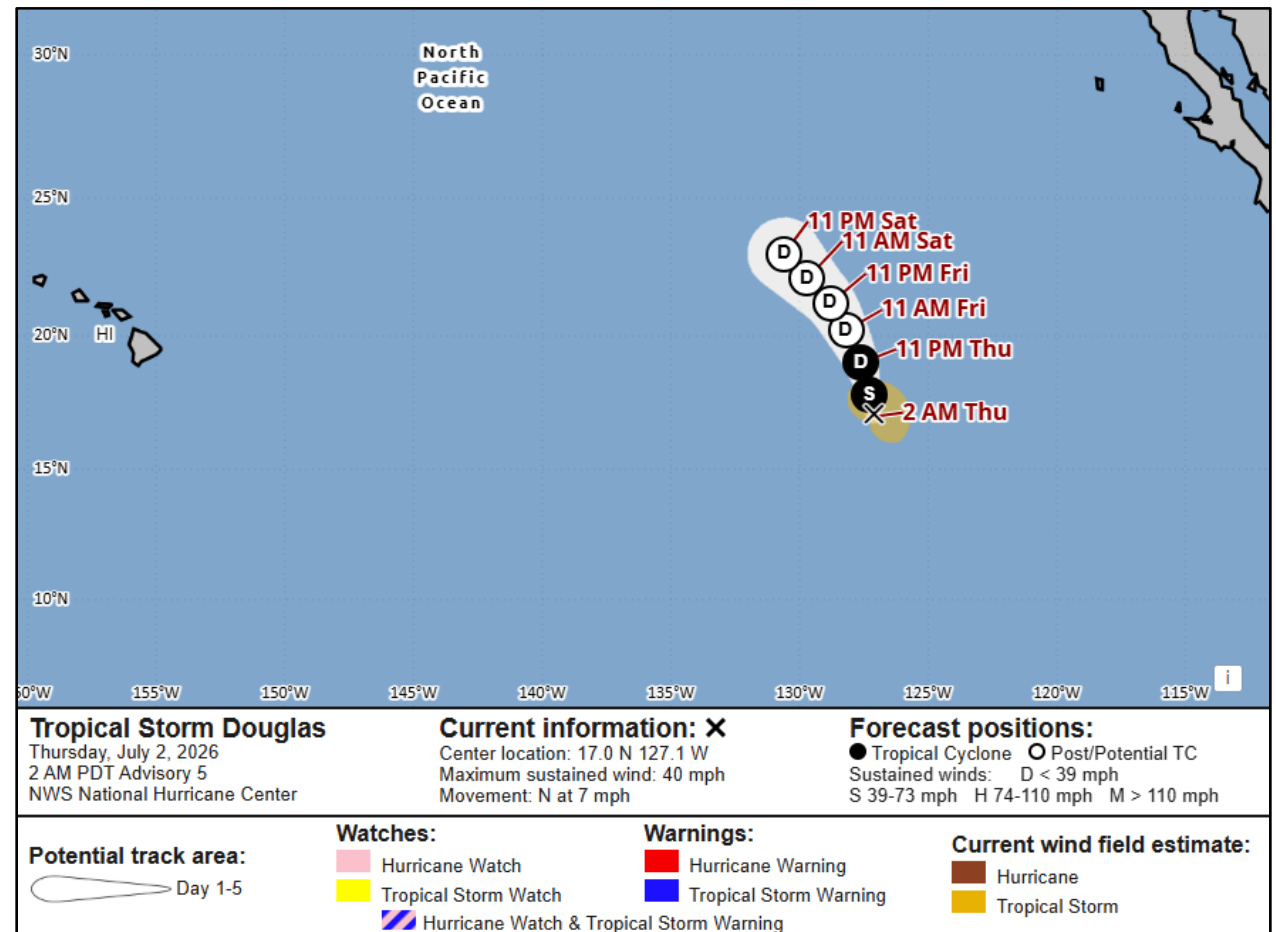


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Tropical Storm Douglas – Eastern Pacific

Situation: (Advisory #5, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- **1,185 miles** WSW of the Southern tip of Baja California
- Moving N at 7 mph
- **Maximum sustained winds near 40 mph**
- **Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 90 miles from the center**
- Some strengthening is **possible the next several hours, a weakening trend is forecast tonight into Friday**
- Douglas is forecast to become a post-tropical **cyclone** on Friday

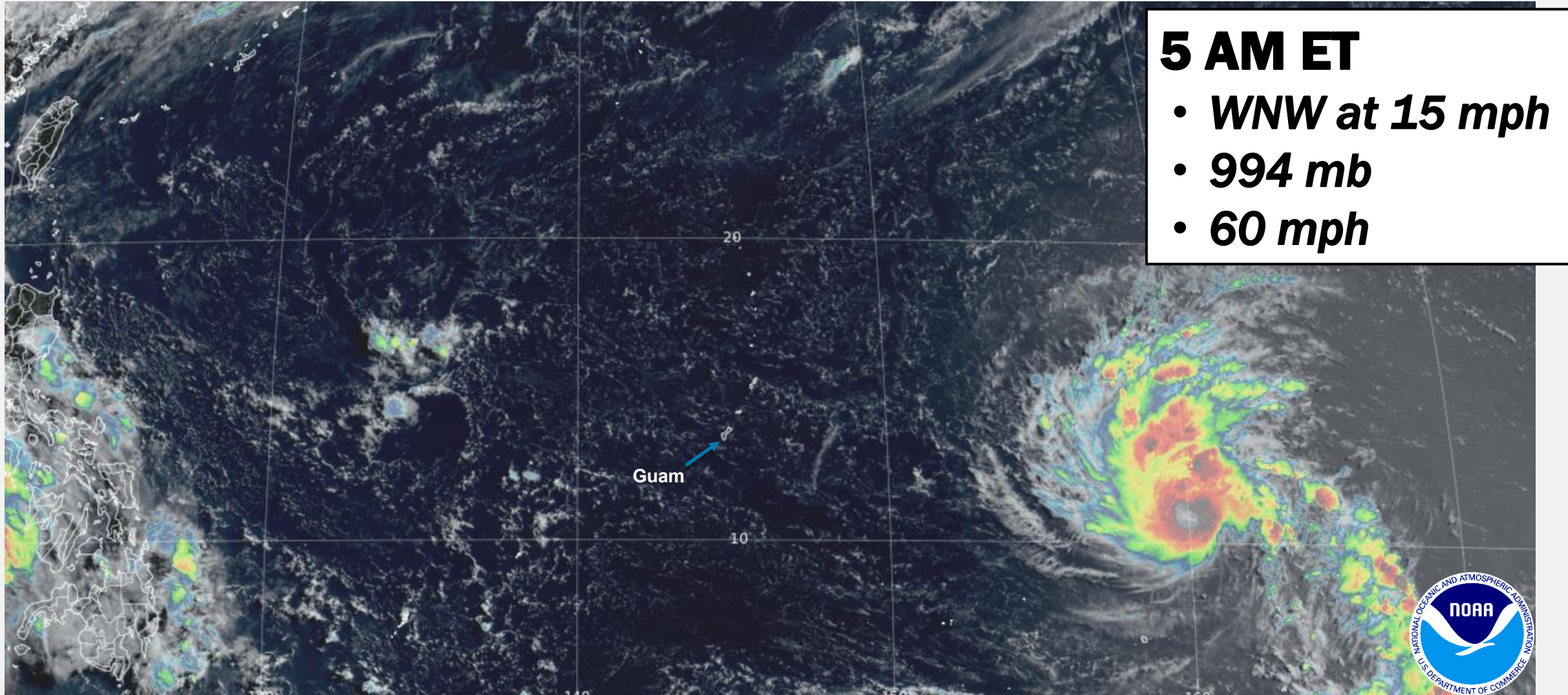

SATELLITE LOOP



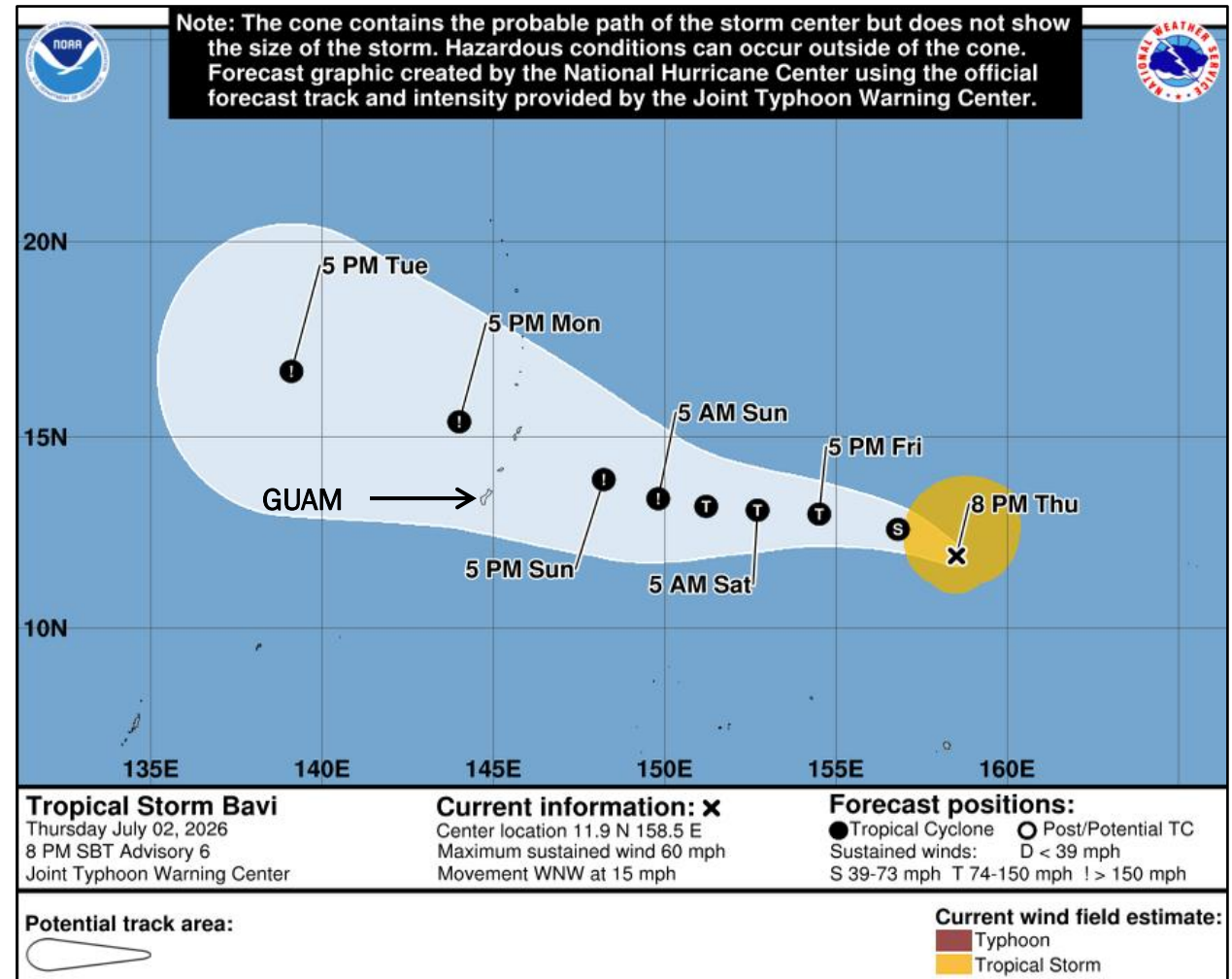
Tropical Storm Bavi – Western Pacific

Situation: (JTWC, Advisory #6 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 930 miles E of Guam
- Moving WNW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 60 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward from the center up to 160 miles
- Bavi is forecast to intensify over the next few days

Hazards Affecting Land:

- **WIND:** Strong and damaging winds could arrive as early as Saturday evening, but most likely to arrive Sunday morning. Typhoon Watches will be issued where winds are possible within 48 hours.
- **RAIN:** Totals of 6-11" possible, locally up to 14" near the center
- **STORM SURGE:** Coastal inundation is likely, with heights potentially exceeding 5 feet

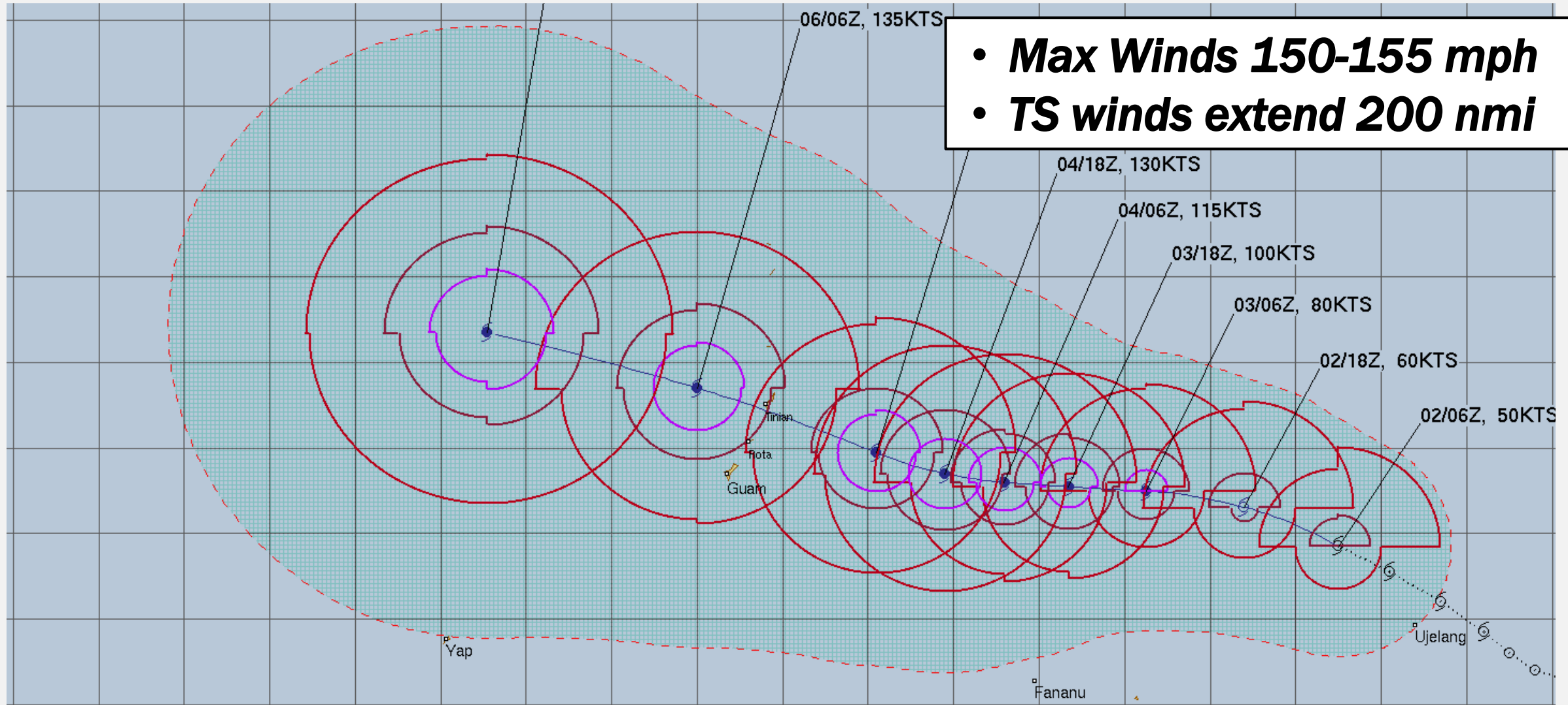


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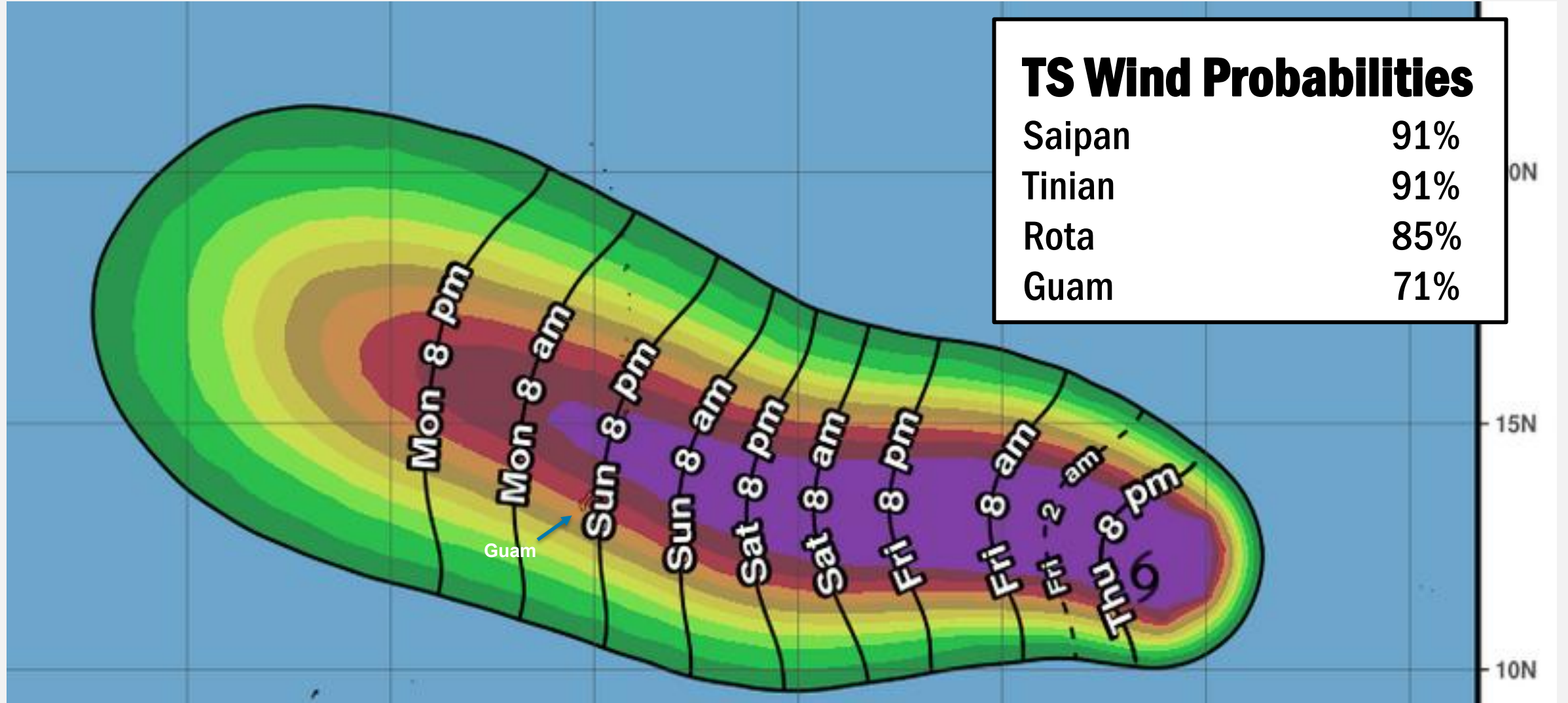

FORECAST TRACK



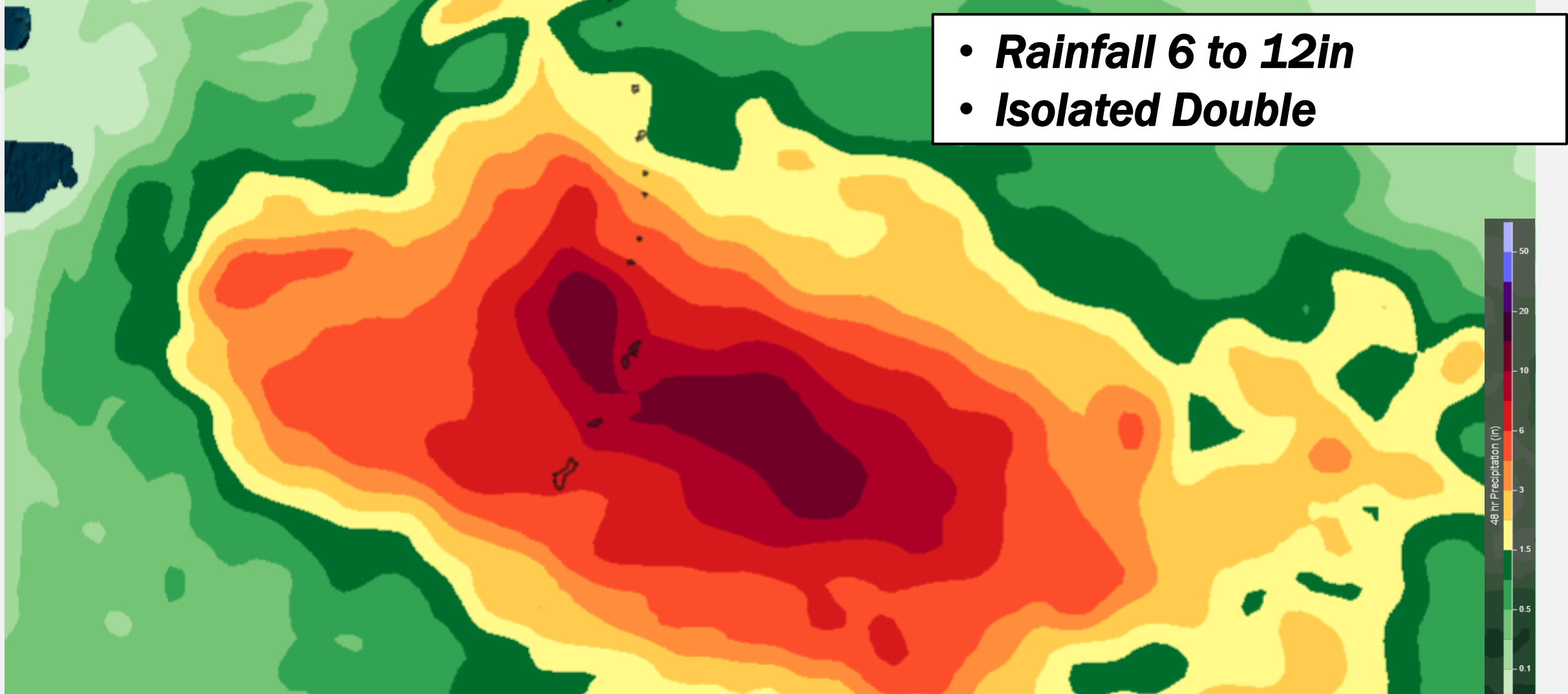

Tropical Storm Bavi Preparations – Western Pacific

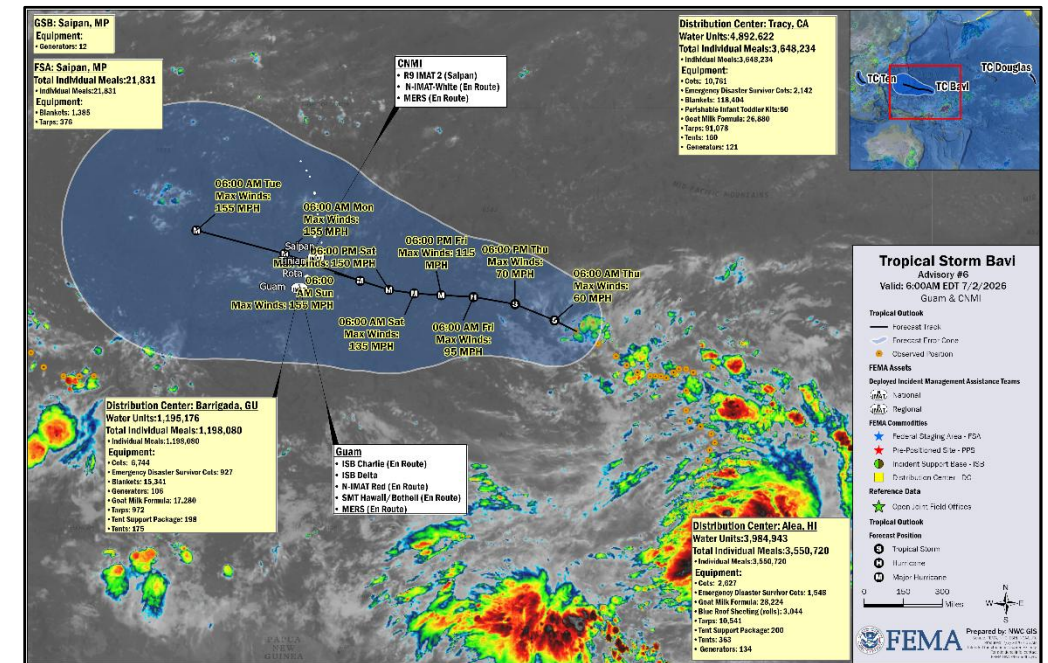
Situation and analysis: Tropical Storm Bavi presents a severe threat to the Mariana Islands as it passes through over the weekend. The potential Super Typhoon may bring widespread impacts to infrastructure, communications, and essential services. FEMA Region 9 and HQ assets, to include IMATs, Logistics, and Disaster Emergency Communications, are deployed and/or en route to Guam, CNMI, and Hawaii to support any emerging response requirements, mitigate potential disruptions, and support recovery. There are no watches or warnings currently in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, or Saipan (*JTWC Advisory #6 and NWS Guam, as of 7:16 a.m. ET*).

National Weather Forecast



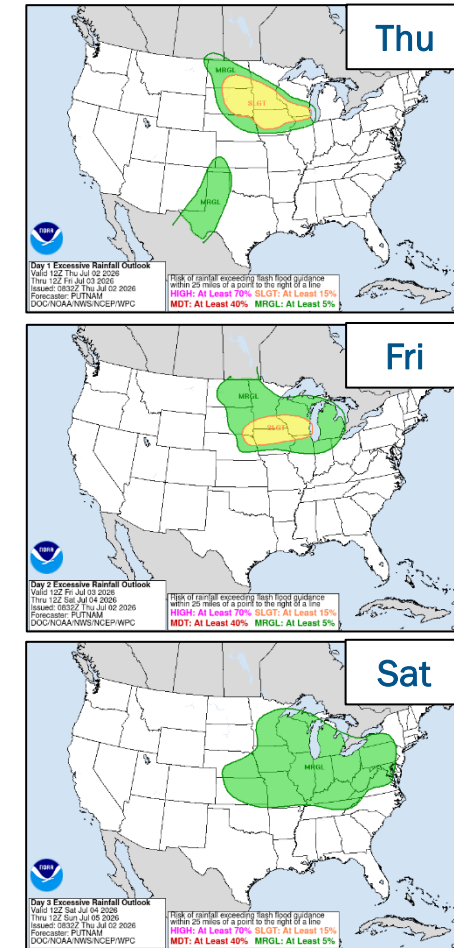
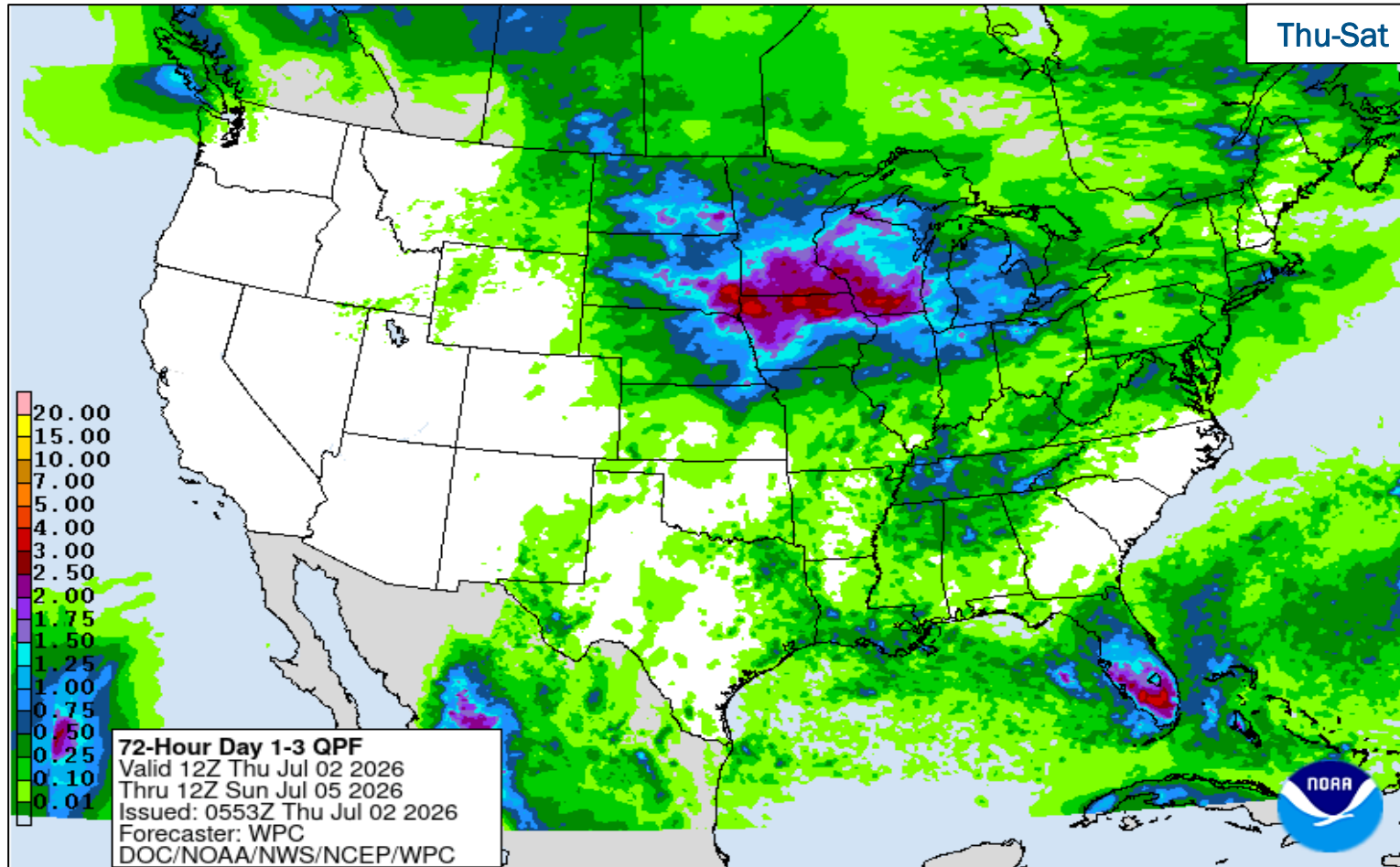
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Severe Weather Outlook



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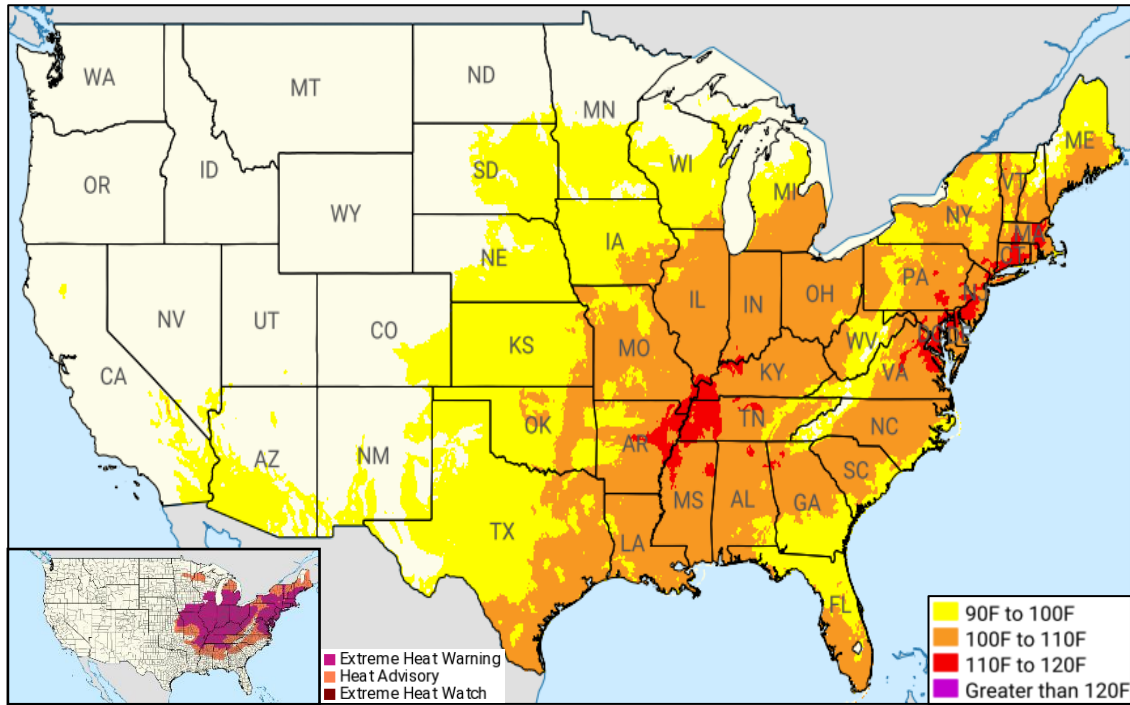
