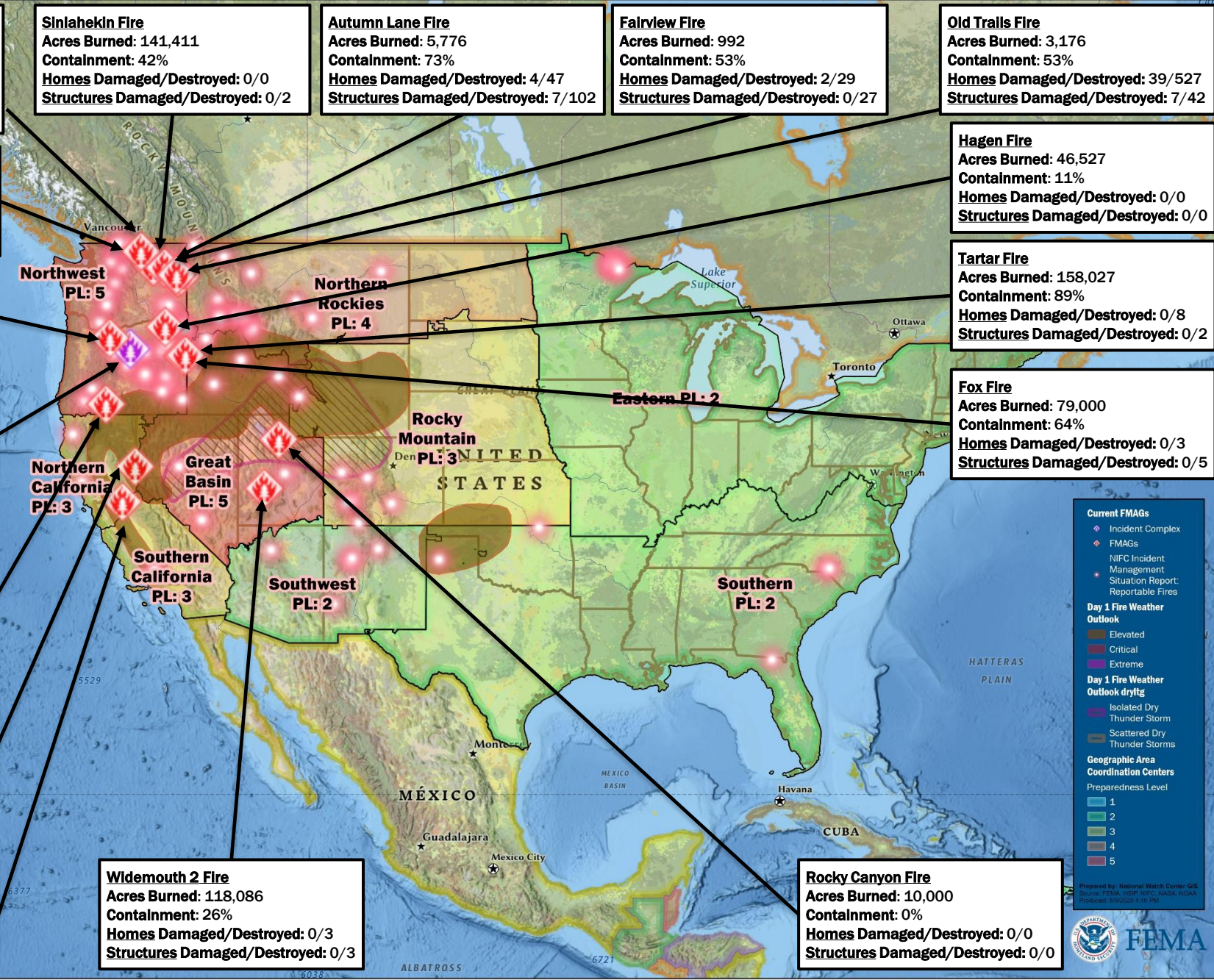

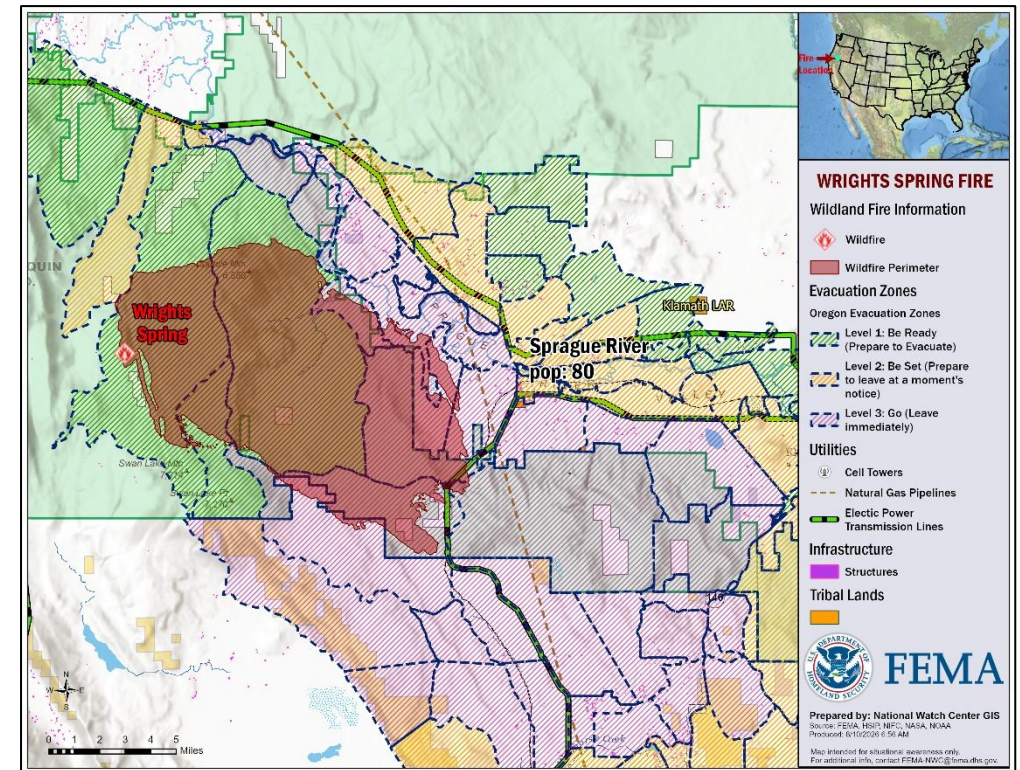

Situation: The FEMA Region 10 Regional Administrator approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Wrights Spring Fire in Klamath County, OR. The fire has burned approximately 33,970 acres of federal, tribal, and private land and threatens 418 primary homes in the communities of Sprague River, Chiloquin, and Klamath Tribal lands. The fire also threatens utility infrastructure, high use recreational areas, sensitive cultural lands, and radio communications infrastructure. Two human and one pet shelter are open and there are no further requests for FEMA assistance (*Region 10 SPOTREP, as of 2:17 a.m. ET*)

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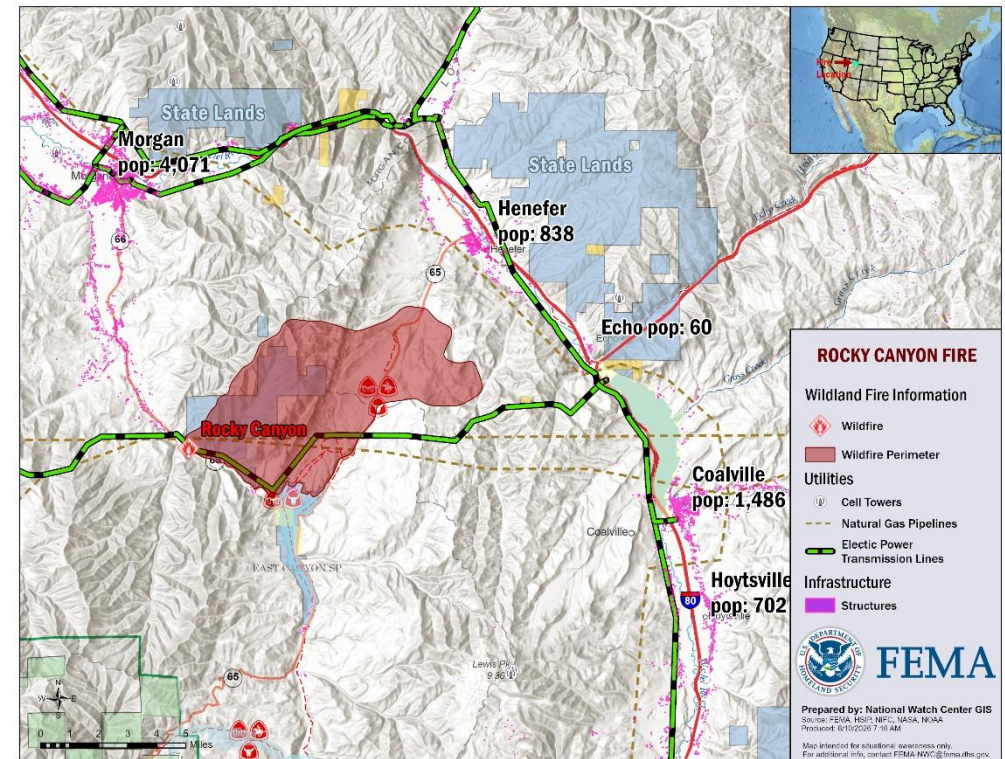

Situation: The FEMA Region 8 Regional Administrator approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Rocky Canyon Fire in Summit and Morgan Counties, UT. The fire has burned approximately 10,000 acres of state and private land and mandatory evacuations are in place. The fire threatens several communities, a campground, power transmission lines, gas pipelines, and several roads and highways are closed. The state anticipates an additional 300 more people may be evacuated and there are no further requests for FEMA assistance. (Region 8 SPOTREP, as of 1:30 a.m. ET)

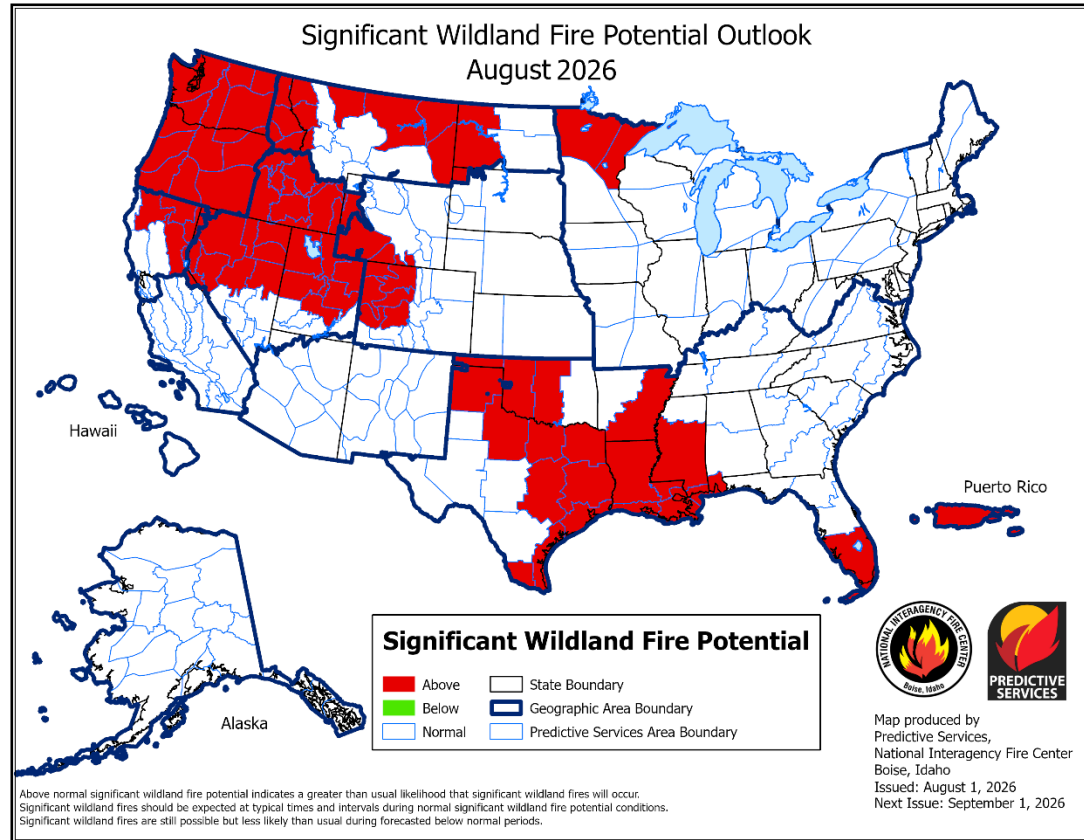

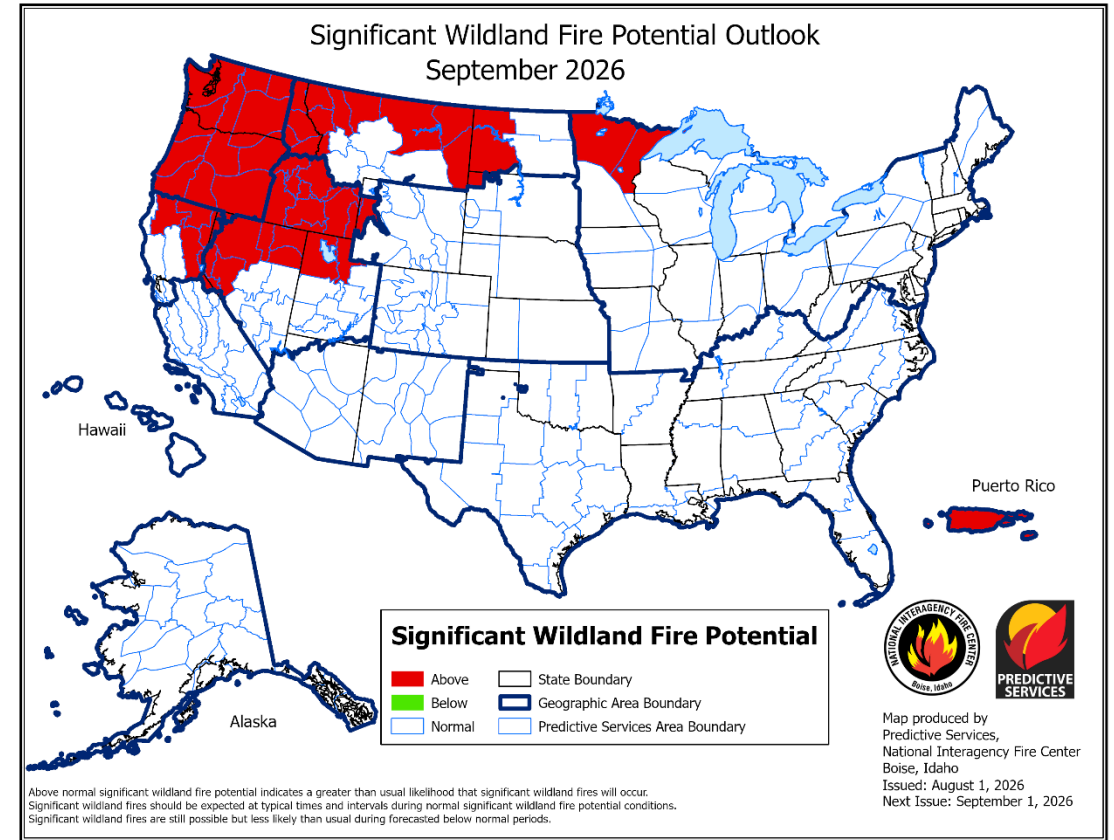


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Significant Wildland Fire Potential Outlook – Aug-Sep

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Wildfires – Washington/Idaho – FINAL

Situation: Locally executed, state-managed, and federally supported fire response operations continue in impacted areas in Washington and Idaho. Temperatures remained in the 80's and 90's across the region and conditions remained extremely dry with humidity in the single digits to low teens for part of the weekend. Initial attack of fires was light; however, some fire spread was observed (Northwest Interagency Coordination Center (NWCC) Morning Brief, as of 9:46 a.m. ET, Aug 9). Elevated Fire Weather is forecast for the majority of Idaho: however, none is forecast for the state of Washington today (SPC Fire Weather Outlook as of 2:10 p.m. ET, Aug 9). Air quality in the region remains poor, however is trending upward in Yakima, Moses Lake, and Spokane Washington (AirNow, as of 10:15 p.m. ET, Aug 9)

Food, Hydration, Shelter: 7 (-4) shelters open / 147 (-52) occupants in WA (ARC, as of 6:51 a.m. ET)

Health & Medical:

- HHS Secretary declared a public health emergency on Aug 7 (HHS R10 SITREP #6, as of 7:52 a.m. ET, Aug 8)
- Spokane VA Hospital remains closed (VA.gov, as of 10:00 p.m. ET, Aug 9)

Water Systems: Wildfire related Boil Water Advisories remain active in Spokane and Ferry Counties (WA DOH, as of 10:00 p.m. ET, Aug 9)

Energy: 30 generators arrived in Ephrata, WA (LSCMS, as of 6:01 a.m. ET)

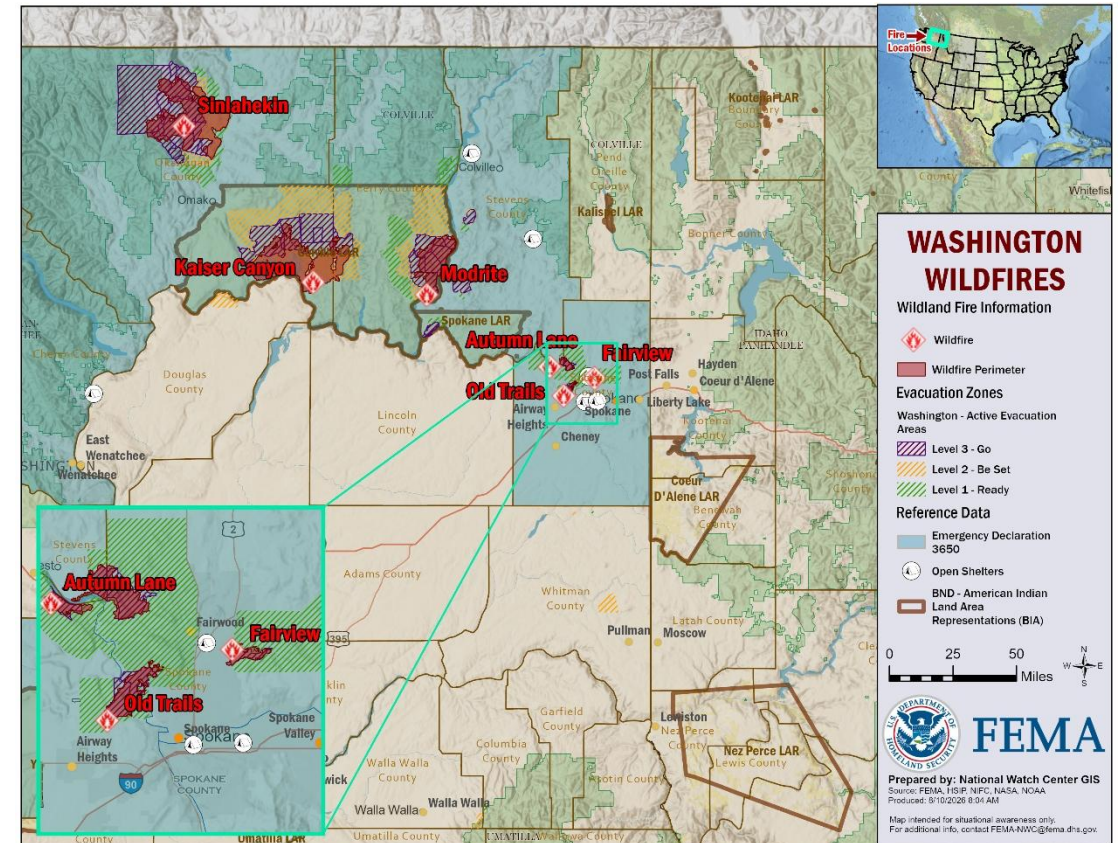

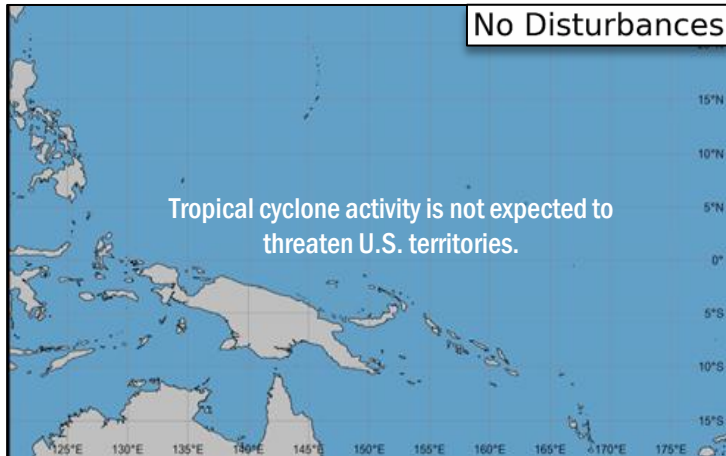


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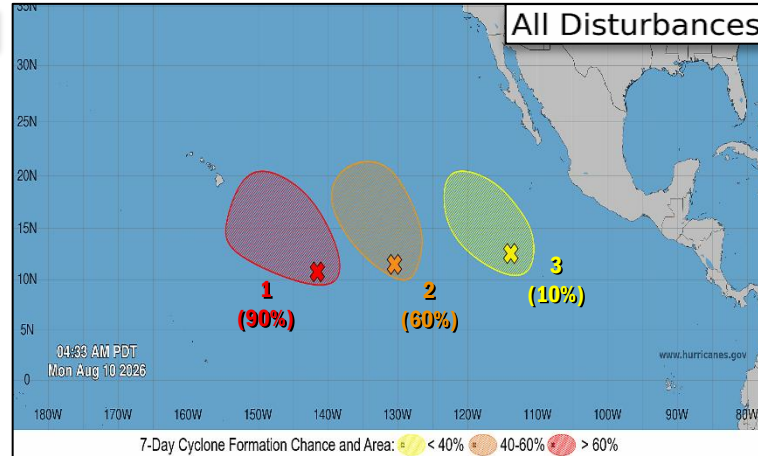

- Moving WNW
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for further development of this system and a tropical depression is **expected** to form **by midweek**
- Formation chance – 48-hour: **Med (50%)**; 7-day: High (90%)

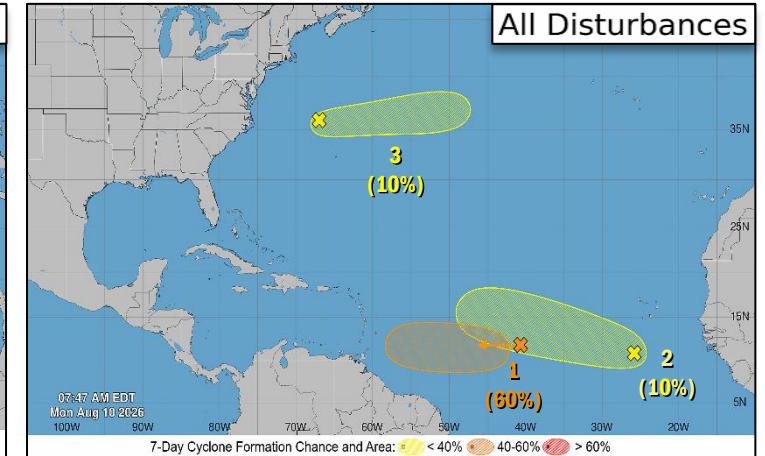
Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles **WSW** of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula
- Moving WNW to NW
- A tropical depression could form during the next few days
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Med (60%)

Disturbance 3: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles **SSW** of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula
- Moving WNW **at 15 mph**
- **Environmental conditions appear marginally conducive for further development**
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (**10%**); 7-day: Low (10%)

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a **few hundred miles** S of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving **W to WNW**
- **Environmental conditions are forecast to be conducive for gradual development by midweek**
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (**20%**); 7-day: Med (**60%**)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located midway between coast of W Africa and Lesser Antilles
- Moving W
- Some gradual development is possible during the early to middle part of this week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (**10%**); 7-day: Low (**10%**)

Disturbance 3: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

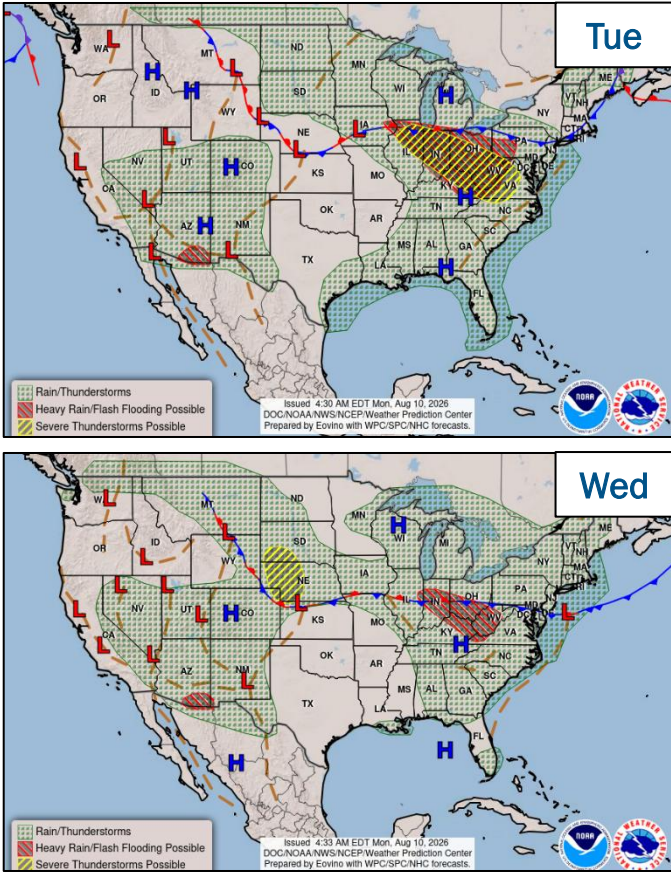
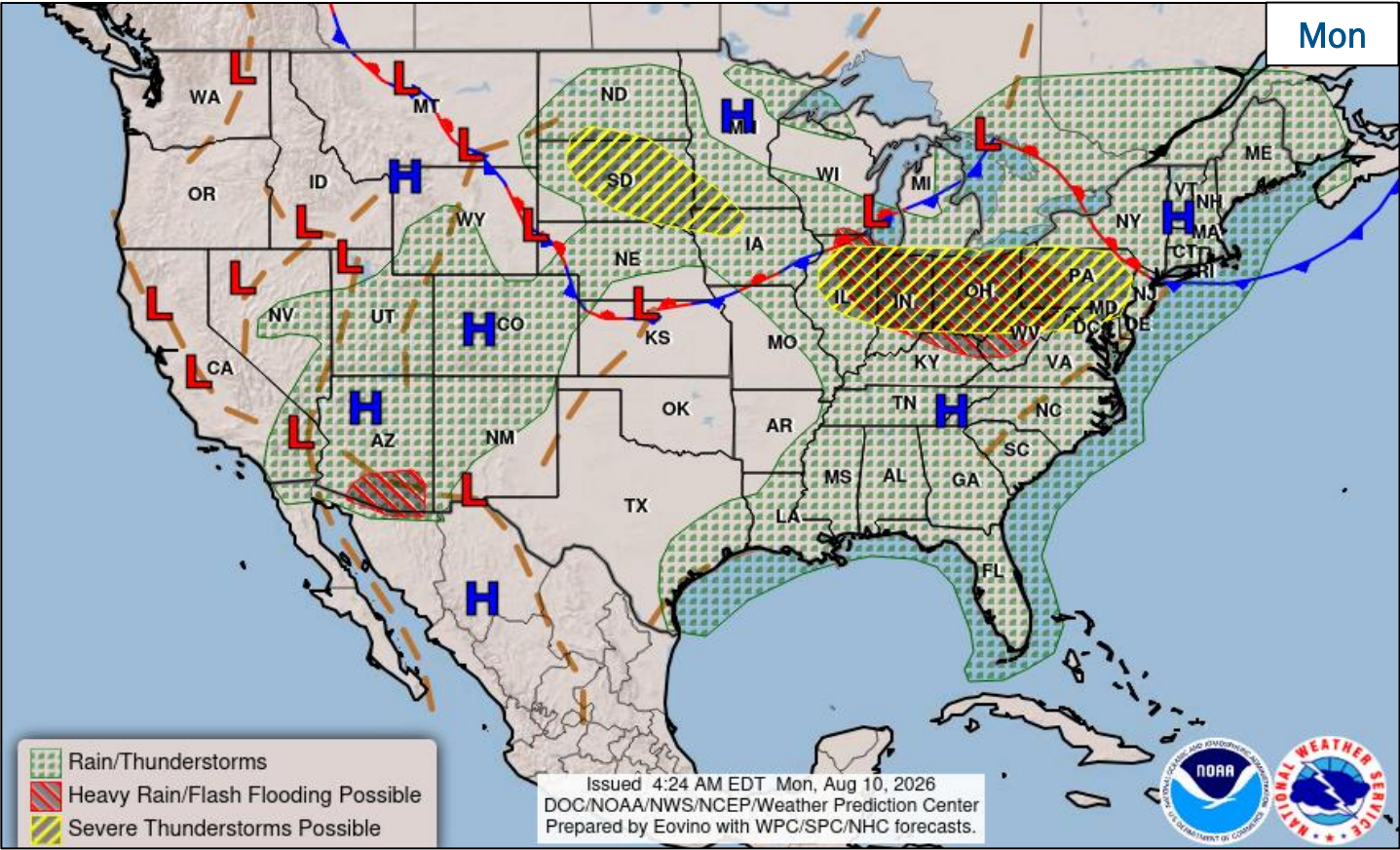

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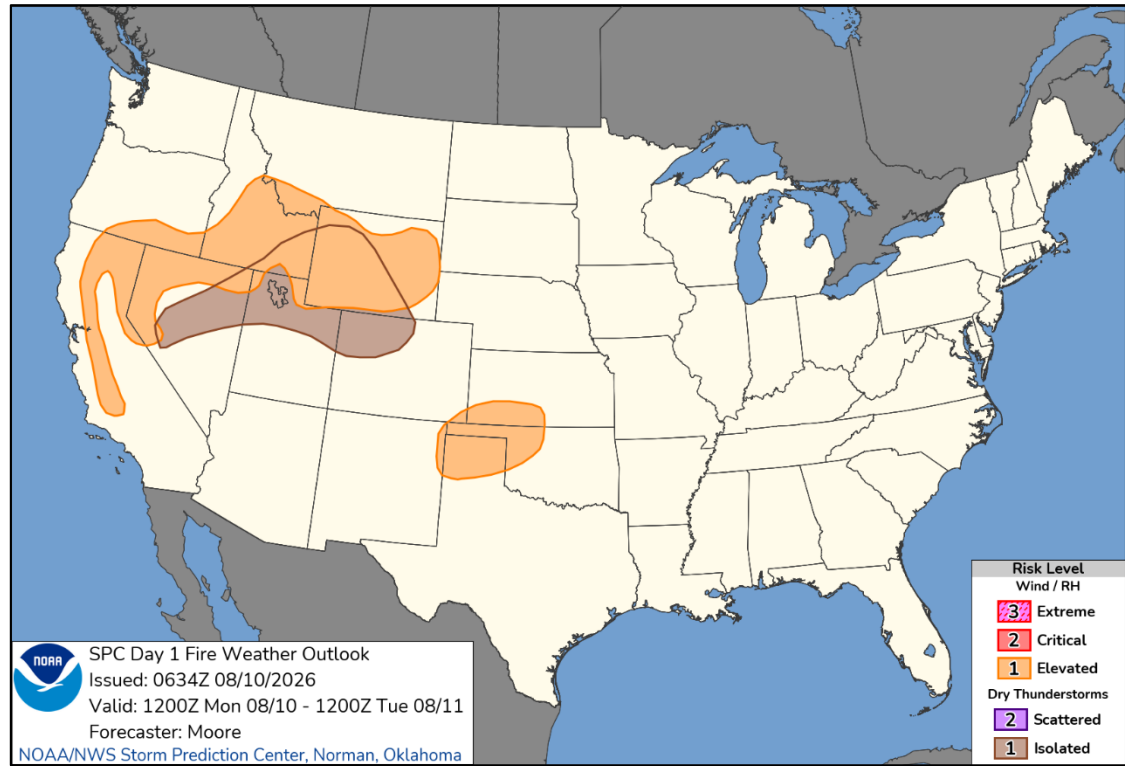
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



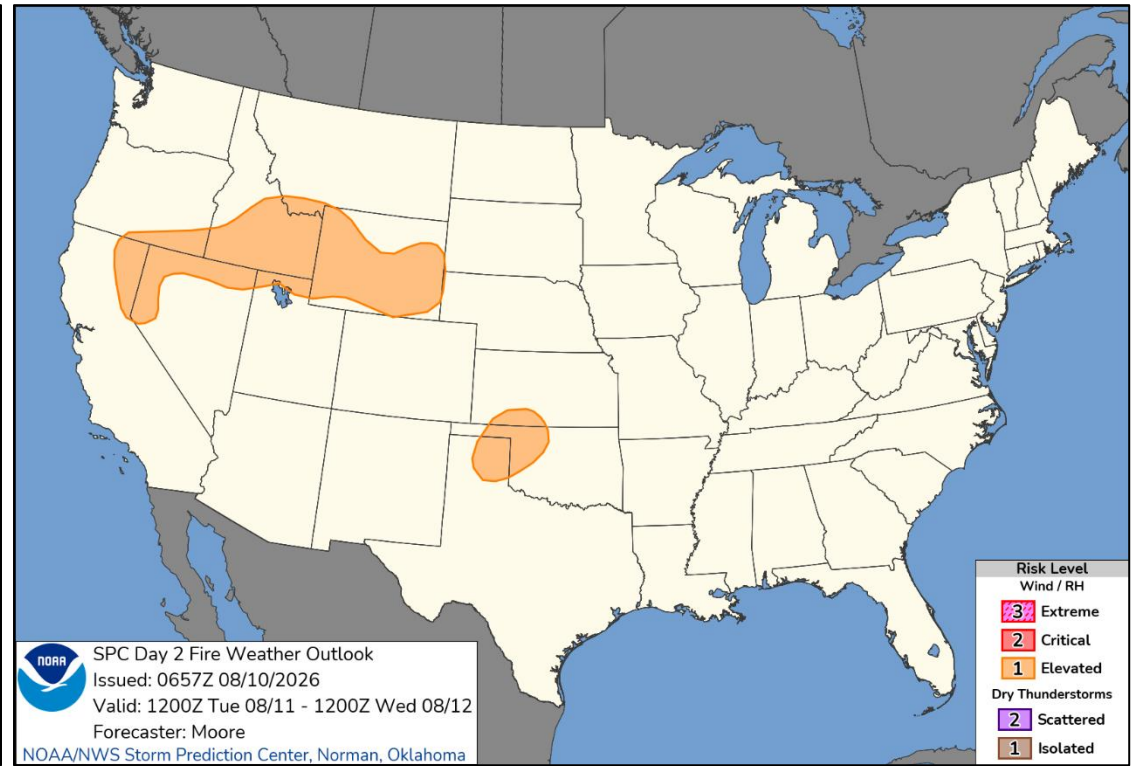

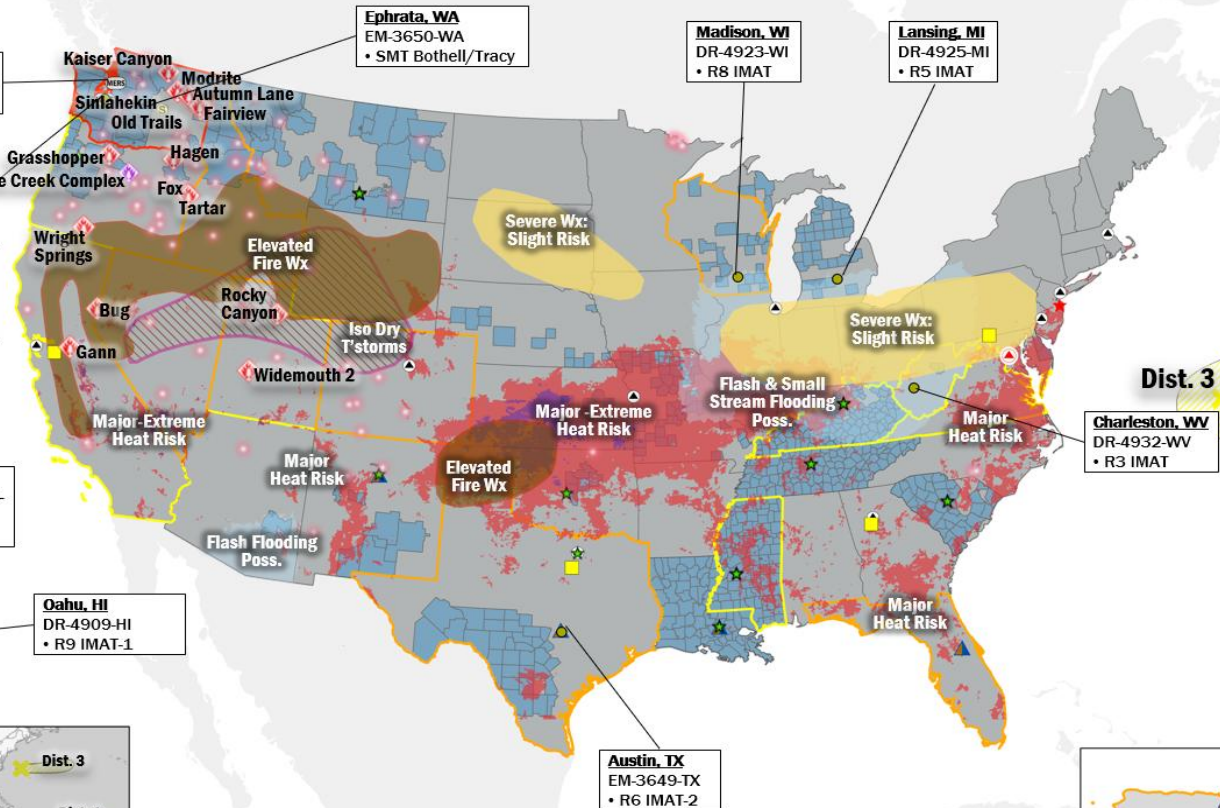
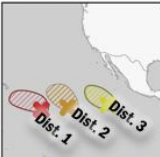
