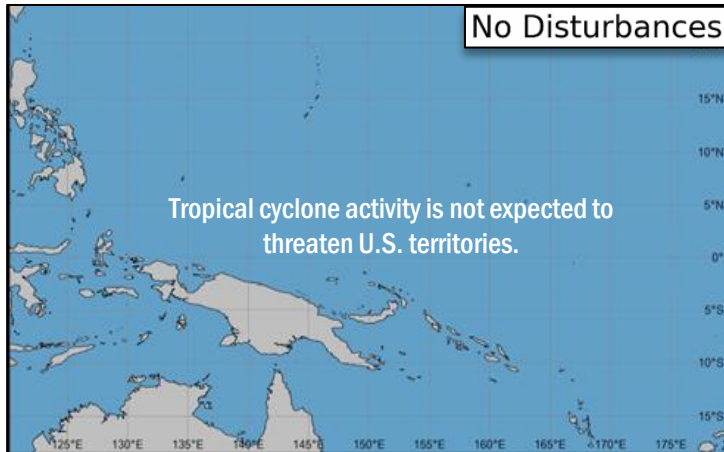

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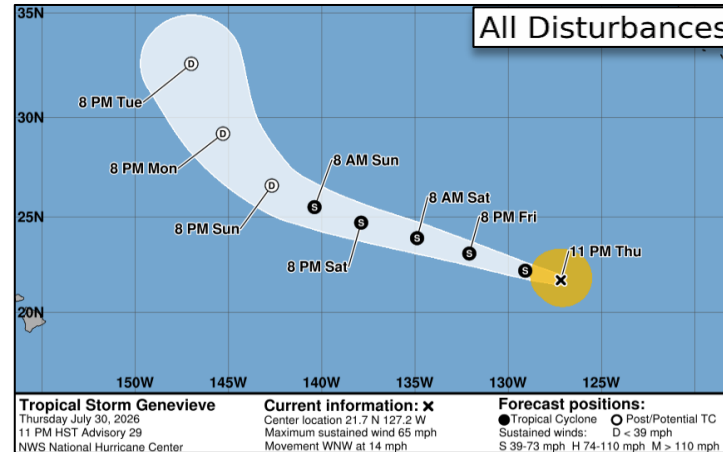

## Eastern and Central Pacific



### Tropical Storm Genevieve: (Advisory #29, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,110 miles W of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Moving WNW at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 65 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 115 miles
- Gradual weakening is forecast during the next few days, and Genevieve is expected to become a remnant low late this weekend

**Situation:** The Acting FEMA Region 10 Regional Administrator has approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Modrite Fire, which is burning on the lands of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation and the community of Inchelium (*pop.* 400). At the time of the request, the fire was burning on 100% tribal land and was threatening multiple tribal facilities and infrastructure. Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

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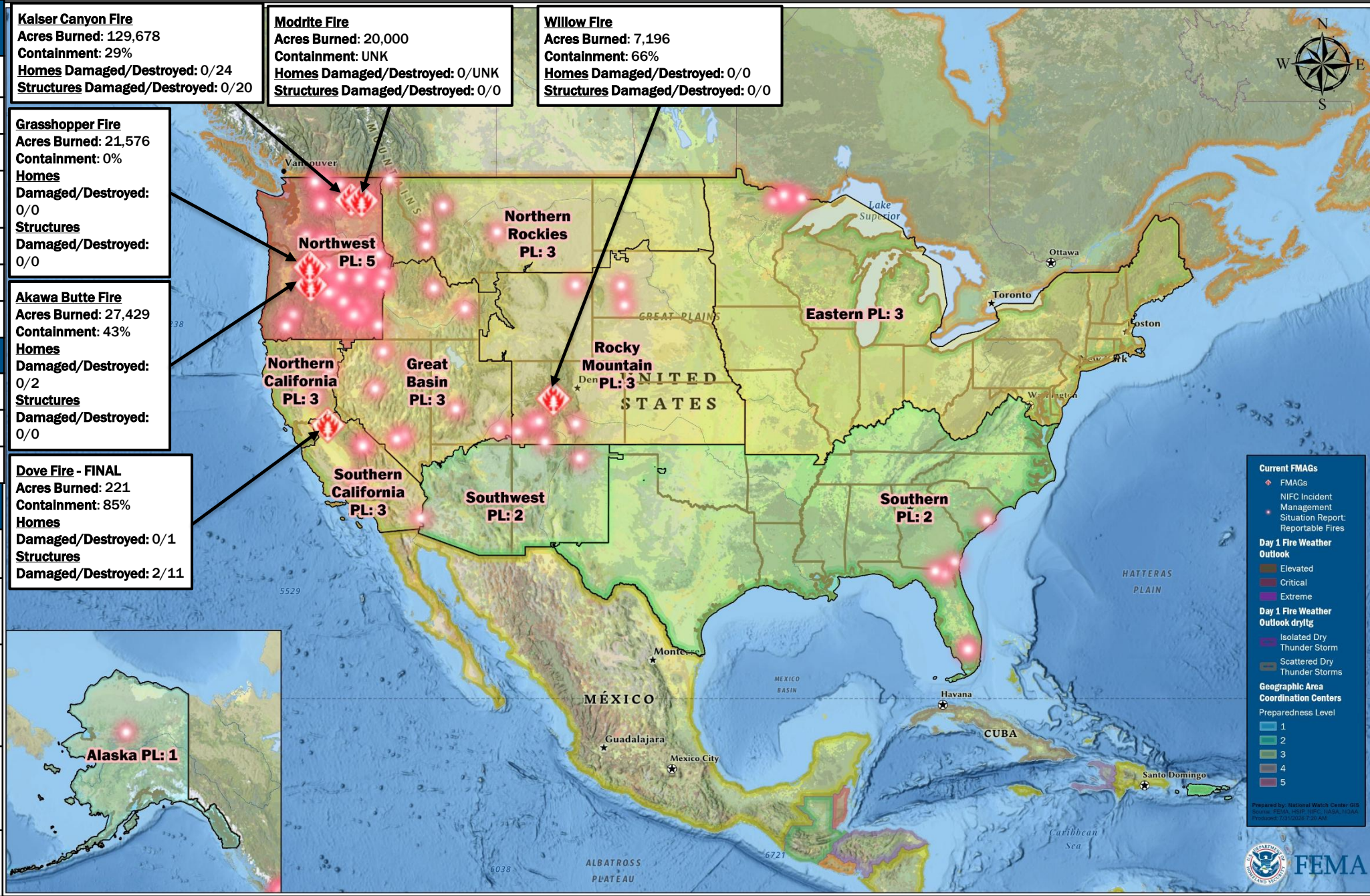

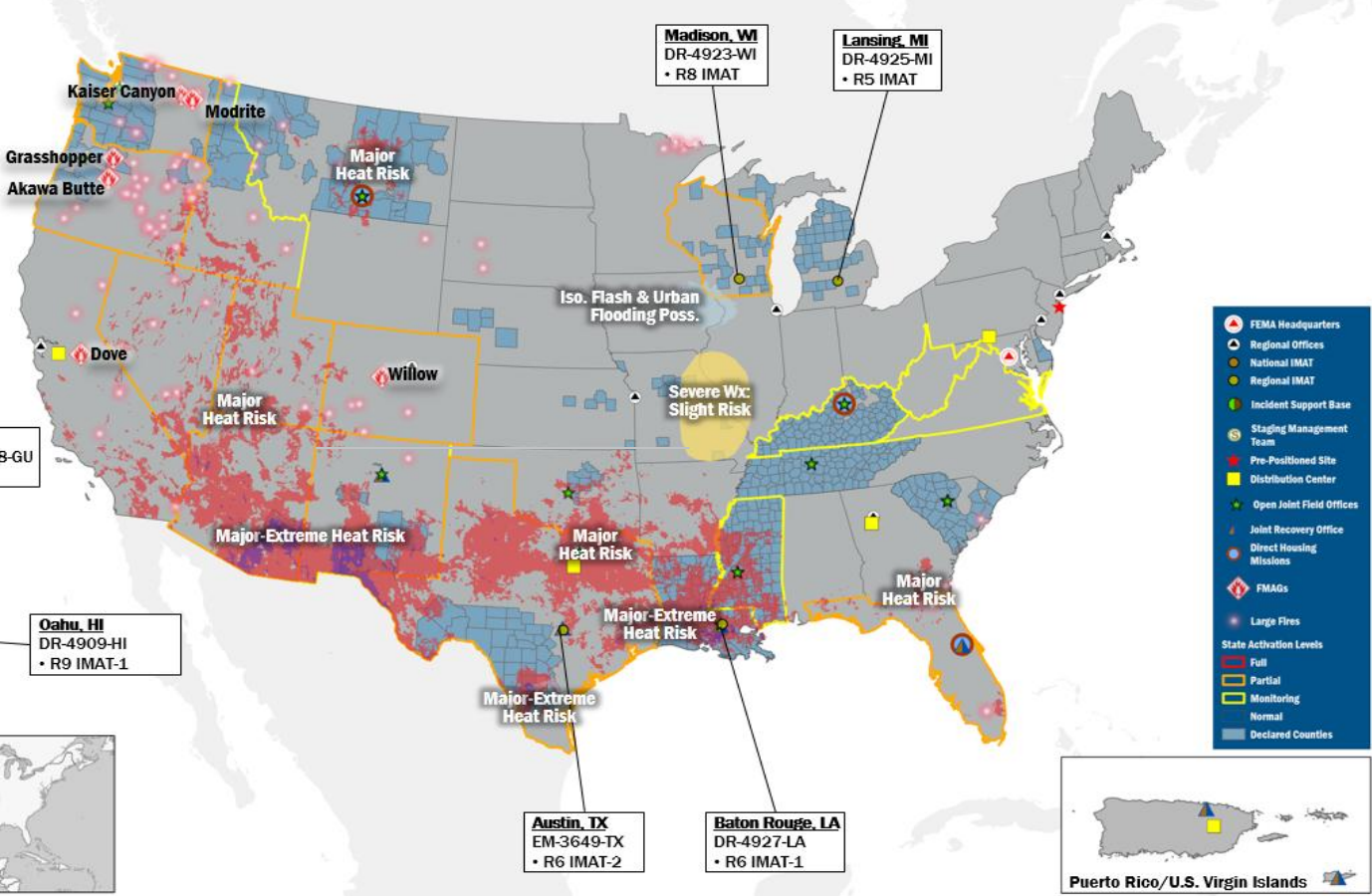
