Situation: Super Typhoon Bavi remains at Category 4 and continues to move away from the Marianas (*JTWC Advisory #30, as of 5:00 a.m. ET*). The Governor of CNMI declared the "All Clear" for Saipan, Tinian, and Rota on July 7. The Governor of Guam lifted the Shelter-in-Place order on Jul 7. FEMA maintains close coordination with Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense (GHS/OCD) to execute assessments of critical infrastructure systems. (*FEMA Planning Section ILBs, as of 5:00 a.m. ET*)

Lifeline Impacts: (*FEMA ILBs, as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Jul 8*)

Safety and Security: Law enforcement and other essential government services are ongoing with adaptations for disaster response

CNMI: Law Enforcement Support Team (LEST) coordinating travel to Saipan, estimated arrival 07/10

GU: Power restored to Territory EOC; debris removal site to open on Jul 8/9 (ET)

Food, Hydration, Shelter: Shelters open; Territories are conducting feeding operations

- CNMI:
- CNMI HSEM delivered 4-5 days worth of MREs and boxed water to shelter sites on Jul 4/5 (ET); World Central Kitchen began shelter and community feeding 7/07
 - Tinian: ESF-6 FHD TF identifying and validating commodity needs
 - 8 (-2) total shelters open / 274 (-219) occupants
 - Saipan: 5 (-1) shelters open / 207 (-170) occupants
 - Tinian: 1 (-1) shelters open / 16 (-47) occupants
 - Rota: 2 shelters open / 51 (-12) occupants. Rota HS shelter in need of generator; Rota Aging Center will receive water and toilets when route is clear

GU: 3 (-2) shelters open / 462 (-403) occupants

Health and Medical: Hospitals and select clinics are operating with generators

- CNMI:
- Rota: Rota Health Clinic (RHC) Generator is offline per USACE
 - Emergency Departments are operating 24/7 on Saipan, Tinian, and Rota

GU: DPHSS Northern Clinic closed due to lack of water access, working with FEMA and Territory to source sanitation equipment and tanker; Guam Memorial Hospital open on generator power; 1 dialysis center closed due to landslide with patients relocated

Water Systems: Water systems are slowly being restored

- CNMI:
- Saipan:
 - 16% of water wells running on CUC generators, 86% of customers receiving intermittent water service
 - Three (3) water filling stations opened on 07/07
 - Rota:
 - Exposed broken water pipe has been repaired and is being pressurized; Water still requires testing for boil water notice to be lifted

- GU:
- Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) Northern system partially operational with assessments underway; Southern and Central fully operational
 - 74 of 98 water wells online; 71 on generator power
 - GWA deployed water tankers in areas of low water pressure
 - Wastewater treatment plants operational
 - Boil water notice issued for GWA customers who lost water service for >48 hours

Energy: Power plant assessments and generator installations are underway

- CNMI:
- USACE conducting generator installations as necessary
 - Tinian: USACE and CUC have begun power plant assessment
 - Rota: Power plant damage assessment indicates damages due to flooding and rain
 - Select gas stations open

- GU:
- 29% of system load restored / 97% of substations energized / 30% of feeders/circuits energized
 - Temporary Emergency Power (TEP) installations underway at Guam Memorial Hospital, Chalan Pago-Ordot Shelter, and Pigua Hill Water Booster pump station

Communications: Communications outages reported across the territory

- CNMI:
- Saipan: Responder communications continued throughout the storm; alternate numbers available if 911 goes out of service
 - Cellular infrastructure:
 - Saipan: Cellular service coverage improving as power is restored
 - Tinian: Cellular service towers restored
 - Rota: 1 of 3 Docomo Cellular sites (33%) out of service

GU: 150 of 240 (62.5%) cell sites online, with 36 out due to power and 166 on backup power; assessments ongoing

Transportation: Port of Guam resumed gatehouse operations

- CNMI:
- ESF-3 USACE executing road clearance MA
 - Saipan flights expected to resume at 5:00 p.m. ET, Jul 8
 - Saipan mass transit services suspended until further notice

- GU:
- All major roadways open; GH-1, 15, 17 are degraded due to flooding or debris
 - Port of Guam resumed gatehouse operations allowing cargo movement through terminal; Apra Harbor is closed with USCG assessing conditions

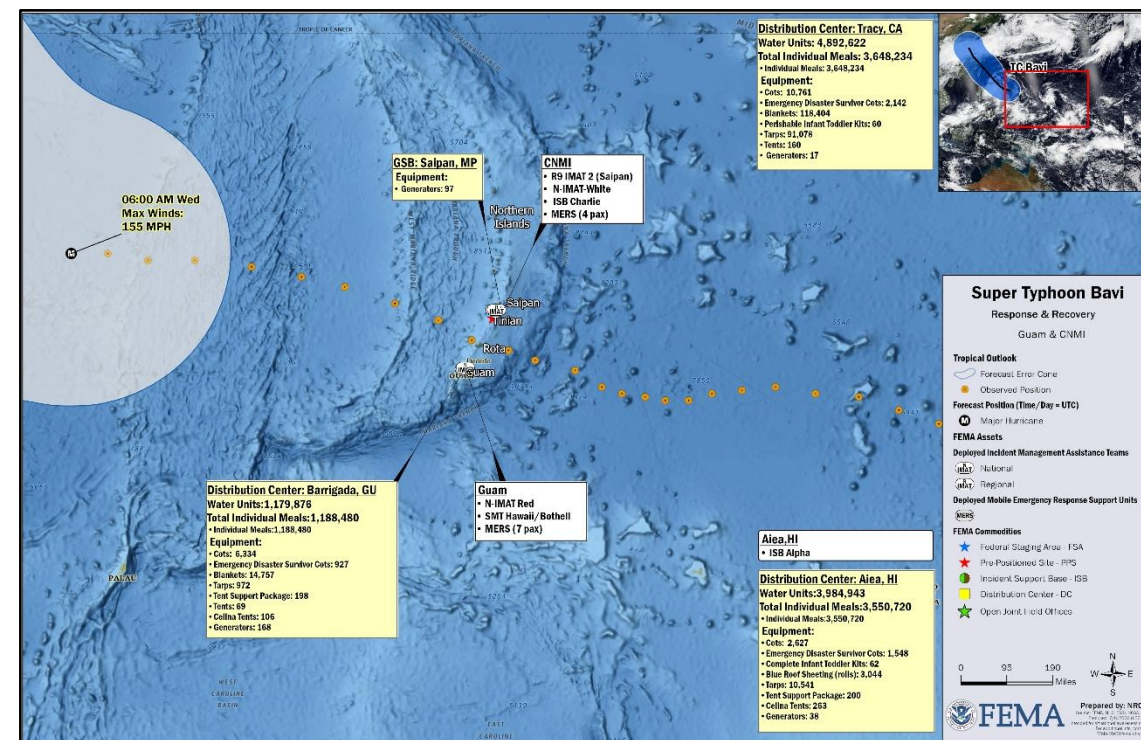

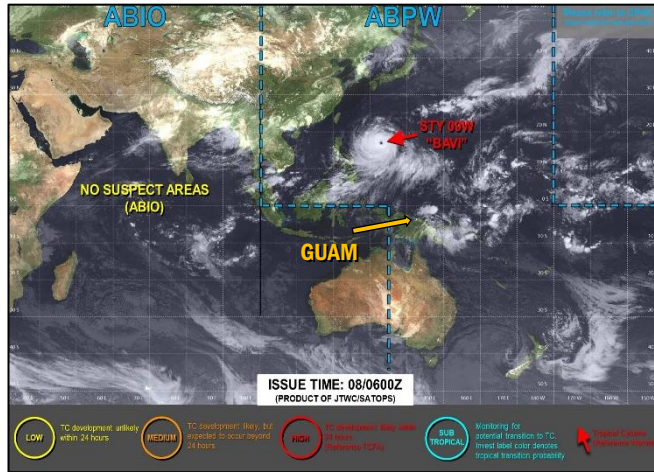

Western Pacific



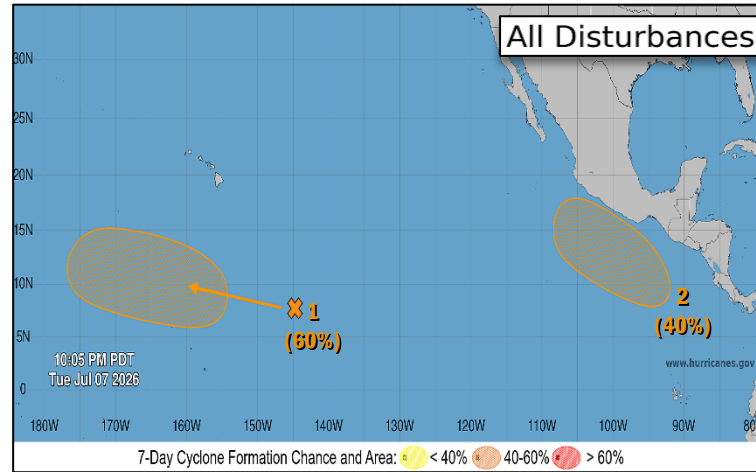
Super Typhoon Bavi (CAT-4): (Advisory #30 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Continues to move away from US Territories

Invest 97W: (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- No significant development expected over the next 24hrs.

Eastern and Central Pacific



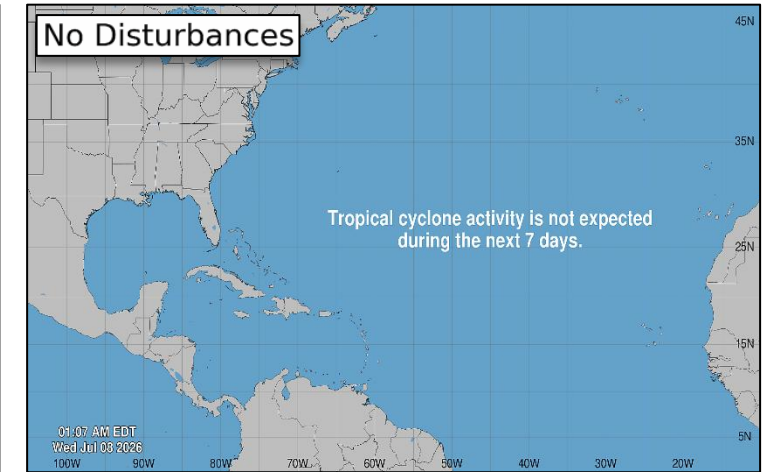
Disturbance 1: (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SE of the Hawaiian Islands
- Moving W to WNW
- Environmental conditions appear favorable for gradual development of this system later this week and into this weekend, and a tropical depression could form
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Med (60%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located offshore of Southwestern Mexico
- Environmental conditions appear favorable for gradual development thereafter, and a tropical depression could form as the system moves generally WNW
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (40%)
